Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Executive Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration the 27th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, covering the activities of the Association during the year ended 31st December, 1960.

1. MEMBERSHIP:

As from 23rd May, 1960 provisional membership was granted the Taumarunui and District Table Tennis Association. Full membership was not granted as our boundaries do not provide for a town and district Association and we are still hoping to see in the near future the formation of the Southern King County Association comprising the counties of Taumarunui, Ohura, Kaitieke and Waimarino with headquarters to be decided. The registered colours of the Taumarunui and District Association are navy blue with red monogram with the initials "T.T.A." embroidered in gold.

A study of the membership statistics for 1960 show fluctuations under the three headings, clubs, teams, members. Although twelve associations recorded increases in team strength which totalled in all, 80 teams, this increase was immediately cancelled by the decrease of 44 and 41 teams recorded by the Southland and Wellington Associations respectively. With returns still to come from Buller and South Canterbury Associations, the New Zealand total in comparison with the previous year, shows a decrease of 22 clubs, 52 teams and 2509 members, the last figure being an estimate only.

2. DEVELOPMENT:

1. Every encouragement was given to consolidating the formation of the Taumarunui and District Association. Once again we called upon the good services of Messrs A.R. Tomlinson and G.A.J. Frew to show the flag and this they did successfully early in June playing exhibitions and demonstrating the basic strokes. Mr. W. Mullins, Chairman of the New Zealand Committee, accompanied the players and had on-the-spot talks with the officials regarding the administration of the sport. In addition, a visit by the Australian team was arranged and we are grateful for the unbounded hospitality shown the visitors. The new Association entered a team in the Inter-Association Teams Championships thus demonstrating the interest and enthusiasm existing in the district. We feel confident that the future will see expansion of the organisation to other counties adjacent Taumarunui.

2. We again congratulate Associations that conducted primary and secondary school tournaments, junior represented contests and open junior tournaments. The energy and enthusiasm by

the boys and girls make these tournaments well worth while and the sport will gain immeasurably by their continuation.

3. The South Canterbury Association brought to notice that the Temuka Borough Council was raising difficulties concerning the use of church halls for use by table tennis clubs. The matter was taken up with the Municipal Association of New Zealand on the grounds that the Borough Council was exercising authority that was having a harmful effect on the encouragement on recreation for young people. The reply from the Secretary Municipal Association was interesting and is quoted here for your information -

quote, "The position regarding halls used for public purposes is that they require to be licensed in terms of the Municipal Corporation Act 1954 and the Twelfth Schedule thereof. In the case of halls used for religious purposes, such as Sunday School halls, they are exempt from rates. If, however, they are let to outside organisations they lose their exemption from rates. Apparently the Temuka Borough Council had drawn the attention of Church authorities to the position" unquote.

3. CHAMPIONSHIPS:

(a) Inter-Association Teams Championships Thirty nine teams entered for the Inter-Association Teams Championships held at Hawera, 29th and 30th August, 1960. A men's and women's team entry from the Franklin Association was rejected being received after the closing date for receipt of entries. The only Associations that did not enter teams were Buller, Bush, Nelson and West Coast, and of these Associations, Buller, Bush and West Coast have yet to be "blooded" in these interesting competitions.

The competitions were held in three halls, the Sports Hall, Community Centre and R.S.A. Hall. The latter two halls were adjacent to each other but were some three quarters of a mile away from the Sports Hall. All the Halls were, however, reasonably handy to the town centre and little inconvenience was caused by the Halls being some distance apart. Private transport was available for teams accommodated at Eltham and Stratford and proved satisfactory. Playing conditions were good and adequate cafeteria facilities were available at each of the two main Halls.

It is interesting to note that Hall controllers stationed in the two main Halls were connected by telephone communication with the Tournament Manager who established his headquarters in his office in the main street of Hawera away from the Halls.

Kean Shield Competition Twenty-two teams, the highest number so far recorded, competed for the Kean Challenge Shield for men. The following Associations were represented: Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Canterbury, Hawkes Bay, Hutt Valley, Manawatu, Marlborough, Northland, North Shore, North Taranaki, Otago, Poverty Bay, Rotorua, South Canterbury, Southland, South Taranaki, Taumarunui, Thames Valley, Waikato, Wairarapa, Wanganui and Wellington. The post-section play was most interesting, the teams being evenly matched. The Auckland team was again successful in winning the final recording their sixth win in succession as the leading Association's men's team.

Teagle Shield Competition: Seventeen teams representing the following Associations, Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Canterbury, Hawkes Bay, Hutt Valley, Manawatu, Marlborough, Northland, North Shore, North Taranaki, Otago, South Canterbury, South Taranaki, Waikato, Wairarapa, Wanganui and Wellington, competed for the Herbert G. Teagle Memorial Challenge Shield for women. The youthful Northland team swept all before them winning all their contest by the wide margin of 11 matches to 1 to record their first victory in the team competition. Mention should also be made of the North Taranaki team which won their section comfortably and proved beyond doubt that no longer does the strength of women's teams remain in the four main centres.

Plate and Bracelet: For those teams not participating in the post-section play of the Kean and Teagle Challenge Shield competition a plate and bracelet competition was arranged. Northland won the men's plate for the third year in succession beating Manawatu in the final 5 matches to 0. In the women's bracelet final, Otago reversed the decision of last year by beating Wellington 3 - 2.

Victor Barna Dunlop Cup Award: With the exception of one team, the judges, Mr. W. Mullins (convenor), Miss M.J. Guthrie and Mrs. D. Salmon, were unanimous in their praise of the high standard of sportsmanship, appearance and punctuality of the teams. The judges stated that it was necessary to mark hard in order to decide the eventual winner and the closeness of the

markings indicated the unanimity of the judges in deciding the eventual winner. Comment was also made that some women's teams looked very smart in their street uniform and although this aspect could not be taken into account for the Victor Barna Dunlop cup award, the Associations concerned are to be complimented on the standard set.

The award was won by the Waikato Women's team with 298½ points closely followed by the Hawkes Bay Women's team with 298 points and the Marlborough Women's team, Bay of Plenty Men's team and Northland Men's team, each with 297 points.

(b) New Zealand Championships: The National Championships held at Hawera 31st August, 1st and 2nd September were conducted under the same conditions as outlined for the inter-association teams championships except that the R.S.A. Hall was not used. The Tournament Manager concentrated the play of certain events in one Hall, such as, junior events in the Sports Hall on Wednesday morning followed by Men's events with the women's events being played in the Community Centre. While this arrangement necessitated a certain amount of transferring from one hall to the other it did not appear to cause any undue inconvenience to the players although it was not satisfactory to spectators wishing to view the matches played by both men and women.

A Tournament of this magnitude require meticulous organisation and no doubt the Tournament Manager in the initial stages had many problems to overcome. Therefore, it is pleasing to report that the tournament ran smoothly and the South Taranaki Association is to be heartily congratulated on the splendid organisation displayed.

The final of the men's singles was a grand contest with the winner, M.L. Dunn in devastating form and his display was appreciated by the large attendance. Although the defending champion, A.R. Tomlinson was defeated he was not disgraced. It was simply Dunn's night. It was also Northland's tournament in that three of their players contested the semi-finals with the youngsters Neti Davis and Norma Attwood playing off for the final. There was no doubt that Miss Neti Davis who became the first Maori to win a New Zealand table tennis singles title and also the youngest player to win the singles title, was the player of the tournament. 14-year old Norma Attwood was also one of the stars and has had the distinction of eliminating the No. 1 seed at the 1959 and 1960 Championships. She beat Mrs. Green in the semi-finals at Hawera and last year beat Miss Brown in the quarter-finals. The Northland combination G.A.J. Frew and Miss N. Davis won the mixed doubles event for the third year in succession

Except for guest umpires, all umpiring was performed by a panel chosen from the Association's representatives and officials. All members of the panel were wearing the Association blazer and looked neat and efficient.

It was pleasing to note that there was a very decided improvement in the attire of the players and although the dress could still be further improved there was little cause for complaint in respect to uniform dress on this occasion.

There were some excellent matches and the attendance of approximately 200 were not disappointed with the standard of play. The North Island decisively defeated the South Island in both men's and women's contests. The North Island men won by 10 matches to 2 and the women by 11 matches to 1.

The North Island men have now been successful in winning all of the eleven contests played since 1946 and since 1955 when the women contest was introduced the North Island has won 5 and the South Island 1.

The standard of table tennis, particularly by the men players was very high and for sheer entertainment, the most sustained ever. There was very little difference between the top five men and their matches against each other in the singles, doubles and mixed doubles events earned constant applause from an appreciative audience.

There were 124 individuals making up 350 entries in the various events and the total number of matches played was 322 with 135 taking place on Friday and 187 on Saturday. The fact that so many matches were completed in the time available on only six tables and with virtually no friction between organisers and players was a fine tribute to the Tournament Manager and his assistants.

5. RANKING LIST In submitting the fifteenth New Zealand Ranking List, the Sub-Committee reported that little difficulty was experienced in deciding the placing of the men but that the placing of the women after the first three provided many problems due to the inconsistencies of performances.

The Sub-Committee felt that the achievement of three players from one Association, Northland, occupying the first three placings in the Women's List was worthy of note particularly as the first two players are so young and their Association is a relatively scattered one in a rural area.

The Sub-Committee experienced the greatest difficulty in obtaining tournament and representative results and placed the blame on Association Secretaries in failing to submit the information. In a number of cases where results were forwarded, the information referred to finals only, and the Sub-committee drew attention that the results of all singles matches from the quarter finals stage onwards, together with details of any match where seeded or leading player was unexpectedly beaten.

6. PLAYER OF THE YEAR The outstanding player of the year was Miss Nett Davis of Northland and the Committee had no hesitation in awarding her the Player of the Year Award. Holder of many junior and provincial titles, Miss Davis climaxed a most successful season by winning the New Zealand women's singles title. At 16 years of age Miss Davis is the youngest ever to win a New Zealand Senior title and she is the first Maori to achieve this honour. In addition she is the only player who has won three open events and one junior event at a national tournament and with G.A.J. Frew she has won the Mixed Doubles Open event for the past three years in succession. Miss Davis played for New Zealand against the Japanese and has been selected as a member of the New Zealand team to compete at the 1961 World Championships.

7. PROVINCIAL UMPIRES SCHEME The aims of the Umpire Scheme are to set a standard of good umpiring and to provide recognition for those of proven ability. Since the commencement of the scheme in 1955 and the insistence that badge holders umpire the finals of National Tournaments, greater encouragement has been given to the importance of umpiring and as a consequent the players and spectators have benefited by the qualifications which the umpire has achieved.

During the year, 27 test papers were marked; seven candidates qualified as Provincial Umpires; one as a Probationary Umpire and five Provincial Umpires who qualified by answering the questions of paper No. 1 successfully completed the questions of paper No. 2. Twelve candidates failed to pass the written test and it is hoped that they will make a closer study of the Laws and attempt the paper again at a later stage.

8. NATIONAL COACHING SCHOOLS Under the control of Mr. J.E. Stewart assisted by Miss M.J. Guthrie a girls coaching school was held at Tauranga on Friday, Saturday and Sunday 13th, 14th and 15th May and a boy's school at Palmerston North 20th to 22nd May. At both schools Mr. Stewart had the assistance of leading players as coaches. The training followed a pattern of match play, individual coaching, illustration of the mechanics of the game, talk on tactics, exchange of opinions and physical exercises.

As both schools were limited to 12 trainees the following were selected from nominations submitted by Associations -

H. Dennis was unable to attend the school due to a broken ankle and his place was taken by D. Free (Manawatu)

Girls: Misses A. Mutch (Auckland), M.J. Ross (Bay of Plenty), R.I. Bush (Hutt Valley), D. Galloway (Manawatu), N.J. Attwood and N. Davis (Northland), A.R. Dravitski (North Taranaki), J.D. Bridson, C.E. Johnson and B.A. Straka (Waikato), L. Larsen (Wairarapa) and J. Wallace (South Canterbury)

Misses D. Galloway and B.A. Straka were unavailable and their places were taken by Misses A.S. Hardaker (Bay of Plenty) and V. Morgan (Wanganui)

At the Girl's School, Messrs A.R. Tomlinson, G.V. Wilkinson and G.R. Shewan attended as coaches and the boy's school, Messrs M.L. Dunn, J.S. Crossley and T.A. Walsh. To these coaches who were on their feet continuously for one and half days we extend thanks for their selfless effort to pass on their knowledge.

One of the remarkable aspects of the School at the Otumoetai Club Hall, Tauranga, was the large number of spectators at all sessions and the apparent local enthusiasm for the game. The Bay of Plenty Association spared no effort to make the school a success and the assistance of a team of young umpires and the refreshment facilities provided were greatly appreciated.

Similarly the Manawatu Association did everything possible to make the boys school a success and its generosity in waiving all charges for hall rent and supper expenses deserve special mention.

Mr. Stewart in his report made comment that there was lack of information from some Association Secretaries as to the mode of transport, arrival times and accommodation requirements of some trainees and he suggested that for any future coaching schools all correspondence be actioned directly between the New Zealand Association and trainees with copies to trainees Association. This would eliminate the time lag which often occurs when local Association Secretaries must wait for committee meetings before attending to correspondence.

In addition to the National Coaching Schools, extensive individual and group coaching was undertaken in the South Island by Miss J.M. Williamson. In Christchurch Miss Williamson held regular weekly coaching programmes of stroke technique and ball control and at the invitation of the South Canterbury Association held a weekend group coaching school at Timaru at which boys and girls from the Canterbury and South Canterbury Associations attended. Our thanks are due to Miss Williamson for the time spent and for the coaching lessons given. Miss Williamson has now returned to England where she is intending to take up permanent residence.

9. INTERNATIONAL TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION: The biennial Congress of the International Federation will be held at Peking, China, the first meeting being scheduled for April 10th, 1961 and the second meeting on April 14th, 1961. New Zealand will be represented by its President, Mr. F.H.G. Johnstone who has also been nominated for the Office of Vice-President, Oceania.

10. INTERNATIONAL TOURS:

(a) Japan: Once again the New Zealand Association is grateful to the Japan Association for sending world champions to this country, particularly when the players are in such great demand in other countries.

The tour of New Zealand by the women's singles world champion, Miss Kimiyo Matsuzaki and the co-holder of the women's doubles crown, Miss Kazuko Yamaizumi, concluded in Auckland on July 2 on the successful and cordial note that characterised the tour which began on June 5 with a contest against Northland.

The visitors played in every major metropolitan and provincial centre with equal success and their determined and superlative playing and their sportsmanship were appreciated and admired. The Japanese girls did not lose a game in their 22 contests which included four "tests" against New Zealand.

Commenting on the play of the Japanese girls, the outstanding feature was their splendid footwork which the New Zealand girls could not match. The champions were superior all round. Nevertheless, they had to fight for their points against New Zealand's leading players, particularly against Miss Joyce Williamson, a former New Zealand singles champion who had had the benefit of two year's experience in Great Britain.

The team manager, Mr. Hitoshi Shimizu who managed the Japanese men's team which toured New Zealand in 1957 was pleased to renew acquaintances throughout the country. He was an astute manager and with his previous experience guided the team throughout New Zealand in a most capable manner. On a number of occasions, Mr. Shimizu played lighthearted matches with veteran New Zealand players which brought many evenings to a humorous and happy ending.

The visiting team taught us a lot and a feature of the tour was the goodwill that it generated and for the grounding it gave our promising juniors in international match-play that they needed.

The thanks of the Association are due to the various members who made themselves available as local tour managers.

Four "tests" were played and on each occasion Japan defeated New Zealand by 5 matches to 0. New Zealand was represented by Misses J.M. Williamson (Canterbury) (Captain), B.C. Packwood (Auckland) and Miss N. Davis (Northland) and Mrs. J.E. Magorian (Otago). Detailed results were as follows -

Financial Outcome: The tour was costly and despite the increased guarantees which Associations were asked to meet, together with 25% of the profit, the New Zealand Association disclosed a loss to date of £131. We were not helped by some Associations that demanded variations in the guarantees set and that insisted that the New Zealand Association accept all the financial risk that may be involved. Guarantees are carefully proportioned merely to cover expenses and not for big profit for the New Zealand Association. A more realistic approach to this vexed question will have to be made by Associations if we are to continue the present system of financing visits of overseas teams. As will be seen from the financial statement of the tour, hotel accommodation is a heavy item in the expenditure and maybe for future tours consideration will require to be given to the billeting of visitors.

A comparison of the financial results and guarantees paid by Associations, with the tour by the Japanese men, is shown in the following table -

(b) Australia Since 1939 when a New Zealand team visited Australia, we have been endeavouring to arrange a visit of an Australian team to New Zealand. Therefore, the visit of Geoff Jennings and Michael Wilcox in 1960 as an official Australian team was history making for not only were they the first Australian team to visit New Zealand but they commenced what has been agreed with the Australian Association, a regular inter-change of visits between the countries every two years.

The players arrived at Christchurch on 17th July and after touring the South Island and the North Island concluded the tour at Whangarei on 6th August with a contest v New Zealand. The team went through New Zealand undefeated and against a New Zealand team won 3 matches to 2. The Australian provided refreshing enjoyable table tennis. It was good to watch and also to play against and as a spectacle brought back memories of the game before the advent of sponge rubber and its failings when used by others than the Japanese. The players won friends with their sportsmanship, their brilliant displays and their willingness to meet every demand made of them.

For the purpose of establishing a standard pattern for comparison in years to come, Associations were requested to treat the visit as a competitive one and not as an exhibition tour. The programme was to consist of four singles and a doubles with the local team comprising two players for the singles events and a doubles combination using the same players or a separate pair. Financial outcome

With guarantees set at a minimum, players billeted, internal travel arranged by private car provided by Associations, it was expected that the tour would break even financially. This unfortunately did not prove the case and the New Zealand Association showed a loss on the tour of £48.10. 5, and there were some heavy losses recorded by provincial associations. At some centres, particularly Wellington where a loss of £83 was recorded, atrocious weather conditions would account for the very sparse attendance while at other centres an excessive price of admission could be attributed to the small attendance. However, it cannot be overlooked that Club members failed to support the fixtures which was the main contributing factor of the losses incurred.

11. 26th WORLD TABLE TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS The 26th World Table Tennis Championships are being held at Peking, capital of the People's Republic of China 5th - 14th April, 1961. As a member of the Federation, for the purpose of giving our players the opportunity of gaining needed international competition and as an added incentive to other players to strive for national representation, it was decided to send a men's and women's team to compete in the team contests and for the members of the team to compete in the individual events. The teams selected were -

Men: Messrs M.L. Dunn (Wellington) (Captain), A.R. Tomlinson (Auckland), G.A.J. Frew, (Northland) and B.A. Foster (Otago)

Women: Misses N. Davis (Northland, N.J. Attwood (Northland) and Mrs. J. Green (Northland) (Captain)

Six applicants were received for the position of Manager and Mr. K.C. Wilkinson Secretary N.Z. Association was appointed.

The teams are scheduled to leave Auckland on 24th March and to return on 20th April.

In addition to the official New Zealand teams, Mrs. G.E. Buckler (Auckland) and Miss B.C. Packwood (Auckland) are attending the Championships in a private capacity. The entry of Miss Packwood in the individual events has been endorsed by the New Zealand Association.

12 RAFFLE A New Zealand wide raffle was conducted during the year to raise funds for the development of the game throughout the country and for overseas tours. A quota was fixed for each association on the basis that each affiliated member would sell five tickets each, the total being £4117. In order to encourage sales a rebate was approved of 10% in the proportion of 5% to associations and 5% to clubs for the first 50% of the quota raised and a further rebate of 15% to associations and 35% to clubs for the second 50% of the quota raised. It is pleasing to report that seven associations exceeded their quotas. The amount paid back to associations was £911.18. 6.

100,000 tickets were printed, 95,030 distributed, and 66,839 were sold, a very satisfactory result. A profit of £1997. 6.10 resulted and great credit is due to associations and club secretaries for the excellent work carried out.

16. FINANCIAL: A profit of £9.8.2 in the General Account shown this year as compared with a loss in 1959 of £232.14. 4. This has been brought about in the main by a reduction in travelling expenses of £62.5. 7. and a £53.13.8 saving in conducting the National Junior Coaching Schools, while two items, N.Z. entry in the World Championships £63. 8. 2, and Jubilee Dinner £75. 3. 1 have not been repeated. There has been a reduction in revenue of £16.4.3. The loss on the Australian Tour is £48.10. 5 and the loss to date on the Japanese Tour is £131.1.9.

The combined receipts and payments total £11,307, the highest in the history of the Association.

17. APPRECIATION: Publicity was again full and complete throughout the country and our thanks are due to the New Zealand Press Association, the New Zealand Broadcasting Service, local newspapers, periodical and monthly magazines for their co-operation.

A tribute is also paid to Association Secretaries and Committee members, for the enthusiasm displayed in the control and management of their Associations. We fully appreciate that without this co-operation and enthusiasm the New Zealand Association could not exist.
