Your Executive Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration, the 29th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, covering the activities of the New Zealand Association during the year ended 31st December, 1962.

MEMBERSHIP:

The membership return for 1962 in comparison with previous years showed fluctuations between Associations. Some Associations increased its team strength, other Associations recorded a decrease. The overall pattern appeared to be, increases in the country areas and decreases in the city areas. The Canterbury Association recorded the greatest progress with an increase of 53 teams in the city area and 12 teams in the country area and with a total of 280 teams is the only Association with more than 200 teams. The Canterbury Association also conduct a Summer Competition with 72 teams competing in grades "A" to "E".

DE VELOPMENT:

- South Taranaki: The formation of a Sub-association at Stratford saw development of the northern area of the South Taranaki Association.
- 2. <u>Taumarunui</u>: Distances is a problem for the ultimate development of the Southern King Country Association which is at present being controlled by the Taumarunui and District Association. Although the Ohakune Club took part with considerable success in the residential championships, the club did not compete in the interclub competition due to the distance of travel. However, it is hoped that the club will be able to enter at Least the "A" grade competition in the coming season.

The colours of the Taumarunui and District Association was registered as Navy Blue with red monogram, with the initials "T.T.T.A." embroidered in gold, worn on the breast.

- 3. Waikato: The Waikato Association reported progress with the formation of the Northern King Country Sub-association. It is expected that the sub-association which is at present being controlled by Otorchanga will affiliate with the Waikato Association in the coming season. Four new clubs affiliated with the Cambridge Sub-association and the Matamata Sub-association is showing a steady increase in membership which has been attributed mainly to the efforts of its Secretary.
- 4. Wanganui: Considerable progress was made towards obtaining finance for the erection of a community sports stadium which is expected to be ready for use in 1964. The initial plan of the building is for a playing area of about 110 ft x 110 ft together with meeting rooms and other amenities. An incorporated society, "Wanganui Community Sports Centre" has been formed and this body with representatives from all sports interest in the project is at present working on plans and finance. The Wanganui City Council has granted the body a considerable area of land about 12 miles from the Chief Post Office and in addition to the stadium it is expected that outdoor sports fields will be developed. Table Tennis had played its part in the raising of money and at a recent Queen Carnival the sum of £2000 was raised by Table Tennis has table tennis members which gave them second place in the overall efforts made by six sporting bodies.
- 5. <u>Visits to Associations</u>: The President, Mr A.B. McCallum visited various Associations, Sub-associations and clubs in the South Island. He visited the South Canterbury and Otago Associations and as Manager of the Canterbury team in the quadrangular tournament held at Nelson, he took the opportunity to meet and discuss table tennis with officials from the various associations attending. Mr McCallum attended the Silver Jubilee of the St. Patricks Club in Timaru, was Tournament Manager at the National Championships held in Christchurch, Referee at the South Island Championships held in Invercargill and attended the presentation of the Junior Player of the Year award at Timaru in December. During a brief visit to Wellington, Mr McCallum contacted members of the New Zealand Executive Committee.

Following the Annual General Meeting the Secretary had occasion to travel in the South Island and took the opportunity of calling upon the President of the Marlborough Association and to attend the opening of the Springlands Club in Blenheim. Travelling further south the Secretary enjoyed the opportunity given to him by Mr A.B. McCallum to inspect the W.J. Cowles Memorial Stadium in Christ-church where the New Zealand Championships were to be held and also to inspect the playing headquarters of the Canterbury Association. While in Oamaru the Secretary called upon officials of the North Otago Sub-association and on his return travel met South Canterbury officials during a brief train stop at Timaru.

6. Films: The Peking World Championship film was screened by a number of Associations and all that saw this film agreed that the film was entertaining, instructional and one of the best table tennis films ever produced.

Another good film was the Jack Carrington coaching film which was produced and edited in Australia. This was an excellent film which showed to advantage the methods used by Carrington in coaching. We are indebted to the generosity of Mr F.J. O'Gorman who made a copy of the film available to Associations.

CHAMP IONSHIPS: 3.

Inter-Association Teams Championships: Thirty eight teams entered for the inter-association teams championships held in the W.J. Cowles Memorial Stadium, Christchurch on 27th and 28th August. In the women's competition two teams were accepted from the Canterbury Association to provide an even number of four teams in five sections. However, a late withdrawal of the Hawkes Bay team necessitated a bye in Section 3.

Kean Shield Competition: Eighteen teams competed for the Kean Challenge Shield for men. represented Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Canterbury, Hawkes Bay, Hutt Valley, Manawatu, Mariborough, North-Land, North Taranaki, Otago, Rotorua, South Canterbury, Southland, South Taranaki, Wairarapa, Wanganui, Wellington and West Coast.

Auckland, Wellington, Canterbury and Otago had no difficulty in winning their sections and the strong Wellington team disposed of Canterbury in the semi-final, 10 - 2 and Auckland in the final by the same margin. Wellington thus retained the shield and completed the tournament with the excellent record of winning 56 matches and losing 4.

<u>Plate and Bracelet:</u> For those teams not participating in the post-section play of the Kean and Teagle Challenge Shield competitions, a plate and bracelet competition was arranged. Hutt Valley won the men's plate beating Northland in the final, 4 matches to 1. In the women's bracelet final, Wanganui beat North Taranaki, 3 - 2.

Victor Barna Dunlop Cup Award: Women teams continue to dominate the top placings for the Victor Barna Dunlop Cup award as evidence of the first nine placings in the 1962 competition which went to women teams. The Judges, Miss M.J. Guthrie, Mrs Inglis and Mr G. Sherman reported that the overall standard of table etiquette, dress and punctuality was good.

Arising from an inquiry by an Association regarding its poor rating under the heading of "Sportsmanship", it was agreed that the heading could convey a wrong impression of a team's performance and the rules were, therefore, amended to provide that one of the qualities which a team must satisfy the Award Committee shall be "Table Etiquette and Sportsmanship" characterised by modesty in victory and cheerfulness in defeat, a ready acceptance of umpire's decisions and correct behaviour at the table.

(b) New Zealand Championships

The New Zealand Championships which were held in the W.J. Cowles Memorial Stadium, Aranui, Christchurch, produced some of the most spectacular table tennis ever seen at a national meeting. Murray Dunn of Wellington and Miss Neti Davis of Northland retained their singles title for the third year in succession and Miss Davis featured in another third successive win, when teamed with Mrs J. Green of Canterbury, the pair won the women's doubles. Another notable feat was the effort of 16 year-old Norma Attwood of Northland who reached the final in all nine events in which she competed. Miss Attwood won five events and was beaten in the final of the other four in which she took part.

The Championships were conducted by the Canterbury Association under the leadership of Mr A.B. McCallum as Tournament Manager. All events were well supported by competitors and the total number of entries, 597, excluding those received for the veteran men's singles in the 35-45 year age group which was a new event, were one more than that received at the 1961 championships. The time-table was fairly well maintained with the exception of Wednesday evening when play fell behind schedule and a few matches were held over to the next morning. The expedite rule, which was invoked on numerous occasions, showed that the officials acting as stroke counters had been well briefed and the application of the rule was handled very well. The comments of players and officials were all in favour of the continuation of this rule. All semi-finals and finals of senior and junior events were umpired by qualified provincial umpires. A programme which contained the draw, time schedule and other items of interest was published. The insert pages on which the draw was printed, was blue in colour and there was criticism that this colour was not helpful to the recording of results when using blue ink. Portions of the finals were televised; there was an excellent coverage of the championships in the local newspapers and there was a national radio link three times daily although limited to only a few minutes.

It was a particularly happy, successful and well-run tournament and all concerned are to be congratulated on the efforts made.

(d) North Island Championships: A record number of 331 competitors competed for the various events of the 1962 North Island Championships held at Tauranga on 13th and 14th July. There were 125 entries for the junior events, an increase of 34 on the previous year. The finals produced high class table tennis and there were also some exciting matches leading to the finals. The Men's Doubles final between G.A.J. Frew and G.J. Jennings and B.A. Foster and R.L. Foster was probably the most spectacular of the tournament. Garry Frew (Northland) won his first North Island title when he beat Brian Foster (Otago) in five games after losing the first two. Miss Neti Davis (Northland) retained her women's singles title for the second year is succession when she beat Norma Attwood (Northland) in five games. These two players met in the North Island final last year when Miss Davis won in four games. B.A. Foster was the only competitor from a South Island Association and he reached the final for the third consecutive year. He now has the unique record of being runner-up to three different title-holders. He lost to M.L. Dunn in the 1960 final, to A.R. TomLinson in 1961 and to G.A.J. Frew in 1962.

The Championships was successfully conducted by the Bay of Plenty Association. In his report on the conduct of the tournament the New Zealand representative commented that some of the tables had been recently painted resulting in the surface not being conducive to fast play. The Representative added, "this painting of tables seems to be one of the commonest errors made by Associations that have been allocated a major tournament", and he recommended that all tables be extensively used prior to tournament play to ensure faster playing surfaces.

(f) Representative Contests and Team Tournaments: In addition to senior representative contests which in many cases are annual fixtures, there were representative contests for other teams according to grades. The list of fixtures showed that junior representative contests are increasing and we are very pleased with this aspect of development.

The Waikato representative team went on tour and visited Manawatu, Wanganui, North Taranaki and Taumarunui. This was a new departure and the Waikato Association is to be congratulated for this progressive move. The West Coast/Marlborough contest came up with a freak score with matches equal at 48 and games equal at 113. Apparently there was no time to count points.

Nelson withstood two challenges for the Perry Shield and Waikato successfully retained the Sutton Shield. Competition was keen for the Laurie Sweetman Memorial Shield and in the opening contest, the holders, Manawatu lost to Wanganui who then successfully defended the shield against Wairarapa only to lose to North Taranaki in the next contest. The season ended with North Taranaki beating off a challenge by South Taranaki.

In the main South Island quadrangular teams tournament held at Surrey Park Stadium Invercargill, Canterbury had an unbeaten record in both the men's and women's section. Other quadrangular tournaments were held at Gisborne and Nelson.

6. PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

For the second year in succession M.L. Dunn, Wellington won the coveted Player of the Year award for 1962. Mr Dunn had a good tournament record in New Zealand winning the New Zealand, Wellington and Hutt Valley men's singles title, but it was his fighting spirit in the 2nd International v Australia at Sydney that made him the outstanding player of the year. New Zealand required to win the 2nd International to square the rubber and when Dunn came out to play the final match against V. Hirsch the Australian champion, the matches were two all. Dunn lost the first game and then won the next three and thus gave New Zealand a meritorious victory, 3 - 2.

At an evening function held at the residence of Mr and Mrs W.S.R. Jopson, the Chairman of the Executive Committee, Mr T.S. Williams, presented the cup to Mr N.L. Dunn.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF YEAR:

In consulation with the donor, it was agreed that the handsome trophy donated by Mr H.N. Ballinger for the encouragement of junior players should be awarded to the New Zealand Junior of the Year. The following attributes were taken into account in deciding the award:

(b) enthusiasm both as a player and club member (a) playing results (c) interest in club and association management affairs (d) sportsmanship (e) potential (f) personality (g) appearance

Tim Underdown of the South Canterbury Association was unanimously selected as the first winner of this award and at an enjoyable function held in the Kingsdown Hall, Timaru, on Monday, 17th December, Mr H.N. Ballinger made the presentation.

7. UNIVERSITY BLUE:

Following the New Zealand University winter sports Tournament held at Christchurch, a Table Tennis University "blue" was awarded to Miss A. Mutch (Auckland).

PROVINCIAL UMPIRES SCHEME:

Fourteen candidates successfully completed their examination during the season and there are now 74 qualified provincial umpires.

The umpire has always been an essential part of every table tennis match. A good umpire adds enjoyment to the match not only for the players but for the spectators. The foreword to the English Table Tennis Association's handbook for umpires aptly says, "the player just as much as the official should know the Laws and Rules governing play and if he does there is unlikely to be any occasion for dispute during a match, and if the player, having studied these things and fitted himself - or herself - to become a qualified umpire, is encouraged to take a generous share of "duty" when not playing, he will be doing a service to the game which most Umpires find provides a rich reward of personal satisfaction".

There is need for more qualified umpires in New Zealand and Associations would be helping themselves by encouraging more of their members to become interested in the Provincial Umpires Scheme.

JUNIOR NATIONAL COACHING SCHOOLS:

The 4th Junior National Coaching School for boys was held at Hawera on 11th, 12th and 13th May and for girls at Tauranga on 18th, 19th and 20th May. Both schools were under the control of the Director, Mr T.S. Williams who was ably assisted by Miss M.J. Guthrie of the New Zealand Executive Committee. At the boys school the trainees were divided into four groups of three and passed through the hands of four coaches, Messrs A.R. Tomlinson, W.O. Jaine, J.E. Stewart and T.S. Williams. The trainees also listened to a talk given by Mr W.O. Jaine on the "Theory of Flight and Ball Control", by Mr J.E. Stewart, "Rules of the Game with particular reference to the Expedite Rule" and by Mr M.L. Dunn, "Training for the National Championships". These talks and discussions were very valuable. Opportunity was also taken to play two matches between Murray Dunn and Alan Tomlinson for demonstration purposes and to assist these players to become match fit for their Australian tour. their Australian tour.

Much the same plan was followed at the girls school where the coaches were Miss B.C. Packwood, Messrs E. Smith, G.R. Shewan and T.S. Williams. A talk was given by Miss Packwood on the training of the Japanese teams for the Peking World Championships and by Mr E. Smith on physical training. Both talks were most appropriate.

Our thanks are due to the South Taranaki and Bay of Plenty Associations for the facilities and amenities provided; to the kind people who billetted the trainees; to the umpires; to the parents who accompanied their sons and daughters to the school and to the coaches who played such an important part in the training.

The Director in his report, stated that he was not yet satisfied that the work of the coaches was planned to the best advantage and expressed concern that there was not time to discuss each trainee's weakness with the coaches before coaching commenced on the Saturday morning. Ways and means are being considered to improve this aspect in the training programme for future schools.

TELEVISION:

Fair progress has been made in the matter of televising table tennis, a number of matches in Wellington, Hutt Valley, Auckland and Christchurch being screened.

The number of occasions has not been great and the screenings not as lengthy as we would wish but the position may be considered satisfactory under present circumstances. Our thanks are due to the Broadcasting Authorities for their helpful co-operation.

The present policy is that jurisdiction in the matter of televising table tennis is in the hands of Local associations concerned and it appears this position will remain until such time as screening hours are extended or more channels become available to cater for extended showing of sporting fixtures.

11. INTERNATIONAL TOUR:

Tour of Australia: A New Zealand team consisting of Messrs M.L. Dunn (Wellington) (Captain/Manager) and A.R. Tomlinson (Auckland) toured Victoria and New South Wales for three weeks commencing in July 1962. This was New Zealand's first visit to Australia following the tour of New Zealand by an Australian team in 1960. From all accounts the tour was most successful and it has been stated that when New Zealand tours Australia again in 1966, there will be a demand from other States to be included in the itinerary.

The team played 5 provincial and 2 international contests and competed in invitation tournaments and the New South Wales State Championships. The team won all the provincial contests, halved the international contests; Tomlinson won the invitation tournament at Conulla, New South Wales and the team won the New South Wales State Championship doubles.

Statistically it is interesting to note that Dunn played Milcox 3 times without a win, Tomlinson played Wilcox 4 times for 2 wins apiece. Each player met Victor Hirsch, the Australian Champion 3 times and both won 2. Murray Thomson (South Australia) played Dunn twice for two wins and Cliff McDonald (N.S.W.) played Dunn twice for one win each but lost his two matches against Tomlinson.

12. OVERSEAS CHAMPIONSHIPS AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Mr A.R. Tomlinson (Auckland) competed at the Australian Open Championships held at Hobart, 3rd/7th September, 1962. After beating Murray Thomson (South Australia) in the quarter finals subcumbed to Michael Wilcox (N.S.W.) in the semi-final. In the other semi-final, Arthu (Victoria) toppled the defending champion Victor Hirsch in five games and went on to beat Wilcox in the final also in five games.

A clearance certificate was given Misses J.E. Brown (Hutt Valley) and J.F. Crosby (Hutt Valley) and Mr A.R. Tomlinson (Auckland) to compete in English and other overseas tournaments. The players who were visiting England and the Continent at their own expense expect to be absent from New Zealand for a period of 12 months.

Upon application by Misses Brown and Crosby it was agreed to sponsor the players as an unofficial New Zealand team in the Women's Teams Championships at the 28th World Championships to be held at Prague in April, 1963. Mr A.R. Tomlinson was appointed non-playing captain and Mrs G.E. Buckler of Auckland who was attending the championships in a private capacity was appointed New Zealand delegate to Congress. The entry of Misses Brown and Crosby and Mr A.R. Tomlinson in the individual events was approved.

The excess of income over expenditure for the year ended 31st December, 1962, amounted to £96.12. O. as against £133.16.10 for the previous year.

During the year a grant of £250 was received from the profits of the Golden Kiwi Lottery. This sum has been set aside as a Junior Development Fund and the expenditure of £149.15, 3 for the 1962 National Junior Coaching Schools charged against it.
