Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Executive Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration, the 30th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, covering the activities of the New Zealand Association during the year ended 31st December, 1963.

1. MEMBERSHIP:

725 clubs, representing an estimated 14,470 players are recorded as the total membership for 1963. There are 2,006 teams competing in interclub competition. These figures show an increase of 71 clubs and 17 teams in comparison with the 1962 returns.

The Canterbury Association has the largest membership with 264 teams competing in the Winter inter-club competition and 91 teams competing in the Summer Competition. Otago follows with 198 teams. Then comes Wellington with 193 and Auckland, 132. Other Associations with 70 or more teams are, South Canterbury, 87, Hamilton, 76, Franklin, 75, North Taranaki 74 and Hutt Valley 70.

## 2. DEVELOPMENT:

1. Manawatu Association: On Saturday, 25th May, the Manawatu Association celebrated the formation of the Association with a Silver Jubilee Tournament followed by a formal dinner and cabaret. The veteran men's singles was won by E. Mayo and the women's singles by Mrs L. Horn, who as Miss Laura Hughes won the first New Zealand Mixed doubles championships with her partner, Ron Dennis, in 1934. The Dinner was presided over by the President, Mr. G. Rowlands and was attended by the Mayor of Palmerston North, the Member of Parliament for the District, Mr. W.H. Brown and Mr. K.C. Wilkinson representing the New Zealand Association.

2. Otago Association: A milestone in the history of the Otago Association was the purchase of a block of land on which was sited a building, to become the headquarters of the Otago Association. The property is situated handy to the city and suburbs and the building which will hold eight or nine tables will be available for inter-club competition, tournaments and championships. Through various fund raising schemes and hard work, the Otago Association was able to make a substantial cash deposit and with the assistance of a grant of £1000 from the Golden Kiwi profits are within reach of clearing the purchase price of £6,250.

3. Poverty Bay Association: As a means of recruiting new members and to extend the scope of inter-club competition, the Poverty Bay Association introduced a Mercantile Tournament. Entries were invited from Government Departments, Local Bodies, Stock & Station Agents, Insurance Companies, Banks etc. Entries were restricted to teams consisting of four players of which two were required to be players who did not actively participate in competitive table tennis. The total entries received exceeded the limit of 48 teams for a one-day tournament and this good response was probably due to calling the tournament a "Mercantile Tournament" a title that is well established in the district for other sports. Teams were divided into four sections and each team had three matches of four singles and two doubles. The matches were limited to 30 minutes duration. The two leading teams from each section were then drawn to play-off on a knockout basis.

To distribute the playing strength more evenly in the "A" and "B" grades of the inter-club competition, the Poverty Bay Association decided that instead of accepting team entries it would invite individual player nominations and to place the accepted players into teams irrespective of club affiliation. For the 1963 season seven teams were selected of as nearly equal strength as was possible and a closely fought competition resulted. The experiment was successful in that players were correctly graded, the "B" grade competition was improved; junior and women players of sufficiently high standard were able to improve their play by competing in the "A" grade and it was found that several players who had dropped out of competitive play were sufficiently interested to play again. The experiment had a disadvantage in finding replacements of the correct standard when team members were not available. This disadvantage was overcome by using members of "A" grade teams not playing at the time as reserves.

4. Taumarunui and District Association: A very successful King Country Maori Table Tennis Championships was conducted under the auspices of the Taumarunui and District Association. There is a large Maori population in the King Country and although there are many Maori table tennis clubs the members tend to keep to themselves rather than compete in open tournaments or inter-club competition. To encourage more open competition it was decided to hold a King Country Maori Table Tennis Championships 113 entries were received including 12 from the Northern King Country Sub-Association. By means of raffles, personal trophies were provided in addition to the Permanent trophies donated by the Tournament Committee. The tournament was conducted on 12 tables and play was continuous from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Meals were available at all hours and a competent women's committee catered for the multitude with a feast of pig and mutton. The finals were of a high standard and pleased the 200 spectators who watched the events. The tournament created interest in competitive play and it is expected that the full success of the tournament will be reflected in the increased numbers competing in next season's Taumarunui and District championships.

**5. Wairarapa Association:** A Festival of Sport sponsored by the Masterton Public Relations Office was held in Masterton during the week ended Monday, 27th October. Invitations extended to kindred sporting bodies were accepted with enthusiasm and with good publicity the week became known as the "Golden Games". The following players were invited to compete in the table tennis tournament: Messrs M.L. Dunn, G.J. Jennings, G.A.J. Frew, B.A. Foster, J. Armstrong and W.N. Evans; Misses L.V. Larsen, M. Broadbent, J.G. Bamford, J. Stevenson and Mrs M.J. Shadbolt. In the men's section Dunn beat Frew in the final and Jennings beat Foster for the minor placing. In the women's competition, Miss L.V. Larsen beat Miss M. Broadbent in the final and Miss J.G. Bamford beat Mrs M.J. Shadbolt for the minor placing. The first three placings received a gold, bronze and silver medal respectively and the presentations were made by Mr. T.S. Williams. The "Golden Games" created a tremendous amount of interest and attracted visitors from many parts of the country.

**6. Formation of New Associations:** 1963 saw the winding-up of the Waikato Association and the creation of three new Associations, namely Hamilton, Central Waikato and East Waikato. Your Committee did not favour the proposal to divide the area in three Associations and could see no advantage accruing from a national point of view. It was, however, apparent for some time that due to the size of the Waikato Association, the long distances of travel and the parochial attitude of large centres, that the sport was not flourishing as it should have been and development was practically negligible. At a Special General Meeting of the Waikato Association members unanimously decided to wind-up the Association and agreed to the formation of two or more Associations within the same area. As from 6th May, 1963 provisional membership was accorded the Hamilton, Central Waikato and East Waikato Associations.

It is now interested to note that the combined membership of three Associations for the 1963 season shows an increase of 27 clubs, 9 teams and 360 members on the previous figures of the Waikato Association.

**7. Visits to Associations:** The President, Mr. A. B. McCallum again visited practically every South Island Association and was introduced to many clubs in the areas. Mr. McCallum was Tournament Manager to a number of Tournaments in the Canterbury district; assisted with the South Island Catholic Championships; managed Canterbury teams competing in South Island quadrangular tournaments and attended the New Zealand Catholic Championships at Timaru and the New Zealand National Open Championships at Napier.

A dispute between the Taumarunui and District Association and the Ohakune Club led to an endeavour by your Committee to solve the dispute by bringing the parties together under the chairmanship of Mr. W. Mullins a member of the New Zealand Executive Committee. Despite this intervention the question in dispute remained unresolved as neither party was prepared to accept the other's viewpoint.

**8. Films:** Through the courtesy of the Charge d'affaires, Czechoslovakia Consulate, a documentary film of the 27th World Championships held at Prague was obtained. The film of approximately 15 minutes duration was titled "The Last Ball" and showed brief extracts of the finals. Unfortunately the commentating was given in the Czechoslovak language but it was possible to turn the sound down and provide an English translation from written material provided. The film was produced for general interest and illustrates the conditions and magnitude of a world championships. The film, together with the English translations is available to Associations for screening.

**9. Table Tennis Details and Constitution:** Copies of "Table Tennis Details" and "Constitution and other by-laws" were reprinted in booklet form and distributed to all Associations. Additional copies of "Table Tennis Details" are available on request. A reprint of the booklet, "Laws of Table Tennis" is expected to be undertaken during the coming season.

### 3. CHAMPIONSHIPS:

(a) **Inter-Association Teams Championships:** Fortyone teams from 21 Associations entered for the inter-Association teams championships held in the Centennial Hall, McLean Park, Napier on 2nd and 3rd September. Associations not represented were Bush, Central Waikato, Rotorua, Southland, Taumarunui and District, Thames Valley and West Coast.

**Kean Shield Competition:** Twentyone teams entered for the men's teams championships. Teams represented Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Canterbury, East Waikato, Franklin, Hamilton, Hawkes Bay, Hutt Valley, Manawatu, Marlborough, Nelson, Northland, North Shore, North Taranaki, Otago, Poverty Bay, South Canterbury, South Taranaki, Wairarapa, Wanganui and Wellington. There were no surprises in the sectional play and, as expected, the section winners were Wellington, Otago, Northland, Canterbury and Auckland. In the post section play Northland beat Otago by two games in a 6-all contest but were soundly beaten by Wellington in the next contest.

The strong Wellington team continue on their winning way by beating Auckland in the final 10 - 2. The Wellington team thus retained the shield with an impressive overall record of winning 55 matches and losing 5.

(b) New Zealand Championships:

(d) North Island Championships: Playing conditions were first class for the North Island Championships held in the A & P Hall, Whangarei on the 12th and 13th July. The number of entries were disappointing and the absence of leading players from Associations in the Southern half of the North Island reduced the championships to one of competition largely between Auckland and Northland players. Seven tables were kept in constant use under very good control by the Tournament Manager, Mr. V.H. Hurrey. Approximately 400 spectators saw the finals, in which singles attracted most interest. The women's final was a tactical battle which took just over an hour to play and the men's final was a spectacular contest which drew repeated applause from the audience.

The Tournament was a triumph for Norma Attwood who won the women's singles beating the national champion Miss Neti Davis, 21-14, 21-23, 23-13, 20-22, 25-23. Miss Attwood paired with Miss B.C. Packwood (Auckland) to win the women's doubles and also won the three under 18 years titles. Alan Tomlinson adopted the role of aggressor from the outset of the men's singles final. Using his loop drive at every opportunity he completely dominated the games and had the Northlander, Gary Frew, defending desperately for most of the contest.

(e) South Island Championships: Entries for the South Island Championships conducted by the South Canterbury Association at Timaru on 2nd and 3rd August were the highest since 1949. (g) Representative Contests and Team Tournaments:

A full programme of representative contests were played during the season. Many of these contests are annual fixtures and an interesting local record of contests won and lost is being built-up.

The Thames Valley touring team visited Manawatu, North Taranaki, and Wanganui and although they were unsuccessful in winning a contest the experience gained made the venture worthwhile. The Taumarunui and District Association also gave encouragement to their players by inviting five Associations to send teams to play contests in Taumarunui.

The Perry Shield was successfully defended by Nelson from a challenge by Marlborough; North Taranaki after beating Wanganui 15 - 13 in the first challenge for the Sweetman shield and then withstanding challenges from Wairarapa and Manawatu finally lost the shield to Wanganui in a return contest; A full round of contests were played for the Sutton Shield and Bay of Plenty merged winners without loss but only after a count back of games in the contest versus Hamilton.

Team tournaments are becoming more popular. There was a quadrangular tournament held at Greymouth, Dunedin and Rotorua; A round robin teams tournament was held at Auckland and junior teams tournament for the same Associations at Whangarei and there was the annual Calder Cup contest for junior teams at Hawera.

Following the Annual Winter Tournament held at Dunedin a selected New Zealand University team toured the South Island Playing representative contests with South Island Associations. During the Christmas/New Year holidays a Sydney University team toured the country playing a number of representative contests mainly against University teams.

#### 6. PLAYER OF YEAR:

The selection of B.A. Foster (Otago) as the Player of the Year for 1963 gave the South Island its first representative to win this coveted award. Brian Foster had a very successful year, winning the South Island, Canterbury and Otago Open Championships. He was a semi-finalist in the New Zealand Championships where he was beaten by the title-holder, M.L. Dunn in five games. This contest was considered one of the best of the tournament and Foster showed fighting spirit when after being down 1 - 2 he won the fourth game with amazing and accurate defence. He was, however, unable to hold the advantage and lost the final game 10 - 21. With his brother R.L. Foster he later took part in one of the most spectacular men's doubles final ever played at a New Zealand Championship.

The trophy was presented to Mr. Foster by the New Zealand President, Mr. A.B. McCallum at a function held in Dunedin. The presentation was televised and later screened at other centres during the N.Z.B.S. news report.

At a suitable function held in Wanganui the H.N. Ballinger Cup was presented to Stewart by New Zealand Vice-President, R.W. Owen.

## 8. PROVINCIAL UMPIRES SCHEME:

There are now 79 qualified provincial umpires with the successful completion of the practical test by five probationary umpires. Nine candidates failed to pass the theory test paper.

Full use of the scheme is being made to ensure that qualified umpires are called upon to umpire at the Island and National Championships. Your committee is satisfied that the umpires are doing a very good job and being helpful both to the players and spectators with their control of the matches.

The ultimate extension of the scheme is to have a small group of top-class umpires to be known as National Umpires. Such Umpires would qualify only after a searching examination of knowledge and capability. However, it is felt that there should be first at least 100 provincial umpires before consideration be given to the introduction of National umpires.

Both Directors reported that the standard displayed was higher than previously experienced and that the trainees were keen to attack rather than defend.

The coaches, Messrs W.O. Jaime, I.L. Houghton and W.N. Evans at the boy's school and Messrs E.K. Smith, W.O. Jaime and G.R. Shewan at the girls school worked hard with individual coaching and are deserving of highest praise for the encouragement given.

The North Taranaki and Bay of Plenty Associations excelled themselves in the arrangements made, the hospitality and courtesies extended, the billets provided, the catering and interest displayed and again your Committee is grateful for this encouragement.

The coaching schools will be again held during the 1964 May School holidays, the boy's school being held at Wellington and the girl's at Pukekohe. In addition there will be a combined South Island school to be held at Timaru.

# 10. TELEVISION:

A studio presentation of an exhibition match between M.L. Dunn and G.J. Jennings, umpired by Mr. J.E. Stewart was screened on Channel 1, Wellington. Although perhaps the exhibition lacked "atmosphere" it received favourable comments by viewers and served the purpose of publicising the sport.

The Auckland Association reported that a special exhibition match on Channel AKTV 2 between representatives George Wilkinson, Bob Taylor, Ray Newton and Terry Quinn proved very successful and it is expected that similar exhibitions will be arranged in the future.

The screening of the presentation of the Player of the Year award to Brian Foster at Dunedin was viewed in Wellington as part of the N.Z.B.C. News Report. The photography and commentating was interesting and well presented.

A delayed film of the finals of the New Zealand Championships was also seen to advantage in Wellington one Saturday Afternoon. Although the camera could have been closer to provide a better presentation, the commentating, the text of which had been supplied by a member of the New Zealand Executive Committee, was sufficient to permit viewers to understand the trend of the matches.

# 11. WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The 27th World Championships was held at Prague, Czechoslovak, 5th-14th April, 1963 and New Zealand was represented in the Corbillon Cup Teams Championships by an unofficial women's team. This was possible through the availability of Misses J. E. Brown (Hutt Valley) and J.F. Crosby (Hutt Valley) who were in England at the time. Mr. A.R. Tomlinson (Auckland) who was also in England was appointed non-playing captain.

## 12. OVERSEAS TOURNAMENTS:

While temporary residing in England for a period of 12 months or more, Misses J.E. Brown and J.F. Crosby and Mr. A.R. Tomlinson competed in a number of tournaments. A.R. Tomlinson is credited with winning the following open events :-

In winning the Scottish Singles (beating McDonald of Australia) in the final, Tomlinson became the third New Zealander to win this title. Previous winners were J.S. Crossley (1950) and G.A.J. Frew (1954)

An extract from the English magazine "Table Tennis" described the final of the Scottish singles as follows, - quote, "The final of the men's singles can best be described by the fact that the only noise besides clamorous applause to be heard from the vast crowd was an official's hushed remark, "Oh if only we had TV cameras here". Sure enough it was one of the finest displays ever seen or likely to be seen in our lifetime. It was an object lesson in the art of counter-hitting from all parts of the floor. The superb winner was Alan Tomlinson and the magnificent loser was Cliff McDonald", unquote.

Tomlinson also competed in the Irish Open losing in the semi-finals to the ultimate winner Tom Caffrey, 19 - 21, 21 - 19, 15 - 21.

The New Zealanders competed in the English Open. Miss Brown was beaten by I. Kreigelstein (West Germany) in the first round, 6 - 21, 19 - 21, 12 - 21 and Miss Crosby was also beaten in the first round by M. Shannon (Surrey), 9 - 21, 10 - 21, 5 - 21. After beating M. Sugden (Scotland), 21 - 5, 19 - 21, 20 - 22, 21 - 17, 21 - 16 Tomlinson lost to D. Creamer (Middlx), 12 - 21, 11 - 21, 12 - 21. In the women's Doubles, the New Zealanders lost to Hicks and Mortimer in the 2nd round, 15 - 21, 17 - 21, 12 - 21. Tomlinson and C. Warren (Surrey) reached the quarter finals of the men's doubles losing to Piddock and Stanek, 15 - 21, 19 - 21, 18 - 21. In the Mixed Doubles event Miss Crosby and M. Sugden (Scotland) lost to M. Thornhill and Miss A. Taft (Middlx) 11 - 21, 16 - 21 and Miss Brown and Billington (Warw.) lost to B. Wright and Miss M. Shannon, 21 - 18, 16 - 21, 16 - 21, 12 - 21. Tomlinson and Miss P. Mortimer (Warw.) reached the quarter finals losing to Berczik and Hierits (Hungary), 13 - 21, 12 - 21, 17 - 21. In the Women's teams event New Zealand was eliminated in the first round by Belgium.

## 13. AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS:

New Zealand was represented at the 1963 Australian National Open Championships held at Sydney by the following players - Messrs. M.L. Dunn, A.R. Tomlinson, G.A.J. Frew, and K.T. O'Carroll; Misses N. Davis, and N.J. Attwood and Mrs. V.E. Muirhead. Dunn and Tomlinson were invited by the New South Wales Association to compete and accepted a grant towards travelling expenses from the host Association. The Northland players were sponsored by the Northland Association and their expenses were met by a fund-raising scheme throughout the district. The New Zealand Association made a grant of £10 each to Dunn and Tomlinson and Misses N. Davis and N.J. Attwood as further assistance towards travelling expenses.

Although the New Zealanders failed to win a title, their presence added an international flavour to the championships and the matches in which they were eliminated were exciting and amongst the best of the tournament.

Prior to the commencement of the Teams Championships which precedes the individual events, a teams tournament was held at the Burwood Table Tennis Centre for players who were not members of State teams. A Whangarei team, Messrs. G.A.J. Frew and K.T. O'Carroll entered this tournament and after beating N.S.W. Railway 5 - 0, and having a default win over Victoria Insurance beat Public Service No 2 in the semi-finals, 3 - 2. In the final the Whangarei team lost to Public Service No 1, 2 - 3.

Following the Australian Championships a New Zealand team of A.R. Tomlinson, G.A.J. Frew and Miss N.J. Attwood beat a New South Wales team 4 - 2. Tomlinson beat Lindsay and lost to Wilcox, Frew beat Lindsay and lost to Wilcox, Miss Attwood beat Miss Ralph and Tomlinson and Miss Attwood beat Lindsay and Miss Ralph.

At Punchbowl another New Zealand team lost to New South Wales, 1 - 6. Dunn lost to Grierson and McDonald, O'Carroll lost to Grierson and McDonald, Mrs. Muirhead beat Miss Chatterton and O'Carroll and Mrs Muirhead lost to Grierson and Miss Chatterton.

#### 14. INTERNATIONAL CONTEST:

The first international women's contest between Australia and New Zealand was played at the Burwood Table Tennis Centre, Sydney on Monday, 16th September. Playing conditions were not of international standard. The lighting of three fluorescent tubes spaced singly in the roof was not sufficient to alleviate the dim background behind the table. Due to permanent fixtures the playing area was cramped with only seven feet behind the table and not quite four feet at the sides. The table surface was fast in comparison with tables used at the Australian Championships. There was a small attendance of about 55 people to watch the contest.

The teams were:-

AUSTRALIA: Mrs. D. Javor and Mrs. F. Smith with Mr. K. Bowler as non-playing Captain.

NEW ZEALAND: Misses N. Davis and N.J. Attwood with Mrs. M.M. Hurrey as non-playing Captain.

The following account of the contests is taken from the Australian Association's Newsletter. -

In the opening match Mrs Javor and Miss Davis were opposed. After their Australian final clash a tense match was expected but Mrs Javor with the fast conditions to her liking flashed a stream of winners past Miss Davis and although the New Zealand champion fought hard she was beaten by a better Player. The first of the needle matches followed with Mrs Smith who was making her debut for Australia and Miss Attwood. Mrs. Smith proved too strong in defence and won in straight games for Australia to lead 2 - 0. The doubles was most exciting. The Australian pair have never teamed before and found themselves trailing 15 - 20 in the first game. They recovered with some magnificent play to win this game 22 - 20. Miss Davis and Miss Attwood easily evened the score with a most convincing 21 - 12 victory. At 20 - 15 in the third in favour of New Zealand the match appeared over. However as the Australians started to win points, the thought of a repeat of the first game created great tension and with Mrs Javor exerting her authority, playing breathtaking strokes, the score crept to 18 - 20 before the winning point was scored by the visitors. New Zealand had a wonderful opportunity when Miss Davis opposed Mrs. Smith. However the defence and all round ability of the Sydney player shaded the brilliant attack of the Kiwi champion and Mrs. Smith scored an impressive three game win. In the final match Mrs Javor was fully extended by Miss Attwood in a match played at lightning speed. Both players stayed close to the table, hitting and pushing at great speed but the experience of Mrs Javor was the deciding feature in a close tussle.

#### 15. INTERNATIONAL TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION:

New Zealand was represented at the Biennial Congress held at Prague, 9th and 14th April, 1963 by Mrs G.E. Buckler. The following decisions of general interest were confirmed -

1. Laws of Table Tennis - Technical Terms. The meeting adopted the recommendation of the Rules

Committee to substitute the following words wherever they appeared in the Laws of the Game or Regulations of the I.T.T.F. "Rally" for "Rest", "Receiver" for "Striker-out", "Centre Line" for "Service Line". The meeting also accepted the Rules Committee's recommendation that as there was no considerable area of agreement in respect of other suggested changes, they should be left for further study.

## 2. Propaganda Commission:

The idea of holding a film festival during the next World Championships was commended as also was the suggested I.T.T.F. course of instructions for umpires, organisers, etc which might be arranged during future world championship meetings. The Advisory Committee would await proposals from the Propaganda Commission on the machinery for organising these two events.

## 3. Laws of the Game - Amendments:

Law 1 The Table - delete the word "non-reflecting" and substitute "matt"

Law 3 The Ball - delete the words "not brightly reflecting" and substitute the word "matt"

Law 4 The Racket - delete the word "non-reflecting" and substitute the word "matt"

Add an italicised note to these three Laws - "The requirement of a "matt" surface is to prevent a dazzling reflection of light from distracting the eye of the player. As well as discouraging the use of shiny materials in actual play. Associations should take positive steps, by an approach to manufacturers, importers and dealers and by approving the use only of matt materials to ensure that satisfactory equipment is available.

Add to definitions supplementary to Law 4 (italicised) -

NOTE the part of the blade nearest the handle and gripped by the fingers may be covered with cork or other materials for convenience of grip; it is to be regarded as a part of the handle.

Law 14 A Point. sub-clause (a) is amended to read, "If before the ball, in play, in leaving the space above the table, shall have passed over the end lines or side lines, not yet having touched the playing surface on his side since being struck by his opponent it comes in contact with him or anything that he wears or carries.

## 4. Regulations for International Competitions - Clothes:

Delete the present working and substitute - "Players shall not wear white or light coloured clothing which might tend to distract or unsight the opponent. The decision as to the offence under this rule shall be with the referee. As well as discouraging the wearing of light materials or use of light coloured racket surface in actual play, Associations should take positive steps by an approach to manufacturers, importers and dealers and by approving dark materials, to ensure the use of uniform or otherwise suitable types of wear and racket surfaces that comply with this specification.

When rubber is used on both sides of a racket, the colour shall be similar; when wood is used for either side, or for both sides, it should be dark, either naturally or by being stained (not painted) in such a way as not to change the character of its surface.

## Options for future World Championships:

Investigations were made into the proposed change of venue by Australia in 1967 and as a result it was recommended that the option be re-affirmed for that date to the Australian Association and that the Association provide further and more concrete information in 1965.

#### 17. DONATION:

We are grateful for a donation towards the funds of the Association received from the President, Mr. A.B. McCallum.

#### 18. NEW TROPHIES:

Two additional cups donated by the Napier Table Tennis Sub-Association in recognition of its control of the New Zealand Championships were added to the list of permanent trophies. The trophies were allocated to the Veteran Men's Doubles event of the New Zealand Championships.

#### 19. PERMANENT TROPHIES:

The insurance policy to cover loss and damage to permanent trophies was not renewed but in its place an insurance reserve was created with the proviso that the sum of £10 be placed aside each year and that when the reserve reaches the sum of £50 the matter be again reviewed.

The conditions of the previous insurance policy were that the New Zealand Association was responsible for any repairs to the value of £2. Over the years there have been repairs necessary for minor damages such as broken handles, dentations, loss of lids etc. but never to a value of more than £2. In the circumstances there appeared to be little gain in continuing the policy and that it would be a better economic proposition to carry our own insurance.

#### 20. FINANCIAL:

The excess of expenditure over income of £17. 0. 3 is due to the additional honorarium, authorised at the last Annual Meeting in respect of the year ending 31st December, 1962, being charged against this year's revenue.

For the second time the Association has been successful in its application for assistance from the profits of the Golden Kiwi Lottery. The grant of £250 was again made for the purpose of assistance in Junior Development and accordingly the cost of the 1963 Junior Coaching School was paid from the grant. It is proposed to further utilise the grant to finance the additional South Island School this year.

## 21. APPRECIATION:

Our thanks are due to New Zealand Press Association for their co-operation in ensuring that the progress of New Zealand players overseas, in England, at the World Championships and in Australia were circulated to newspapers throughout the country.

To the New Zealand Broadcasting Corporation and in particular to television news reports of table tennis from overseas and within New Zealand we are grateful for the interest and encouragement given by the media.

To local newspapers and monthly magazines that gave generously ample space for the reporting of table tennis, we extend our appreciation.
