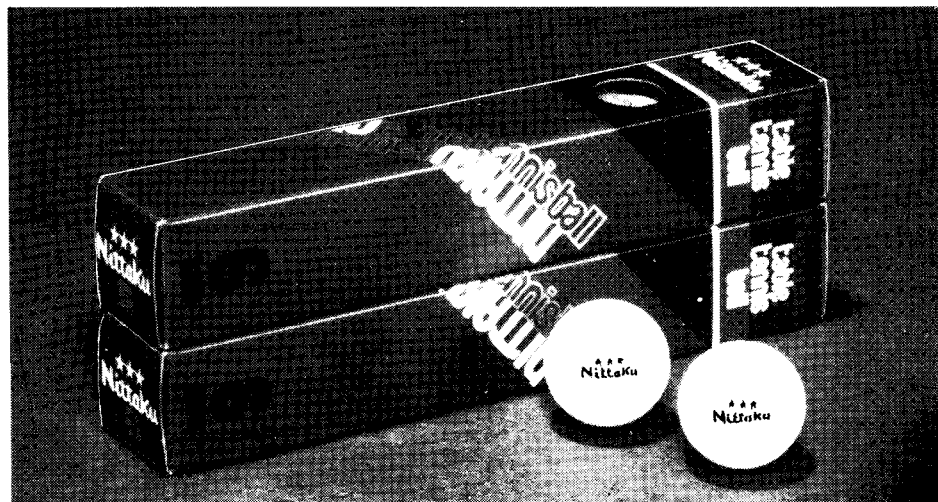

MEMBERSHIP:

As in past years, membership returns were slow to come in and the excuse that the information was not readily forthcoming from clubs and sub-association, is not good enough. There was also a disturbing trend of some Associations paying the current subscriptions dues after the close of the financial years.

A new look has to be taken by all Associations and the N.Z. Association, about the assessment and method of obtaining these figures. It is a N.Z. constitutional requirement that "all subscriptions shall be paid not later than the thirtieth day in June in each year". There is also a deterrent clause in the N.Z. Constitution which says ".....every association whose subscriptions is in arrears on the first day of July in any year shall.....be deemed to be suspended until the subscriptions have been paid."

The payment of subscriptions is based on the previous year's team figures and, therefore, is a known amount for which provision could be made in the annual accounts, for payment in the next year.

In the drive for membership we should be conscious that in 1967 the membership of Taumarunui and District ceased; Thames Valley went into recess in 1969, followed by South Taranaki in 1976 and Rotorua in 1983. Next to nothing has been done to revive these Associations, because the NZTTA does not have a national organiser to travel the country to drum up support to re-establish these areas. This is a pity, for it is certain that there are people in Taumarunui, Thames Valley, South Taranaki and Rotorua who have tables and equipment and who enjoy table tennis as a social amenity. It is simply, lack of leaders, who will come forth to set up an organisation structure to harness these groups into active team competition.

SOUTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The National Mutual Finance South Island championships, conducted by the Marlborough Association at the Centennial Hall, Blenheim on 15/17 June, 1984, brought together some of the best North Island and South Island players, to provide a quality of entries which has been lacking in previous South Island championships. The men's field would have even been stronger, had the NZ champion Barry Griffiths not withdrawn for business reasons.

The junior events included a number of 18-year olds who had represented New Zealand in the Australian junior team and individual championships in recent years.

Auckland/North Shore players dominated the men's singles and doubles events. Players from these North Island associations fought out the semi-finals of the men's singles, for 23-year-old Malcolm Darroch (North Shore) to emerge as the South Island men's singles champion. Darroch beat Kevin Schick (Auckland) in the final 21-17, 21-14, 21-17.

Defending champion, Jan Morris held her title for the third year in succession, beating Ann Gyongyos (Wellington) in the final 21-18, 21-10, 21-16. She has now won the singles title eight times - more than any other player. With her success at Blenheim, Jan commenced a series of title wins which was going to lead her to the grand slam of winning the South Island, North Island and New Zealand titles in the same year.

Winning the boys under 18 singles, Tony Radford (North Shore) also opened up the possibility of achieving the same glory of winning the three major age group titles in the same year. This also applied to Tanya McAvinue (Manawatu) who won both the under 18 and under 16 girls' singles.

In his comment on the conduct of the championships, John Lelliott, the NZ liaison officer commented, "Nigel Perry didn't have a big team of workers, but their dedication is to be commended. The players seemed very happy with the organisation and the standard of behaviour was good, although they weren't all willing to take part in umpiring."

The National President, Mr Dick Rassie was present for most of the championships and spoke briefly at the official opening.

NORTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1984 COUNTRYWIDE N.Z. Golden Jubilee North Island championships was robbed of some interest through the late withdrawal of seeded players.

While the finals of the open events lacked excitement, there were some notable performances. Down two games in the final against team-mate Peter Jackson, Barry Griffiths (Auckland) took the vital third game at 24-22 after a stoppage of play and discussion which took place when Jackson complained about a 'sweaty' ball which caused him to serve into the net when the score was 20-20. Jackson still had match point at 22-21 before Griffiths scraped through to win the game. After that Griffiths, looking more composed and controlled, won the next two games to take the title.

Griffiths had beaten Malcolm Temperley (North Shore) in the semi-finals, while Jackson pushed Raymond Gin (Auckland) aside to win the other semi-final slot in three easy games.

Jan Morris (Canterbury) secured her second leg of the grand slam when she again besetted the dour Wellington defender, Ann Gyongyos, in a long tiring match, 21-14, 21-17, 19-21, 18-21, 21-11. The South Island champion had beaten Shelley Bougher (Auckland) in a tough battle of the semis, 21-15, 30-28, 21-15. In the other semi-final, Chris Lee (Auckland) was not in the mood to chase Ann Gyongyos and in a disappointing match went down 15-21, 21-18, 15-21, 6-21.

Shelley Bougher and Christine Lee, however had a good win in the women's doubles final beating the defending North Island champions and current NZ champions, Ann Gyongyos (Wellington) and Kristen Phillips (Hutt Valley). The scores were 12-21, 21-15, 21-13.

Griffiths and Jackson were too strong in the men's doubles disposing the Auckland pair Graham Lassen and Raymond Gin in quick time, 21-12, 21-15.

In the junior events Tony Radford (North Shore) notched up another one in winning the under 18 boys' singles. With Sean Ryan (North Shore) he added the boys' doubles title to his list, but failed to make it a hat trick when he and his partner lost to David Kilmister and Tanya McAvinue in the final of the mixed doubles.

Not to be outdone by the boys, Tanya McAvinue (Manawatu) quietly added the North Island under 16 girls singles to her South Island success in this age event.

The championships were early disrupted by a lighting problem in the Walter Nash Stadium; there were late arrivals of northern players through car breakdowns on the road, a little over one day, proved insufficient for the programming of a large junior entry.

Despite all these unexpected difficulties, Ron Menchi, the NZ Liaison Officer, in his report on the conduct of the championships, wrote, "The tournament provided consistent match conditions for all participants and the Hutt Valley Association and, in particular tournament officials, can be congratulated on running this fixture so well."

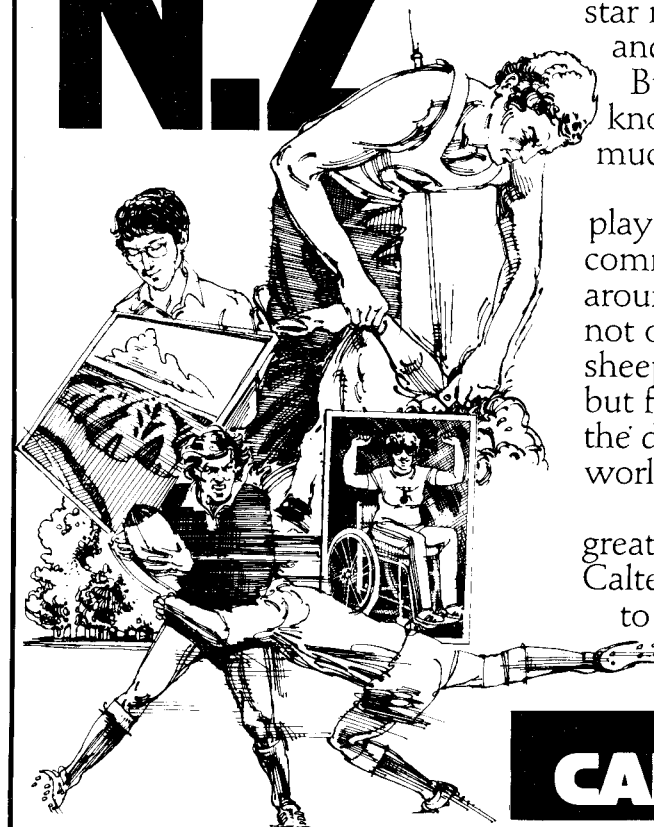

(b) NZ Junior Individual Championships

When the 'grand slam' is mentioned, one thinks of senior players scoring this unique record of winning the open singles events at the South Island, North Island and NZ championships in the same year, e.g. 1984 saw Jan Morris (Canterbury) become the first woman to achieve the 'grand slam'.

This year two juniors etched their names in the record books for a similar performance. Tony Radford (North Shore) won the three titles in the boys singles, under 18 years, and, not to be outdone, Tanya McAvinue made it a triple effort for 1984, when she took the three titles in the under 16 years events.

We were delighted to have a large contingent of junior players from New Caledonia competing at the championships. They were a popular group looked after by James Morris who knew them well through coaching engagements in Noumea at the invitation of the Ligue Caledonienne de Tennis de Table. Following the conclusion of the championships, the party visited Northland as guests of the Northland Association.

It was interesting to note that, while entries for the open and senior age group events showed a decrease on the numbers who entered the same events last year, the entries for junior events showed a markedly increase and we find this latter trend most encouraging.

From the report of John Lelliott, the N.Z. Liaison Officer for the junior section of the championships, two quotes sum up the conduct of the tournament:

- "The players standard of play, dress and behaviour were good, but team management in a number of areas was below standard".
- "There were a large number of high quality games with perhaps the most outstanding achievement being the performance of Karl Entwistle in winning the under 16 boys' singles".

(c) Association Award - Bill Hurrey Cup

In the assessment of the Association whose players achieved the most successes in the finals of the junior individual events, key players who win more than one event, score heavily for their Association.

This is what happened for the Northland Association who, through their players, took the Bill Hurrey Cup with a clear margin of six points ahead of the next Association. The Traill brothers won the under 18 and under 16 boys doubles: Gary Traill and Delwyn Houlihan scored maximum points winning the mixed doubles under 16, and Lance McKegg and Vickie Woodman all but swept the under 14 years events.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the junior events with double pairs sharing the points and 2 points for the cadet events, with the double pairs sharing the points.

(a) Senior Inter-Association Teams Championships

24 men's teams (23 last year) and 21 (19) women's teams competed for the various team honours at the Manawatu Sports Stadium, Palmerston North 26/27 August, 1984.

A determine bid by the North Shore men's team gave the Auckland champions the biggest fright in years. Auckland sneaked home 6-5 in a dramatic five-hour contest. It was Malcolm Temperley and Malcolm Darroch who spearheaded the North Shore attack and the pressure was really put on Auckland when Darroch beat Griffiths - 14, 19, 19 to level the match score at 5 - all. In the last match, Jackson won the first game against Temperley after holding a lead throughout. Temperley came from behind to win the second 23-21, but could not last the distance and Jackson ran away with a 21-12 score to take the match and the contest for Auckland. It was Auckland's ninth defence of the Kean Shield.

With a consistent and winning performance in the 'B' grade, the Canterbury men's team will return to the 'A' grade next year as the sole representative of South Island Associations in the top grade.

Southland and Kapiti are having the ups and downs. Southland winning the 'C' grade last year went up to 'B' grade and Kapiti came down, but next year Southland come down to 'C' grade and Kapiti go up to 'B' grade.

Marlborough a clear winner of the 'D' grade also earned promotion for next year's competition displacing East Waikato in the 'C' grade.

In the women's section, Auckland made it a double when their women's team came through undefeated to retain the Teagel Shield for the tenth time in succession.

Otago as winners of the 'B' Grade will join Canterbury as the two South Island Associations in the 'A' grade next year,

(b) Victor Barna Dunlop Cups Awards

HISTORY OF THE COMPETITION

During his tour of New Zealand in 1949, accompanied by Richard Bergmann, Victor Barna offered a trophy for the promotion of "inter-town competition" on a knock-out basis, or such other promotion of the sport as the New Zealand Executive Committee thought fit.

The trophy was received in 1950 through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, who requested that the trophy be known as the "Victor Barna Dunlop Cup".

The New Zealand Executive Committee decided that the cup shall be awarded annually to the Association whose team or teams, competing in the Inter-Association Teams Championships, excel in play, in sportsmanship, appearance, team spirit and punctuality. At first it was decided that the award shall be won by an Association and not by any one team of that Association, in the belief that the award would be an incentive to all Associations to maintain better discipline and foster stronger team spirit among all its players. However, difficulty arose when some Associations had only one team competing, while others had two, and after the first two years of competition, the rules were amended so that each team could be considered on its own merits. In 1965, the rules were further amended to provide for two separate competitions, one for men's teams and one for women's teams and again through the courtesy of Dunlop Sports (N.Z.) Ltd, a second identical cup was presented.

(c) Inter-Island Contests

With no South Island player ranked in the first 10 of the NZ senior list or the first 10 of the boys under 18 years list, it is not difficult to see why the South Island men have no chance against the North Island and this was again borne out, with the 12-0 win to the North Island in the annual inter-island contest played at Palmerston North on Tuesday 28 August, 1984.

Even without Barry Griffiths and Malcolm Temperley, who were not available, the North Island selector's choice of James Morris, Peter Jackson, Graham Lassen and Alan Pedley, with the newly capped NZ representative, Malcolm Darroch as reserve, overwhelmed the South Island making it three years in succession for the North Island to beat the South Island without losing a match.

Ron Foster (Otago) was an interesting selection for the South Island men's team because of the time span between selections. He last represented the South Island in 1961 as a Southland player and had previously played for the South Island in 1957/58/59.

Over the years, the women have been much more evenly matched and, with Christine Lee and Shelley Bougher making themselves unavailable, the South Island chalked up their 5th win in 30 contests. It was also the first time that the South Island had won in successive years.

The South Island women, led by the NZ representatives Jan Morris and Kadia Rice, who has accepted South Island status while she is studying at the University of Otago, were unbeaten in the top bracket of the contest.

In the lower-half, it was a battle of the juniors, with the North Island pair, 15-year-old Tanya McAvinue and 18-year-old Jane Bevan getting the better of the South Island teenagers, Jennifer Lawn and Sandra Mayes, to even the match score. The doubles were halved and on a count back, South Island was declared winner by 15 games to 12.

(d) NZ 50th Golden Jubilee Open Championships

With good preparation, through consultation and acceptance of advice, the Manawatu Association scored a great success in hosting the NZ 50th Golden Jubilee open international championships at the Manawatu Sports Stadium, 28 - 30 August, 1984.

The presence of players from Japan, Australia and New Caledonia gave the championships more than usual interest and the NZ players revelled in the strong competition which resulted.

The championships had as its main sponsor, the Manawatu 'Evening Standard' newspaper which, in addition to supplying printing and other stationery requistes, gave a tremendous coverage of the table tennis activities through daily full-page articles, results and photographs. At the conclusion of the championships, the 'Evening Standard' published a sports supplement which included a full summary of the

results and highlights. Here is a quote which speaks for itself, "David Ogilvie, Sport Editor, who, along with colleague Lorraine Vincent, performed nearly as hard as the players to give excellent coverage that kept locals and visitors alike on their toes waiting for each night's edition".

There were other sponsors who contributed to the success of the Jubilee championships and these have been acknowledged in the splendid championship programme booklet.

In the addition to the overseas players, we were very pleased to welcome two distinguished guests, Mr Hirosuke Tamasu, President of the world famous BUTTERFLY Company, who was accompanied by his Assistant Export Manager, Mr Hiroyuke Kamizuru, and Keith Bowler, from Sydney, Executive Director, Oceania Table Tennis Federation.

At a grand Maori concert, Mr Tamasu displayed his versatility as a linguist when he sang in Maori the words of the song 'Pokarekare Ana'. The willingness of the leader of the Japan team, Mr Hiroshi Yaiota and his players to join in spontaneously in a singalong with the Maori entertainers on the stage, also added to the enjoyment of a festive evening to be remembered.

The best entertainment in the men's singles came from the matches in the quarter finals, with the Japanese Ace, Hiroyuki Abe, confirming, with his amazing repertoire of shots and control, that he was odds on favourite to win the NZ title. Abe beat Lassen 13, 11, 12. Temperley could not reproduce the atmosphere or strokes which caused the elimination of the top Australian Bob Tuckett in the previous round and Jackson won easily 14, 14, 15. Griffiths looked his best against the heavy chop of Hoshino, but it took three tiring games before he emerged the winner 14, 15, 19. Against the volatile Australian Javor, Maehara (Japan) lost the first game and almost the second. He was behind in the last two games but came through to win a tough 4 - game battle, -11, 21, 18, 19.

The New Zealander's could not match the experience of the Japanese in the semi-finals. Jackson could not control Abe's courtcraft, his speed and attack and went down -11, -7, -16. Maehara was too old in the head for Griffiths and the final result was inevitable. Maehara beat Griffiths, 12, 19, 17.

A classy exhibition was given in the all-Japan final. The players traded long drives and high tossed returns to produce exciting rallies which were reminiscences of bygone years when the Japanese attackers dominated the world scene. Maehara tried to mix it but could not stem the onslaught and conceded the NZ title to Abe 11, 11, 14.

The women's singles was notable for the win by Jan Morris (Canterbury) who notched up her fifth NZ title. Her win over Shelley Bougher (Auckland) 16, 18, 17 when added to her South Island and North Island titles made her the top NZ woman player.

Shelley Bougher, the defending titleholder eliminated the Oceania champion, Christine Lee (Auckland) in the semi-finals, -15, 16, 18, 18.

Ron Menchi, the NZ Liaison Officer summed it up nicely when he wrote in his report, ".....I am sure that all will look back on these

championships with pleasure. It was well run with a friendly atmosphere. The presence of such high qualified overseas players with top administrators, brought to the tournament a true international ingredient. A well prepared programme of social events complemented the competitive aspect. It was a fitting end to the Golden Jubilee season of the NZ Table Tennis Association. Well done, Terry Davison, Mike McAvinue, Margaret Kilmister and all the many hard workers from the Manawatu Association."

(e) Association Award - Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup

Kadia Rice and Ron Foster steered Otago to a surprise points lead to take the Arthur Meachen Memorial Cup award. The award is to the Association, who players achieve the most successes in the finals of the open and age group events at the N.Z. championships. It was 1967, 17 years ago, that Otago players last featured in sufficient finals to give their Association the award.

With the Japanese players winning the open events and thus eliminating Aucklanders who have, in the past, scored heavily in these events, more emphasis was given to the age group events to decide the winning Association. Kadia share the mixed doubles with Abe of Japan and added two valuable points with her under 21 women's singles title. Ron Foster won the men's singles over 45 years and shared the men's doubles to give Otago a total of 7 points, one ahead of Auckland and Canterbury. Japan players scored the most points, but were not eligible for the Association Award.

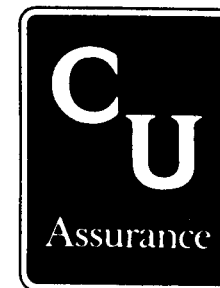
Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points and 2 points for the open and age group singles events respectively with doubles partners sharing the points.

REPRESENTATIVE CONTESTS AND TEAM TOURNAMENTS

Nelson continues on its winning way, outclassing Marlborough to retain the Perry Shield: Hamilton and Franklin are the two strong adversaries for the Sutton Shield and this year it was Hamilton's turn, but Franklin dominates the junior equivalent of the competition with their sixth consecutive victory; the Sweetman Shield round robin tournament lapsed for want of organisation and similarly no round robin tournament was held for Central North Island Associations. The Associations concerned must take stock of the position and do something positive for they cannot afford to let the opportunity of competition for their players slip away.

The northern districts senior and junior round robin, caters handsomely for the players from Hamilton to Northland and it is because of this good regular competition that the northern players are so strong. The South Island also have a regular annual teams competition and again the meeting of South Island players is good for the encouragement given for players to represent their Association.

The Hutt Valley Association was given permission to undertake an internal tour of North Island areas, 17-21 May. The party consisted of 12 junior and 2 seniors.

Permission was also granted the Northland Association for a bus tour of New Zealand 4-13 May. A party of 22-24 players, plus parents toured the North and South Islands playing matches against the various provincial Associations.

The Hutt Valley and Northland Associations are to be commended for the initiative displayed and the encouragement given to their players to visit other Associations to gain experience.

While it is known that practically all Associations have a schedule of representative contests, it is obviously from the few submitted that a full coverage is not available for this Report.

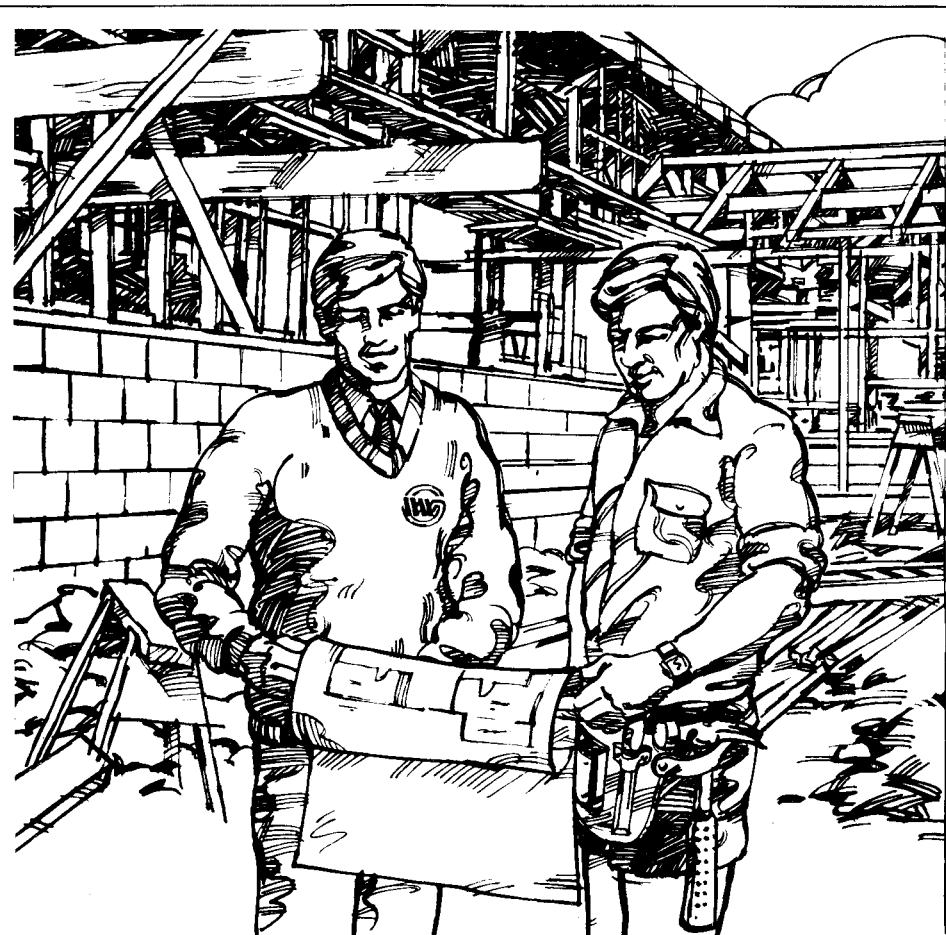

INTERMEDIATE/PRIMARY SCHOOLS TEAMS TOURNAMENTS

North Island Tournament: Hutt Intermediate won the Peter Ansdell Shield as winners of the North Island intermediate/primary schools tournament which was held at Whangarei on 15 September, 1984. After beating Raumanga (Northland) 7-2, Green Meadows (Napier) 6-0, Whangarei 6-1, Hutt Intermediate found Wairau (North Shore) a harder nut to crack. At the end of the first three singles and one double, the match score was 2-all; it was still even at 4-all at the end of the second series of singles and doubles; Hutt then won the next two of three singles to record a narrow victory 6-5.

The Hutt Intermediate team was Darren Sears, Bradley Roberts, Kevin Mahuru.

South Island Tournament: In a repeat of the results of the North Island Tournament, Westport South Primary beat Menzies College (Southland) 10-1 and the Cathedral Grammar (Christchurch) 9-2. The final against Kenmore Intermediate (Otago) saw another 6-5 score when Westport South Primary won two of the last three singles to win the PDL cup and the honour to represent the South Island in a New Zealand final.

The Westport South Primary team was Shaun Duncan, James Fairbrass, Rhys James.

New Zealand Final: Through the financial assistance given by the schools, parents, NZ Table Tennis Association and the Westland Savings Bank and with the interest shown by the Mayor, Town Clerk and Westport Borough Council, a NZ final for the intermediate/primary schools teams tournament was held. This was the first time since 1977 that the winners of the North Island and South Island competition met in a NZ final. In an excellent atmosphere and in the presence of the Mayor of Westport, the North Island Hutt Intermediate team beat Westport South Primary team 8-3. The fixture was held at Westport on Sunday 4 November, 1984 and attracted an attendance of 50 people. At the conclusion of the final, an entertaining exhibition match between Maxine Goldie (Buller Sub-Association) and Darren Sears (Hutt Valley) was played. The Westland Savings Bank presented a figurine trophy as a permanent record for future NZ finals. Further discussions are taking place with the Westland Savings Bank, to have the figurine mounted on a suitable base to make the trophy more attractive and to provide space for engraving of the names of the winning schools.

COACHING

Good Advice: The following extract is taken from an article by Goroh Shibutani, 1956 All Japan Champion, in "The Table Tennis Report", August 1984, published by TAMASU COMPANY LIMITED:-

"Only practice makes perfect. There is no royal road to victory. Good players, every one of them, have won their excellence through hard, steady practice of basics. What is important is to know always what you are practicing at. You must have a definite objective of each practice item. Otherwise, your practice is pointless and you only waste time and energy. There is no way to become a strong player other than by working constantly and patiently. Work hard every day, and you will make it. There is no other way."

The Nittaku National Junior Coaching Schools Sponsored by the manufacturers of 'NITTAKU' table tennis equipment, the twenty-sixth national junior coaching school for boys was held at the Wellington Stadium and for girls at the Empire Club rooms on Friday/Saturday, 27-29 January, 1984. The boys' school was conducted by David Cook and the girls by Bruce Shewan.

The North Shore Association expressed disappointment in the selection of the coach for the boys' school and this led to a number of trainees withdrawing after selection; two players failed to see the course through and effectively suspended themselves and Ron Menchi stood in for the coach for one session while he was attending his father's funeral.

In his report, David Cook commented, "A number of late defections meant that the overall standard of the trainees was lower than in recent years, but with nine Association represented, perhaps the overall strength of table tennis around the country is becoming rather more even." David Cook went on to say "The mood and attitude of the trainees was very good, far more positive than in 1983. All the trainees realised that they had much to learn and took their opportunity well."

At the girls' school, Susan Cuthbert, replaced Helen Beumelberg (Canterbury), who was unable to attend because of financial reasons. Bruce Shewan, the Hamilton Coach, who directed the school reported, "The spirit of the school was excellent throughout. All trainees were punctual at all sessions and their attitude and effort could hardly be faulted."

At the suggestion of David Cook, and with the co-operation of the Wellington Association, a joint social function in the form of a barbeque was held on the Saturday evening. The successful and pleasant get-together provided a social contact away from the table.

Kevin Schick, Raymond Gin, Malcolm Temperley, Shelley Bougher were not available and Malcolm Darroch replaced Maurice Burrowes (Canterbury) who withdrew.

Regional Junior Coaching Schools: To ensure that a wide sweep of players are included in the national coaching scheme, three regional junior coaching schools are held, for boys and girls who are not quite up to the standard expected for nomination for the national junior coaching schools.

The Northern Regional school held at the Air N.Z. Stadium, Auckland 11-13 May, 1984 was conducted by the Auckland Coach, Richard Lee; the Central school at the Clarendon Complex, Carterton by the Wellington Coach, Paul Escott and the Southern school at the Timaru Town and Country Club's Sports Pavilion by the Otago coach, Martin Duffy.

Nineteen attended the Northern school, 20 at the Central school and 14 at the Southern school. No nominations were received from the Bush, Manawatu, Northland, North Taranaki, and Waitemata Associations. The Wanganui sole nominee later withdrew.

The following extract from the report of Paul Escott summed up the conduct of the schools, "A total of 30 different table routines were covered over the three days. The standard of behaviour of the trainees was outstanding and on no occasion was it necessary to reprimand anyone. All participants, without exception, were a credit to their Association". This comment was endorsed by the Wairarapa Association who added, "also Mr Escott had the attention of the children at all times and seemed to be very competent at getting his message across to everyone".

At the Northern school, a video camera, loaned by Jack Borough, was used as a visual instruction.

Martin Duffy expressed disappointment at the general standard of players invited to the Southern Regional school. He claimed that, if South Island table tennis was to progress in a satisfactory manner, the Southern Regional school must be attended by the leading South Island juniors. Associations should not nominate sub-standard players, keen as though they may be. Basic coaching must be done within Associations.

It is agreed that regional junior coaching schools are not for beginners, and better selection is required from Associations, to ensure that nominees are of the standard which would lead them to be considered as future nominees for national junior coaching schools.

National Director of Coaching: With the approval reached at the 1984 Annual General Meeting, that finance would be available through a levy on all inter-club teams to cover the costs of a full time professional Director of Coaching, negotiations were commenced, and are continuing, with an overseas coach of our choice. While agreement has been reached on practically every item in the Condition of Employment, the remuneration clause is not yet settled. However we are satisfied that a conclusion will be reached on this clause and that a firm contract will be signed.

We are seeking an international coach, who could become the National Director of Coaching, to be responsible for all aspects of coaching in New Zealand, including visits to provincial associations. Subject to immigration policy, the term of employment is for an initial period of five years. The coach is expected to take up his duties early in 1985.

Coaching Manual: The revised NZTTA coaching manual, which was completed by David Cook and vetted by regional coaches, is available from the Executive Officer at a cost of \$4.00. The manual is a useful tool for coaching. All coaches and Associations should have a copy.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR:

Jan Morris (Canterbury) completed an unbeaten singles record during the 1984 season, which culminated in her winning a unique grade-slam, the women's singles title at the South Island, North Island and N.Z. Championships in the same year, the first time achieved by a woman.

Jan also had success as the women's champion at the Auckland 60th Jubilee championships with a tactical four-game victory over the current Australian open champion, Shelley Munday (Victoria).

With her continuing reign as the Canterbury women's champion, Jan was again chosen as the Canterbury Player of the Year.

For the consistency of performances, JAN MORRIS was named as the 1984 Player of the Year.

HISTORY OF THE AWARD

Through the generosity of the English Table Tennis Association, the net proceeds of the international contest England V New Zealand at Winchester, England in 1954, amounting to approximately 50 sterling pounds, was donated to the New Zealand Association. Using part of these funds, it was decided to introduce a player of the Year Award based on a similar presentation conducted by the English Association. A handsome trophy was purchased and the first award was made to R.V. Jackson of Auckland in 1955.

UMPIRING

International Umpires: Fresh from attending an international umpire training course held in Hong Kong 23-31 December, 1983, Gary Farquhar and Tony Darroch were successful in passing the test papers set for the 9th International Umpires Examination conducted by the International Table Tennis Federation in March on this year.

As qualified international umpires, they join Keith Fraser, Ivan Houghton and George Wilkinson as the other members of the select bank of N.Z. International umpires.

Tony Darroch has accepted the invitation to umpire at the 38th World Championships to be held in Gothenburg, Sweden, 28 March to 7 April, 1985 and with Stuart Scott and Miss Ruth Singer from Australia will form an umpire's squad from Oceania. The trio will wear matching blue reefer jackets with a distinctive Oceania International Umpire pocket monogram.

Provincial Umpires: Bill Burns (Auckland), Denis Duffy (Hawkes Bay), Sandy McIntosh (Auckland), Graham Simpson (Auckland) and Arnold Voice (Wairarapa) qualified as provincial umpires and the award of an umpire badge. P.J. Fergusson (Auckland), Max Pascoe (Auckland) and Boyce Wong (Wellington) passed the theory paper but have still to take the practical examination to qualify.

'Tabletalk': The 4th issue of 'Tabletalk' a newsletter for umpires, was published in August. 500 copies were printed through sponsorship by the Manawatu 'Evening Standard' newspaper. The newsletter contained information about the recent changes to the Laws of table tennis and republished notes prepared by the English Table Tennis Association about foot stamping during play, the service law and racket colours. There were also extracts from an interview with the World President, Mr H. Roy Evans, OBE originally published in the 'Tees Sporter' magazine.

The Alan and Edna McCallum Umpiring Trophies:

Eight girls and 12 boys made up the 20 nominations from five Associations which were received for assessment of umpiring skills. John Lelliott commented on the lack of interest being shown by Associations when he wrote in his report, "The number of nominations was low and it was quite clear that many Associations had omitted to nominate some very good junior umpires. It is hoped that Associations will think about this early next season as umpiring standards are not high and our junior players need motivating".

The judges for the 1984 awards, Frank O'Gorman and Ivan Moffat, selected Kielly Hamilton-Ralph of Franklin and Andrew Marr of Otago as the winners of The Alan and Edna McCallum trophies.

History

At the instigation of Frank O'Gorman, two trophies were presented to commemorate the outstanding contribution made to table tennis by the late Alan Bruce McCallum and his wife Edna McCallum. The trophies are awarded to a boy and a girl under 18 years of age who excel in the performance of umpiring matches.

(a) World Cup, Oceania Qualifying Tournament

The World Cup is one of the top class international table tennis tournaments, conducted under the auspices of the International Table Tennis Federation, in which sixteen of the top men players in the world compete for the Roy Evans Cup. Included in the sixteen are the champions of the six continents of Africa, Asia, Europa, Latin America, North America and Oceania.

The qualifying tournament conducted by the N.Z. Association at the Upper Hutt Town Hall on Saturday 17 March 1984, decided the Oceania representative at the 5th World Cup Tournament held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in August 1984.

Unable to obtain a sponsor for the fixture, or television coverage, the full costs for staging the tournament was borne by the NZ Association.

NORWICH UNION LIFE INSURANCE SOCIETY were associated with the printing of the programme which provided useful biographical details of the players for the spectators and news media.

Keith Fraser, Cary Farquhar and Mike McShane, formed a good team of umpires and the scorers were Mike McAvinue and Tony Darroch.

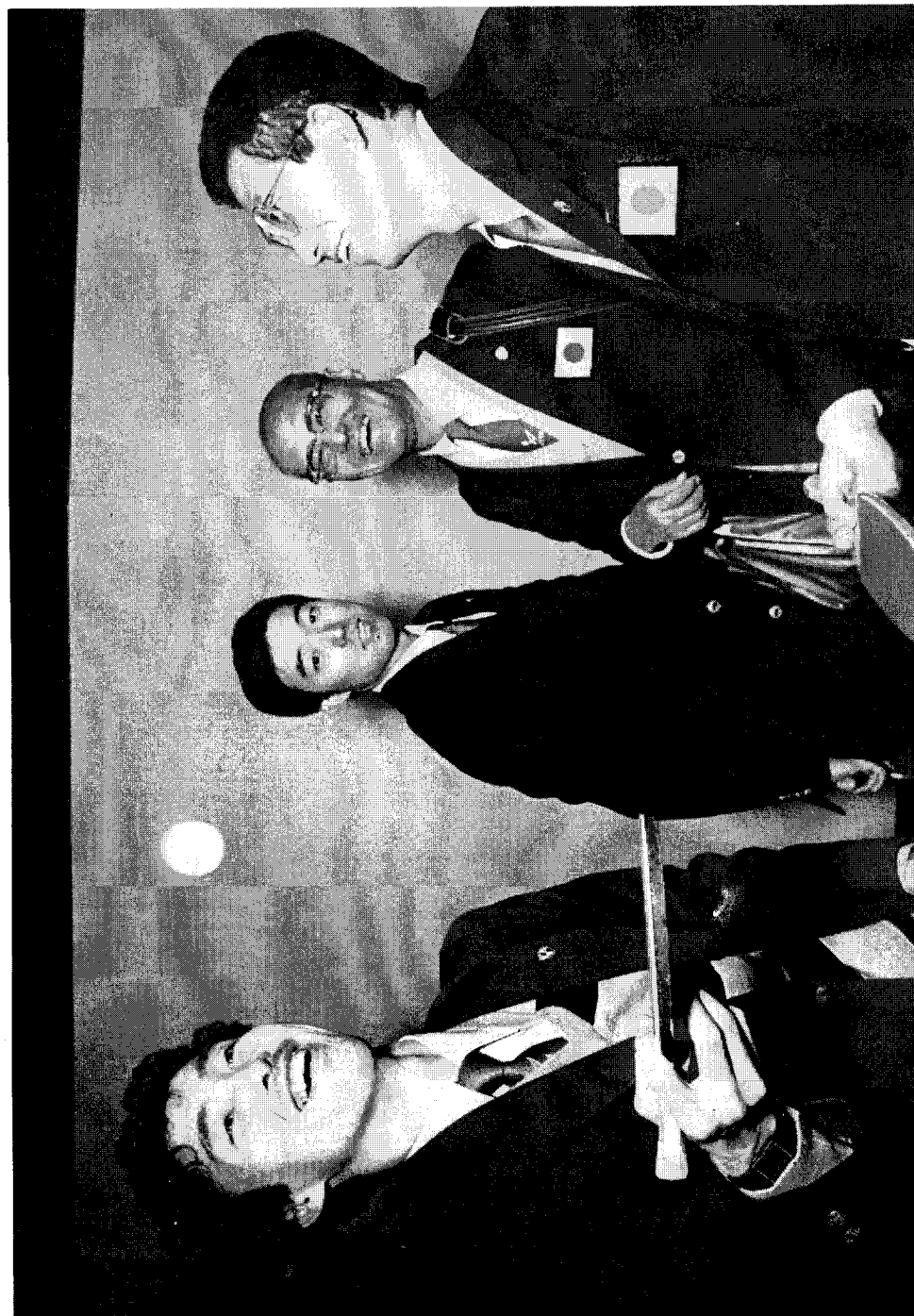
Mike McShane, who was a qualified Australian umpire, was visiting New Zealand with his children, as winner of a local competition which offered travel to New Zealand. We were pleased to use his experience and knowledge as an umpire.

Australia was represented by its two top players, Gary Haberl, who, at the time was the current Australian and NZ champion and Tommy Danielsson, ranked No. 2. Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson were the NZ selection.

The tournament was won by Danielsson who was undefeated in the round robin played. In the final against Habert, 25-year-old Danielsson, a former member of the Swedish national team, lost the first game 15-21, but then demoralised his younger team member to win the next two games with ridiculously low scores of 6 and 9. The result was a reversal of the final of the 1983 Australian championships when Haberl beat Danielsson in a see-sawing five game-match.

Danielsson impressed with his controlled table tennis play and the long range hitting which he successfully used when it looked as if he was beaten by his opponent, but above all, Danielsson impressed with his quiet but determined table demeanour. It was a delightful change from the mannerisms of some players with their pained expressions, blaming everything but themselves for a missed shot.

Barry Griffiths, just back from a five months training programme in Japan where he had beaten Haberl consistently, was disappointing and in the match which counted, he lost to Haberl 18, 13. Griffith's only win was against fellow representative, Peter Jackson whom he beat -16, 20, 17.

(b) World Cup 5

The Malaysian Table Tennis Association again hosted the World Cup tournament at Kuala Lumpur, 29 August/2 September 1984. The promoters of this prestigious tournament, which brought together, in a field of 16, the top world ranked men players and the champions of the various continents, was the International Management Group and the sponsors were British American Tobacco Company -555.

Two of China's world top three were beaten in the quarter finals, but it was still a Chinese player, Jiang Jialiang who won the President's cup when he beat Kim Wan of South Korea, 21-14, 16-21, 21-4, 21-11 in the final.

In the group play, Tommy Danielsson, the Oceania representative had a good opening win against the ex-world champion, Jonyer, but lost to Cai Zhenhua (China) and Ulf Bengtsson (Sweden).

In the play-off for positions 13 to 16, the American Danny Seemiller edged out Danielsson for 14th place with a 21-18, 15-21, 22-20 win leaving Danielsson to beat the Malaysian entry, Lim Chin Leong for the 15th place.

VISIT OF JAPAN TEAM

While in Tokyo, attending the 37th World Table Tennis Championships, Ron Menchi and Ken Wilkinson talked to Mr Hiroshi Yaoita, vice-president of the Japan Table Tennis Association about the possibility of having two top Japan men players compete at the 1984 NZ Golden Jubilee International open championships.

This was the opening gambit which led to the involvement of The Japan Foundation and agreement by the Japan Association for the selection of a three-man team for a short tour of Australia, New Zealand and Indonesia.

Led by Mr Yaoita, the Japan team delegation arrived at Wellington on Saturday 24 August, travelling from Melbourne via Christchurch.

We were delighted with the selected of Mr Yaoita as Leader. He could have had the more important role as Leader of the Japan delegation to the Asian Union championships in Pakistan in October, but chose to come to New Zealand. He was an important table tennis identity, through his international work, but in particular with his coaching and management of leading players in Japan. Mr Yaoita has held the position of general Secretary of the Japan Association, he has been a Council Member of the ITTF and is currently vice-chairman of the Japan Association.

The three players were Hiroyuki Abe, who is ranked 44 in the current world classification list and 9th in Japan. Abe had been to New Zealand before, with the Japan team that competed at the 1981 NZ Summer Games in Auckland. Masahiro Maehara, ranked No. 4 in Japan, had been a member of the Japan national team at four world championships and the third player, Ichiro Hoshino, while not so well known, was specially selected as a defensive player who would be attractive to watch.

The visit to New Zealand was made possible by The Japan Foundation who paid the overseas and domestic travel costs, but there were also other sponsors who assisted in no small way. Simon Barnett of Barnett Sports, the Palmerston North entrepreneur, paid the domestic accommodation costs and hosted a dinner evening in Wellington for the Japan party and also the NZ team and administrators. Toyota New Zealand sponsored the international contest at Taita and Television NZ provided TV coverage of the Taita international. In addition to this support, Mike McAvinue and the Manawatu Association provided warm and generous hospitality during the time the Japan party and other overseas dignitaries were in Palmerston North.

The NZ players played extremely well in the international contests. Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson had wins over Hoshino and Maehara and although they could not match, Abe, showed the benefit of their training in Japan. It was also clear that their technical skills are highlighted when they have opportunity of meeting top class players.

QUEENSLAND OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

NZ players excelled in the conditions at the Queensland open championships and the results were one of the best overall performances by NZ players overseas. Every title they competed for was won, men's singles, women's singles, men's doubles, women's doubles, mixed doubles and under 21 men's singles (N.Z. also provided the runner-up in two of these events).

In the words of the team manager, "This was a magnificent achievement and a proud day for N.Z. Table Tennis."

The Qantas Queensland open was held at the Brisbane Table Tennis Centre, Windsor, 26-27 May, 1984. The Queensland Association extended an invitation for NZ to send a team of international players to play in the championships and to tour Queensland.

The tour became very attractive after personal discussions with Jim Bond, the Queensland delegate who was holidaying in N.Z, with the offer that transman air fares, together with internal travel and hospitality to compete in two weekend tournaments as well as the Queensland Open would be provided for the team members. After anxious moments waiting for the details to be confirmed, part of the tour fell away through problems with internal sponsorship and in the end the New Zealanders competed only in the Queensland championships.

The following players accepted the invitation to compete at the championships: Richard Lee (Auckland) who was appointed Player-Manager, Peter Jackson (Auckland), Christine Lee (Auckland) and Jan Morris (Canterbury), Barry Griffiths (Auckland), who was at the time temporarily residing in Melbourne, later joined the N.Z. team party.

Although the NZ players, as guests of the Queensland Association, were prepared to do promotion work for the Association and Richard Lee made it known that he would like to meet with coaches for interchange of ideas and to have some clinics or seminars with Queensland players, the offer was not taken up by the Queensland Association.

Barry Griffiths played superbly to win the men's singles title defeating Australian ranked players, John Cooney, Gary Haberl and Robbie Javor. In the matches against Conney and Haberl, Griffiths lost the first two games but came back with decisive wins in the next three games to emerge as winner. The win against Robbie Javor in the final was particularly good.

It was also a top class tournament for Peter Jackson who won three titles, under 21 men's singles, men's doubles and mixed doubles. In the men's singles Jackson eliminated the South Australian Neil Ward in the quarter finals 21-12, 21-17, 21-15 but lost to Javor in the semi-final 0-3 in a match much more even than the scores indicate.

The Griffiths-Jackson combination were in a class above the field in the men's doubles and won easily.

Christine Lee dominated the women's events and was a big winner, taking the three open events, singles, doubles and mixed. The pairing of Christine Lee and Jan Morris formed a very strong combination and they were far too good for other pairs in the women's doubles.

Richard Lee, had the last say when he wrote in his report, "to sum up, a kind invitation, a well run tournament and total success for the N.Z. team. What more could we want?"

As a reciprocal gesture for the hospitality given to NSW junior players when visiting New Zealand on a number of occasions, an invitation was received from the NSW Country League for a NZ junior team to tour the country areas.

Over the years NZ has been favoured with entries from NSW players. We have enjoyed their company and are flattered that the same players keep coming back year after year to our national championships. In return NZ provincial teams have found a tour of NSW interesting and exciting. The exchange which is going on between NSW and NZ is good for the development of the sport.

It was agreed to send a NZ team of three boys under 15 years and a Manager, to visit Canberra, Wagga, Couburn, Parkes, Lithgow and with the last two days in Sydney for sightseeing. The national selectors named Colin Gin (Auckland), Murray Traill (Northland) and Karl Entwistle (Canterbury) and Mrs Christine Lee accepted the invitation to manage the team. The team members were responsible for the payment of air travel and incidental meals when travelling between centres. Free hospitality, billets and meals were provided by the NSW Country League affiliates. Most of the travel was done by rental car with Christine Lee, who was familiar with the country, as driver.

It was a domestic tour where the results were not important. The N.Z. team played mixed teams of different age groups and for the record the results were:

The boys also competed in the Illawarra open and age group events without success, but the men's singles final gave them an opportunity to see a thrilling match between Haberl and Pinkewich, with Haberl winning 23-21 in the 3rd game. Christine Lee won the women's singles beating Andrea Campbell in the final and with Campbell the women's doubles title.

'On reflection', Christine wrote in her report, "I would not advise future managers to attempt the manager-player combination."

Christine Lee proved an excellent choice as Manageress. She did not overlook the publicity aspect and through press releases by the NZPA in Australia, NZ newspapers published a number of reports about the progress of the team through NSW.

The Manageress summed up the tour in the final paragraph of her report when she wrote, "We all enjoyed the trip immensely. There were very few hassles. None whatsoever from the boys. Overall hospitality could not be faulted. Perhaps the matches were too one-sided but the officials at the places we visited were happy about the tour. A very worthwhile experience for the three boys as well as myself."

VISIT TO NEW CALEDONIA:

The Northland Association sent a team of six junior players under the control of James Morris to New Caledonia for a series of matches from 28 May to 9 June 1984. While in Noumea, James Morris continued his coaching of New Caledonia players.

TASMANIA EASTSIDE LEAGUE VISIT:

Players and supporters of the Tasmania Eastside Table Tennis League, were in the South Island 2-9 June, 1984 for a "friendly-social-sightseeing tour". The 20 strong party included visits to the Hermitage, and Mt. Cook, the Haast Pass, Milford Sounds and Queensland in their sightseeing itinerary. Friendly matches were played against Southland, Otago and Canterbury.

FIRST AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The following New Zealand players submitted entries for the various age group events at the First Australian National Veterans championships, to be held at the Kingsborough Table Tennis Centre, Summerlees Road, Kingston, Tasmania, 22-23 November, 1984: - Pat Doyle, Valley Kwok, John Lelliott, Frank O'Gorman, Theo Sandberg, Isobel Cleland and Thelma May.

With a minimum of three players required, the men formed themselves into a New Zealand team to compete in the over 40 men's teams competition. Individual events were programmed for singles and doubles events for over 40 years, singles events for over 50, 60 and 70 years. The Organisers intended to arrange unofficial teams matches (2 per team) for players over 50 and 60.

1985 COMMONWEALTH AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The National Selectors, John Lelliott (Convenor), Alan Tomlinson and Frank O'Gorman, chose the following players to represent New Zealand at the 8th Commonwealth Championships at Douglas, Isle of Man, 17-23 March, 1985 and at the 38th World Championships at Gothenburg, Sweden, 28 March - 7 April, 1985.

Men: Barry Griffiths (Auckland), Peter Jackson (Auckland)
and Malcolm Temperley (North Shore)

Women: Christine Lee (Auckland) and Jan Morris (Canterbury)

Subsequently Christine Lee withdrew and her place was taken by Kadia Rice (Otago). James Morris indicated that he was not available and Graham Lassen (Auckland) was named as the non-travelling reserve.

The NZ Executive Committee appointed John Lelliott as Manager and Geoff Rau as Coach/Adviser.

An application by Malcolm Darroch (North Shore) to compete in the individual events of the World Championships was approved. Darroch was entered for the singles events and will partner Malcolm Temperley in the men's doubles.

INTERNATIONAL TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION:

The NZ Association has forwarded the following proposition for consideration at the Biennial General Meeting of the ITTF -

"That a standardisation of two bat colours, red and black be adopted by manufacturers."

The Oceania Federation supports the nomination of Ken Wilkinson (NZL) as the Vice-President elect for the Oceania Continent for the two years, 1985/86.

Mr Wilkinson succeeds Len Haycraft (AUS) the present holder of the office who automatically retires after serving a two-year term.

As one of the Officers of the ITTF, Mr Wilkinson becomes a member of the Executive Committee which has power to deal with current or urgent business, duly reporting to the Council.

The Oceania Federation also supports the nomination of Eric Coster (AUS) as a Council Member of the ITTF. The Council is elected biennially and consists of the officers and thirty three other representatives to carry on the work of the International Federation between its General Meetings and to guide General Meetings. The Council administers the finances of the Federation.

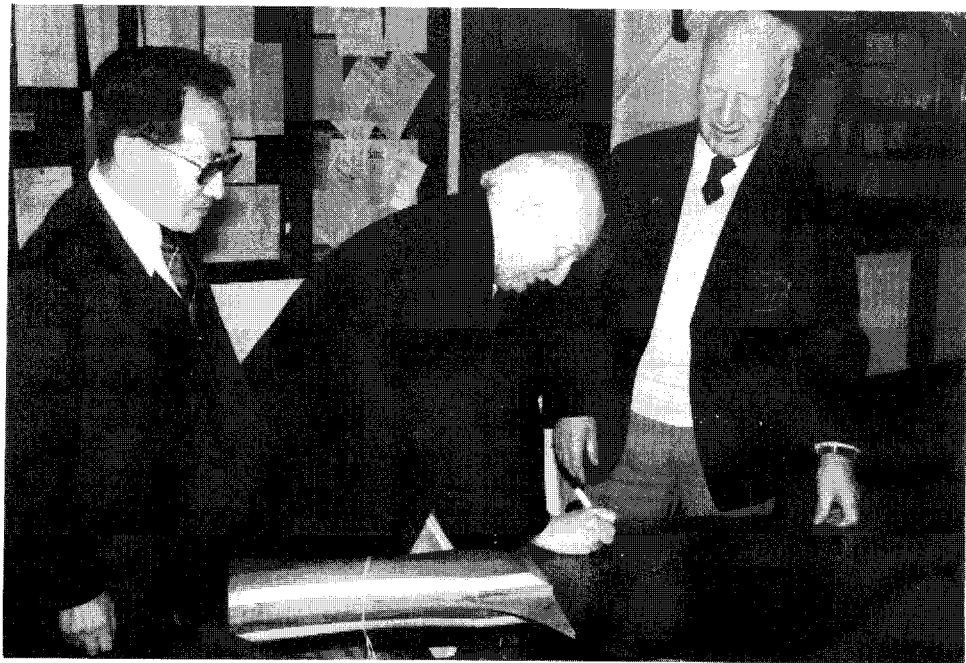
OCEANIA FEDERATION:

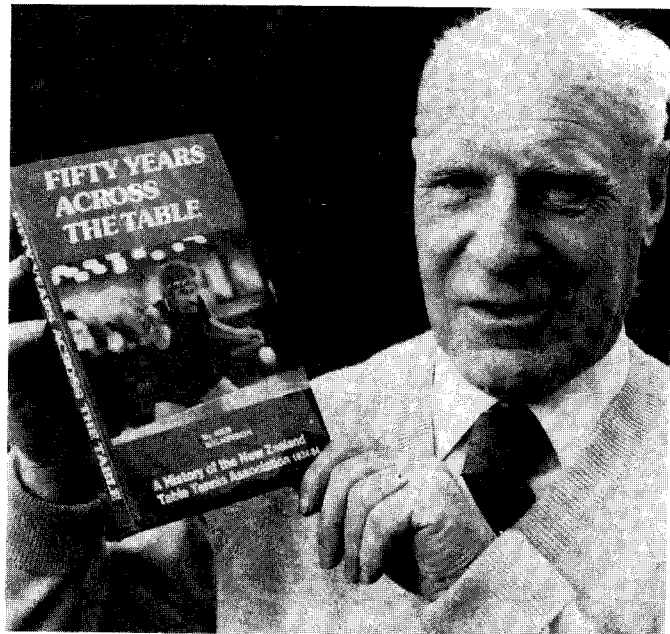
TRAINING OVERSEAS

It is very important that, at every opportunity, New Zealand players go overseas to obtain international experience and training which will improve their table tennis technical skills. The experience gained also helps to raise the standard of play in New Zealand. 1984 saw the greatest number of New Zealand players travelling overseas and the NZ Association supports the initiative displayed by these players.

1. Barry Griffiths continued his training in Japan, through financial assistance from the NZ SPORTS FOUNDATION and with the personal interest of Mr Ichiro Ogimura. Griffiths returned to NZ on 20 February, 1984 after spending 4 months in Japan.
2. With assistance from the North Shore Association, 23-year-old Malcolm Darroch, competed in the German International open championships at Duisburg, 9-12 February, 1984 and later joined the Natursreunde Rheydt Club to compete in the German League competition. Darroch returned to NZ on 28 March, 1984 after spending two months overseas. Later, on 1 September 1984, he returned to Germany to join the GW Bad Hamim club to continue his training.
3. Through the kind favours of TAMASU COMPANY LIMITED, Peter Jackson (Auckland) and Alan Pedley (Franklin) trained at the BUTTERFLY DOHJO, Tokyo, Japan for one month from 8 January, 1984. The daily training and physical exercises were extensive. There was practice sessions with many leading Japanese men and women players. In the evening excellent video films were analysed. The time spent at the DOHJO which, also included accommodation, was a tremendous experience for the players.
4. Shane Cummins (Franklin) later joined Peter Jackson and Alan Pedley for further training and practice with members of the Kawasaki Steel Company in Tokyo. Jackson and Pedley returned to NZ on 27 February, 1984 while Cummins remained for a longer stay with the host Company.
5. 19-year-old Alan Shewan (Hamilton) chose England and Peter Hirst as his preference for table tennis experience. He left NZ on 30 June 1984 and is expected to return on 22 December 1984.
6. After a most successful season in NZ as the top 18-year-old, Tony Radford (North Shore) is scheduled to be in Japan for 2 months from 3 November 1984 till 1 February 1985. He is accompanying Barry Griffiths, who has made the introductions for him in Japan.

50TH JUBILEE NZ TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

1984 was the year when celebrations took place to mark the 50 years formation of the NZ Table Tennis Association.

The celebrations opened with the holding of the 50th Annual General Meeting at the Trentham Racecourse complex, followed by a get-together on the Friday evening. Saturday afternoon was occupied with the staging of the Oceania Qualifying Tournament for the World Cup and the weekend celebrations concluded with a formal dinner on the Saturday evening.

A book featuring the history of the NZ Association 1934-1983 was published, a special datestamp was provided by the Post Office to mark the occasion, a large bat was made available by Barnett Sports to autograph, table coasters, a souvenir menu, bottles of McWilliams Muller Thurgau wine specially labelled and a Jubilee cake were provided. A video screening of a personal message from the President of the ITTF Mr H. Roy Evans OBE and his wife, Nancy, speaking from Wales, was relayed through a television set.

Over 300 people attended the weekend celebrations and it was an opportunity for meeting past champions, players and administrators of by-gone years.

Dinner: The dinner was held in the Oaks Room, Members Stand, Trentham. Tables were set out in alternating red and white table cloths, adorned with posy bowles prepared by the Upper Hutt Floral group. The NZ Association provided specially printed plastic coated table mats, which depicted an early ping pong drawing room scene. The table mats were sponsored by Whitcoulls. A souvenir printed menu, sponsored by McWilliams Wines NZ Ltd, featuring on the cover, photograph of the First Ping Pong Tournament in NZ 1902 and the NZ blazer pocket, which became the Jubilee monogram, printed on table coasters were also available to guests. A Jubilee cake, was sponsored by Westpac Banking Corporation. Sprays were provided for the wives of the invited quests. The Master of Ceremonies was Terry Bellamy of Dunedin, who added to the occasion with his flair as a Master Toastmaster. Following dinner the quests returned to the Carbine Room where a full bar service and entertainment was provided.

The Book: "50 years Across the Table" written by Ken Wilkinson, covered the history of the NZ Table Tennis Association for the 50 years 1934-1983. The book was sponsored by SHELL. 153 pages of narrative, supported by 72 illustrations, the book was bound by a hard cover, together with a dust cover, featuring in full colour, an action photograph of the NZ team captain, James Morris. The book received a good initial review by Brian Humberstone, Feature Writer, for the NZ Herald, and has since been reviewed in many other newspapers, including the ETTA Table Tennis News.

There was also a brief mention of the book in a Hungarian sports magazine. Libraries throughout New Zealand purchased books to make them available to their readers. While the expected sales in NZ were disappointing, the book has been purchased world-wide by enthusiasts in Norway, Denmark, Germany, England, Japan and Australia.

Wine: McWilliams Wines, NZ Ltd supported the Jubilee by making available, at an attractive price, bottles of McWilliams Muller Thurgau, a light sweet wine of excellent balance, especially labelled for the NZTTA 50th Jubilee celebrations. The wine was very popular and there was no problems in disposing of the bulk lot ordered.

Display Exhibition: Lloyd Richards set up a display of historical records, photographs, newspaper clippings, banners, early relics of equipment, including an immaculate 1901 Ping Pong set donated from the late Alan McCallum records. As a permanent record for the N.Z. Association, Winstone Limited sponsored a display case to house the numerous pins, badges and insignias of overseas countries.

The NZ Association is pleased to be associated with TAMASU COMPANY LIMITED, manufacturers of the BUTTERFLY quality table tennis equipment.

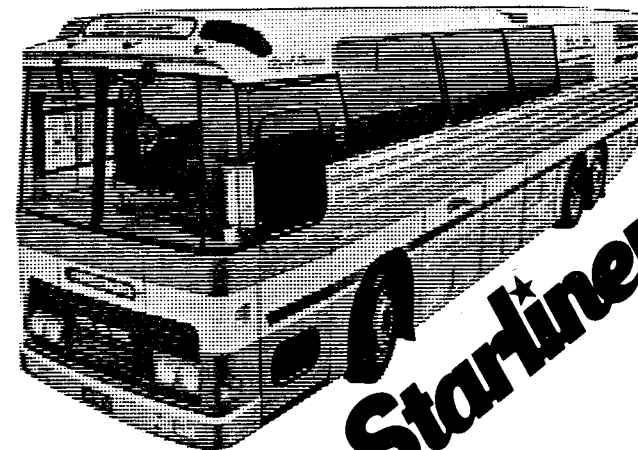

N.Z. TABLE TENNIS DEVELOPMENT TRUST

The Development Trust is still not receiving the support it should be getting from Associations, clubs and players. Despite reminder forms being sent out, seven members have not renewed their subscriptions and the income has dropped from \$585 in 1982/83 to \$520 for 1983/84, of which 54% comes from the Hutt Valley area. This years three new members are the Canterbury and Kapiti Associations and Mr Trevor de Cleene, M.P. The Hawkes Bay, Hutt Valley and Nelson Associations have renewed their membership but the only club which has renewed its membership is the Empire Club of Hutt Valley. It would be appreciated if all Associations would consider membership for 1984/85 and ask the clubs in their Associations to consider also.

Grants have been given in the past year to Peter Jackson and Tony Radford both for training in Japan which must be beneficial to the development of New Zealand Table Tennis.

THE NZTTA NATIONAL LOTTERY

Robert Gross on behalf of the Franklin Table Tennis Association was the organiser of the 1984 NZTTA Lottery. It had 60,000 tickets at \$1 each with 40% of the sales going to the provincial associations. Prizes were:

1st	Datsun 120Y Car
2nd	Video Recorder
3rd	Microwave Oven
4th	Portable Colour TV

and 10 other prizes of \$100. Cash equivalents were offered for the major prizes. Sponsorship of \$700 from Bata Ltd., towards ticket printing costs was arranged by the NZTTA. Reasonable discounts on cost prices were arranged on the major prizes.

The lottery had been delayed from the 1983 year because the previous NZTTA lottery balance sheet had not been audited as required by the Internal Affairs Department. 39020 or 65% of the tickets were sold. The performance of the provincial associations varied tremendously with over 90% of their allocation sold by Franklin, Bay of Plenty and Northland, to less than 50% by Auckland, Kapiti, Marlborough, Otago and Waitemata. There was trouble getting in the unsold tickets from a couple of associations. A schedule of the ticket sales by all associations shown as a percentage against the allocation is given at the end of this report.

In the NZ individual junior championships, trophies are sought for the mixed doubles, under 12 years event, to complete the programme. For the North Island and South Island championships there are a variety of junior events not yet provided with a permanent trophy. Specifications for the donation of trophies are:

EPNS or better, plinth to be plastic or wood, total height of trophy and plinth to be not less than 30cm, height of plinth not less than 8mm, value of trophy to be not less than \$60 retail and title engraving of trophy to be discussed.

FINANCIAL REPORT - by Dick Lynn, ACA Treasurer

Substantial improvement was recorded in the financial position under review in 1984. The Association carried out normal activities in addition to holding two Golden Jubilee functions. Though the costs incurred in carrying out these activities were high, a good profit still resulted.

The holding of the 50th Jubilee dinner, Oceania elimination match, NZ v Japan test series, the sending of a N.Z. junior team to Perth, and a coaching programme consisting of two national coaching schools, and three regional coaching schools were the main events of the year. The Association received assistance for the last three events. For the Junior Tour, contributions of \$8,000 were received from the players and manager. Sponsors and TVNZ gave \$3,820 towards the N.Z. v Japan tour. The coaching programme received a grant of \$7,000 from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport.

A grant of \$6,373 was received from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport to offset administration costs of \$24,463 which is well up on \$20,670 for last year. The net cost of the tour to Perth, Australia was \$4,358 which compares to \$4,975 for overseas tours last year. Further recovery was made in the coaching area.

Income this year rose by \$9,752 mainly to a well-run lottery netting \$5219, and a financially successful tour by a Japanese team. One disturbing aspect is the drop in interclub teams both in 1983 and 1984. Team strength is what affiliation fees and coaching levies are based on and the prospects for 1985 do not look good.

Net working capital has increased this year from \$10,500 to \$16,581, a sound position. The Association has invested \$25,000 on term deposits with Westpac, and A.G.C. These represent the 1985 Ministry of Recreation and Sport's grant received early and the coaching levies held in the National Coaching Fund. To this fund the Executive has approved a transfer from general funds of \$1,500, the 'Nittaku' ball sponsorship.

In 1985, the Association is to embark on three new ventures, which may involve an increase in expenditure if not carefully budgeted for. The Association hopes to employ a national coach part way through the financial year. A coaching levy of \$25 based on team fees is to be charged to Associations to meet the cost in part. The Association moves into Sports House on 1 December and outgoings there are much greater than at Recreation Services. Also a new Executive Officer is to be appointed on a basis of 25 hours per week, compared to the present incumbent's 20 hours (paid) per week.

Another activity that will drain the Association's finances is the sending of two teams to the Commonwealth and World Championships. Though the members will contribute \$2000 each, the cost to the N.Z. Association will still be in the range of \$8,000 to \$10,000.

Referring back to the National Coach, it is envisaged all the monies held in the special fund account will be utilised in meeting the relocation costs of the coach and family.

The present surplus income is insufficient to meet the cost of all the activities to be undertaken in 1985. The Association will need to seek special grants from the Ministry of Recreation and Sports for both the World Champs, and the National Coach. Sponsorship from table tennis allied organisations will be sought. Finally, we need to run another raffle. The concept of \$1 raffle tickets is still the best method from the 'national' view, even though some provincial Associations do not push sales vigorously enough. \$10,000 is required, not the usual \$4,000 to \$5,000 that seems only able to be raised.

DIPLOMA:

Congratulations to David Cook on obtaining a Diploma of the NZ Council for Recreation and Sport. David received his diploma in recreation leadership and his final submissions, at a residential course at Salmond Hall, Dunedin, during the last weekend of November, 1983, was an oral presentation of his written assignment "NZ Table Tennis Association's Coaching Manual".

OBITUARY: It is with sadness that we have to record the death of prominent table tennis administrators and a sportswriter, who by their personal efforts and dedication, assisted in a big way to the development of table tennis in New Zealand.

**** HENRY DAVID KENNEDY, a foundation member of the Wellington and N.Z. Associations; a Wellington representative, playing against English internationals Perry and Wilde in 1934, was also a player who contributed much towards the administration of table tennis in the early years. Harry, as he was best known, died at the Porirua Hospital on 6 March, 1984 aged 77.

**** BENJAMIN THOMAS PEGLER, in his 95th year, died at the Gisborne Hospital on 19 March, 1984. Ben, an identity of the Hutt Valley for many years, was a member of the N.Z. Executive Committee 1945 - 48. His longevity was a tribute to his devotion to health foods, fitness and sporting activities.

**** WILLIAMS MULLINS, 80 who died at the Hutt Hospital on 25 June 1984, was a life member of the N.Z. Association. He was a long serving member of the N.Z. Executive Committee covering a span of 26 years, 1941 - 1966 including a 5-year term as Chairman of the committee. Bill Mullins was also involved with the Hutt Valley Association, occupying key positions over a long period of time.

**** J.M. (MORRIE) MACKENZIE, 83 died in Clyde, Otago, 7 October, 1984. Morrie MacKenzie was a noted rugby journalist and sports editor of "Truth" and the "NZ Sportsman". Table Tennis was often featured in articles and tournament coverage in the monthly magazine "NZ Sportsman". At the 25th Jubilee dinner of the NZ Association in 1959, Morrie MacKenzie replied to the toast "The Press".

There were other provincial identities who died during the year and these included Peter Woodman of the Northland Association, Bill Tye, North Shore, who had a fatal heart attack at the early age of 37, Mrs Gwendoline Morris, mother of Jan, who died suddenly on her return home from the N.Z. Championships and Mr Takashi Suzuki, President of the Japanese Table Tennis Company, TSP, who passed away on 30 August 1984.

Depreciation


Fixed assets and equipment have been depreciated using an annual rate of 10% with the exception of shirts, badges, pennants and partitions where an annual rate of 20% has been used.

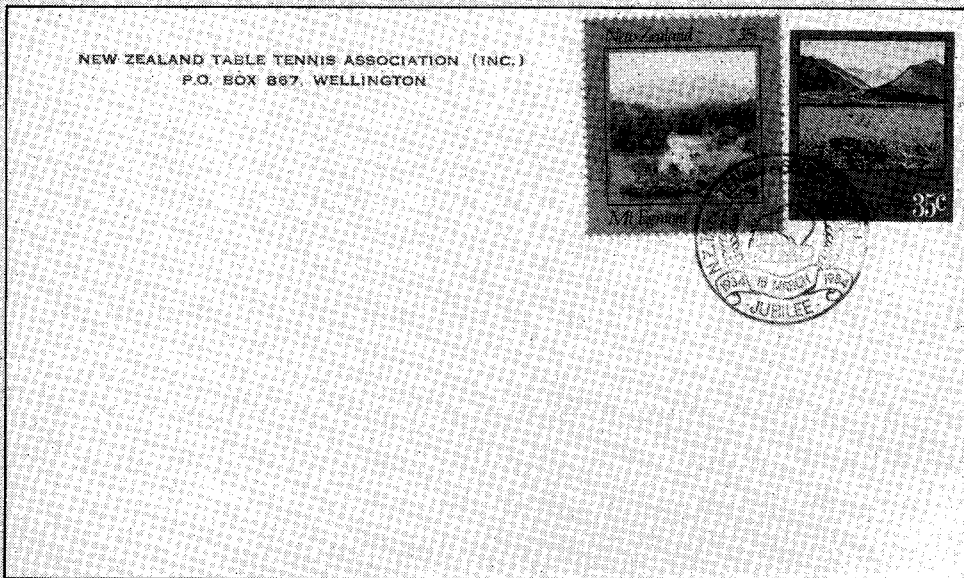
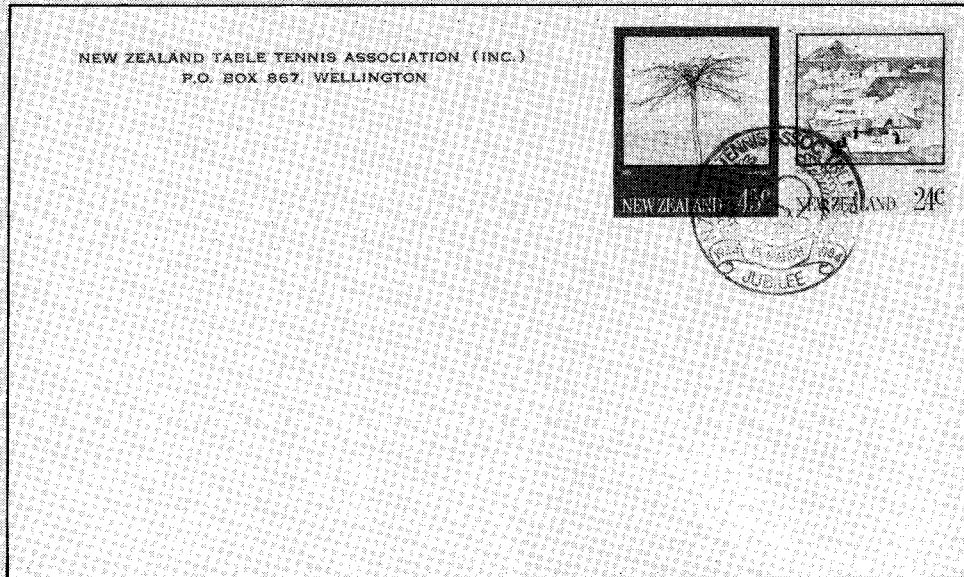

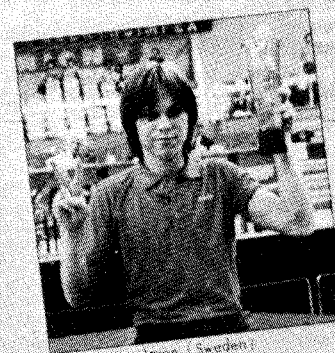
