TO ALL MEMBERS,

The Executive Committee submits for your consideration the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 October 1985.

The 1985 season was notable for several highlights:

- The end of an era.
- The appointment of a Director of Coaching
- The election of NZTTA as a member of the New Zealand Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association.
- The release of the report from the Sports Development Inquiry Committee 'Sport on the Move.'
- The formation of the New Zealand Assembly for Sport.
- The introduction of veterans teams events in the NZ Championships programme.
- The combining of the senior, junior and veterans teams and individual events at the New Zealand Championships hosted by the South Canterbury Association.
- The Inter-Island contests expanded to include veteran and junior events.
- A junior Test Match New Zealand v Australia held in conjunction with the New Zealand Championships week.

The end of an era was, of course, the retirement at the 1985 Annual General Meeting of Ken Wilkinson BEM after a service of 36 years as successively honorary secretary, salaried secretary and Executive Officer to the New Zealand Table Tennis Association. Many were the sincere tributes paid to Ken at that meeting and it was fitting that during that part of the proceedings he was joined by his wife, Phyllis, and Catherine, one of his two daughters.

Ken has not severed his connections with table tennis. He is a Life Member of NZTTA, President of the Oceania Table Tennis Federation and a council member of the International Table Tennis Federation so his typewriter is still churning out plenty of table tennis correspondence.

Peter Hirst, a top coach with the English Table Tennis Association, was offered, and accepted, the position of New Zealand Director of Coaching.

The arrival of Peter and his wife, Sally, with their family on Tuesday 28 May 1985, was the culmination of months of negotiations and heralded the beginning of what should be a very exciting and challenging period for New Zealand table tennis. This appointment supplied the missing link in our coaching system.

ADMINISTRATION HEADQUARTERS

In December, 1985, the headquarters for NZTTA was moved to the Sports House complex in Mercer Street, Wellington. The fourth floor of this building is occupied by the New Zealand Council for Recreation and Sport and the national offices of Badminton, Golf, Lawn Tennis, Netball, Roller Skating, Softball, Swimming, Women's Hockey, the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme as well as Table Tennis.

Whilst the rent is higher than was being paid at Courtenay Place the advantages of the new complex far outweigh any disadvantages. Some economies have been achieved to offset the increased costs.

During the year Countrywide Building Society presented some framed photos of players from several sports and these are displayed in the building. The table tennis photo is an action shot of Barry Griffiths.

A study of these statistics can only be a cause for grave concern. Some facts can be readily ascertained:

1. The number of association teams has dropped from 1,048 in 1981 to 747 in 1985 - a decrease of 301.
2. A decrease of 120 sub-association teams between 1982 and 1985.
3. A decrease of 82 business house teams between 1982 and 1985.
4. A decrease of 41 schools teams between 1981 and 1985.
5. A comparison of the total number of teams between 1981 and 1985 shows an overall decrease of 475 - a loss of 26.88% !
6. Six associations conduct a business house competition.
7. Ten associations conduct a schools competition.

These are very depressing facts which must concern all table tennis administrators.

Why have the numbers diminished to such an extent because, essentially, the advantages of table tennis are the same as they have ever been. If ever a sport qualified for the description 'a sport for all' it is surely table tennis.

The problem is poor marketing. Many think of marketing as the way the sport sells itself; the projection of the right image. But marketing is more than dealing with the present. It is the antenna with which an organisation anticipates shifts in people's desires and expectations and plans for them.

Is innovation being stifled by tradition? Is policy from year to year being determined by rote?

The importance of marketing has been acknowledged by the Auckland association as we note from their annual report that they are to prepare a five year plan.

The decline in the apparent popularity of the sport concerned the Executive Committee that it held an informal meeting at which almost a day was devoted to considering the present and future direction of table tennis. A comprehensive report is being prepared and will be circulated as early as possible.

NZ OLYMPIC AND COMMONWEALTH GAMES ASSOCIATION

By letter dated 26 August 1985, we were advised that NZTTA has now been accepted as a member of this association. Membership entitles us to have a member on their Executive Committee and will, in due course, entitle us to apply for grants from Olympic Solidarity through both the NZ National Olympic Committee and the International Table Tennis Federation.

SPORTS DEVELOPMENT INQUIRY COMMITTEE

The Sports Development Inquiry Committee was appointed in December 1984, by the Minister of Recreation and Sport, the Honourable Mike Moore. The committee was chaired by Sir Ronald Scott and the terms of reference were to inquire and report upon:

1. Objectives and priorities for the development of sport
2. Participation in all levels of sport and the special needs of particular sectors or interest groups
3. The existing constraints on the development of sport in New Zealand
4. Sport and health
5. The roles of central, regional and local government in the provision of support services for sport
6. Promotion of trade and tourism through sport

Your Executive Committee presented both written and verbal submissions on aspects which it considered itself competent to comment. Our areas of concern centred round the cost of administration of table tennis at the national and provincial levels, greater financial assistance for measurable projects (e.g. the coaching programme consequent upon the appointment of the Director of Coaching) and the cost of sending representative teams to overseas competition.

The report and recommendations of the Inquiry Committee were presented to the Minister on 12 November, 1985. The report 'Sport on the Move' is a very significant and comprehensive document which sets out the problems facing sport and it makes some very practical recommendations on how sport could be assisted financially.

One of the key recommendations calls for the introduction of Lotto, a form of long-odds gambling. The profit from Lotto will be used to fund sports, recreation, the arts and community projects in New Zealand.

The racing industry, which currently has almost a monopoly on the gambling dollar, is opposed to the introduction of any other form of legalised gambling as they fear their industry will be adversely affected - even though overseas experience would seem to indicate that this is not the case.

It is important that table tennis, along with all the other sports, mobilise support at all levels of participation to counter the racing lobby as our response could well be a critical factor in resolving the issue in favour of sports. For this reason associations were circulated seeking their support and we hope all took appropriate action.

The Minister is quite excited about the report and he is keen to do his part so it is incumbent on us to give him our whole hearted support.

One section of the report is very relevant to table tennis and is quoted for members to reflect upon:

"Individual obligatory funding (e.g. subscriptions) as a potential source of increased funds is limited. This is not to underestimate its current contribution, which is assessed by Treasury as being some \$170-\$200 million a year. However, attitudes to finding more money in this area harden on the premise that an increase in fees has an immediate effect on participation. While understanding these concerns, we find the view somewhat narrow. A running club charging an annual fee of \$5 sought and received community funds through recreation and sports grants. This is an obvious case of community funds being used for personal benefit activities. There are a number of major sports with annual fees as low as \$15 and \$20. Such fees clearly need to be brought into line with current levels throughout sport, and for sports to receive community funds to offset losses

caused by low fees is a misuse of community funds."

Sir Ronald Scott and his committee deserve the highest praise for completing a comprehensive report in easy to understand language in such a short period of time.

The implementation of the recommendations will enable sports to plan longer term with a degree of certainty. There could be exciting and challenging times ahead.

The Minister invited all interested parties to comment on the contents of the report and your Executive accepted the invitation.

NEW ZEALAND ASSEMBLY FOR SPORT

On 13 November 1985, the New Zealand Assembly for Sport came into being. The main objective of this Assembly is to give 'one voice for sport.' It was an exciting meeting attended by representatives of about 60 sports. Table tennis was represented by Ron Menchi, Peter Hirst and Merv Allardyce. Vice President Mike McAvinue also attended.

NZTTA has applied to become a member of the Assembly.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

In March 1985, the Government issued a White Paper on Goods and Services Tax. The Paper proposed that the turnover or taxable supply threshold be \$2,500 and that returns, including 'nil' returns, and payments be made two-monthly with penalties for failure to comply.

Your Executive Committee presented submissions to the Advisory Panel under four headings:

1. Background information on the administration of table tennis,
2. Problems which will arise through the imposition of the tax,
3. Problems associated with the administration of the tax,
4. Re-allocation of the tax to sports bodies.

The Government has now declared a GST rate of 10%, with the threshold of taxable supply on turnover to be set at \$24,000. Small organisations such as sports clubs will not have to charge and account for GST if their taxable supply falls below \$24,000.

To ease administrative difficulties, organisations which have an annual turnover of less than \$250,000 will be allowed to make six-monthly returns.

Whilst these changes have, to a large extent, overcome the concerns expressed in our submissions there still remain some areas of concern:

1. GST will have to be collected at least on that proportion of club subscriptions which are likely to be paid to their parent association and to NZTTA. The reason for this is that NZTTA and associations with a threshold above \$24,000 will have to charge and account for GST on affiliation fees.
2. Children and other non-earners represent nearly 50% of table tennis players.
3. It is estimated that over 90% of table tennis players (including children and other non-earners) are involved in more than one sport. Should costs increase as anticipated, multi-sports players may be forced to reduce their activities in organised sports and it is our contention that the numerically smaller sports with a lower profile will suffer.

There is little doubt that GST will be an additional cost pressure for sport,

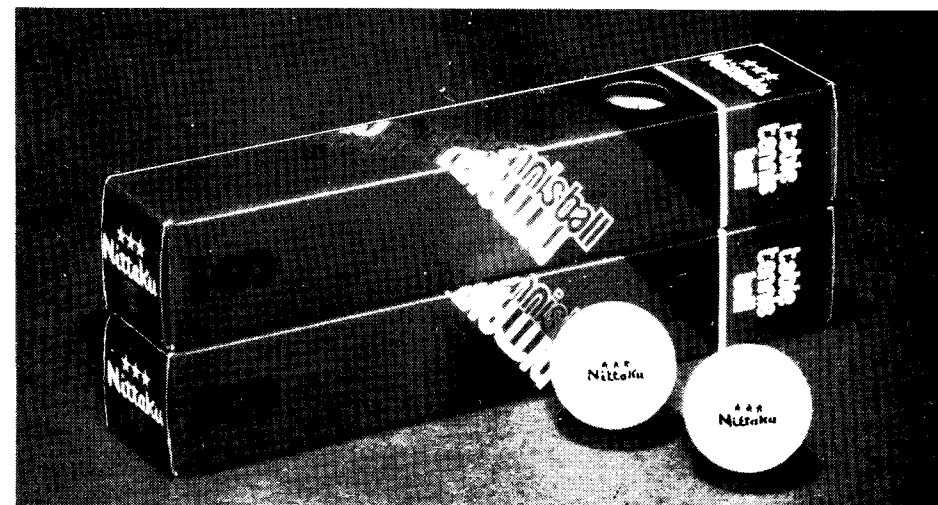
TABLE TENNIS GOODS OF INTERNATIONAL FAME

both in its added-on effect on subscriptions and the processing needed to complete returns. Such pressures come at a time when sport is suffering from a severe running down of government funding.

NATIONAL LOTTERY

Because of the amount of discussion which took place at the 1985 annual meeting and the closeness of the vote which decided the format of the raffle, it was predictable that there was more adverse correspondence on this year's raffle than in previous years.

Be that as it may the commitment of the guarantee system prompted many associations to 'get out and sell' and the result was very pleasing to those associations and, of course, to the NZTTA.

When all outstanding amounts are paid the raffle should yield a net \$13,300 to NZTTA.

It became obvious at the 1985 annual meeting that the future of the national raffle will have to be considered very carefully. It was apparent that it will become more difficult to agree on a raffle which will be acceptable to all associations as there seems to be a wide variation in the types of raffles which have the greatest appeal in different areas.

The 1985 raffle was organised by Robert Gross on behalf of the Franklin Association and we extend to Robert our grateful thanks for carrying out this onerous task.

NZ TABLE TENNIS DEVELOPMENT TRUST

The trustees of this fund were John Lelliott (convenor), Trevor Flint, Bob Lassen and Mike McAvinue.

Subscriptions for the year totalled \$320 and a grant of \$300 was made to Malcolm Temperley.

The concept which prompted the creation of the Trust was excellent but it is in danger of an early demise unless it can be given a significant boost.

An all out drive for once only donations to create a capital fund which could be invested and grants made from the revenue would inject life into the Trust and relieve the faithful few of an annual commitment.

RESTRUCTURE OF MANAGEMENT OF NZTTA

Many players and officials met at the North Island and New Zealand Championships and discussed ideas to restructure the New Zealand Association into a National Council and a smaller Management Committee. It was envisaged that there be seven regions each with a member - these seven members together with the Management Committee to comprise a National Council.

A Restructure Committee was formed to investigate and report back. It was anticipated that a report and recommendation will be prepared for the consideration of the 1986 Annual General Meeting.

PERMANENT TROPHIES

In 1984 the Horowhenua Table Tennis Sub-Association donated two cups to be known as the 'Horowhenua Cups' for the New Zealand Championships Under 12 Years Mixed Doubles event.

We thank them for these cups and regret the omission in acknowledging them in the 1984 report.

We also acknowledge the fine trophy donated by the Westland Savings Bank, Westport, for the New Zealand final of the Primary/Intermediate Schools Teams Championship.

UMPIRES

Umpiring seems to be the 'cinderella' side of table tennis so it was pleasing to learn of the formation of the Auckland Table Tennis Umpires Association. Members have adopted a uniform which has been the subject of much favourable comment. JUNIOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

Although the number of nominees was small the submissions made on behalf of each nominee were very impressive.

The 1985 Junior of the Year was 15 years old MAXINE JOAN GOLDIE of Westport.

The presentation of the award was made by the President of the West Coast Table Tennis Association, Mr Norm Crawshaw, at the Buller High School end-of-year prize giving ceremony.

RACKET COVERINGS

At the Biennial General Meeting of the International Table Tennis Federation held on 5 April, 1985, the New Zealand proposal to restrict the colours of rubbers to red and black only was adopted by about 70% of the votes. The newly adopted regulation will become effective in the Northern Hemisphere in July, 1986.

This regulation tidies up the confusion and different interpretations which arose as a consequence of the 1983 regulation which required that bats have two clearly different colours.

As far as New Zealand is concerned the Executive Committee resolved that:

1. The new rule be introduced from 1 April, 1987, provided it is in force prior to the New Zealand Easter break, for all Open, North Island, South Island and New Zealand Championships.
2. Its application for association inter-club and other local participation to be at the discretion of each association.
This is because of the availability of other colours and it is not intended that lower grade and social players be chased from the game. It should be noted, however, that two colour bats must be used.

JAPAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

As Japanese players were to participate in the 150th anniversary celebrations of the State of Victoria in August, we were asked by the Japan Table Tennis Association if we could host a party of three to the New Zealand Championships.

After we received the cable from Japan it had been our intention to suggest an International contest Japan v New Zealand be played in Christchurch prior to the New Zealand Championships. The costs of bringing the Japanese players from Australia could have been covered by television fees and sponsorship.

However, before this invitation was sent to Japan we were approached by a leading player who had discussed a proposal with a private promoter to have an international televised tournament in Auckland. At that stage it was expected that the tournament would comprise players from Japan, England, Australia and New Zealand. We had been assured that the promoter had organised television coverage and a sponsor.

We, therefore, telexed Japan with three options:

1. To participate in an international invitation tournament in Auckland, or
2. An international contest in Christchurch and attendance at the New Zealand Championships, or
3. A combination of the first two options.

We favoured the first option as:

1. We had been assured that television coverage and a sponsor had been arranged.
2. With the inclusion of the overseas players the standard of play would have been high and the resulting television coverage would have given very good exposure for New Zealand table tennis.
3. We had been informed by Television New Zealand that they would not give us coverage of both the tournament in Auckland and the Test in Christchurch. Because of this it would have been difficult to have found a sponsor for the Test in Christchurch.
4. The only way we could have considered the third option was to ask Japan to pay their return fares from Australia.

The Japan Table Tennis Association accepted the first option.

On 29 July, the promoter withdrew from arranging the international tournament in Auckland. At that stage there was insufficient time to make any alternative arrangements so it was with regret that the visit by the Japanese players had to be cancelled.

NITTAKU NATIONAL JUNIOR COACHING SCHOOLS

The dates of these two schools were changed from the end of January to the May school holidays for two reasons:

1. It had been hoped that Peter Hirst may have arrived in New Zealand in time to conduct them, and
2. The dates of the Australian Junior Championships had been changed from May to the end of August.

As it was known that it would be 'touch and go' whether Peter would arrive in time the Hutt Valley Association kindly agreed to host both schools. The rationale was that by having both schools near his home he would not be separated from his family so soon after their arrival.

It is now history that he did not arrive in time and we are grateful to Dave Cook and Paul Escott for conducting the Girls and Boys Schools respectively.

The girls' school was held from 17-19 May and the Boys' School from 24-26 May.

Dicky Babor replaced Gary Traill who was unable to leave Whangarei due to extremely bad weather. On the final day John Warrington joined the Boys' school to make up the required number for a points circuit.

In his report on the Girls' school Dave Cook commented that "About 2/3rds of

the trainees were positive, prepared to experiment and take advice constructively. It was apparent, however, that only about four girls accepted physical exercises as part of their training regime. It would seem that most girls do not think enough about serve, its placement variation and tactical aspects. The attitude throughout was good but the players must remember that they get out of something as much as they put into it."

Paul Escott, in his report, commented "I was appalled at the poor quality of the serving. Most players showed extreme difficulty in producing a short serve. Many, however, demonstrated a good range and variety of spin serves (mostly on the long side.)"

A continuing administrative problem associated with coaching schools is the lack of courtesy being shown by players in failing to notify the host association in reasonable time of their travel arrangements. This problem was highlighted to a greater extent this year through both schools being hosted by the same association.

As a result the Executive Committee has resolved that trainees who do not advise the host association of their travel arrangements by the date to be stipulated, will be excluded from the relevant school.

REGIONAL JUNIOR COACHING SCHOOLS

The Northern Regional School was hosted by the Hamilton Association from 17-19 May and was directed by Neil Addis (Bay of Plenty) and attended by 20 trainees.

The Central School was hosted by the Wellington Association from 24-26 May and 18 trainees attended under the direction of Dave Cook (Wellington.)

The Southern School was held from 11-13 May and was directed by Martin Duffy (Otago.) It was hosted by the South Canterbury Association and attended by 17 trainees.

We are grateful to the coaches and to the host associations.

A consensus from the reports of the three coaches would indicate that all participants were willing to work hard throughout the courses and the behaviour was of a high standard.

COACHING

Although Peter Hirst has been in New Zealand less than six months quite a lot has been achieved.

1. Initially he visited all associations to meet administrators and coaches and to ascertain their needs and how best they considered he could assist them.
2. Seminars for club coaches have been held and coaches and prospective coaches from 19 associations have had the opportunity to attend a course. Some 120 persons took advantage of the opportunity.
3. Several school demonstrations have been held.
4. He accompanied the New Zealand Junior teams to the 1985 Australian Junior Championships.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF COACHING

It is imperative that a structure be established to both encourage and allow players to progress to their full playing potential; that assistance be available at every level in the form of technical information, and that practice times and facilities are made accessible. A measure of progress in the form of ranking,

seeding or averages be prepared regularly (e.g. 3 times per season) and be kept up to date.

SUGGESTED STRUCTURE

Association Level:

Associations provide a regular weekly session of coaching - practice that could cater for the needs of people with an active desire to improve and move on to a regional level. This could be by formal association squad sessions or on an accepted system of attendance which shows a level of commitment.

Progress could be measured by the regular production (e.g. 3 times per season) of percentage lists, averages, rankings, seedings etc.

Regional Level:

Seven regions should be established and these could be:

Region 1 Auckland, Franklin, Northland, North Shore and Waitemata.

Region 2 Bay of Plenty, East Waikato, Hamilton, Poverty Bay, Rotorua and Thames Valley.

Region 3 Bush, Manawatu, Hawkes Bay, North Taranaki, South Taranaki and Wanganui.

Region 4 Hutt Valley, Kapiti, Wairarapa and Wellington.

Region 5 Marlborough, Nelson and West Coast.

Region 6 Canterbury, Mid Canterbury and South Canterbury.

Region 7 Otago and Southland.

Groups, selected from association groups, should be established with a regional coach to be appointed by the Director of Coaching and each group to meet once a month. The squad members to be encouraged to attend regional and national level tournaments with a degree of guidance from the regional coach. The results of regional tournaments to be processed through a national computer and a regional ranking or seeding list be produced three times per season for each of the seven regions.

National Level:

National junior and senior squads be selected from the seven regions for training on a regular basis.

The National rankings to be produced solely from the results of five major tournaments - New Zealand championships, North Island championships, South Island championships and two 'top 12' tournaments. Players wishing to be available for New Zealand selection to attend these five tournaments.

Tournaments:

There are a large number of tournaments scheduled each year and this leads to:

1. Pressure on leading players to train by competition rather than train for competition,
2. Difficulty in scheduling all tournaments, and
3. The full coaching programme at regional and national level cannot be introduced until tournaments can be scheduled to allow for 'free' weekends.

By limiting the criteria for national rankings to the five major tournaments as suggested above, players would be better able to plan their season's activities.

Rankings:

I suggest that a computer ranking system along the lines of the English system be introduced.

International Programme:

During the New Zealand championships Robin Radford, John Lelliott and I had discussions with the Manager of the Australian Junior team, Trevor Barr, to explore the possibility of extending table tennis activities between Australia and New Zealand at both senior and junior levels.

For the seniors it is suggested that every second year each country select 2 men and 1 woman to play a total of seven matches on one table. The purpose of the contest is simply to test the best players who are available with the degree of pressure that can only be produced in full international events.

The suggestion for the juniors is that each country select 6 boys and 6 girls annually to compete in Test matches, round robins and joint training. This format is designed to test players in the three areas of match play, tournament play and training.

Subject to finance I also suggest that tours to both Europe and Asia be considered on a bi-annual basis for seniors and annually for juniors. Such a move will provide the much needed experience which is not available in New Zealand.

School Programme:

Our aim is to arrange a promotional demonstration in every intermediate school in New Zealand every two years. The short programme, of approximately 35-40 minutes duration, is designed to demonstrate table tennis from the point of view of a novice progressing through to international techniques and providing information and practice routines. From the experience gained so far a set of guidelines was prepared for associations:

1. A single table in an area slightly smaller than a badminton court,
2. An audience of at least 100 - as it is a promotional exercise it is important that a large proportion of the audience comprise students without table tennis experience.
3. The demonstrations to take place during school hours - not lunch time.
4. A representative of the local association to be in attendance to organise follow-up action - which could include setting up a coaching group within the school.

Manual and Publications:

The current coaching manual is currently being divided into two sections:

Part 1: A glossy booklet that will provide information on:

- (a) The structure of association club nights;
- (b) Information for teachers in a school situation, and
- (c) The syllabus for the club coaches award.

Part 2: A similar format to the current manual updated to include the syllabus for the association coach award.

Coaching Award Structure:

For the purpose of conducting seminars for coaches it is proposed to form 14 association groupings. This should enable a seminar for each group to be conducted annually.

Club Coach Award - Training: a minimum of 10 hours instruction conducted by the Director of Coaching.

Assessment: verbal questions on the 10 hour syllabus.

- Training: (a) One year's experience as a club coach;
 (b) Attendance at an association coaches course (12 hours);

At the conclusion of the Open events a social hour was hosted by the Southland Association. Throughout the tournament full cafeteria services were provided and the cost were reasonable.

The prizes were of very good quality to a total value of \$2,500. The Southland Association obtained sponsorship from 36 firms and individuals with the main sponsor being P C Blenkhorne Ltd.

In his report John Lelliott commented "Ron Garrett and his team are highly commended for a very well organised tournament which was very much appreciated by the players. A number of other people in addition to those listed worked long hours and all were clearly very proud of their stadium which was opened in 1971 and extended in 1978 to its present size - a great achievement for a small association. NEW ZEALAND CHAMPIONSHIPS WEEK

"The eight contests were played on 16 tables before a crowd of about 400 which was the biggest audience in my memory. There is little doubt that most players are in favour of the new system even though it was a bit one-sided and some of the top players did not make themselves available."

There did not appear to be any adverse reaction to the non supply of additional shirts. With the increased number of participants it was financially impossible to purchase more, particularly when the shirts are used only once a year. It was very pleasing to note, and a credit to the players, that they accepted and carried out the request to wear the appropriate coloured shirt.

INTER-ASSOCIATION TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

It was disappointing to note some last minute withdrawals in these events which necessitated some draws having to be redone more than once. Full marks go to South Canterbury who handled the changes so well that their programme was right up to date when issued.

The teams events were spread over four sessions on Sunday and Monday and two sessions on the Tuesday.

"A very good mini-bus service between the two venues was provided. This was a most essential service and the volunteer drivers were most co-operative. They also picked up players with no transport from their motels throughout the tournament.

Many contests finished well before time with, once again, quite a large number of defaults when a team had reached the magic number of six wins. I can only repeat previous comments that this is not always fair to those players who have travelled a long way at great expense and miss out on matches they would have learnt something from."

The junior teams from Australia played in the men's 'B' grade and women's 'A' grade sections whilst the teams from New Caledonia participated in the men's 'C' and 'D' grades and women's 'C' grade sections.

Some highlights of these championships were:

*** The continued dominance of the Auckland men's and women's teams. The Kean Challenge Shield was won by the men's team for the 10th consecutive year and the Herbert G Teagle Memorial Challenge Shield was won by the women's team for the 11th consecutive year.

*** The Hamilton men's and women's teams both earned promotion to 'A' grade in 1986.

*** The Hutt Valley under 18 and under 15 teams won three of the four 'A' grade titles. In the Under 18 Girls they had to be content with second place behind Auckland.

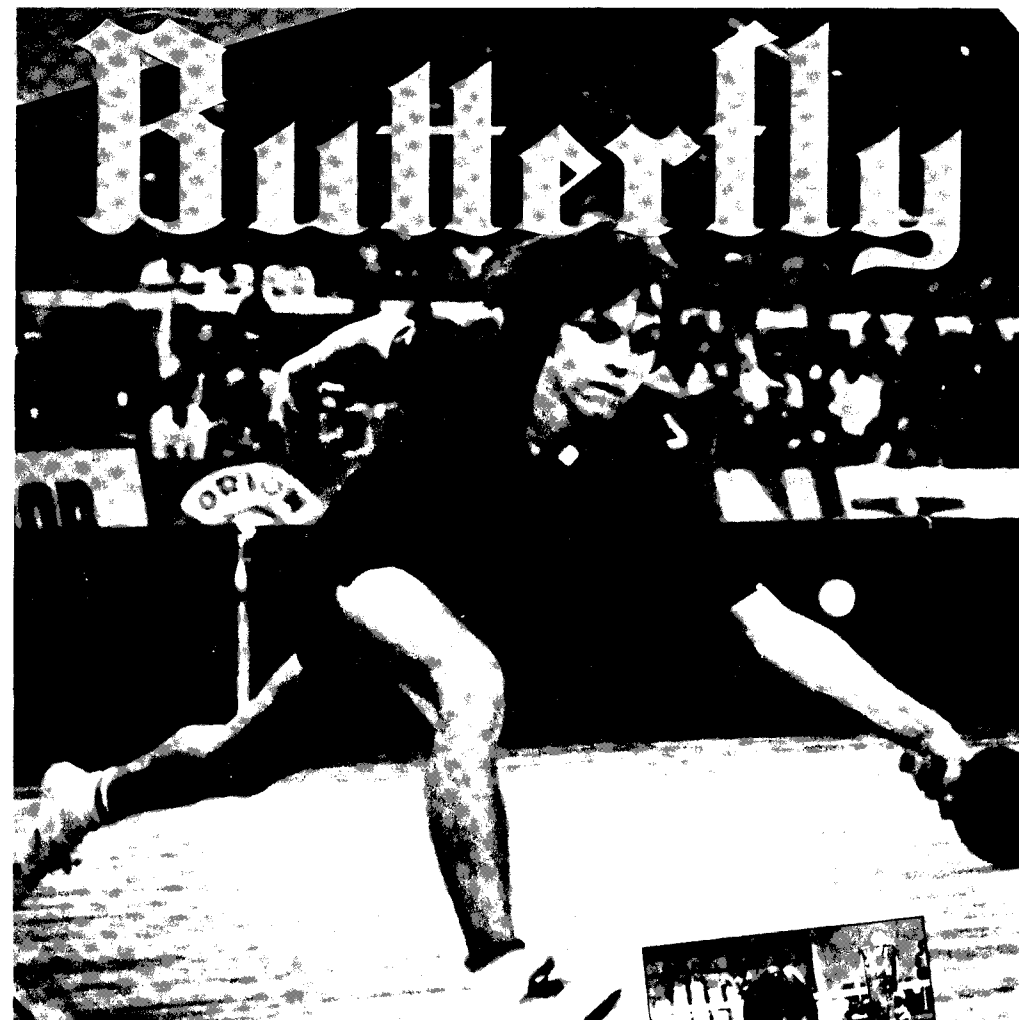

3. We, all three, enjoyed our judging and would like to stress that the final results for the three top placings in both men's and women's sections were very close and were only resolved during the final session of play within the teams events."

1985 TOUR TO COMMONWEALTH AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The New Zealand party which attended the Commonwealth Championships in Douglas, Isle of Man, from 17-23 March, and the World Championships at Gothenburg, Sweden, from 28 March to 7 April was Barry Griffiths, Peter Jackson, Malcolm Temperley, Jan Morris, Kadia Rice, Geoff Rau (Coach) and John Lelliott (Manager.)

Christine Lee was selected but withdrew from the team.

Because of the high cost of the trip, the initial problem was finance. With a shortage of funds and no increase in support from the Government, players and officials had to contribute \$2,000 each, which was double any previous tour contribution.

All players and officials were supplied with Butterfly clothing and supplied with Butterfly rubber sponsored by the Tamasu Company of Japan.

We gratefully acknowledge the assistance given by Peter Hirst in arranging for practices in London both prior to the Commonwealth Championships and again between the conclusion of these championships and travelling to Sweden.

A training schedule was prepared for the women's team. As the members of the men's team were from the Auckland region regular practices were held with the result that they were probably the best prepared team to leave New Zealand for some time. Geoff Rau has expressed his appreciation to the Waitemata Association, the Manurewa Club and especially Bob Lassen and the Auckland Association for the use of their facilities for training. Special thanks were also due to those other players who sacrificed countless summer days to assist with the pre-tour training - Richard Lee, Kevin Barry, Alan Shewan, Shane Cummins, Tony Radford, Alan Pedley and Graham Lassen in particular.

Whilst there was no New Zealand touring group to support our teams, there was regular support from Bob and Barbara Lassen, Val and Tony (when he wasn't umpiring) Darroch, Ken Wilkinson; Malcolm Darroch and Diane Ord.

COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The men's team finished 7th out of 18 teams and lost only one contest during the team events. This compares with the 1983 team which was 10th out of 13 teams.

The women's team slipped a place to finish 7th out of 15 teams as compared with

6th out of 10 teams in 1983.

In the individual events the success story was the performance of Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson in the men's doubles. In the first round they beat St Louis and Delph (Trinidad) 22,17; second round Meneely and Robinson (Ireland) 13,18. In the third round they beat seeded Javor and Haberl (Australia) -16,18,7 and in a major upset beat England's Sandley and Cook 21,-11,11 to assure themselves of a medal and advance to the semi-finals. In the semi they lost to the eventual winners Musa and Sule (Nigeria) -19,19,-19 after having an early lead in the third game. A tremendous effort which gained for them a bronze medal - our first in the men's events at the Commonwealth's.

At the end of the championships Peter Jackson was ranked No. 12 and Malcolm Temperley No. 13 in the men's and Jan Morris was placed at No. 14 in the women's rankings.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

These championships were held in the Scandinavium, a magnificent stadium with good heating and lighting with 19 tables and seating for over 12,000 spectators.

The men's team was in Category 3 Group F and they won all their contests quite comfortably. In the play-offs they lost to Turkey which put paid to their chances of attaining a higher ranking so we retained our 39th position.

The women's team was in Category 2 Group G and although they won only one contest it was enough for them to retain their 27th position and remain in Category 2.

The system operated for the teams events makes it very difficult to improve on the ranking. Our men's team had beaten 4 teams in Category 2 at the Commonwealth championships and there were at least another 4 teams in Category 2 that we could probably have beaten. It is pleasing to note that at the Biennial General Meeting of the ITTF that the system is to be changed for the 1987 World Championships.

In the final of the qualifying round he met Al-homdam (Saudia Arabia) who had earlier beaten the No. 2 from Denmark (a first division country) and the No. 1 from Turkey. Peter played very well to win 17,17. In the first round of the main draw he beat Bob Tuckett (Australia) 17,14,17. His next match was against M Applegren (Sweden) which he lost -20,-13,-19. Although this was a loss it was an excellent performance against a player who is currently ranked No. 9 in the World!

INTERNATIONAL TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION BIENNIAL GENERAL MEETING

Our delegates to this meeting were John Lelliott and Bob Lassen and a very full agenda occupied two days.

Ken Wilkinson also attended as an ITTF Council Member.

The following were the main items of interest:

1. Roy Evans was re-elected President at the age of 75 - still only the second President in the history of the ITTF.
2. The New Zealand remit to restrict rubber colours to black and red only was passed by a good majority and will become effective in the Northern Hemisphere from 1 July, 1986. All other remits affecting the racket were lost.
3. The remit to require the ball in service to be thrown up 15-16 cms was lost even though voting was 58 for and only 31 against. The chairman ruled that a 75% majority was required.
4. The 1987 World Championships will be held in New Delhi and the 1989 in Stuttgart, West Germany.
5. The limit on the prize money at open competitions was abolished.
6. A remit to abolish the present category system for teams was carried 52-33. It was then passed 53-32 that the initial round would be 16 groups of 4 teams, the four teams being drawn, one each, from the current categories 1, 2, 3 and 4. Four new categories will be formed based on the results of the initial round. This means that teams will be placed in categories based on current form rather than the form of two years earlier.

1985 AUSTRALIAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

These championships were held in the Kingborough Sports Centre, Kingston, Hobart, from 1-6 September.

The New Zealand party comprised the following:

Originally the tour was to cost each player in the vicinity of \$500 but after a vote was taken it was unanimously agreed to use motel accommodation in preference to billets. The final cost to each player was \$700 and the non-travelling reserves were given the opportunity to accompany the team if they paid their full expenses of \$1,200 each. Both Murray Traill and Sharon Coad took up the option and competed with merit at the championships.

All players and officials were outfitted with Butterfly clothing and supplied with sheets of Butterfly rubber sponsored by the Tamasu Company of Japan.

At the conclusion of the North Island championships Peter Hirst took a training squad which included all the selected players and during this training he issued the players with a training programme to prepare for the tour.

On arrival at Hobart airport the party was met by members of the organising committee, a gesture that was greatly appreciated.

TEAMS EVENTS

The girls' team performed very well in finishing in second place, losing only 4-5 to Victoria, a very solid team with their girls being ranked 1,3 and 5 in Australia. This was the closest any New Zealand girls team has ever come to winning the title.

The boys found the competition much tougher. Nevertheless, they still managed to beat the top seeded Queensland team. Although they won three contests along with two other teams they were relegated to 5th position overall on the countback.

Because New Zealand teams are not seeded for the teams events, the critical contests are played early in the competition and this makes it hard after a Trans-Tasman flight and following a hard week at our National Championships.

The best performances were:

Gary Traill beating Ian Irving (Australian No.1 junior) -9,21,13.

Eileen Hoete beating Jan Tepper (Australian No.1 junior) 16,-14,11.

Gary and Murray Traill were, perhaps, unlucky to lose their semi-final of the Under 17 boys doubles to eventual winners D Naber & B Turner -19,17,-20 after leading 14-10 in the third game.

Tanya McAvinue and Eileen Hoete reached the semi-finals of the Under 17 girls doubles losing to J Langridge & C Schreenan -12,14,-14.

Gary Traill and Eileen Hoete reached the semi-finals of the Under 17 mixed doubles losing to the eventual winners, D Lee and S Mitchell -12,12,-13.

A system of umpiring used extensively in Australia and at this tournament, is that tournament officials arrange all the umpiring from the players entered, and they maintain a record of all umpiring done to ensure that every player umpires one match for each event in which they enter. A player who refuses to umpire is removed from the tournament. The system seemed to work well and all players were keen to get their share of umpiring done as soon as possible.

OCEANIA ZONE WORLD CUP QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT

This tournament, to determine the Oceania Zone representative in the World Cup Tournament, was played in Sydney on 1 July.

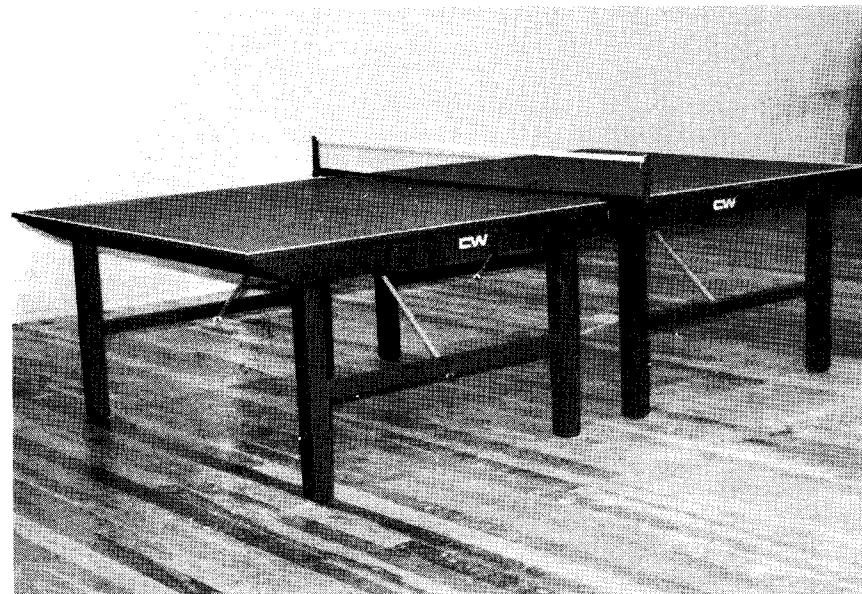

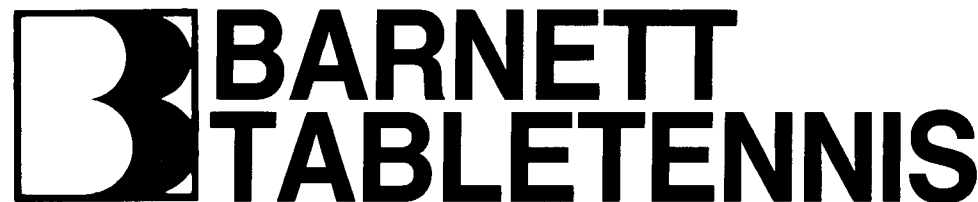

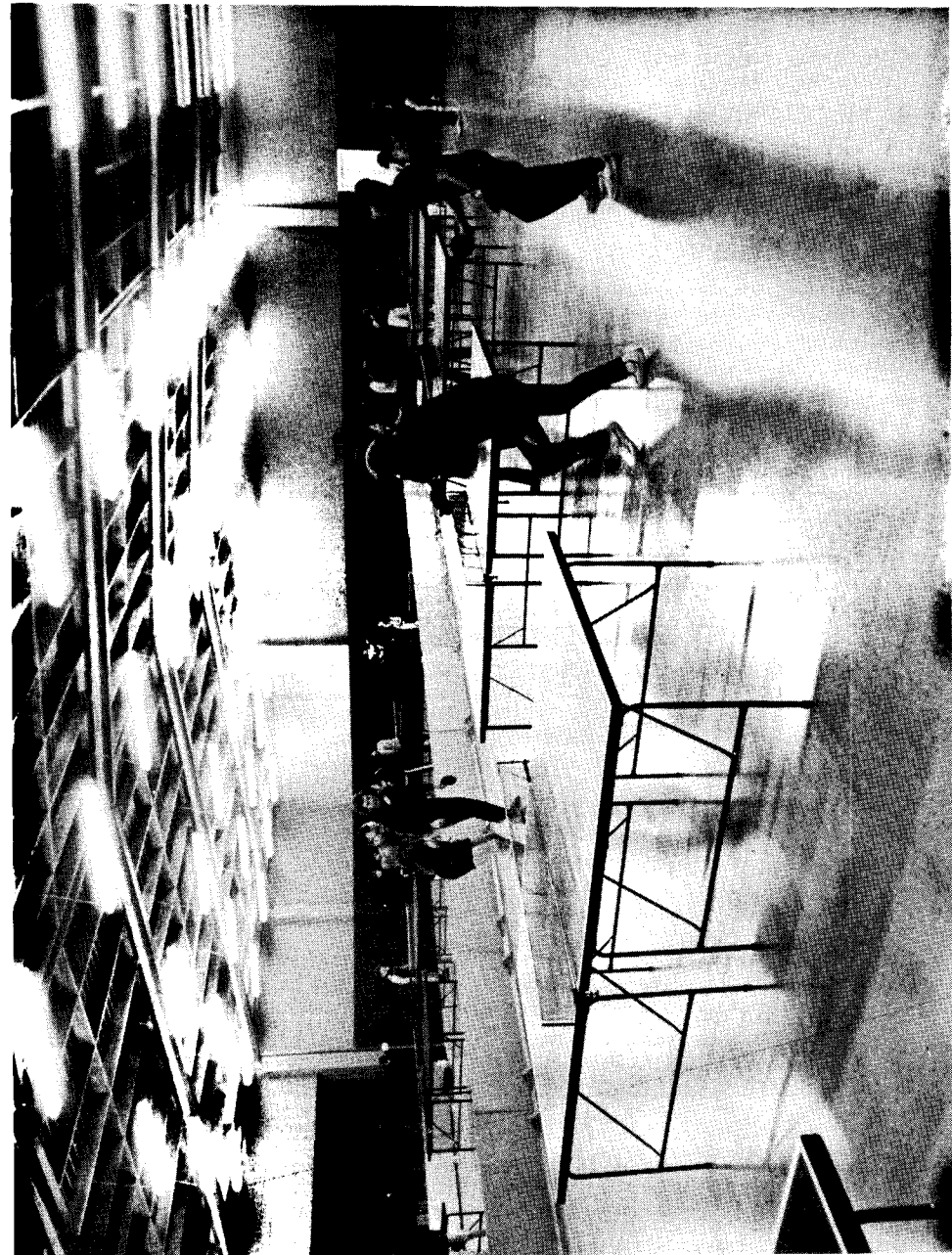

TREASURER'S REPORT

Soundness was maintained in the financial position under review. The Association carried out normal activities but with costs being higher, a small loss was incurred.

The sending of a New Zealand senior team to the Isle of Man and Sweden for the Commonwealth and World Championships, the sending of New Zealand junior teams to Tasmania, the employment of a National Coach, and the holding of two national coaching schools and three regional coaching schools were the main events of the year. The Association has been promised a grant of \$7,000 for the National Coach and has received assistance of \$6,450 for the coaching schools. An application has been made for assistance for the trip to Sweden but no advice of support has been received at present.

For the senior team's tour, total contributions of \$14,000 were received from the players, manager and coach. For the junior tour, contributions totalling \$9,753 were received from the players and manager.

A grant of \$6,197 was received from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport to offset administration costs of \$30,721, substantially up from \$24,463 last year. The net cost of the tour to Isle of Man and Sweden was \$12,798 and to Tasmania \$4,881 - up on \$4,358 last year. The net cost of the coaching programme was \$1,830.

Income this year rose by \$12,072, due mainly to another successful raffle raising \$10,000 as provided for in the resolution passed at last March's annual general meeting, and to a one-off grant promised to offset the cost of employing the National Coach. Numbers of inter-club teams continued to drop so there has been no real increase in revenue from affiliation fees.

Net working capital decreased from \$16,581 to \$13,055, reflecting the higher costs of operations in 1985.

In May, 1985, Peter Hirst arrived from England to take up his appointment as National Coach. Personal family relocation costs have used up \$7,226 of the special fund set up to meet establishment costs for Peter. Furthermore 7/12ths of the coaching levy, \$13,733, collected in 1985 has been treated as a prepayment in these accounts. This money will be utilised in meeting the costs of the National Coach to May, 1986.

In 1986, the Association is liable to account for twelve months salaries for the Executive Officer and National Coach. The 15.5% increase to public service salaries will be passed on to these salaries and the total costs of salaries is expected to be \$44,000. Normal income and grants of \$60,000 is budgeted to be received, while total expenditure is budgeted to reach \$80,000, after setting the total cost of the 1986 coaching programme at \$43,000.

To meet the deficit of \$20,000, it is proposed to seek sponsorship for coaching and to use the balance in the National Coach Fund Reserve account. Beyond 1986, raffles and/or national levies will be required as additional income to meet costs of overseas tours and coaching programmes.

In accordance with an annual meeting decision the 1986 affiliation fees and coaching levies will increase by 16.1% (rounded to the nearest dollar) being the increase in the Consumer Price Index to 30 September, 1985.
