

TO ALL MEMBERS.

The Management Committee presents for your consideration, the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 October, 1987.

1987 was a very busy and challenging year. There were several highlights:

- The sponsorship of the secondary schools teams table tennis championship by Commercial Union Insurance;
- The first year of the operation of the NZTTA National Council;
- Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson qualified to represent New Zealand at the 1988 Olympic Games;
- Barry Griffiths won both the New Zealand and Australian singles titles;
- The 1st New Zealand Masters Table Tennis Championships were held;
- A ranking system based on points won at designated tournaments was introduced;
- There was a change of format for the inter-association senior teams championships;
- The junior age groups were changed;
- Planning has commenced for the introduction of Kiwi Table Tennis;
- On the international scene, the third president in the history of the ITTF was elected.

#### COMMERCIAL UNION SPONSORSHIP

Without doubt, THE highlight would have to be the sponsored inaugural Commercial Union Secondary Schools championship. The sponsorship by Commercial Union Insurance is worth \$40,000 over a three year period and is the first ongoing substantial sponsorship obtained by NZTTA.

The interest generated in the first year was quite exciting and there is every confidence that it will be the catalyst for very strong secondary schools competitions throughout the country. Already some associations are planning their 1988 programme. It would seem that some are planning a competition with the winner being the association team to proceed to the regional play-offs, whilst others intend holding the Commercial Union play-offs earlier in the season and using that tournament as a starting point for a local competition.

The Association records its appreciation to Mr Bill Bean, Sales and Marketing Manager for Commercial Union, for his encouragement, advice and practical assistance during all the stages of the championship.

#### NATIONAL COUNCIL

Meetings of the National Council provide a forum to discuss national and regional issues and the presence and contribution of the representative of each of the six regions should provide sufficient information and debate to enable balanced decisions to be made.

All affiliated associations are part of the network which comprises the New Zealand family of table tennis - the NZTTA - so, as such, they all have a duty to contribute. The bonus is that in contributing they also share in what is happening in other regions. It is essential, therefore, that each association makes full use of their Regional Councillor by maintaining regular contact either by direct contact or by regional meetings.

There is quite a difference between the administration of a district association and that of the national body - the latter requires a different perception. In view of this, the first year of the operation of the National Council can be recorded as being very successful. Enthusiasm and a sense of purpose was evident at the four meetings which were held.

Several initiatives were started and these will be reported on under their separate headings.

At the time of preparing this report, advice had been received that two Councillors had been re-elected by their respective regions. Continuity of representation at this stage in the life of the National Council should be to the advantage of New Zealand table tennis.

#### **ADMINISTRATION**

The Management Committee met on ten occasions between 18 March and 10 December (the last meeting prior to the preparation of this report) and the attendance record was as follows:

Life member Dick Rassie attended one meeting.

A personal computer was purchased at what was considered a good price. The availability of the facility is leading to the streamlining of some procedures and, consequently, greater efficiency.

Advice has been received that the rental of our office in the Sports House complex will rise by 146% from 1 December, 1987. Although this is a large increase, alternatives which were considered in some depth were less attractive.

With a few exceptions, the number of inter-club teams continues to decline. This is a cause of grave concern to the Management Committee as affiliation fees and coaching levies are based on these team numbers. The question must be addressed whether the number of winter inter-club teams is a true barometer of the table tennis activity within each association.

It is certainly apparent that a different base must be considered and adopted in setting the levies payable to NZTTA to ensure a realistic income. It is unreal that the levies per team increase and yet the total revenue to NZTTA from this source, after allowing for inflation, actually decreases!

A logical answer could be to levy all players a registration fee as is done in most other sports. An alternative could be to change the emphasis completely to levies based on the current year's activities.

Through an initiative of the National Council, a remit will be presented to the Annual Meeting for the consideration of delegates.

It is very sad to have to report the disaffiliation of the Poverty Bay Association, the sole reason for which was the high level of fees payable to NZTTA through affiliation fees, coaching levies, national lottery guarantee and AGM delegates expenses. Numerically, Poverty Bay is a small association and the bulk of their revenue comes from the younger age group. The sadness is tempered a little by the comment of the President of the Poverty Bay Association that after they have regrouped and reorganised, they hope to reaffiliate.

There are other associations which are likely to be similarly affected so it is vital that the method of levying fees be addressed as a matter of urgency.

#### DEVELOPMENT

The 1986 Annual Report set out a proposal to invite two or three associations to take part in a pilot development scheme, custom made for each association. Four associations were approached and a meeting held with each by the Executive Officer and Director of Coaching. Of the four, one association, Nelson, accepted the challenge and THEY made a conscious decision to target three activities for 1987. That they achieved two of the three was a tremendous achievement and they are to be congratulated on their initiative which resulted in an increase of about 30% in their playing numbers. Well done, Nelson!

#### Table Tennis Week

An initiative of the National Council is to promote a table tennis week at the beginning of each season. The original concept was to have a New Zealand wide campaign during a specific week at the start of the season but, because some associations start earlier than others, the promotion in 1988 will be regionalised.

A sub-committee is preparing a Resource File which will be ready for distribution to associations through the respective Regional Councillors in early February. It is proposed that each Regional Councillor will convene a meeting of his member associations to discuss and co-ordinate the week's activities.

#### Tournament Calendar

It had been intended to prepare a tournament calendar in diary form and have copies available for sale to players. As some dates have not yet been finalised it is likely that this project may have to be deferred for introduction in the 1989 season.

#### Magazine

At the last annual meeting it was agreed that investigations be made with a view to producing a national table tennis magazine. Efforts to obtain an editor have been unsuccessful. However, the National Council has agreed that if sponsors can be obtained to cover the costs of each issue, periodical newsletters be published. Already, two sponsors have indicated a willingness to become involved.

#### NATIONAL LOTTERY

The commitment of the guarantee system ensures that the budgeted profit is available to the National Body. For those associations which sell, or exceed, their allocation of tickets a useful profit also results.

NZTTA income benefitted by \$19,598.

The 1987 lottery was again organised by Robert Gross on behalf of the Counties Association. We, again, express our grateful thanks to him for a job well done.



#### HILLARY COMMISSION FOR RECREATION AND SPORT

This Commission came into existence on 1 April, 1987, and replaced the Ministry of Recreation and Sport and the Council for Recreation and Sport. It will be the Body to which future applications for grants will be made.

As the Commission has been in existence for a short time, it is difficult to judge and comment on the direction it seems to be taking. We are hopeful that profits from lotto will provide a larger pool of money for funding sport than was the case through the National Projects Scheme.

#### ASSEMBLY FOR SPORT

The Assembly for Sport can, perhaps, best be described as the Parliament for Sport. It will represent the interests of sport in representations to the Hillary Commission and to Government. Your Executive Officer was a member of the Assembly sub-committee which prepared submissions on funding for sport which were made to the Hillary Commission.

#### OLYMPIC SOLIDARITY COURSE

A course funded by Olympic Solidarity for Oceania members was organised by the Australian Table Tennis Association and held at the NSW Academy for Sport, Narrabeen, Sydney, from  $21-31~{\rm May}$ .

Each member country was invited to send representatives to the course and, in the case of New Zealand, airfares were paid for the equivalent of one and one-half persons. Ron Menchi and Ron Garrett used these fares and David Cook also attended at his expense. In addition, Ken Wilkinson, in his capacity as President of the Oceania Table Tennis Federation, and Peter Hirst attended. They were both included among the principal lecturers.

The course covered general administration, marketing, tournament administration and control, umpiring and coaching.

In his report, Ron Menchi summed up the course with the comments:

"In summing up my impressions of the course, I feel that perhaps too much was attempted to be covered and one tended to feel a little 'punch drunk' with the amount of information which was passed on. Because of changes made to the original schedules, the programme seemed to jump around with no logical sequence. Altogether, the plusses far outweighed the negatives. The fixture in many respects was successful and justified the considerable amount of work carried out by the organising committee."

#### ITTF BIENNIAL GENERAL MEETING

Our representative at this meeting which was held during the World championships was Geoff Rau. Items of interest from the meetings included:

- In a ballot, Ichiro Ogimura of Japan became only the third President of the ITTF.
   He defeated H Roy Evans of Wales who had held the position for 20 years.
- Mr Evans accepted the position of Life President of the ITTF.
- NZTTA Life Member Ken Wilkinson was elected as the ITTF Council member representing the Oceania region.

- The 40th World championships will be held in Dortmund, West Germany, in 1989.
- The current membership of the ITTF is 130 countries.
- 91 associations were represented at the ITTF meeting and a further 16 associations were represented by proxy.

Changes were made to the service rule and the regulations regarding towelling. The five minute optional break after the third game of a five game match has been eliminated.

The wording of the relevant rules and regulations which come into effect in New Zealand from 1 January, 1988, is as follows:

- 3.6.4 A Good Service The server shall then project the ball, by hand only and without imparting any spin so that it rises at least 16cm after leaving the palm of the free hand.
- 3.13.2 Play shall be continuous throughout a match except that any player shall be entitled to claim an interval of not more than two minutes between successive games.
- 4.4.4.1.1 The umpire may allow the shortest reasonable pauses for such purposes as towelling, but only after every five points; towels should be kept near the umpire.

#### RANKING SYSTEM

The 1987 annual meeting agreed to the introduction of rankings based on certain specified tournaments with points being allocated for expected and unexpected wins, weighted according to the classification of each tournament with bonus points being awarded to the winners, runners-up, losing semi-finalists and losing quarter-finalists.

The designated tournaments included the Top 12's, North and South Island championships, Inter-association teams championships, New Zealand championships plus one Open championship from each of the six regions.

The National Council decided that seedings for these tournaments would be taken from the latest ranking list at the time the seedings were required. Overseas players would receive separate consideration.

As the rankings are updated in the order that tournaments are played it is essential that copies of the result sheets are forwarded to NZTTA immediately after each tournament. This did not always happen in 1987.

There were critics of the system but, like most innovations, some hiccups were to be expected. Some anomalies became apparent and a remit will be presented to the annual meeting to try and overcome some of them.

Critics should focus their attention on the philosophy of the system rather than the nuts and bolts. If the philosophy seems right then the mechanics of the system will gradually evolve.

#### PLAYER OF YEAR AWARD

BARRY JOHN GRIFFITHS (Counties) was named the 1987 Player of the Year.

Outstanding achievements included the following:

New Zealand Championships: WINNER men's singles, men's doubles and mixed

doubles.

Australian Championships: WINNER me

WINNER men's singles and men's doubles. WINNER Oceania zone men's singles qualifying

tournament.

WINNER (with Peter Jackson) Oceania zone men's

His winning of the New Zealand and Australian men's singles titles is the first time this feat has been accomplished since Bob Jackson in 1956.

They will each be known as the "Whitcoull's Cup."

It is relevant to record, here, our appreciation to Mr Athol Attwood who takes a great interest in the condition of the various cups and shields as he comes in contact with them - usually as a result of wins by members of the Hamilton Association.

#### GOLDEN JUBILEES

Congratulations are extended to the Southland, South Canterbury and Canterbury Associations, all of which celebrated their Golden Jubilees in 1987.

#### LI CHUN LI

The Manawatu Association is to be congratulated on their initiative in sponsoring Li Chun Li, a world class player, as their official coach. She toured New Zealand as a member of the Chinese junior table tennis team in 1980 and has been a member of the Chinese National squad since 1981.

#### OBITUARY

It is with sadness that we record the death of LAURA MARIE HORN (nee Hughes) who died on 2 February, 1987. She won the New Zealand women's singles title in 1938 and the mixed doubles titles in 1934 and 1935.

We extend our condolences to the family of Mrs Horn and to the relatives of other table tennis personalities who died during the year.



#### ADOPTED BALL

In accordance with the decision of the 1987 annual meeting the adopted ball for 1988 and 1989 will be the NITTAKU 3-star ball, the New Zealand agents for which are John Vaughan & Co Ltd, Wellington. This ball will be used for all National tournaments, coaching schools and for any international contests held in New Zealand. For all other fixtures, associations have the choice of table tennis balls which have been approved by the NZTTA.

#### INTERNAL PROGRAMME

A full programme of National tournaments was held.

- South Island championships hosted by Otago 13-14 June.
- North Island Championships hosted by Auckland 10-12 July.
- 1st NZ Masters championships hosted by Auckland 12-15 July.
- New Zealand championships including the senior and junior inter-association teams championships, individual events and Inter-Island contests hosted by Canterbury from 29 August to 6 September.
- The final of the Commercial Union Secondary Schools championship was hosted by Hutt Valley 18-20 September.
- Primary/Intermediate schools teams championships: The South Island tournament hosted by Otago 19 September; The North Island tournament hosted by Hutt Valley on 3 October. The New Zealand final hosted by Otago on 11 November.
- The TSP Under 18 Boys' and Girls' National coaching school hosted by Hamilton 15-17 May.
- The TSP Under 15 Boys' and Girls' National coaching school hosted by Manawatu 13-15 May.
- Top 12 tournaments were held as follows:

Senior men: Hosted by Auckland 6-7 June;

Hosted by Counties 17-18 October.

Hosted by Kapiti 9 May; Senior women:

Hosted by Hutt Valley 17 October.

Under 19 Boys: Hosted by Otago 15 June.

Under 19 Girls: Hosted by Auckland 9 July.

Under 15 Boys: Hosted by Manawatu 13 May.

Under 15 Girls: Hosted by Manawatu 13 May. (Both the under 15 tournaments were held in conjunction with the

National coaching school.)

The North Island championships were notable for several features which should be shared:

(a) While the tournament was called 'The Air New Zealand North Island Open Table Tennis Championships' it was interesting to note that sponsorship to a total value of \$1,800 had been obtained for different events and these were listed in the programme. As a public relations exercise, photos of the winners receiving the sponsored prize were sent to each sponsor.

- (b) One of the most talked about features was the use of specially made umpires stands with flip score charts. As a spectator aid, their effect was quite dramatic. An added bonus was that they assisted the tournament organisers in knowing the progress of each match.
- (c) Publicity to newspapers and radio stations was made more efficient by the installation of a facsimile machine in the stadium.

The New Zealand Championships were titled 'The 1987 Placemakers New Zealand Table Tennis Championships. NZTTA Liaison Officer Ron Menchi concluded his report with the comments:

"The 1987 Placemakers NZ Championships was notable for two major innovations. A new system was used to determine seedings and a new format for the inter-association teams championships was tried. Were they successful? Players and administrators have some time to debate the merits of the changes."

1st New Zealand Masters Championship. If the enthusiasm generated by these championships is a guide, then a separate veterans championships will become a permanent fixture in the NZ table tennis calendar. Over 100 players competed and this included a strong contingent from Australia.

An open meeting was held and an Advisory Committee was formed comprising Ray Rowland (Manawatu) as chairman, Rhys Morris (Hamilton) as secretary and Thelma May (Canterbury) and Bob Lassen (Auckland) as members.

Because of the number of Australians present, a friendly international was held prior to the commencement of the tournament.

The Commercial Union Secondary Schools championship finals featured much table tennis of a very high standard. This was especially so in the final contest between Hutt Valley High School and Westlake Boys' High School. The winners, Hutt Valley High School became the first holder of the magnificient Commercial Union Trophy and each member of the winning team received a miniature of the trophy as a permanent memento.

The final afternoon was attended by several executives of Commercial Union and their associated company, National Mutual. The General Manager of Commercial Union, Mr J S Lowcay, presented the prizes and certificates. Prior to the commencement of the tournament, all players and team managers were presented with a tee shirt, sweat top and training pants. The Tournament Manager requested that all umpires wear the sweat top and the uniformity added to the image of the tournament.

Our thanks and congratulations are due to the Hutt Valley Association for arranging about 24 billets for the visiting players and officials and for looking after them during their stay.

It had also been our intention to send a team to the Asian junior championships which were originally scheduled to be held in Indonesia immediately following the Australian junior championships. Arrangements were cancelled because we were unable to obtain confirmation from Indonesia. Subsequently, the dates and venue were changed.

1988 Olympic Games. New Zealand was represented at the Oceania zone qualifying tournaments by Malcolm Darroch, Barry Griffiths, Peter Jackson, Maxine Goldie, Ann Gyongyos and Sarah Sandley.

Through the efforts of Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson, New Zealand will be represented in the table tennis section of the 1988 Olympic Games. Barry won the men's singles tournament and he and Peter Jackson won the men's doubles tournament. Congratulations are extended to Barry and Peter. They will become part of New Zealand table tennis history as being the New Zealanders who first competed in table tennis events at an Olympic Games.

Peter Hirst has been named as the Manager/Coach of our team.

In addition, Tony Darroch, an International Umpire, has been appointed by the Oceania Table Tennis Federation as the New Zealand representative on the Oceania umpires panel which will officiate at the Games.

#### WHERE TO NOW?

The primary purpose of an Annual Report is to report on the activities which took place during the year under review. Because our activities are on-going, it is also an appropriate time to share with members the concerns of the Management Committee for the continued development of the sport.

The aims of the NZTTA can be summed up as being to promote the sport of table tennis and to give all players the opportunity to reach their full playing potential.

Table tennis, like most sports, is a numbers game. The larger the base, the better the chances of producing top class players with a measure of continuity. The larger the numbers, the better the revenue base which is established to help achieve the objectives of clubs, district associations and the National Association.

The needs of associations can vary for as many reasons as there are associations. However, one fact is applicable to all - nobody can successfully do it on their own. Everybody can learn from others and within New Zealand there are a lot of very able and knowledgeable administrators. All this expertise needs to be harnessed and shared.

Players compete against each other on the table but this is, really, the end product of the facilities, know-how and planning which enabled the competition to take place. In other words, competition is the end product of the 'system' which has been established. Whilst the structure and system are an essential ingredient, they need to be sufficiently flexible to meet the needs and aspirations of people not only today, but in the next few years.

Table tennis needs the commitment, planning and the flexibility to move with the times.

Administrators must be positive and dynamic - even entrepreneurial - but above all, realistic. A measure of realism can be achieved through planning. Not that the planning needs to be so detailed that its purpose is lost in the maze.

The survival of most clubs and associations revolves around a relatively small number of committed persons, many of whom have been involved for a number of years. They can, generally, be classified into four categories:

- (a) Those who have done their own 'thing' for so long that they have developed 'tunnel' vision and are so entrenched in their ways that it is difficult to get them to change. They are comfortable in what they do because it has 'worked' in the past.
- (b) Administrators who can see the need for change but become frustrated through lack of support and negative reactions in initiating changes and drop out of the administrative scene.
- (c) Those who are keen to assist but, because they aren't encouraged and helped, also drop out through frustration. They weren't given ideas on WHAT to do and HOW to do it.
- (d) Those who become 'tired' but stay on rather than see the club or association 'fold.' They become more like caretakers and so preserve the status quo.

All these people can offer either knowledge, ideas or enthusiasm. If all these talents can be harnessed, then progress will be made in establishing an on-going supply of administrators, none of whom should have such a work load as to be burnt out within a short period of time.

A more professional approach is required at all levels of table tennis activity. Professional as in the way things are planned and done, not necessarily in the sense that people have to be paid. Sports such as table tennis will, in the forseeable future, continue to rely greatly on volunteer administrators. They have a vital role to play in the healthy growth and development of our sport.

Simon Barnett prepared an excellent marketing report for NZTTA, copies were forwarded to associations in April, 1986, and extracts from it were included in the 1986 Annual Report.

How many people in your association have read it?

Among the many relevant comments in that report was the statement 'TABLE TENNIS IS NOT OWED A POPULAR FOLLOWING BY SOCIETY - THERE IS NOTHING INTRINSICALLY SPECIAL ABOUT TABLE TENNIS.'

It follows from this that if table tennis people do nothing, then nothing will happen. Things will only happen if we MAKE them happen. We must, therefore, PLAN THE WORK AND WORK THE PLAN.

Whatever initiatives emanate from the National Council or Management Committee are doomed unless the rest of the 'family' network pick them up and run with them.

We need to get the base firmly in place. Who ever heard of a topping-off ceremony on a multi-story building before the foundations were laid?

Our base is, surely, a supply of administrators and forward planning to make things happen!

A positive environment needs to be created to recruit administrators and train them in WHAT to do and HOW to do it. They need to be encouraged to try new ideas. Does it matter if some ideas don't quite work at the first attempt. It is only by experimenting that progress will be made and new ideas come to fruition.

Would your association be prepared to fund the cost of two forward looking administrators, one of whom could be the secretary, to a weekend seminar to share their knowledge, problems and successes with other association administrators? Seminars are held for coaches. Is it not equally, or more, important for administrators to get together?

#### CONCLUSION

We can only reiterate that the future of table tennis is in the hands of players and administrators. There is little point in bemoaning the decline in inter-club team numbers if we sit back and do nothing. Certainly there are problems but wherever there are problems there are solutions!

After his election as President of the ITTF, Ichiro Ogimura was quoted as saying "I really believe in the superiority of our sport. It is something like running the 50 metres dash and playing chess and bridge at the same time. It is an extremely athletic and intelligent sport. I cannot accept a situation in which it is regarded as only a minor sport. The fact that we are among the most recent sports to join the Olympic movement doesn't mean that we have to be humbly grateful for acceptance. Of course we are proud to be part of the Olympic family but we have earned our place there by innate virtues of our sport and the fact that we were one of the top three sporting federations in the 1970's in the number of affiliated member associations. And now with 133 countries in membership of our Federation it is still one of the most widespread in popularity.

 $\,$  Mr  $\,$  Ogimura believes that the time is right for changes to be made. "If we have a rigid conception of what table tennis is or should be we will never make progress."

#### REPORT OF THE NEW ZEALAND DIRECTOR OF COACHING

#### Selections

#### Non-Playing Captains

Martin Duffy (Otago), David Jackson (Auckland), Alan Pedley (Counties), Geoff Rau (Counties), Peter Hirst (Director of Coaching.) Kerry Lewis (Auckland) also assisted.

Special mention must be made of the non-playing captains who travelled to the Australian Junior championships as they paid 100% of their costs for the privilege of looking after other peoples children.

Because New Zealand is geographically isolated, national teams need to travel to other countries more often to measure their standard against that of players of other countries. It does not follow that a player who is good in New Zealand will perform well overseas. Competing against and observing what is done in other countries allows information to be brought back to New Zealand, so the more people who travel, the more information which reaches the New Zealand structure.

Overseas teams need to tour New Zealand so that a much broader section of the table tennis community can be exposed to and, therefore, gain a better appreciation of world trends in table tennis. It is not necessary that the touring teams be the world's best — they could be junior and/or club teams to show the many facits that table tennis has to offer.



It is relevant to compare table tennis with other sports such as squash, rugby and netball at which New Zealand traditionally performs well at the international level. Communist countries plough enormous resources into sport as do countries with an abundance of private money e.g. U.S.A., but these countries, generally, do not take squash, rugby and netball seriously. World championships in these sports attract entries from up to about twenty countries whereas table tennis attracts in excess of 80 countries. Many of the table tennis playing countries maintain permanent squads and international competitive experience is gained on a regular basis.

At the last Commonwealth table tennis championships, Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson gained for New Zealand a men's doubles medal and this was achieved against countries such as Hong Kong, Canada, India, Nigeria, England, (all full time players) Pakistan, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Australia, (all part-time players) Guernsey, Jersey, Isle of Man, Trinidad, and Jamaica.

More recently, Barry Griffiths won one of the Oceania men's singles places and he and Peter Jackson won the Oceania men's doubles slot which gives them the right to represent New Zealand at the 1988 Olympic Games. This highlights the standard of New Zealand table tennis despite limited financial resources. Congratulations to Barry and Peter.

The resources of the NZ Table Tennis Association are not in hard cash but in it's people and their expertise. We can only operate within the constraints of our finances and one of the sad consequences of this is that our New Zealand representatives have to pay for the privilege of representing their country.

#### Regional Coaching

This year saw the beginning stages of a Regional structure. The country is divided into six regions and the aim is to have two coaches appointed to each region - one to have responsibility for helping coaches and the other to have responsibility for development squads. The overall aim is to have the help and measure at every level by all associations having representation in each regional squad. In turn, National squads will be selected from regional squads. In some areas the programme is rolling with success and in others, activity has been limited. Nobody would expect things to work immediately but they will continue to evolve as more coaches become available. A start has been made in the right direction.

#### Ranking System

The new ranking system passed by the last Annual General Meeting was instituted. The system is not without its critics who, generally, fall into the following categories:

- (a) Those who do not understand what it is all about;
- (b) People who chose not to play in the selected events;
- (c) People who think they are better than they are.

After all, the benefits are that it is based on facts, not on someone's opinion. It is far better for players to be judged on what they prove they can do rather than what somebody else believes they can do. Players, as always, retain the FREEDOM OF CHOICE as to whether or not they play in the designated events. The system works for the majority of players, not an isolated one or two. Over the last few months the National Council, Management Committee and selected individuals have monitored the developments and have decided to suggest to the next Annual General Meeting some fine-tuning designed to remove some anomalies which became apparent.

#### National Coaching Schools

The TSP National Coaching Schools for Under 18 and Under 15 boys' and girls' were hosted by the Hamilton and Manawatu Associations. It is not an easy task to arrange billets and activities outside the coaching time for 48 young players. Thanks are offered to the officials of the Hamilton and Manawatu Associations for a job well done.

#### General Coaching Activities

Coaches/ helpers courses, personal performance courses and schools decomonstrations were held. These will be extended in 1988 to link a developmental visit to each association for non-representative players through activities chosen by each association. This is really to help the so called social player who has a desire to improve (remember the help and the measure.)

Developmental meetings were held with some associations to try and stimulate development. Some of these, especially in the South Island, were very successful.

#### Kiwi Table Tennis

Perhaps the most exciting project for table tennis is the development of Kiwi Sport which is a joint venture between the Hillary Commission for Recreation and Sport, the Education Department and the sports bodies who choose to become involved.

Kiwi Sport is a modified sport with modified rules specially designed for children between the ages of 9 and 12. It is to be introduced in a fun way without the restrictions of the conventional games as adopted for adults.

A special teachers/helpers manual for KIWI TABLE TENNIS has been prepared and submitted to the Education Department for approval. Emphasis has been placed on the development of skills to ensure that competitive sport is introduced in a non-competitive situation. To supplement the syllabus a Skills Award Scheme has been produced to cover six levels of achievement.

The children will be required to participate in a variety of Kiwi sports to enable a wide range of physical and mental skills to be developed. This should ensure that we will have every opportunity to promote KIWI TABLE TENNIS.

#### Coaches Association of New Zealand

A close working relationship has been created with CANZ in the development of a coaching award scheme that will allow for coach education at five levels. This will include general coaching principles as well as the sports specific needs.

Coach education spreads much further than just New Zealand. During the year an Olympic Solidarity funded course for the Oceania region was hosted by the Australian TTA at the New South Wales Academy of Sport, Narrabeen, Sydney. The course covered coaching and administration and the principal speakers included Mn Hans Giesecke (Hon Treasurer of the ITTF), Mr Ken Wilkinson (President of the Oceania TTF), Mr Zhou Lansun (National Coach of the Australian TTA), Mr Ron Monte (National Coaching Director of the Australian TTA) and myself.

This course resulted in an invitation for me to conduct a coaches course in New Caledonia to coincide with the international invitation tournament which was held in that country.

The Oceania Table Tennis Federation is now committed to coach education throughout the Oceania region.

I plan in the coming year to initiate a publication of news items and technical articles. This should help coaches to appreciate the background information as to how we arrive at the present level of expertise in addition to setting the direction for future trends.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Careful management on a monthly basis to the 1987 budget has resulted in the Association's finances being slightly depleted at 31 October, 1987. Not all normal activities were able to be carried out in these difficult times financially applicable to all smaller sports. Net working capital has decreased from \$13,577 in 1986 by \$3,593 to \$9,984 at the end of 1987.

For the main activities of the year, four junior teams were sent to Brisbane, senior teams were sent to India (World's), New Caledonia, Brisbane and the Olympic Qualifying tournament. Two National coaching schools were held in Palmerston North and Hamilton. The costs of overseas tours were, again, mainly borne by the players. The Association was able to grant \$4,800 towards these tours.

A grant of \$5,875 was received from the Ministry of Recreation and Sport (final) to offset administration costs of \$45,500, substantially up on \$32,159 last year. A grant of \$14,000 was also received from the Ministry to offset the National coaching programme costs of \$52,495, up from \$42,513 last year. Further outside grants were received from Commercial Union sponsorship, \$5,000, and Simon Barnett, \$5,000, which reduced the administration and coaching costs respectively.

Income from fees and levies increased from \$38,573 to \$47,858 solely through the raffle levy being set at \$20,000 instead of \$10,000 at the last annual general meeting. The 1988 affiliation fee and coaching levy will increase by 9.9% (CPI figure, less GST component at 30.9.87.) There seems to be no arrest to the inter-club team numbers falling. A new method of funding involving capitiation levies or base fees per association plus activity fees for all association competitions and tournaments needs to be urgently installed to bring a realistic income to the National Body.

For 1988, the Association has received a grant from the Hillary Commission of \$20,000 towards administration and coaching. Further urgent financial assistance is being sought from the Hillary Commission to meet a \$14,000 deficit budgeted for the cost of maintaining normal activities and the introduction of Kiwi Sport. Known increases for 1988 are rent by \$4,500, salaries by 7% and 10% increases for the inflation factor.

Unless the 1988 annual general meeting alters the method of raising income from fees and levies to become effective in 1988, a further raffle needs to be organised to raise at least \$20,000 after GST for the Association.

A further factor that affects our finances is that one-eleventh of all income (except interest) is payable as GST to the Inland Revenue Department. The 1987 income from grants, sponsorships and raffle proceeds has been netted down in the accounts, after allowing for GST to be paid. Government has announced that the rate for GST will increase to 12.5% from 1 October, 1988.

#### ASSOCIATION AWARD - ARTHUR MEACHEN MEMORIAL CUP

This award is presented to the association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the Open and senior age group individual events at the New Zealand championships.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 and 2 respectively for the Open and age group events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

The 1987 winner was **HUTT VALLEY** Association whose players scored 10 points, followed by Counties and Canterbury with 8 points, Auckland and Wellington each with 6, Manawatu 4, Hamilton 2 and Waitemata 1 point.

#### ASSOCIATION AWARD - BILL HURREY CUP

This award is presented to the association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the junior individual events at the New Zealand championships.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the junior events and 2 points for the cadet events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

Three associations, WEST COAST, RUTT VALLEY AND NORTHLAND shared the cup for 1987 with 12 points each. They were followed by Otago with 8 points, Auckland and Hamilton each with 6 points and Wellington 3.

#### ALAN AND EDNA MCCALLUM JUNIOR UMPIRING AWARDS

The 1987 winners were **ALAN HILL**, and **RADHA VIVEKANANTHAN** both of Manawatu. The judges also named Carl Herbert and Russell Dickey (Hamilton) as equal second in the boys and Shelley Neal (Auckland) second in the girls.

The cups were presented to the winners by Mrs Edna McCallum.

Six associations nominated 9 boys and 8 girls for the awards.

In their report the judges, Messrs F O'Gorman and L Hines, commented:

"The finalists were as good as in previous years, but the Under 15's were much superior to the Under 19's. They were judged on both singles and doubles in Under 15's and Under19's.

"The judges were disappointed that many associations did not nominate anyone and considered that the Under 19 umpiring in both boys and girls was of a poor standard. As both the winners are from the Under 15's, the judges hope that the Under 19's show a marked improvement in 1988. It is recommended by the judges that the judging be confined to the junior teams events. It does not mean that only team members can take part."

"With occasional exceptions, the standard of dress and behaviour was found to be pleasingly high. In particular, the commendable high standard of the women's teams made the judging particularly difficult.

"The judges feel that the rules regarding appearance would benefit from updating and recommend that the method of scoring be re-examined with a view to simplification.

"It was decided that no purpose would be served by detailing the points of the non-winning teams."

#### OCEANIA OLYMPIC QUALIFYING TOURNAMENTS

Through negotiation, the ITTF had agreed with the International Olympic Committee the entry size of the various table tennis events for the 1988 Olympic Games and, in turn, the ITTF had decided how these entries would be allocated. Oceania was allocated two places in the men's singles and one each in the women's singles, women's doubles and men's doubles. There was also a provision that for the doubles one of the partners be one of the singles qualifiers.

The Oceania Table Tennis Federation members agreed that each eligible country be represented at the qualifying tournaments by three men and two women and that the format of the singles tournaments be three round robins played over three days with a full round being played each day. Each player thus played the other players three times.

As the doubles combinations had to comprise one of the singles players, a doubles qualifying tournament was only needed for the men and only if the singles qualifiers were from different countries.

The Oceania Qualifying Tournament was hosted by the Australian Table Tennis Association in Coburg, Victoria, from 14-17 August, and the countries represented were New Zealand and Australia.
