



TO ALL MEMBERS.

The Management Committee presents for your consideration, the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 October, 1989.

1989 was notable for several highlights:

- The first ever meeting of representatives of the New Zealand and Australian Table Tennis Associations;
- New Zealand competed in the Commonwealth and World championships;
- The 3rd Commercial Union Secondary Schools Teams championship was held;
- New Zealand tour by Guo Yuehua and Daniel Suchanek;
- Grant aid funding was received from the Hillary Commission;
- Financial assistance was received from the NZ Sports Foundation;

#### VISIT OF DELEGATION FROM AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

Following a proposal from the Australian TTA, it was agreed that a meeting be held between representatives of the New Zealand and Australian Associations to discuss matters of mutual interest and concern. The meeting stemmed from a perception that there had been a deterioration in the 'official' relationship between the two associations an example of which was the saga which excluded our teams from competing in the Australian 1989 Junior teams championships.

The meeting took place in Wellington 15-17 October. New Zealand was represented by Ron Menchi, Peter Hirst and Merv Allardyce whilst Australia was represented by Laurie Wharmby (President), Keith Bowler (Vice President) and John Ostermeyer (National Executive Director.) Also in attendance was Ken Wilkinson in his capacities of President of the Oceania Table Tennis Federation and ITTF Vice President for Oceania. Keith Bowler is also Executive Director of the Oceania TTF and ITTF Council member for Oceania.

Wide ranging discussions were held and the following is a summary of the more significant topics which were covered.

#### Participation in Australian/New Zealand Senior Championships

Australia formed a sub-committee to investigate all matters concerning their championships and competitions. One of the proposals, if adopted, would mean that the current Australian Open championships would become a Closed championship. To replace their Open championships Australia indicated its intention to start an international circuit for Oceania which could include invited teams from South East Asia and the Pacific. The tournament could be held over an extended weekend and the planned starting date was 1991.

From a New Zealand perspective, this initiative could have quite exciting possibilities for us. There could be the opportunity for New Zealand to host a similar tournament either before or following the Australian event which would give our players a top class tournament in both New Zealand and Australia. Table tennis players and supporters would also have the opportunity of watching a top class table tennis tournament in New Zealand.

Participation in Australian/New Zealand Junior Championships

Australia advised that it is likely that the Under 15 and Under 17 championships would be continued in the current format until about 1992 when it was hoped that the Under 15 would be incorporated into a National Schools competition. The Australian delegates were of the opinion that New Zealand would be able to enter teams in the 1990 Australian Under 15 and Under 17 championships but this would need to be confirmed by the ATTA annual meeting in March, 1990.

It was also likely that the Australian Under 21 championships would become a Closed event and conducted with the senior Closed championships. It was proposed to group the Under 19 with the Under 17 as a Junior championship. Australia expressed the hope that the Under 19 and Under 17 championships could develop into an Oceania tournament.

New Zealand considered that either Australian or State teams could participate in the New Zealand teams championships. Australian representative teams would be welcome to compete but the question was raised whether Australian teams would be too strong for the NZ format where every association is entitled to enter a team in each of the various teams events. Australia is to consider the matter. If they choose not to send an Australian team then they will nominate the State team/s to compete.

#### Secondary Schools Competition

It was suggested that the winners from the two countries compete in each others national finals. In the longer term an Oceania final may be possible.

#### Coaching Camps

Australia advised that they currently have a squad of 16-17 in the Under 15 age group. It was agreed that a start for Under 15 combined coaching camps be made in January 1991 in Australia and then alternately in NZ and Australia. It was also agreed that the aim be to extend the concept into an Oceania camp.

#### Coaches Magazine

A magazine is currently prepared and circulated to Australian coaches. It was suggested that it could include input from NZ and circulated to NZ coaches as well. It was agreed that this course of action be taken and that it could develop into an Oceania magazine.

#### National Coaches Forum

The forum held in Australia in January each year could include attendance and input from NZ.

The  $\,$  NZ regional coaches seminars could include attendance and input from Australian coaches.

Arrangement could be made to include an exchange of National Directors of Coaching.

#### Formal Competition Exchanges

These were not considered a proposition if the proposed international circuit was adopted.

#### Informal Competition Exchanges

This item covered association or privately organised tours to each country. They were not considered a problem but any proposed tours would need to be approved between the NZTTA and ATTA.

#### Oceania Matters

General Observations:

- Problems of communications with the Island members. It was agreed that physical contact with Island members may be the most satisfactory solution;
- New Zealand and Australia had too big a vested interest to allow Oceania to wither and die as a separate zone.

Development Proposals:

- Coaching camps with emphasis, initially, on Under 15 players.

The starting point in Year 1 could be the Olympic Solidarity course to be held in Hamilton in May, 1990.

Year 2 could be a visit by an Oceania coach to Island members to be preceded by a reconnaissance mission by an OTTF official.

The costs of the official and coach to be a charge on OTTF.

- The extension of the ATTA coaches newsletter to become an Oceanioa one.
- Investigation into an Oceania secondary schools tournament.
- Investigation of an Oceania Youth tournament teams of 2 boys and 1 girl Under 17.

Oceania Representation on ITTF

It was agreed that the best available people should be Vice President and Council member without necessarily alternating every two years as is the current practice. Suggestions ranged from alternating every four years to longer terms. It was agreed that the continuity of a longer term should lead to more professionalism.

Future Meetings

It was agreed that meetings of this nature were most beneficial and that, initially, they should be held annually and then, perhaps, every 18 months. The next meeting would be held in Australia in October 1990.

Observations

The meeting, which was chaired by Ron Menchi, was considered well worthwhile. The atmosphere was friendly and the discussions open and frank. There seemed a genuine attempt to consider the interests of the Oceania region as it is certainly in the interests of both Australia and New Zealand to ensure that the Oceania region is developed.

From a New Zealand perspective, there was a certain amount of envy at the level of grant aid funding available to sports in Australia as compared with New Zealand.

#### NATIONAL COUNCIL

The National Council has now been in operation for three years and during the year under review it met on four occasions.

Regional Councillors have a very challenging role to perform. Whilst they need to have the ability to represent the views of their member associations they also need to have a much wider perspective of the overall needs of table tennis both nationally and internationally if the sport is to progress. New Zealand cannot insulate itself from the rest of the table tennis world and still keep up with the rest of the table tennis world and still keep up with the rest of the table tennis world. Likewise, district associations cannot insulate themselves and expect to remain as viable and progressive entities.

Although nominated, John Bower (Region 1) subsequently withdrew his nomination. It is appropriate that we record our appreciation to John for the perspective which his talents enabled him to contribute as a National Councillor.

#### ADMINISTRATION

The Management Committee met on nine occasions up to 14 December (the last meeting prior to the preparation of this report) and the attendance record was as follows:

Note 1 - Peter Hirst was on assignment overseas for one meeting.

In the last annual report it was noted that a major cause for concern was the apparent continuing decrease in the number of players who are affiliated to clubs and associations. Based on the membership returns so far received for 1989 this trend seems to have continued in some associations despite the fact that our research indicates that in excess of 20,000 table tennis bats were sold during 1989! Two conclusions can, perhaps, be drawn. The is that NZTTA is not being supplied with correct membership information and the other is that associations and clubs are not able to present the sport in a way to attract new members.

Also in the last annual report reference was made to the ever increasing work load of the Executive Director and the need for part time clerical assistance. The Executive Director's salary was increased to become a fulltime position and Mrs Deirdre Rogers was appointed as a part time assistant in February and she works an average of 15-18 hours per week.

At the instigation of the National Council it is proposed that newsletters be prepared by the Chairman from time to time. The first newsletter was circulated in November.

Commercial Union recently informed us that they would not be renewing their sponsorship of the secondary schools teams championship. Changed conditions in the insurance market have meant that their promotional objectives needed to change and the table tennis sponsorship no longer fitted their corporate strategy.

We were, naturally, disappointed with the decision. However, we record our gratitude to Commercial Union for the very good relationship we enjoyed with them during the three year term. The sponsorship enabled us to promote the secondary schools teams championship and this resulted in an increase in the number of participating schools. This can only be good for table tennis.

#### FINANCE

Whilst the proposal submitted to the 1989 annual general meeting to introduce a capitation fee on all players was rejected, the exposure which the proposal received enabled the National Council to reconsider the merits of the proposal and the matter was discussed in some depth at the September meeting. It was agreed at that meeting that the Management Committee prepare a detailed exposure draft setting out options for obtaining revenue from associations at annual levels of \$40,000, \$60,000 and \$80,000 and the outline of expenditure at each of those levels.

In preparing the draft document, the Management Committee had to keep in mind that there was division on the merits of a player capitation levy and the national raffle. An important factor was also the need for certainty of the level of revenue to enable proper planning and implementation of those plans.

The Management Committee recommended that the budgetted revenue required from associations be allocated to regions and that each Regional Councillor convene a meeting of his member associations for those associations to agree on their respective shares of the regional allocation. The National Council accepted the recommendation and agreed to an income level from associations of \$60,000. A remit will be submitted to the 1990 annual general meeting.

#### VISIT OF GUO YUEHUA AND DANIEL SUCHANEK

Negotiations which began 18 months earlier came to fruition with the arrival in New Zealand on 7 July of Guo Yuehua and Daniel Suchanek for a tour which included visits to nine associations. Guo also competed in the North Island championships.

The intention of the tour was to promote table tennis and from reports received from the host associations all were very pleased with the promotional aspect even though small losses were made in all except two centres. Newspaper cuttings received indicated that about 900cms of media publicity was obtained and this included a coloured photo in the Southland newspaper.

Barry Butler co-ordinated the South Island section of the tour and through his initiative Peter Jackson accompanied the visitors and played a match against Guo in each centre. This enabled some spectators to see for the first time a top New Zealand player and Olympic representative in action.

#### COACHING

In January, 1989, Peter Hirst resigned as our full time Director of Coaching to accept the position of Executive Director to the Coaching Association of New Zealand. He has retained the title of Director of Coaching but, understandably, he was not able to devote the same amount of time to NZTTA.

The Management Committee arranged with Peter that certain work would be done for NZTTA on a contract basis and other work would be done on a voluntary basis (in the same way as other members of the Management Committee contribute on a voluntary basis.)

It was agreed that the contract work would broadly cover:

Coach Education:
 Mainly seminars for coaches on a regional basis.

- Teacher Education:
- The promotion of Kiwi Table Tennis to Teachers and Teachers College students.
- Direct National Junior Coaching Schools as appropriate.
- Act as non-playing captain with New Zealand teams.

As a volunteer administrator he is involved in:

- Administrative work as a member of the Management Committee and National Council.
- Duties associated with being convenor of the NZ Selection panel.
- Administrative work associated with coaching e.g. technical publications, reviewing and updating manuals etc.

#### DEVELOPMENT

#### Table Talk Newsletter

Three issues of the TABLE TALK newsletter were published and sent to subscribers with a complimentary copy to associations. As there has been very little feed-back or contributions it is difficult to judge whether it is fulfilling the purpose for which it was intended. Perhaps a better indication will be obtained after the next issue when subscriptions will be due for renewal! The number of subscribers is 113 which raises the question whether there is sufficient interest to continue publication or whether it will suffer the same fate as previous attempts to establish a newsletter.

#### Kiwi Table Tennis

The Director of Coaching conducted introductory courses for teachers and Teachers College students at Waikato and Palmerston North Teachers Colleges. KiwiSport is an initiative of the Hillary Commission and although they have promoted it quite extensively they have not made the same level of funding available to national sporting bodies. The development of Kiwi Table Tennis by our associations has depended on the commitment of each association and the availability of persons to promote it during school time.

We understand that the Hawkes Bay Association received a commendation for their efforts and congratulations are extended to them.

A video tape has been prepared by the Director of Coaching in association with the Otago University. We acknowledge the sponsorship of Commercial Union in covering the cost of the copyright value of the video which will enable it to be sold at a reasonable price. The Commercial Union sponsorship is being included in the tape and on completion of this it will be available for sale.

A Skills Award scheme is still being worked on and we are still hopeful that a sponsor will be obtained. The scheme will be in six levels with the first three applicable to Kiwi Table Tennis.

The manual is to be updated to complement the videotape.

The needs of Kiwi Table Tennis are very similar to the needs of beginner players at club level so the manual, video and Skills Award scheme will be appropriate resource material for use by clubs.

Planning

A programme has been prepared for 1990 setting out the significant projects which will take place. In addition to the normal activities, it is planned to conduct a series of regional administrators seminars with contributions from outside experts.

#### NATIONAL LOTTERY

The commitment of the guarantee system ensures that the budgeted profit is available to the National Body. For those associations which sell, or exceed, their allocation of tickets a useful profit also results. The method of allocating tickets for 1989 was changed with the agreement of the annual meeting and although it seemed acceptable to most associations, some found the additional allocation a burden.

NZTTA income benefitted by \$21,124.

The 1989 lottery was again organised by Robert Gross on behalf of the Counties Association and we express our grateful thanks to him for a job well done.

#### HILLARY COMMISSION FOR RECREATION AND SPORT

Our application for National Sport Funding resulted in our receiving a grant of \$40,000 for the Commission's 1989/90 year. This allocation is at the same level as the previous year and, in accordance with our priorities, is for salaries.

A further \$2,500 was received from the International Sports Priorities Board for attendance at meetings of the ITTF and will relieve Ken Wilkinson from some of the burden of the costs which he has borne for many years in his capacity as either ITTF Vice President or Council Member for Oceania.

We have been allocated \$4,000 for Women in Sport. Initially, our intention had been to use this grant to establish a national teams championship for secondary schools girls but the conditions attached to the grant may need a rethink on this proposal.

The source of the funding from the Hillary Commission is allocations made to the Commission by the Lotteries Board. Whilst the level of funding received by NZTTA enables us to do things which we could not otherwise do, it is a cause for concern that the level has remained static even though lotto profits have increased.

We are grateful to the staff of the Hillary Commission whose advice and assistance has always been readily available.

NZ SPORTS FOUNDATION

The Sports Foundation handles all applications on behalf of the Hillary Commission for international sport funding. We maintain liaison with the Foundation for funding as appropriate.

#### NZ ASSEMBLY FOR SPORT

The Assembly for Sport plays an important role on behalf of its member national sports bodies which represent approx 1.3 million New Zealanders. It represents the interests of sport in representations to the Hillary Commission, Government and other agencies as appropriate.

Members are kept informed of the activities of the Assembly and invited to comment on the many issues which they address. Significant matters during the year have included the Government proposals to tax charitable trusts and sports bodies, the Commerce Commission involvement with the Speedway Board of Control (and the possible iomplications for all sports) and the Government proposals to ban tobacco advertising and sponsorship.

In association with the NZ Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association, the Assembly conducted an Olympic Solidarity funded course for national administrators in May. This was attended by the Executive Director.

#### OLYMPIC SOLIDARITY COURSE

NZTTA has been granted \$US30,000 funding to conduct a regional Oceania table tennis course in 1990. It is intended to invite two players under the age of 15 and a coach from each of the member countries of the Oceania region to a players and coaches course to be held in Hamilton in May.

#### PLAYER OF YEAR AWARD

PETER STUART JACKSON (Auckland) was named the 1989 Player of the Year.

Peter has a World ranking of 153, finished 29th in the Stiga World Grand Prix and is a consistent performer for New Zealand.

Although the number of nominations received was small, the submissions made on behalf of each nominee were, again, very impressive.

The 1989 Junior of the Year and the winner of the H N Ballinger Cup for the second successive year was ANDREW JOHN MARR.

#### OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

Through its affiliation to the ITTF the Oceania Federation is able to be represented at ITTF sponsored tournaments such as the Olympic Games, World Cup, World doubles cup and World teams cup. On the administrative front Oceania is directly represented on the ITTF Council through having an Oceania Vice President and Council member.

In area size it would seem to be the largest continental table tennis federation. This creates the problems of isolation and long and costly distances to travel. Combine these factors with small population groups and we have a rough picture of the challenge which is presented in communicating and developing the region.

Some of the problems are set out in the report on the meeting with delegates from the Australian TTA. It is vital that New Zealand and Australia support the efforts of the Oceania Federation in developing the Island countries.

#### TAMASU CO LTD

The contract between Tamasu Co Ltd and the New Zealand Association to outfit the national senior and junior teams with a range of BUTTERFLY tracksuits, skirts, shorts, shoes and rubbers is current to 31 December, 1990. In addition we have received the BUTTERFLY calendar with its colourful portraits of international table tennis players, diaries and a regular copy of the 'Table Tennis Report' with the English supplement.

#### JOHN VAUGHAN AND CO LTD

#### INTERNAL PROGRAMME

A full programme of National tournaments was held.

- 3rd NZ Veterans championships hosted by Manawatu 24-27 March.
- The NITTAKU Under 17 girls' and Under 15 boys' National coaching school hosted by Canterbury 22-24 April.
- The NITTAKU Under 17 boys' and Under 15 girls' National coaching school hosted by Auckland 16-18 May.
- South Island championships hosted by Southland 16-18 June.

- Air New Zealand North Island Championships hosted by Auckland 7-9 July.
- G.E.C.-Osram New Zealand championships including the senior and junior inter-association teams championships, individual events and Inter-Island contests hosted by South Canterbury from 25 August to 2 September.
- The final of the Commercial Union Secondary Schools championship was hosted by Waitemata 29 September - 1 October.
- Primary/Intermediate schools teams championships:
   The South Island tournament hosted by West Coast 16 September;
   The North Island tournament hosted by Hutt Valley on 28 October.
   The New Zealand final hosted by Hutt Valley on 29 October.
- Top 12 tournaments were held as follows:
   Under 15 Boys: Hosted by Canterbury 22 April.
   Under 15 Girls: Hosted by Auckland 16 May.
   (Both theses tournaments were held in conjunction with the respective National coaching schools.)
- The 16th World Games for the Deaf were held in Christchurch 7-17 January. NZTTA was not directly involved but because they were a World event, a summary of the results is included in this report.

3rd New Zealand Veterans Championships The principal sponsors for these championships were DB Draught, 2XS Corp and Trustbank. About 100 competitors, including seven from Australia, contributed to the great atmosphere which seems to be a feature of the Veterans championships. The organisation for the presentation of the medals at the dinner was very efficient. Winners were marshalled into order and this contributed to a relatively short but impressive ceremony which involved representatives of the sponsors.

North Island and South Island Championships. B and C Grade men's and women's singles events were introduced at these championships.

In his report on the South Island championships, the NZTTA Liaison Officer, John Beatson commented that the championships were well organised and managed throughout. "Another pleasing feature was the number of doubles pairings seen wearing matching shirts. The players concerned added value to the appeal of the matches in which they participated. It was suggested to me that associations hosting major championships might well consider awarding a prize to the best dressed doubles pair."

The North Island championships was the first major tournament conducted in New Zealand by computer. Results were fed directly into the computer and the result cards for ensuing matches were printed by the computer. The presence of Guo Yuehua added some international class to the field.

The New Zealand Championships were, again a very well conducted tournament. There was a hiccup in the teams events due to weather conditions disrupting the arrival of the Manawatu teams. Some contests had to be defaulted but those which could be were rescheduled. Competitors included a party of eleven players and two officials from New Caledonia, four from Queensland and one from South Australia. The New Caledonians made a clean sweep of the Under 13 individual events and their Under 15 girls team was undefeated in the A Grade.



The Commercial Union Secondary Schools Teams Championship finals confirmed Hutt Valley High School as the top New Zealand table tennis secondary school. For the third successive year they won the magnificent Commercial Union Trophy.

For several reasons the format of the finals was changed. Teams comprised three players but each contest comprised five matches with one player playing two singles and the other two players playing one singles each and the doubles. The consensus of opinion from the players seemed to slightly favour the format used and that it would be worth another trial.

Mr Des McDermott, the Northern Area Manager for Commercial Union, presented the trophy to the winning team and certificates to all competing players.

The finals were hosted by Waitemata and our appreciation is recorded to their members for their organisational work and arranging billets.

The Primary/Intermediate Schools Teams Tournament for 1989 was played because the Hutt Valley Association again offered to host the North Island tournament. The sad aspect was that it attracted only three teams from outside the Wellington region. The New Zealand final was also hosted by Hutt Valley on the day following the North Island tournament.

The National Council has agreed that for 1990 the tournament be conducted along the same lines as the Commercial Union Secondary Schools championship i.e. in three stages with association and regional play-offs and a national final.

These tournaments should be viewed as a very important part of the table tennis programme as they provide the link between Kiwi Table Tennis and the retention of players at the secondary school level.

#### INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

During the year New Zealand was represented at the following tournaments:

- 9th Commonwealth Championships held in Cardiff, Wales 20-26 March.
- 40th World Championships held in Dortmund, West Germany, 29 March 9 April.
- Hong Kong Open Championships 25-28 May.
- Japan Open Championships held in Tottori, 1-4 June.
- New Caledonia International Invitation Tournament held in Noumea 10-15 July.
- The Australian Masters and Veterans championships in Adelaide 14-20 October.
- The Oceania World Cup representative for 1989 was Barry Griffiths. This tournament was held in Nairobi 5-9 September.

An invitation was not received from the Australian TTA so our junior teams did not compete in the Australian Junior Teams championships.

The World Championships were in the opinion of Peter Hirst "without doubt the best organised and presented I have ever attended. They were run with true German precision. The presentation was tremendous with march in and pennant exchange for each contest. To help with television presentation the floor in the main hall was

stained red with surrounding furniture being of similar colour." In his final comments Peter reported "This was without doubt the most trouble free tour of the magnitute of the World's and Commonwealth. The teams were well balanced socially as well as professionally which led to a harmonious team spirit. It would be unfair to single out any team member as all performed with great credit to themselves and to New Zealand. I personally feel proud to be associated with them."

As well as our team, Tony Darroch attended the championships as a member of the Oceania panel of umpires which officiated.

#### OBITUARY

We record with sadness the death on 20 November, 1989, of Arnold Voice, "Mr Table Tennis" of Wairarapa. At the time of his death he was the Patron of the Wairarapa Association. Arnold and his wife were the donors of the two trophies for the NZ Under 15 Boys and Girls B Grade teams championships.

To all members of the NZ table tennis fraternity who have suffered a death in their family we extend our condolences.

#### APPRECIATION

During a year we are accorded assistance from a number of sources in addition to those who have already been mentioned. Associations and individuals have provided billets for teams, the Director of Coaching and Executive Director. To these persons, and others who have assisted, we say a very sincere 'thank you.'

#### CONCLUSION

1989 is the end of another decade. Now is the time to plan for the next ten years

As was mentioned in the 1988 annual report, we need to create a positive environment to recruit, train and retain administrators with some flair. This will create a firm platform to attract players into the table tennis family.

As ITTF President, Ichiro Ogimura, put it "If we have a rigid conception of what table tennis is or should be we will never make progress."

We commend his comments to you.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

The 1989 season turned around the association's finances from a parlous state twelve months ago. Net Working capital increased from \$633 in 1988 to \$19,931 at 31 October, 1989, due to a combination of several factors.

For the main activities of the year, our players went to the Commonwealth and World Championships in Europe, the Hong Kong and Japan Open championships and an Invitation International tournament in New Caledonia. All trips were funded by the players. Two National Junior coaching schools were held again.

A grant of \$40,000 was received from the Hillary Commission for development, coaching programmes and administration costs. \$5,000 was received in secondary schools competition sponsorship from Commercial Union Insurance Co. Finally, two years ball sponsorship of \$1,900 each were received from John Vaughan & Co Ltd.

Income from 1988/89 summer inter-club activity fees, winter activity fees, levies and lottery guarantees brought in \$69,470 as against \$58,520 for the last three items in 1988. One-off benefits in the accounts included settlement of the Jubilee account, two years ball adoption fees and some sales of equipment - total \$5,742.

There were some benefits gained from reduced expenditure. The National Director of Coaching resigned his full-time position in January, 1989, so three months salary only is reflected under salaries. Because of cash accounting, there were no bad debts. Finally, no junior teams went to Australia and the \$2,000 subsidy was saved. Offsetting these benefits is the bad news that the association now has to pay full duty and customs charges on all Butterfly equipment received to outfit the teams travelling overseas.

For 1990, the Association has again received a grant of \$40,000 from the Hillary Commission. \$4,000 will also be received to promote women in sport development if all conditions are met.

The Management Committee and National Council will be putting forward proposals for associations to contribute \$60,000 in 1990 towards the revenue of NZTTA. This amount, together with the \$40,000 grant from the Hillary Commission and other revenue items such as interest, sponsorships and sales of Table Talk and coaching videotapes should provide sufficient income in 1990 to meet budgetted expenditure of \$100,000 and any increased subsidies that managers and players going overseas to represent New Zealand deserve.
