To all Officers and Members,

The Management Committee presents for your consideration, the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 October 1991.

Some of the highlights of the year were:

- *** New Zealand hosted the Oceania Olympic Qualifying Tournament
- *** Three players qualified to represent New Zealand at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain.
- *** New Zealand teams competed in the 1991 World championships in Chiba, Japan, at which the women's team improved their world ranking from 43 to 16.
- *** Peter Jackson represented Oceania at the 555 World Cup in Kuala Lumpur.
- *** Junior and Youth teams competed in the respective Australian championships.
- *** Additional grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission enabled an expanded coach education programme to be implemented.
- *** Ken Wilkinson BEM was elected a Personal Honorary Member (Life Member) of the ITTF.

OCEANIA OLYMPIC GAMES QUALIFYING TOURNAMENTS

Highlight of the competitive year was the hosting of these tournaments in Palmerston North 16-19 August.

For the 1992 Olympic Games, which are to be played in Barcelona, Spain, the ITTF had allocated to the Oceania Continental zone places for two men and two women for the respective singles events and one place for each of the men's and women's doubles. As the doubles had to include one of the singles qualifiers, doubles qualifying tournaments were only needed if the two singles qualifiers were from different countries.

The Oceania Table Tennis Federation members agreed that each eligible country be represented at the qualifying tournaments by three men and three women and that the format of the singles tournaments be a complete round robin on each of three days. Each player thus played all the other players three times.

New Zealand was represented by Hagen Bower, Malcolm Darroch, Peter Jackson, Maxine Goldie, Kadia Keller-Rice, Li Chunli and the non-playing captains were Peter Hirst and David Jackson.

Congratulations are extended to Peter Jackson and Li Chunli who both finished first in their respective singles. Congratulations are also extended to Hagen Bower who, with Peter Jackson, won the men's doubles play-off. These three players have earned the right to represent New Zealand at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona and we are delighted to report that their selections have been confirmed by the NZ Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association selectors.

We also congratulate the Australian players Dennis Makaling, Kerri Tepper and Ying Kwok who make up the balance of the Oceania representation for the Games.

The local media gave good coverage to the event. The local radio stations broadcast regular reports and Peter Lapp of the Manawatu Standard published articles before and during the tournament and also arranged reports for dissemination through the Press Association.

ADMINISTRATION

National Council

The National Council comprises the six Councillors elected by each of the regions plus the members of the Management Committee.

During the year under review the Council met on five occasions with one of the meetings being held in Auckland during the New Zealand championships.

Management Committee

The Management Committee met formally on nine occasions up to 12 December (the last meeting prior to the preparation of this report).

National Type Championships

The National Council appointed a sub-committee to consider various aspects of the North Island, South Island, New Zealand and NZ Veterans championships. The objectives of this review are to:

- (a) Present championships and the sport to the public in the best way;
- (b) Provide a structure that will allow more players to participate;
- (c) Provide players with value for money;
- (d) Encourage more associations to run these tournaments;
- (e) Reduce the current pressures of tournament organisation;
- (f) Provide specifications and support for tournament organisation (schedules) and environment (tables, lighting, playing area etc.)

The opportunities for the sub-committee to meet have been very limited but a lot of research has been done to prepare programmes which will meet the above objectives.

National League

The National Council is researching a proposal that an eight team National Table Tennis League commence in 1993. The proposal is that the competition be held over five consecutive weekends between mid-June and the end of July which will enable top ranked overseas players to be invited to participate in what would be their

off-season. The major challenge will be to obtain sponsorship to make the competition a viable proposition. It is, however, an exciting prospect which could give our sport the sort of national profile which may attract some television coverage.

Publicity

During the year Peter Lampp, Sports Editor of the Manawatu Standard, was appointed NZTTA Publicity Officer for the print media. For a trial period all NZTTA media releases will be made through him.

The NZ Assembly for Sport arranged a television package for lower profile sports called the Smokefree TV Series. The series was sponsored by the Health Sponsorship Council, NZ on Air and Television NZ. The time allocated to table tennis enabled some snippets from the NZ championships in Auckland to be televised.

A general promotional poster was printed and 17 associations purchased supplies of it.

National Lottery

The national lottery was conducted on a voluntary basis and this proved very successful for the 19 associations which participated in it. Over \$47,000 was retained by associations. It is proposed to conduct a similar lottery in 1992.

NZTTA Handbook

It is several years since the Handbook was first published. It has now been updated in a loose leaf binder which will enable amendments and additions to be added from time to time.

Dispute with Hutt Valley TTA

A low point of the year was the confrontation with the Hutt Valley Association over activity fees on the 1990 NZ championships. Rejection of the Hutt Valley claim by the National Council, a meeting between representatives of the Management Committee and Hutt Valley and a personal plea by our President to them to withdraw the claim in the best interests of table tennis failed to convince Hutt Valley so the matter was referred to the Disputes Tribunal. The Tribunal dismissed the Hutt Valley claim.

Official Ball 1991/92

The adoption of the Double Fish 3-star ball for all national type championships, rating tournaments and international contests in New Zealand is current until 31 December 1992.

It is appropriate to record our appreciation of the contribution which Geoff Rau (Region 2) made during his term as Regional Councillor. He did not seek re-election due to his commitments to ITTF.

MEMBERSHIP

Because of the need to have more statistical data, both for planning and to monitor the results of projects, the membership information sought from associations was changed to provide a breakdown of membership in age groups by gender under five categories of affiliated club members, associate club members, business houses, secondary schools and primary/intermediate schools. As this is the first year, comparisons with previous years are not possible.

It is our perception that some associations have not furnished all the information requested. Some may not have fully understood the explanatory circular whilst others may have adopted a conservative approach in the preparation of their returns. It is essential that full disclosure be made to enable us to supply accurate information to agencies such as the Hillary Commission which makes a significant financial contribution towards the development of table tennis. In the case of the Hillary Commission, we are accountable to them and need to justify the level of funding made available by them. If we do not achieve the targetted results then the level of funding will decrease and table tennis will be the loser.

From the membership returns received some relevant information has been extracted and is expressed in the following table in percentage terms.

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR RECREATION AND SPORT

For our 1991 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$63,500. This compared with \$46,500 in 1990. The additional amount was for our national coaching programme. The total amount received was based on the objectives and priorities outlined in the NZTTA management plan which had been submitted to and discussed with the Commission.

We are grateful to the Hillary Commission for their financial assistance. We also record our appreciation to the staff of the Commission whose advice and assistance has always been readily available.

In addition to their funding activities, the Commission conducts initiatives such as Fair Play, Volunteers Involvement Programme, Women in Sport, KiwiSport, Drugs in Sport etc. As appropriate, table tennis links in with these programmes.

The Commission has advised that the level of grant-aid funding for 1992 will be \$57,000.

NZ ASSEMBLY FOR SPORT

The membership of the NZ Assembly for Sport includes 103 national sports organisations, 34 sports service organisations and 13 organisations representing smaller interest groups. It represents about 1.4 million New Zealanders as it has a very important role in acting for sport in representations to the Hillary Commission, Government and other agencies as appropriate.

During the year the Assembly was engaged on projects such as the Smokefree TV Series which benefitted table tennis, the Smokefree Environment Act, liquor advertising and sponsorship and is currently making submissions to the Government Select Committee on the ACC and Rehabilitation Insurance Bill.

COACHING

The most exciting development was provided by additional funding from the Hillary Commission which enabled regional coaches to be appointed to train teachers/helpers in the promotion of Kiwi Table Tennis in primary schools, and club coaches. As a direct result of this funding a lot of progress was made which is reflected in the following statistics:

The programmes in three regions were not completed so the approval of the Hillary Commission is being sought to carry over the funding to the 1992 programme.

The 1991 programme was another learning experience for NZTTA and associations and because of this some shortcomings became apparent. The strategies for 1992 will need to target individual associations which will be assisted as long as they meet criteria which will be clearly spelt out. The criteria will include the need for associations to have a suitable person or persons to work with schools during school hours and agreeing on the level of achievable results.

The Hillary Commission had made it very clear that it is the responsibility of NZTTA to ensure that targetted results are achieved. Failure to do so could lead to a reduction in the grant-aid funding for both the coaching programme and salary support.

Another positive move was the appointment of Barry Wynks as the NZTTA contact with the Hillary Commission KiwiSport programme.

PLAYER OF YEAR AWARD

LI CHUNLI (Auckland) was named the 1991 Player of the Year.

Chunli has a world ranking of 50, won all her matches in the Oceania Olympic Qualifying tournament (she dropped only three games) and at the world championships she was instrumental in lifting the world ranking of the NZ women's team from 43 to 16.

JUNIOR OF YEAR AWARD

Very good submissions were made on behalf of Debbie Garrett (Southland) and Samantha Palmer (Canterbury.)

The 1991 Junior of the Year and winner of the H N Ballinger Cup was DEBBIE GARRETT.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

The development of the Federation is of vital interest to, especially, Australia and New Zealand for without it our players would not have access to some of the world events including the Olympic Games.

Early in 1991 an ITTF sponsored Ambassador squad, accompanied by OTTF President Ken Wilkinson, visited Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia and Fiji to promote table tennis.

Another Ambassador squad is scheduled to tour some Oceania countries in 1992 and there is a possibility that New Zealand may be included in the itinerary.

The 6th Oceania championships are scheduled to be hosted by Papua New Guinea later in 1992.

There are now ten Oceania countries affiliated to the ITTF.

TAMASU CO LTD

The contract between Tamasu Co Ltd and the New Zealand Association to outfit the national senior and junior teams with a range of BUTTERFLY tracksuits, skirts, shorts, shoes and rubbers expired on 31 December, 1990. A renewal of the contract is still under negotiation. In addition we have received the BUTTERFLY calendar with its colourful portraits of international table tennis players, diaries and regular copies of the 'Butterfly World Report.'

All our teams during 1991 wore BUTTERFLY clothing.

DOMESTIC PROGRAMME

A full programme of National tournaments was held.

- *** The DOUBLE FISH Under 15 and Under 17 boys and girls combined National coaching school hosted by Auckland 15-17 March.
- *** 5th NZ Veterans championships hosted by Waikato 29 March-1 April.
- *** The STAR AND GARTER HOTEL South Island championships hosted by Nelson 14-16 June.
- *** The TRUSTBANK CENTRAL North Island championships hosted by Manawatu 28-30 June.

- *** The PROSPECT OF HOWICK New Zealand championships including the senior and junior inter-association teams championships, individual events and Inter-Island contests hosted by Auckland 2-14 September.

- *** New Zealand finals of Schools Teams Championships:
 - * Secondary Schools Girls hosted by Waitemata 30-31 August.
 - * Secondary Schools Open hosted by Waitemata 30-31 August.
 - * Primary/Intermediate hosted by Hutt Valley 21-22 September.

- *** Top 12 tournaments were held as follows:
 - * Under 15 Boys: Hosted by Auckland
 - * Under 15 Girls: Hosted by Auckland
 (Both these tournaments were held in conjunction with the National coaching schools.)

5th New Zealand Veterans Championships.

The Waikato Table Tennis stadium was an ideal venue for these championships.

Although the organising committee was unable to negotiate an overall sponsor they obtained sponsorship for the various events from 44 firms.

Special singles events using "soft" balls and rackets with ordinary rubber with pips out or sandwich rubber with pips out (not long pips) having a total thickness not exceeding 3mm were introduced. The purpose of these events was to "test the water" with a simpler form of competition to make the game more enjoyable. Standard rackets with slower balls should have more appeal to attract former players and less experienced players who may struggle with the spin of conventional rubbers, balls and the effects of "funny" rubbers.

Easter eggs were presented to the players on Easter Sunday, a novel first for this fixture and a gesture well received by the players. Another innovation was the availability of T-shirts specially screen printed for the tournament.

It was a very friendly and well run tournament for which Pauline Bennyworth and her team can feel very proud.

A summary of the results starts on page 24.

The Star and Garter Hotel South Island Championships.

It is ten years since the Nelson Association last hosted these championships which can be best summed up by quoting from NZTTA Liaison Officer John Beatson's report: "The tournament officials can be well pleased with their efforts and they, and their willing band of helpers during the course of the tournament, are to be congratulated on such a well organised and administered tournament. For enthusiasm, dedication and friendliness, other tournaments will have a hard act to follow. Well done, Nelson!"

Trustbank Central North Island Championships.

When the association which had been allocated these championships withdrew, the Manawatu Association Veterans Committee accepted the challenge with three months notice. In his report Adrian Sutton, the NZTTA Liaison Officer, commented "The use of the Hawkes Bay semaphore board and the expertise of Frank Powell and Lester

Bartle (both also ran the 1990 NI championships) illustrated how several associations within a region can co-operate to host these large ventures."

The Prospect of Howick New Zealand Championships.

Although these championships had a major sponsor a further twelve sponsors were acknowledged in the programme. In their report the NZTTA Liaison Officers, Ron Menchi (senior) and Merv Allardyce (junior) included comments on the following:

- ** The front five tables were separately barricaded with the dividing barricades being a red colour.
- ** The more colourful dress of some teams and the uniform dress of some doubles combinations in the individual events.
- ** Certificates were presented to the runners-up of the teams championships but not for the winners of individual events where medals were presented. Both these changes were made with the agreement of the Management Committee.
- ** A continuing feature of championships hosted by Auckland was the less demanding pace due to the slightly extended duration of them.
- ** Ten new Butterfly tables were used for the first time although there were some comments at the variation in playing on the new tables and the older tables.
- ** Auckland has a very professional team with a lot of experience so it was expected that the championships would be well run. This was the case.

A summary of the results are listed on pages 34-42.

Schools Teams Championships.

The three schools teams championships were each held in three stages - association, regional and New Zealand finals.

As most of the players competing in the secondary schools girls and secondary schools open championships finals were also members of their association teams, these finals were played in the Auckland area immediately prior to the commencement of the New Zealand junior championships to save the costs of going to a separate venue. The trial seemed to be quite successful.

The primary/intermediate schools teams championship finals also included the North Island and South Island finals.

We are grateful to the Waitemata and Hutt Valley Associations for hosting the New Zealand finals.

A summary of the results are listed on pages 48 and 49.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

During the year New Zealand was represented at the following tournaments:

- *** 41st World championships in Chiba, Japan, 24 April-6 May.
- *** Australian U15 and U17 Championships in Hobart 1-7 June.
- *** 3rd International Tournament of Noumea, New Caledonia 15-19 July.
- *** Australian U19 and U21 Championships in Geelong 29 July-2 August.

*** 555 World Cup in Kuala Lumpur 11-14 September.

*** 8th Australian Veterans championships and Masters Games in Brisbane 13-18 October.

41st World Championships

These championships were held in the Nippon Convention Centre, Chiba, Japan. The building alone covered an area of about 6 hectares (14 acres)! Peter Hirst reported "The visual impact of the venue in full flight was amazing. Players wearing white, yes WHITE, and multi-coloured uniforms, and umpires with bright red blazers. The image was one of spectacle and professionalism."

Some idea of the scale of these championships can be gained from the following statistics:

- 65 associations competed in the teams events plus a further 16 associations in the individual championships;
- 101 associations were represented at the ITTF Biennial General meeting;
- 1,000 players and officials and 700 media persons were involved;
- 377,000 people visited the site;
- 79,000 members of the public bought tickets to enter the first hall;
- 7,000 players from over 20 countries participated in the Global Junior, Global Masters and Global Ladies championships;
- A total of more than 200 tables were used for all events;
- There was a total income and expenditure of approx. \$US14 million (\$NZ25m.)

The women's team effort was outstanding in reaching the play-offs for the top 16 teams, and finally finishing in 16th position but only four points away from 12th position. The men gained 39th place which was a creditable performance considering the overall standard of the men's competition.

Australian U15 and U17 Championships

New Zealand was represented by girls and boys teams in both age groups. In the teams contests three of the teams finished in second place and the U17 girls in third place. In his report, David Jackson commented:

"The main aim placed on the players was to play well, rather than to win. Doing the right things, such as spinning the ball in the first phase, getting in but not necessarily first, taking the ball as early as comfortably possible and making use of the six basic tactical ploys were the things that were aimed for. To succeed at international level necessitates that the players do very positive things during each rally, and also each game. The emphasis was placed on trying to teach people about international table tennis. As the players learn at different speeds, it would be inappropriate to judge them whilst actually there, particularly those travelling with a New Zealand team for the first time. This tournament should be used as a learning experience and maybe we begin to judge performances in tournaments after returning home. Several of the players were quick to make judgement of themselves, but solely on the basis of results achieved. I was very quick to point out the various things that they had or should have learnt, and that the real test was going to be how they digested these items."

3rd International Tournament of Noumea

The format of the teams event for this tournament was 3-player teams, 2 men and 1 woman, with 4 men's singles, 1 women's singles, 1 men's doubles and 1 mixed doubles. The host association paid the international airfares for the players and hospitality for the players and non-playing captain.

Australian U19 and U21 Championships

New Zealand entered men's and women's teams in both the U19 and U21 age groups. All teams acquitted themselves well with the U21 men winning, both the U19 teams finishing second and the U21 women in third place.

In his report, Barry Butler made these comments:

"It is becoming very apparent that the Academy of Sport in Victoria is having a great impact on the standard of table tennis and other sports (e.g. netball.) There is now greater depth in both number and skills of players. Therefore, even first round contests had to be contested vigorously with a tough physical and mental approach.

"It is in this area of physical, mental plus hard match play that New Zealand needs to follow-up if we wish to keep pace with emerging Australian juniors. Therefore, I think we should be looking at ways of instituting intensive training camps (1-3 weeks) prior to competing in Australian tournaments.

"Players who don't shape up in this atmosphere would not be taken on tour therefore you would end up with a more professional and dedicated approach from the players who attended. At present a very small percentage of our players know how to train and prepare for a tournament of this standard.

"My personal vision tells me if we don't we will be following behind Australia's standard within three years. They are proving that the more intensive training of their Academy group is rubbing off on many more players."

Ken did retire and in recognition of his service to the ITTF he was elected a Personal Honorary Member of the ITTF. This is the equivalent of life membership. This award, when added to awards such as the Queen's honour of a BEM, Life memberships of NZTTA and the Oceania TTF and an ITTF gold star award, is ample illustration of his commitment and dedication to table tennis over a long period of time.

The thrust for 1992 will be to help associations to increase playing numbers with emphasis on Kiwi Table Tennis in primary schools and development of intermediate schools.

The Olympic Games in Barcelona will generate a lot of interest.

Teams will compete in the Australian U15 and U17 championships.

The 6th Oceania championships are scheduled to be hosted by Papua New Guinea.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As will be seen from the accompanying financial reports, the Association has completed the year in a sound position. Net working capital at \$29,229, is substantially higher than for the previous year due in the main to unexpended monies in respect to regional coaching.

Income received from association allocations and from the Hillary Commission was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including the various tournaments, monies outstanding from the previous year and not included in the accounts for that year, interest, royalties and sales of stock items.

As has been customary in recent years, there has been much activity in the form of overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) including the World championships (in Japan) and the Australian junior and youth championships. A national junior coaching school was again held in Auckland and we hosted the Oceania Olympic Qualifying tournament (in Palmerston North) which required an unexpected expenditure of some \$6,645.

Grants were received from the Hillary Commission (\$63,500) and the NZOCGA (\$7,000). The latter was for assistance to those senior players involved in preparation for the Olympic Qualifying tournament.

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$68,963 - an increase of \$6,944 due principally to the receipt of \$5,258 due from associations from the 1990 year. It should be noted that some \$5,364 was outstanding as at 31 October 1991.

For 1992, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our grant will be \$57,000. A total of \$33,000 has been tagged for administrative costs in the national office and is expected to be matched by at least a further \$21,000 from association funds.

The National Council has approved allocations to district associations for 1992 totalling \$66,000. This amount will enable the Association to meet its budgetted costs for 1992.

ASSOCIATION AWARD - ARTHUR MEACHEN MEMORIAL CUP

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 and 2 respectively for the Open and age group events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

AUCKLAND was the 1991 winner with 24 points, followed by Counties 13, Hutt Valley 11, North Harbour 9, Waitemata 2, Waikato 1, Wanganui 1.

ASSOCIATION AWARD - BILL HURREY CUP

This award is presented to the association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the junior individual events at the New Zealand championships.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the Under 19 and 17 events and 2 points for the Under 15 and 13 events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

The 1991 winner was WAIKATO Association whose players scored 20 points. They were followed by Hutt Valley 14, Auckland 11 and Otago 5.

ALAN AND EDNA MCCALLUM JUNIOR UMPIRING AWARDS

Five associations nominated 9 boys and 5 girls for these awards.

The 1991 winners were RICHARD PARANGI (Northland) and SAMANTHA PALMER (Canterbury). The judges named Paul Hempstead (Waikato) and Nikki Schollum (Hutt Valley) as the respective second place-getters.

It is a matter of concern that more associations do not make the effort to nominate their young players for these awards. Some competent umpires were denied the opportunity of being included in the judging as they had not been nominated by their associations before judging commenced.

VICTOR BARNA DUNLOP CUPS

Congratulations are extended to the SOUTHLAND men's team and the HAWKES BAY women's team for winning the respective cups.

The judging panel was Frank Powell (Convenor), Ivan Moffat and Tarzan Graham. In his report, Frank Powell wrote:

"Overall impressions of the judges were similar throughout. New shirt styles were more colourful than the conventional styles of recent years but the rest of wearing apparel - shorts, skirts and other lower garments, along with socks and shoes - never reached the same high standard. Shirts were uniform in teams in early rounds but fell away, often badly, by the third day. Registered uniform details appeared to be out of date for some associations or not being maintained, or possibly not cared about by team members.

"Sportsmanship surprised by being generally of a high standard. Verbal comments were curtailed or eliminated.

"Punctuality was poor in a lot of cases and a 23 minute delay in starting a contest was poor and both teams appeared equally at fault.

"Table etiquette was generally good.

"The two winning men's and women's teams were outstanding, and could not be faulted on appearance and punctuality in any session. Below the winning teams were a bunch of teams that maintained a high and close standard throughout. Often the other teams had a team member that infringed continuously and lowered the good impression made by other team members."
