To all Officers and Members,

The Management Committee presents for your consideration, the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31 October 1992.

Some of the highlights of the year were:

- Reaffiliation of North Taranaki Table Tennis Association.
- Numbers playing table tennis increased.
- Grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission enabled a very successful coach education programme to be implemented.
- New Zealand was represented at the Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain, by players and
- Teams competed in the Australian U15/U17 championships.
- ITTF Ambassador squad visit.
- 18 players competed in the Australian Veterans championships in Canberra 18-24 October.

A high point of the year was the re-affiliation of the North Taranaki Association after an absence of four years. President Barry Butler and Executive Director Mery Allardyce visited the association on 21 April and they were impressed by the enthusiasm of the members they met. The other member associations in Region 3, Hawkes Bay, Manawatu and Wanganui, are to be highly commended in the encouragement they have given North Taranaki by absorbing a greater proportion of the NZTTA financial allocation to the region. Their gesture made it easier for North Taranaki to re-affiliate and to accept gradual increases of the NZTTA budget.

The total number of affiliated associations is 23.

ADMINISTRATION

National Council

The National Council comprises the six Regional Councillors elected by each of the regions plus the members of the Management Committee. A major function of the Council is to formulate policy which determines the general direction which New Zealand table tennis should take. This is not an easy task for the Regional Councillors as it could sometimes be necessary for them to agree to a course of action which may not be in the perceived short term interests of their regions but would be in the longer term interests of New Zealand table tennis as a whole.

During the year under review the Council met on three occasions.

NZTTA Budget

A major item at the December National Council meeting is to consider the NZTTA budget for the following year and to allocate to the regions the amount required from associations.

At a meeting of each region, the member associations then agree to the proportion to be paid by each.

The system followed for 1992 and the percentage allocations to regions have remained the same since it was introduced in 1990. The Council agreed that the criteria and percentage allocations should be reviewed for the 1993 regional allocations.

NZTTA Strategic Plan

The June meeting was devoted almost entirely to Councillors making contributions to the elements which they considered should be included in a strategic plan. A facilitator was engaged for the purpose.

As a result of this meeting four major objectives were identified:

- 1. To promote and develop the sport of table tennis (Marketing Plan).
- 2. To help all affiliated players to reach their playing potential (Player Development Plan).
- 3. To operate NZTTA as an effective and efficient organisation (Administration Plan).
- 4. To be a resource centre for affiliated associations (Resources Plan).

The next stage was to approach persons to contribute to the preparation of selected sub-plans which, when completed, become the basis for implementing those plans. It will take some time to complete the strategic plan but will be a well worthwhile exercise as a blueprint for the future but with the flexibility to make changes.

Sub plans which are currently being prepared include those on Women in Sport, Publicity, Coach Education/Accreditation, Umpires Training/Certification, Players Code of Conduct. Talent Identification, NZTTA Organisation/Structure.

Ball Adoption

At it's June meeting the National Council considered tenders from the agents for five brands of ball for adoption as the official ball for the two years from 1 January 1993 to 31 December 1994. The Council resolved that the official ball be the Double Fish 3-star white and orange balls with the provision that if the Double Fish 3-star ball is not approved by ITTF, NZTTA reserves the right to use a coloured ball of a different brand on occasions as determined by the management committee.

National Lottery

The national lottery was held but only after a big effort by President Barry Butler in convincing some associations to be part of it and others to increase their ticket orders.

Although it is a voluntary lottery many associations rely on the profits to cover their affiliation fees to NZTTA. As a national lottery it needs to offer good prizes and to do that a minimum number of tickets are needed to cover the costs and give a reasonable return to associations.

Associations which participated benefitted by a total of \$33,800.

National League

Efforts to obtain a major sponsor have not so far been successful as it is unlikely to be held in 1993 as had been hoped.

1993 National Type Championships

At the 1992 AGM there were no applications to host the 1993 New Zealand senior and junior championships or the North Island championships. A possible reason for this was that associations had decided to await the outcome of the proposal to conduct the senior, junior and veteran events as separate championships.

Waikato has offered to host the North Island junior championhips and Auckland the NZ junior teams and individual championships. The North Island senior and veterans and NZ senior teams and individual championships have not yet been allocated.

Visits to Associations

President Barry Butler and Executive Director Merv Allardyce visited Marlborough, West Coast, Mid Canterbury, Kapiti and Wellington and attended the South Island teams tournament in Timaru. It is intended to visit more associations in 1993.

In addition Ron Menchi and Merv Allardyce attended the Manawatu Annual General Meeting.

It is appropriate to record our appreciation of the contribution which David Jackson (Region 1) made during his term as Regional Councillor.

NZTTA Premises

Because of expansion by some national sports, the space in the Dominion building was no longer suitable for all sports. Agreement was reached with the Wellington City Council to lease the fourth floor and part of the third floor of the new Civic Library building in Wellington.

The lease is for an initial period of 4 years with two rights of renewal each of 3 years. The move to the new premises is scheduled for 13 January 1993.

Management Committee

The Management Committee met formally on 10 occasions up to the time this report was prepared.

MEMBERSHIP

There was a dramatic increase in the number of players who benefitted from the activities promoted by associations, clubs and the Kiwi Table tennis programme.

The following is a summary of the Membership Returns which were prepared by associations as at 31 August.

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR SPORT, FITNESS AND LEISURE

For our 1992 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$57,000. The total amount received was based on the objectives and priorities outlined in the NZTTA management plan which had been submitted to and discussed with the Commission.

We are grateful to the Hillary Commission for their financial assistance. We also record our appreciation to the staff of the Commission, especially our Liaison Manager Paul Tredinnick, whose advice and assistance has always been readily available.

In addition to their funding activities, the Commission conducts initiatives such as Fair Play, Volunteers Involvement Programme, Women in Sport, KiwiSport, Drugs in Sport etc. As appropriate, table tennis links in with these programmes.

The Commission has advised that the level of grant-aid funding for 1993 will be \$57,720.

COACH EDUCATION PROGRAMME

This programme was possible through funding assistance from the Hillary Commission. The thrust was to increase the number of coaches with particular emphasis on school teachers to give them the skills to introduce Kiwi Table Tennis to their pupils. The targets set for associations were related to the population base of each association and an arbitrary average of 30 pupils per teacher was used.

Although not all associations became actively involved with the programme we believe that the results achieved make it the success story of the year. Top marks and congratulations to those associations who had the courage to make an investment for their future.

The target for coaches and teachers was 443 and the figure achieved was 515. About 8,500 children were introduced to Kiwi Table Tennis and whilst this was less than target it still represented a good result for the first year that this particular programme has been in operation.

It should be pointed out that these figures should not be compared with the membership figures as the latter were submitted at an earlier date.

In addition to this programme, seminars were held at Colleges of Education as follows:

Barry Wynks is the NZTTA representative with the Hillary Commission KiwiSport programme and we express our appreciation for his conscientiousness in carrying out this role.

Kiwi Skills award certificates for the four levels as listed in the Kiwi Table Tennis booklet are readily available from the NZTTA office. Still to be completed are the Kiwi Table Tennis manual and after that the video tape.

COACHING

Area Training Camps

At the December 1991 National Council meeting it was agreed that regular area training camps be held with the Northern area comprising Regions 1 & 2, Central area Regions 3 & 4 and the Southern area Regions 5 & 6. The system seemed to work well in the Northern and Southern areas but not so well in the Central area. These camps were self funding.

National Camps

It was also agreed that national camps for specific age groups be discontinued in favour of camps which contained a mixture of men, women and juniors.

Two camps were held:

1-3 May Hosted by Hutt Valley 26-28 May Hosted by Counties

A third camp planned for October was not held due to insufficient players being available. It was re-scheduled for December. These camps were subsidised by NZTTA.

BALL RESEARCH

The Sports Science Research and Development Funding Programme is funded by the Hillary Commission to promote applied and experimental research throughout New Zealand.

With the encouragement of ITTF President Ichiro Ogimura, we applied to the Sport Science and Technology Board for a grant to research the learning curve for beginner players using different sizes of balls and how learning is transferred to a standard ball.

The project will be personally supervised by Professor Les Williams who is the Dean of the Physical Education Faculty at Otago University.

Questions which will be addressed in the research include:

- which ball is easiest and fastest to learn with?
- what implications do the results have for tactics?
- which increases anticipation time and longer rallies?
- which is more fun in early stages and at veteran level?
- how well does one transfer after learning with one ball and changing to another?

It is expected that the project will take 12 months to complete at a cost of about \$20,000.

The Sports Science Technology Board has offered a grant of \$13,641, NZTTA has committed \$5,000 and it is hoped that ITTF will fund the balance.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

The development of the Federation is of vital interest to, especially, Australia and New Zealand for without it our players would not have access to some of the world events including the Olympic Games.

A comprehensive development plan has been prepared for the Federation and the successful implementation of it would lead to greater numbers playing and a raising of the overall standard. Unfortunately because Oceania member associations are all separated by great stretches of water, the costs of implementing most of the proposals will be an inhibiting factor.

The Oceania championships were scheduled to be hosted by Papua New Guinea but they had to withdraw due to circumstances beyond their control.

Bob Tuckett resigned as Executive Director because of his increased involvement with the Australian Table Tennis Association. He has been replaced by Stuart Scott with the assistance of his wife Rhonda.

Oceania Regional Olympic Solidarity Course

The Australian Table Tennis Association conducted a regional course at Narrabeen, NSW, 15-21 August. Major topics covered included coaching and umpiring. 32 participants from six Oceania countries attended the course.

New Zealand was represented by Barry Wynks and Janice Stead.

ITTF Ambassador Tour

An ITTF Ambassador Promotion Squad in association with Japan Shipbuilding Foundation visited the Oceania region from 8-21 April.

The squad comprised Takehiro Watanabe and Tsuneyasu Yamamoto of Japan and the tour included visits to Fiji, Western Samoa, American Samoa, Tahiti and New Zealand.

Originally it had been intended that the New Zealand section of the tour would include parts of the South Island but later it was changed to the Waikato area when there was a change of itinerary which shortened the stay in New Zealand.

The squad members were accompanied by Ken Wilkinson, representing the ITTF President, and Geoff Rau, the ITTF Vice President for Oceania. Visits were made to Auckland Table Tennis stadium, Hamilton, Tokoroa and Taupo. The itinerary was prepared and finalised by Keith Herbert and we are very grateful to him as it had to be put together at quite short notice.

The success of the visit can, perhaps, be best summed up by a quote from Ken Wilkinson's report on visits to a couple of the schools: "At the first session, the young children screamed with laughter when the Japanese players commenced their warm-up and had only hit the ball over the net four times! You can imagine the reaction of the children when the same rally was going on after the ball had passed over the net 20 or 30 times."

NZ SPORTS ASSEMBLY

The membership of the NZ Sport Assembly includes 108 national sports organisations, 34 sports service organisations and 13 organisations representing smaller interest groups. It represents about 1.4 million New Zealanders so it has a very important role in acting for sport in representations to the Hillary Commission, Government and other agencies as appropriate.

During the year the Assembly was or is engaged on projects such as the Smokefree TV series, liquor advertising and sponsorship, an alternative sports insurance cover and the issue of the effects of the new fringe benefit tax regulations on sporting organisations.

PLAYER OF YEAR AWARD

Barry Griffiths (Counties) was named the 1992 Player of the Year.

Barry won the New Zealand open men's singles title for a record eighth time surpassing Bob Jackson's record set in the 1950's.

JUNIOR OF YEAR AWARD

The following nominations were received:

The 1992 Junior of the Year and the winner of the H N Ballinger Cup was Kirsty-Anne Giles.

The number of nominations received was small but the submissions made on behalf of each nominee were impressive. The nominating associations are to be congratulated on encouraging their younger players to take an active part in the management of their clubs and associations.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - RUSSELL DICKEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

To commemorate the memory of the late Russell Dickey who died in a motor vehicle accident in 1991, the Waikato TTA and friends of Russell offered a trophy for a junior player who qualified under the following criteria:

*To be awarded to that junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand table tennis taking into account:

- 1. Performance
- 2. Behaviour
- 3. Neatness of presentation
- 4. Co-operation
- 5. Team spirit (where applicable)

The award can be won only once by any player.

If two players are rated equally, the older player to receive the award.

The selection to be made by the New Zealand selectors and presented at the NZ Junior championships."

The inaugural winner was Conrad Lee (Auckland.)

TAMASU CO LTD

Awapuni Motor Hotel 6th NZ Veterans Championships

"I was greeted in the stadium with a bowl of fruit and a smile." This is a comment by Adrian Sutton in his report on these championships. This gesture, which was greatly appreciated, greeted all the players on their arrival at the Barber Hall and set the scene for another very friendly tournament.

As Adrian reported "Most of the finals were played on Monday afternoon and were presented well on two tables each cordoned off with two umpires apiece. A fitting display - congratulations Manawatu for presenting the sport well."

The New Dynasty Restaurant South Island Championships

Otago TTA hosted these championships and it was pleasing to note that some of the top players from the North Island competed. Entries were only slightly down on 1991 when the championships were held in the more centrally located Nelson.

Greenpark Motel North Island Championships

In recent years Auckland has had more than their share of hosting North Island and New Zealand championships and a spin-off from this is that with the same group of key personnel they have become very professional.

In his report, Ron Menchi commented "For this tournament Auckland ran a successful "Naming" lottery and this method seems to be an answer to the ongoing challenge of finding an overall sponsor." He commended John Bower and his team for a well run tournament which featured the best matches on four feature tables which were separately barricaded off.

Invercargill Licensing Trust NZ Championships

History was made when for the first time the NZ championships were hosted by the Southland Association. No praise is too great for Ron Garrett and his team. In addition to the main sponsor 69 sponsors were named in the programme and other sponsorships were received after the programme had gone to print.

It was interesting to observe the number of women officials and the ease with which all the officials could be identified by their dress. More associations are adopting more colourful dress especially in their tracksuits.

A big "thank you" is due to the players in the individual events of the junior championships. Their co-operation was tremendous which was well illustrated on the final day of their championships when a programme which looked almost impossible to achieve in the scheduled time frame was attained.

Southland trialled the new format for the teams events as had been agreed by the 1992 annual meeting. The National Council had agreed that the seven matches for each contest comprise 5 singles and 2 doubles.

Unfortunately, due to a smaller number of teams than would normally be expected to enter it was not prudent to introduce all the recommendations and this resulted in some mis-matches in most grades during the group play.

Subsequent to the championships a questionnaire was sent to players who competed in the teams events, to officials who accompanied the teams and to associations. The responses from Under 15 teams players were not taken into account as it became clear form the small number of responses that for many it was their first national tournament so they were not able to compare the format with previous championships. Because of the very small response (33.6% of questionnaires distributed) it was well nigh impossible to get a clear indication of the reaction and opinion of players. Did the opinions of those who responded reflect the opinions of the majority or are the majority quite happy to play under whatever regulations are adopted from time to time? A summary of the responses received were circulated to all associations.

Group play was introduced for the senior open and C grade men's and women's singles with the top two players from each group proceeding to the post section knockouts. It is now history that after the post section draw for the men's open singles had been released there was a protest signed by five players on the grounds that the draw was "unfair/unbalanced" and that subsequently three players withdrew from the event.

That there were some hiccups, a greater than usual number of late withdrawals and even some tense moments during the championships was no reflection on the Southland officials for whom no praise is too great.

Schools Teams Championships

The three school teams championships were each held in three stages - association, regional and New Zealand finals.

Both the secondary schools finals were held immediately prior to the commencement of the NZ Junior championships to save the costs of travel to a separate venue. We are grateful to the Southland association for hosting these finals and arranging billets.

The primary/intermediate finals were hosted by Nelson and we are grateful to them for hosting them and providing billets for the visiting players.

For various reasons none of the three championships finals had the full complement of six teams. In the case of the primary/intermediate championship some regions have made the conscious decision to limit their involvement to establishing a regional winner.

25TH Olympic Games, Barcelona - 25 July to 9 August 1992

Report from Peter Hirst

*The International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) allocated the number of places in each event to each of its continental zones and the continental zones each decided their method of qualification. The procedure followed in the Oceania zone was for 3 players per country to play off three times on a round robin basis which produces an overall ranking 1, 2, 3, 4 etc. New Zealand hosted the event in October 1992 and qualified Peter Jackson mens' singles/doubles, Hagen Bower men's doubles and Li Chunli women's singles. All were accepted by the New Zealand Olympic Commonwealth Games Association selection panel.

When the Australian Olympic Committee did not confirm the selection of a male player the vacant singles spot was allocated to Hagen Bower as he had already been selected as a doubles representative.

Li Chunli being an ex Chinese national could not gain release from the Chinese Olympic Committee and only after extensive efforts from a great number of people did the International Olympic Committee executive rule her eligible to play. In particular we record our appreciation to Michael Hooper (General Manager NZOCGA) and Tay Wilson (IOC member) for their assistance in this

As a result of the early selection process the preparation phase was able to take place in a planned fashion. Two major pluses in the preparation were a budget to work with and good lead in time.

NZOCGA made available to NZTTA \$14,000.00 to prepare teams for Barcelona. NZTTA decided to utilise 50% for the pool of players seeking qualification and 50% for those who were successful.

The early lead in time made a planned approach feasible.

Peter Jackson and Hagen Bower were based in Belgium playing national league for the biggest part of the preparation phase with Li Chunli being in Japan, Hong Kong, China etc. Communication proved easy with Peter Jackson and Hagen Bower but non existent with Li Chunli.

Peter Jackson and Hagen Bower took in two trips to Australia in the two months prior to competition to:

- 1) Play the Ballarat Open which took in the Australian elite;
- 2) Play a series of matches with Australia and a touring Chinese side along with joint training.

Due to extensive English connections the final preparation took place in Grantham, England, with the English team in joint training and matches before moving into the Olympic Village and practice in the competition venue with a range of nationalities.

It would have been beneficial during the later stages of preparation to have taken in the China, Japan and USA Opens which nearly all the other qualifiers did. Finances did not make this possible."

Michael McAvinue was selected as a member of the 3 person Oceania umpires team which officiated at the game.

Australian U15 and U17 Championships

New Zealand was represented by girls and boys teams in both age groups. In his report, David Jackson commented:

"The main aim placed on the players was to play well, rather than to win. Doing the right things, such as spinning the ball in the first phase of the rally, getting in but not necessarily first, taking the ball as early as comfortably possible and making use of the six basic tactical ploys were the things that were aimed for. To succeed at international level necessitates that the players do very positive things during each rally, and also each game. The emphasis was placed on trying to teach people about international table tennis. As the players learn at different speeds, it would be inappropriate to judge them whilst actually there, particularly those travelling with a New Zealand team for the first time. This tournament should be used as a learning experience and maybe we begin to judge performances in tournaments after returning home. Several of the players were quick to make judgement of themselves, but solely on the basis of results achieved. I was very quick to point out the various things that they had or should have learnt, and that the real test was going to be how they digested them."

1992 Asian Senior Championships

These championships would be held in New Delhi 7-14 November and New Zealand would be represented by a women's team only.

1992 World Cup

Peter Jackson will represent Oceania at the World Cup which is a men's singles tournament to be held in Vietnam 11-13 December.

1992 World Doubles Cup

These events are scheduled to be held in Las Vegas, USA, 17-20 December. The Oceania representatives in the men's event will be Peter Jackson and Hagen Bower. The Australian pair of Kerri Tepper and Ying Kwok will compete in the women's event.

Training tour to China

Resulting from an approach from Zhu Hui with an offer to accompany a group of players to China for training, associations were invited to nominate players interested in spending a month in China during the Christmas 1992 period. A total of 16 players indicated an interest and the tour will take place from 22 December to 20 January.

Global Youth Championships

An invitation was received for teams from Oceania to comopete in the inaugural Global Youth championships in Japan in January 1993. Because of time constraints it was not possible to hold qualifying tournaments with Australia so it was agreed that a member of the NZ selection panel arrange a telephone meeting with the convenor of the Australian selection panel and the ITTF Vice President for Oceania to agree on which country should represent Oceania in the U21 men's and U21 women's events. A meeting was held and it was agreed that Australian teams compete in both the events.

Tour to Malaysia

Teams did not compete in the Australian U19 and U21 championships. Instead an approach was made to the Malaysian Table Tennis Association for us to send teams to Malaysia for training with and competing with their players. The tour is scheduled to take place in February 1993.

OBITUARY

We record with sadness the death of a table tennis administrator and player, who by his dedication, made a very significant contribution to the development of table tennis in New Zealand.

Mr LESLIE CHARLES ELLIOTT who died on 29 July 1992 at the age of 92. Les was a life member of NZTTA. He is survived by his wife Jean, also a life member of NZTTA, son John, grandchildren and great-grandchild. We understand he was still playing table tennis in 1991.

To all members of the NZ table tennis fraternity who have suffered a bereavement in their family we extend our condolences.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As will be seen from the accompanying financial reports, the Association has completed the year in a very sound position.

Income received from association allocations and from the Hillary Commission was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including the various tournaments, monies outstanding from the previous year and not included in the accounts for that year, interest, royalties and sales of stock items.

In addition, a change in accounting policy has resulted in accounts receivable at the end of the year, \$7,449 (incl GST), being reported as having been received. That amount and a refund from Recreation Services, has substantially contributed to the increased net working capital. This refund enabled us to upgrade our computer equipment and improve the quality of presentation.

As has been customary in recent years, activity in the form of overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) has included grants to the non playing captains.

National training camps have been subsidised.

Grants were received from the Hillary Commission (\$57,000) and the NZOCGA (\$7,000), the latter for the assistance of those players participating in the Olympic Games in Barcelona.

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$75,828, an increase of \$6,865 due principally to the inclusion of association fees outstanding, \$6,621, at the end of the year.

For 1993, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our grant will be \$57,720. A total of \$35,720 has been tagged for administrative costs in the National Office and is expected to be matched by at least a further \$25,000 from association funds. The grant also provides \$15,000 for coach education, \$4,000 for coaching in general, and \$3,000 for the travel costs of the ITTF vice president.

The National Council has approved allocations to district associations for 1993 totalling \$66,000, that amount will enable the Association to meet its budgeted costs for 1993.

ASSOCIATION AWARD - ARTHUR MEACHEN MEMORIAL CUP

This award is presented to the association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the Open and senior age group individual events at the New Zealand championships.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 and 2 respectively for the Open and age group events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

AUCKLAND was the 1992 winner with 28 points, followed by Counties 10, Hutt Valley 9, North Harbour 5, Canterbury and Otago 4 each and Waikato 2 points.

ASSOCIATION AWARD - BILL HURREY CUP

Under 15 Years

This award is presented to the association whose players achieve the most successes in the finals of the junior individual events at the New Zealand championships.

Points are awarded on the basis of 4 points for the Under 19 and 17 events and 2 points for the Under 15 and 13 events. In the doubles events the partners share the points.

The 1992 winner was HUTT VALLEY Association whose players scored 17 points. They were followed by Auckland and Otago 10, Waikato 6, South Canterbury, Canterbury and Wanganui 2, Waitemata and Wellington with 1 point each.

ALAN AND EDNA MCCALLUM JUNIOR UMPIRING AWARDS

Nine associations nominated 12 boys and 7 girls for these awards.

The 1992 winners were GLEN FOULKES (Canterbury) and NIKKI SCHOLLUM (Hutt Valley). Both umpired several junior finals and acquitted themselves well.

VICTOR BARNA DUNLOP CUPS

Congratulations are extended to the COUNTIES men's team and the KAPITI women's team for winning the respective cups.

The judging panel was Patricia Swale (Convenor), Neil Tapper and Graeme Isitt. In her report Patricia Swale wrote:

*Appearance: The overall impressions of the judges were similar throughout. Although several teams were immaculately dressed, disappointment was expressed by us all at the general standard of shoes (many disgusting) and socks (football socks!) Shirts, shorts and skirts were not uniform from the start of the competition. Several teams were never in full uniform or any uniform for the whole competition.

*More attention should be paid to associations uniforms as listed. They were either not maintained (or enforced) and the impression was that many team members didn't seem to care. The judges all agreed that the team uniforms were disappointing especially from the public image that should have been achieved.

"Women's teams were hard to fault in comparison with the men's teams.

*Sportsmanship: This was generally reasonable. Verbal comments should be curtailed as several team members were rather vocal. More attention could be given to retrieving balls etc.

"Punctuality: This was very poor. The day 1 and 2 first sessions commenced with many teams starting up to twelve minutes late and continuing sessions starting up to 10 minutes late. Teams were not organised and seemed to hang back e.g. games finishing and the next player not even ready to start, which had the effect of prolonging sessions.

"Table etiquette: An area to be improved on considerably, with many players never acknowledging or thanking the umpire. (Note: One player hitting the ball away from his table without taking note of where he was hitting it to).

"The allowed points and deductions for teams under the four categories show the judges' observations. Overall the judges gained an impression of a much higher standard in the women's teams than in the men's teams.

"Under the associations marking system it doesn't show the large difference between the top placed teams and the bottom of the competition. The two winning teams from both contests were outstanding.

"The professional approach by the Counties men's team must be commented on and all teams could well be advised to try to achieve this standard, which will greatly improve the public image to our sport.

"Below the top teams there was close competition and the placings changed over each session. Temperament was a major problem which continually pulled some teams down. Often a team member infringed continually and this lowered the good impression made by other team members."
