To all Officers and Members

Like any other year, 1994 had its high points and its low points.

Particularly pleasing was the progress made in the implementation of our coaching plan and its accompanying structure to more efficiently organise and run area and national training camps. A coach accreditation system has also been prepared and will be actioned in 1995, along with guidelines setting out options for players to progress from beginner to international level. National Director of Coaching Barry Butler and his team of Area Coaching Co-ordinators and Coaches are to be thanked for their dedicated work in this area.

We are also proud to report a glittering array of medals won by players representing New Zealand overseas. Successes were recorded in the Australian Junior Championships, the Australian Veterans Championships, and most notably the Oceania Championships in Tahiti from which all 19 players returned with at least one medal.

On what may be considered the downside some associations have voiced concern at the cost of affiliation. There is no doubt that concern is being felt but it may well be a symptom of the more fundamental problem of decreasing playing numbers. Table tennis has so much to offer and it is our belief that there is a large market waiting to be tapped.

Thanks and congratulations are extended to all those Association and Club officials who kept the day to day life of New Zealand table tennis ticking over, many of whom are seeing their work rewarded with a large measure of progress and achievement at local level.

The Management Committee presents for your consideration the 61st Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30 September 1994.

COACHING

Coaching Plan

In the latter part of 1993 a structured coaching plan was prepared and circulated to associations and selected coaches for comment.

The plan provided for three areas - northern, central and southern - to be established for coaching purposes with the appointment in each area of an Area Coaching Co-ordinator and an Area Coach. The appointments are for a two year term but subject to review at the end of the first year.

Each area has a coaching committee comprising the Area Co-ordinator (convenor), Area Coach and a representative from each member association.

The NZ Coaching Committee comprises the Director of Coaching (convenor), the three Area Coaching Co-ordinators, the convenor of the NZ selection panel and the KiwiSport representative to the Hillary Commission.

Additionally, Barry Butler accepted the role of Director of Coaching and has been the driving force in the successful introduction of the structure.

Given the fact that the appointments of the Area Co-ordinators and Area Coaches were not finalised until December 1993 and the first area camps were held as early as February reflects great credit on the officials concerned.

Area Training Camps

A total of 17 area training camps were held during the year. Some catered for the top players and some for second level players. This ensured that all associations had the opportunity to be represented at an area camp. In total 210 players attended the various camps.

National Training Camps

Two national camps were held. Players each paid \$100 towards the costs except local players providing a billet who paid 50%.

12-13 March This was a combined senior and junior, male and female camp which was attended by twenty-three athletes under the direction of Martin Duffy and Richard Lee.

9-10 April Twenty-four male and female players in the age groups under 17 and under 15 attended this camp under the direction of Martin Duffy and Richard Lee.

Both these camps were hosted by Hutt Valley TTA and we are grateful to them for arranging billets and local transport.

6 August It had been intended to hold both a men's and women's Top 10 tournament but when several men withdrew the men's section was cancelled. The women's tournament was held in Hamilton and we express our gratitude to the Waikato TTA for hosting it.

Coaches Seminars/Kiwi Table Tennis

Our targets for 1994 were 470 club coaches and school teachers and 500 tertiary students. Ten associations furnished reports, nine associations achieved 402 club coaches and teachers. The tertiary programme presented table tennis to 320 students. The main reason for not achieving our target for this group was a change of system at the Waikato College of Education which gave us access to fewer of their students.

Congratulations are extended to Northland, Auckland, Manawatu, Wanganui, Hutt Valley, South Canterbury and Southland for giving about 3,300 school children the opportunity to play table tennis during 1994.

Cochs Accreditation

A meeting of senior coaches with Peter Hirst (Coaching New Zealand) as the facilitator was held in August to consider the number of coaching levels which should be introduced and the syllabus for each. It was agreed that at this stage there should be courses for Kiwi Table Tennis teachers (1-2 hours), teachers and student teachers (6 hours), Level 1 (8 hours for coaches working at club level) and Level 2 (12 hours for coaches working at association level and higher.) All these courses would be formally introduced in 1995 and 1996 with a Level 3 introduced in 1997. With the introduction of this structure it is not intended that all coaches have to start again. There will be provision for recognition of prior learning.

A draft exposure document is currently with those who attended the meeting and it will then be circulated to associations.

Player Development

Another project which is about to commence is the preparation of a booklet setting out the pathway for players from beginner to international level. It will contain guidance to assist players to reach their full playing potential. It will also form the basis of an application to the NZ Sports Foundation for financial support for our elite players.

MEMBERSHIP

The following is a summary of the Membership Returns furnished by associations as at 31 August, 1994, compared with the previous three years. Three associations have not submitted their returns so the information supplied by them in 1993 has been used to give credibility to the comparisons between the four years.

The tables illustrate the trends since membership has been furnished by associations in the current format. Whilst all trends are significant your attention is especially drawn to "Affiliated club members" as these members are the real financial bread and butter base of clubs and associations. Clubs are the basic unit of the table tennis family so the trends above are a cause for concern. They highlight the need to make table tennis more attractive and appealing. One way is to look for new and better ways to deliver quality services to increase the customer base.

ADMINISTRATION

Regional Councillors

Consequent upon the election of two Councillors to other offices at the last annual general meeting two new Councillors were elected. Ron Garrett was elected NZTTA President and his position as Region 6 Councillor was filled by Bob Hurr (Otago) and Michael McAvinue, on his election to the Management Committee, was replaced as Region 3 Councillor by Dave Welch (Wanganui.)

Keith Herbert (Region 3) and Merv Palmer (Region 5) have chosen to relinquish their positions.

We record our appreciation to them for their contribution to New Zealand table tennis during their terms of office.

Management Committee

Up to the time of the preparation of this report the Management Committee had met on nine occasions. Two members were resident outside the Wellington district. Barry Butler attended most meetings by a telephone link-up. The system seemed to be quite satisfactory and reduced the costs of the meetings.

New Zealand Lottery

This lottery has been organised for the benefit of clubs and associations which choose to participate in it. It is run as a national lottery to take advantage of the benefits of scale to make it more attractive to the ticket buyer. Despite best efforts, the number of tickets committed by associations are not now enough to justify a car as the first prize and also give a good profit return to participating clubs and associations.

This year the first three prizes were for travel and the total number of prizes increased to 53. Even with the increased number of prizes the absence of a car as the first prize made the selling of tickets in some areas much harder than in previous years.

The positive aspect was that profit per ticket increased.

It is to the credit of associations that they agreed to a proposal that the profit in excess of \$1 per ticket up to a maximum of 40 cents per ticket be allocated to an NZTTA travel fund for players. 40% of these funds were allocated to the Australian junior championships, 40% to the World championships and 20% to the Oceania championships. For an association's players to qualify for a grant the association needed to commit themselves to a minimum sales value of tickets based on a percentage of their previous year's affiliation fees allocation.

Five associations chose either not to be involved with the lottery or not to take sufficient tickets to qualify.

The lottery was organised by Robert Gross on behalf of the Counties-Manukau TTA and we record our thanks to him. We also acknowledge the assistance of Stars Travel International, Wellington, for donating the third prize and their financial support towards the cost of the first and second prizes.

Doping Policy

The New Zealand Sports Drug Agency Act 1994 established an independent Sports Drug Agency to implement a sports drug testing regime. The Agency is to provide leadership in the development of a national strategy concerning the use of drugs in sport and has the role of encouraging the development of educational programmes to promote drug-free sport.

As an Olympic sport and as a recipient of grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission we are required to have a doping policy, the machinery to enable testing to take place and disciplinary procedures in the event of a positive test on an athlete. Notices of Motion will be submitted to the Annual General Meeting to incorporate necessary changes to the Constitution.

Racket Covering Adhesives

The ITTF has reaffirmed a ban on all liquid adhesives from 1 August 1995 and the ban is scheduled to be implemented in New Zealand from 1 January 1996. Liquid adhesives are due to be replaced with pressure sensitive adhesive sheets. The latest indications are that because of promising research with water based adhesives the ban on all liquid adhesives may be amended to the ban applying only to all solvent based adhesives. Developments will be monitored with interest.

Computer Software

During the year computer generated ratings using ITTF software have been produced in parallel with the systems which have been operated manually since ratings were introduced in 1986. It is intended that only the computer generated system will be used from 1995.

The Management Committee has been conscious of its vulnerability in relying on a sole contractor to process entries and draws for national type championships. Evaluation of alternative software has taken place during 1994 and it is hoped that a suitable programme will be in use for 1995.

Travel Discount

A travel discount has been negotiated with Ansett New Zealand whereby we are guaranteed a 30% discount off the full economy airfare for domestic travel within New Zealand. This discount will now be available to affiliated members travelling to national type championships.

Australian Table Tennis Magazine

The Australian TTA produces a good quality magazine which is published four times per year. NZTTA arranged to contribute articles and to distribute the magazine in New Zealand. As an extra for New Zealand subscribers a supplement covering New Zealand items of news is included with each issue. There are currently 69 subscribers.

The content of the magazine should appeal to most table tennis buffs. With the level of competition between Australia and New Zealand, especially at junior and veteran level, the magazine is an ideal way to keep track of what is happening on both sides of the Tasman.

New Zealand Playing Uniform

The uniform for New Zealand representative teams has been redesigned using the latest in material. It has been well accepted by players.

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR SPORT FITNESS AND LEISURE

For our 1994 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$58,000. The amount received was based on the objectives and priorities outlined in the NZTTA management plan which had been submitted to and discussed with the Commission.

Paul Tredinnick has been our Liaison Manager with the Commission. He left in June and has been replaced by Hamish Grey. We express our appreciation to them and to other members of the Commission staff for their advice and assistance.

The Commission's policy is that they will fund national sporting organisations up to a maximum of one-third of the organisation's revenue. In line with this stated policy the amount of grant-aid for 1995 has been reduced. The exact amount has not been finalised as representations have been made for the reduction to be made in stages to ensure that programmes which are in place can proceed.

The Commission is strongly encouraging us to hold a seminar to review "the big picture" of NZ table tennis and to address topics such as what is our core business, where are we now, where do we want to be in, say, five years or ten years time. The recommendation is that the seminar comprise 10-12 persons and should include persons outside the national structure and even outside table tennis to ensure wide representation and new ideas. It is anticipated that the seminar will be held in February.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

A general meeting of the Federation was held during the 7th Oceania Championships held in Tahiti 6-14 May, 1994.

Matters of interest which arose from that meeting are listed hereunder:

- ** A formal Constitution was adopted.
- ** The Federation has adopted the ITTF rules in determining the eligibility of players to compete in Oceania championships.
- ** The next championships have been allocated to Guam and they are scheduled to be held in the second half of May 1996.
- ** Geoff Rau was re-elected President. Other officers elected were Phil Males (Australia) Executive Director and Mrs Fran Keyhoe (Australia) the umpires co-ordinator.
- ** The Federation appointed Glen Tepper as Development Officer. During 1994 he visited Papua New Guinea and Tahiti and was also scheduled to visit Fiji. The success of his visit to Tahiti was reflected in the performance of the Tahiti teams at the Oceania championships. As a means of measuring the relative standards of players in the Oceania region it has been agreed in principle that Australia and New Zealand, in alternate years, invite the Island countries to compete in their respective junior championships and that an Oceania training camp be held following these championships. Australia hosted the first camp after their under 15 and under 17 championships.
- ** Keith Bowler (Australia) was, along with Ken Wilkinson (New Zealand), one of the founders of the Federation. He has been deeply involved since its inception. Keith has decided to retire and it is fitting that we record our appreciation to him.

NEW ZEALAND SPORTS ASSEMBLY

The membership of the NZ Sports Assembly includes 107 national sports organisations which represent 1.4 million sports members.

An important function of the Assembly is to make representations to and liaise with the Government, Government Agencies (in particular the Hillary Commission), and make such recommendations as are approved by the Assembly on sports related issues and opportunities.

The number of Acts which can have an effect on sport make it important that NZTTA be a member of the Assembly to keep abreast of developments in current and proposed legislation.

The Assembly co-ordinates the Smokefree television sports programme which is supported by the Health Sponsorship Council, New Zealand on Air and Television New Zealand. The programme series is designed to give lower profile sports some television exposure. We record that although associations were invited to submit ideas for table tennis none were received.

Sport, Fitness and Recreation Industry Training Organisation

The Assembly is represented on the Sport Fitness and Recreation Industry Training Organisation (SFRITO). This organisation is the sport, fitness and leisure industry's response to a government initiative called Skill New Zealand. It introduces a new philosophy of learning and assessment based on the acquisition of predetermined standards of competence. It has been designed to allow New Zealanders greater access to education and training in ways which are convenient and appropriate for the learner.

The relevance of this initiative to table tennis is that it will enable coaches, administrators and other officials to gain skills through their involvement in the sport and to have them formally recognised. In addition, the "units" passed are transportable and can, therefore, be cross-credited towards other qualifications.

ASSOCIATION AWARDS

These awards were introduced by the National Council in 1993 to acknowledge associations for significant achievement. Two nominations were received in 1994 and it was decided that one of the nominees merited an award. Congratulations are extended to:

WANGANUI TTA, for outstanding achievement in promotion and publicity.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

PETER JACKSON (Auckland) has been named the 1994 Player of the Year. Peter has a current World ranking of 150. At the Oceania championships in Tahiti he was unbeaten in the teams event and reached the final of the men's singles.

JUNIOR OF YEAR AWARD - H N BALLINGER CUP

The criteria used in awarding this cup covers sportsmanship, potential, dress, personality, enthusiasm, interest in club and/or association management affairs and playing results.

The 1994 Junior of the Year and the winner of the H N Ballinger Cup was **CRAIG SIMS**.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - RUSSELL DICKEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to that junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand table tennis taking into account performance, behaviour, neatness of presentation, co-operation and team spirit. The award can be won once only by any player.

The winner for 1994 was **DANIEL ASTLE (Canterbury)**

OBITUARY

We record with sadness the deaths of table tennis administrators and players who made a significant contribution to the development of New Zealand table tennis.

- *** **LAURENCE MARTIN WILSON** died in Lower Hutt on 25 December 1993. Laurie was a member of the NZTTA Executive committee from 1957 to 1964. In 1947 he won the NZ men's doubles title.
- *** **THELMA MAY** died in Christchurch on 20 February 1994. Thelma was a sportsperson in the truest sense of the word and was one of a rare breed of top table tennis players who made a significant contribution to the administration of the sport both at association and national level.
- *** **MALCOLM ROY TEMPERLEY** died in Auckland on 27 March 1994 aged 33. Malcolm was a New Zealand senior men's representative player (ranked 13th in the Commonwealth in 1985), coach, and administrator. His funeral was held in the Auckland Table Tennis stadium.
- *** **GRAHAM LASSEN** died in Canberra on 13 April 1994 aged 39 years. Graham represented New Zealand and in 1977 he was ranked 13th in the Commonwealth. He won the NZ men's singles in 1979 and 1980.
- *** **ROYSTON (ROY) GEORGE LEA** died in Sydney (where he had lived for a number of years) on 30 April 1994 after a long illness. Roy served on the NZTTA Executive committee from 1965 to 1971.
- *** **HENRY NORMAN BALLINGER** died in Waikanae on 27 June 1994. Norm Ballinger played an important part in the development of NZTTA in the early days of its existence. For nine years from 1940 to 1948 he was hon. secretary of NZTTA and for 22 years from 1940 to 1961 he was the hon. treasurer. In 1949 he became the first ITTF vice president elected from the Oceania region. In recognition of his services to table tennis he was elected a life member of NZTTA in 1962.

To all members of the table tennis fraternity who have suffered a bereavement in their family we extend our condolences.

Awapuni Motor Hotel 8th NZ Veterans Championships

These championships seem to have a format which meets with the approval of players. They were very well run and the presentation dinner held at the conclusion of the championships was well supported. A merit list for each age group was announced at the dinner. Appreciation is recorded to those who assisted in the preparation of the lists.

Invercargill Licensing Trust South Island Championships

In his report, the NZTTA Liaison Officer commented "While the field of players represented most of the South Island's leading players combined with some North Island representation, it was noticeable that the middle bracket of players from the South Island were not present. This meant that most draws had a small number of players even though of high quality. It seems unfortunate that South Island associations had not promoted this tournament and made the middle bracket of players aware that the round robin system is now used."

Hewson Office Supplies North Island Championships

A raffle which attracted 23 prospective sponsors was held by Hutt Valley TTA and was won by Hewson Office Supplies who became the principal sponsor of the tournament. Despite the poor state of the Walter Nash stadium which made playing conditions marginal the small group of volunteers did a tremendous job.

McDonalds New Zealand Senior and Junior Championships

The inter-association teams events had format changes which had been agreed at the 1993 annual meeting. Contests comprised nine singles matches. Teams were graded into a standard six teams per grade and there was provision for a grading round involving teams 5 and 6 in the higher grade and teams 1 and 2 in the next lower grade. At the end of the round robins the top two association teams played a final contest to decide the winner of each grade.

It is pleasing to report that the overall standard of dress was very high - a credit to associations and players. More associations are adopting eye-catching uniforms.

For the most part the tournament proceeded very smoothly which was a reflection on the quality of the staff.

A summary of the results starts on page 39.

Schools Teams Championships

The three schools teams championships were each held in three stages - association, regional and New Zealand finals.

Both the secondary schools finals were held just prior to the commencement of the NZ junior championships to save the costs of travel to another venue at a different time. We record our appreciation to the Canterbury TTA for hosting the event and providing billets for the visiting players.

The primary/intermediate finals were kindly hosted by Wellington TTA.

All six regions were represented in the secondary open finals, four in the secondary girls and five in the primary/intermediate.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

Events in 1994 included:

- COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Hyderabad, India, 25 January - 1 February
- WORLD VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Melbourne, 22-27 April
- OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Tahiti, 8 - 13 May, 1994
- AUSTRALIAN UNDER 15 AND UNDER 17 CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Geelong, Victoria, 2-8 July
- ASIAN SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Tianjin, China, 20-27 September
- AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS, held in Perth, 1-8 October

Commonwealth Championships

These championships were held in Hyderabad, India, 25 January - 1 February. New Zealand was represented by a men's and women's team. Each of the players contributed approximately \$2,100.

Martin Duffy commented in his report that the women's teams event was spoiled for NZ by the non-arrival of three African teams, two of which were in the same section as our team. This gave them only one group contest and required them to play off for positions 1-8 among very strong teams.

The teams and results are listed on pages 49-50.

World Veterans Championships

Held in Melbourne, 22-27 April, about sixty New Zealand players participated in this major event, including Auckland's Errol Cheal who, at the age of 87, was the oldest of the 1809 competitors. Fifty-two countries were represented; sixty-six tables operated, and 6,700 matches were played.

The only medal winner was Alf Harding, who won bronze in the Over 80 men's doubles. Other players who did well include Yvonne Fogarty (quarter-finalist in the Over 40 women's singles), Isabel Cleland (quarter-finalist in the Over 70 women's singles), Barbara Jackson (last 16 in the Over 60 women's singles), William Weinstock (runner-up in the Over 40 men's consolation event), and Merle Harding (winner of the Over 80 women's consolation event).

Oceania Championships

These were held in Papeete, Tahiti, from 8 - 13 May.

Hopes were held that Peter Jackson would regain the Men's Singles title he lost last year to Australia's Dennis Makaling, but although he beat Makaling in the teams events, he was narrowly defeated in the final by a surprise finalist, Paul Langley (also of Australia).

The event was a major overall success in that every member of the 19-strong team returned home with at least one medal.

Senior Manager Barry Butler commented in his report that the team seemed better prepared for the event than in the past and he felt area and national training camps had contributed to this.

A major accommodation difficulty was encountered on arrival at Tahiti and although this was addressed promptly a letter from a team official attributing the difficulties to the Executive Director was received by the NZTTA chairman. It was some months before the issue was resolved by the withdrawal of all charges and an apology to the Executive Director from the official.

The basic cost to players (excluding clothing) was \$1820 which included transport, up-graded accommodation and meals.

Teams and results are listed on pages 50-51.

Australian Under 15 and Under 17 Championships

These championships were held in Geelong, Victoria, from 2-8 July.

Four New Zealand teams competed (a girls and boys team in each age category) and all teams finished either 3rd, 4th or 5th. Kirk George was New Zealand's most successful player, being rated 2nd in the Under 15 boys Order of Merit list.

Senior Team Manager Ron Garrett commented favourably on the organisation, transport, accommodation, and playing conditions. Richard Lee furnished comprehensive and perceptive individual reports on all players, assisted by Martin Duffy.

The cost of the trip to each player was approximately \$1,200. For an additional cost, all players were invited to attend a five day Oceania Training Camp at the conclusion of the championships. Tracey Harris and Paul Innes took up the offer.

Teams and results are listed on pages 52-53.

Asian Senior Championships

These championships were held in Tianjin, China, on 20-27 September.

New Zealand was represented by a women's team only as there were not enough men of sufficient standard available to form a team. (The overseas-based players had returned to their clubs to fulfil their commitments).

Competition was intense and the women's team finished 14th out of 16 teams. The experience was a memorable one for the players with the host city demonstrating exceptionally lavish hospitality.

The cost to the players was \$2565, excluding clothing.

Results are on page 53.

Australian Veterans Championships

Held in Perth on 1-8 October, these championships were attended by eight New Zealanders. The New Zealand entries were co-ordinated by John Lelliott. John was also New Zealand's most successful player, winning the Gold Medal in the Over 60 men's singles and a bronze medal in the Over 60 men's doubles.

John's report, and other results, appear on page 54.

The players met all their own costs.

Development Tour

It had been intended to take a small group of players in the 18-22 age group to Queensland immediately following the New Zealand championships. Unfortunately sufficient air reservations could not be confirmed so the tour has been deferred until 1995. The players already selected will be given first option.

Asian Junior Championships

An invitation to compete in these championships was declined as it clashed with the Oceania Championships.

Australian International Open Championships

An invitation was received but declined as a team of suitable standard was not available.

Australian Secondary Schools Championships

Information on these championships, held in Canberra on 5-8 October, was circulated to Associations. We are not aware of any New Zealand schools attending.

CONCLUSION

This report contains many positive things which have happened during 1994 and they will be improved on and added to in 1995. The number of players travelling overseas during the off-season to gain further experience increased - there are currently ten to our knowledge. A challenge is to obtain funding to assist selected players, and especially more women, to travel overseas because of the benefits to New Zealand table tennis.

An area of concern is the general health of our clubs - the backbone of table tennis. It could be that the seminar being encouraged by the Hillary Commission and planned for February may identify strategies needed to attract and retain athletes, officials and administrators.

In the year 2000 the Olympic Games will be held in Sydney. The Government appointed a New Zealand 2000 Task Force to identify how New Zealand and New Zealanders could take advantage of the opportunities associated with this event. The Task Force has recommended that strategic alliances should be created across sport, tourism and trade. A key issue for sport is increased funding for high performance sport. A new Anzac Sport Accord is being developed whereby New Zealand athletes can train in Australia using the facilities of the Australian Institute of Sport in the years leading up to the year 2000. We need to be alert for every opportunity to assist our elite players. It should be a very exciting and challenging period.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Association has completed the year in a sound position. An operating surplus of \$1,927 has been achieved through the reserves of Office Equipment and Kiwi Table Tennis Manuals having been brought back into the accounts as income. In future, the two reserves (which are to be continued) will be tracked through the statement of uncommitted funds.

Income received from association allocations and from the Hillary Commission was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including various tournaments, interest received, ball royalties and sales of stock items.

As has been customary in recent years, activity in the form of overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) has included grants to the non-playing captains.

National training camps were again subsidised; participants contributed a maximum of \$100 per camp.

Several grants totalling \$58,000 were received from the Hillary Commission in terms of the 1994 funding application including \$3,000 by way of a grant for attendance at ITTF meetings by GP Rau.

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$74,876. Fees outstanding at the end of the financial year totalled \$13,887.

For 1995, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our total grant will be \$41,000; an amount which they have deemed to be appropriate given the current level of allocations to district associations. The Commission has stated in writing that their policy is to provide funds only to the level of one-third of an organisation's total income. The full amount of the grant has been tagged for administrative costs in the National Office.

Allocations to district associations for 1995 are expected to rise to \$67,850; an increase of that amount being seen as the very minimum required to enable the Association to meet its budgetted costs for 1995.

AUDIT REPORT

To the readers of the financial report of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association Inc.

I have audited the Statement of Financial Position and the Statement of Income and Expenditure. The Over 40 Women did well finishing third with 5 wins and 2 losses, and all three won 52% of their matches. The Over 50 Men's team finished 7th out of 10 with 3 wins and 7 losses. John Lelliott won 62%, Eddie Moore 26% and Eddie Millard 22%. Lelliott and Moore both beat New South Wales top player Ken Cole who had recently won the New Zealand Over 45 Men's Title. Janice Stead won 33% and Kevin Fogarty 37% in the Presidents Teams.

In the individual events Lynley Barker reached the Quarter-finals in the Over 40 Women's Singles and Doubles. The only medals were won by John Lelliott who caused a big upset by beating Australia's No 1 in the Over 60's Quarter-final, Bill Bates of Victoria, 21-18, 15-21, 21-5. He then beat Tom Sal in the Semi-final 21-15, 22-20, and Tony Herbert of Queensland in the Final 21-16, 21-15 to win a Gold Medal. He also won a Bronze Medal in the Over 60 Men's Doubles with Tom Sal of Victoria.
