YEAR'S HIGHLIGHTS.....

- The performance of the men's team at the World Championships in finishing in the top half was a very meritorious effort.
- The level of sponsorship and publicity for the New Zealand Championships in Whangarei was a tremendous example of what can be done.
- There was a lot of enthusiasm and commitment displayed by the group which was brought together for the two planning workshops.

OF CONCERN.....

was the decrease in the number of affiliated members which focused the attention of some associations on the cost of affiliating to Table Tennis NZ. This was and is a concern especially in view of the fact that the total affiliation fees being paid by associations is, effectively, less than they were six years ago.

THANKS AND CONGRATULATIONS.....

are extended to all those Association and Club officials who so freely give of their time and expertise for the benefit of their members and table tennis in general. We hope their hard work has been rewarded with lots of success.

ADMINISTRATION

Management

Since the last Annual Meeting the National Council met on three occasions and the Management Committee (up to the time of the preparation of this report) had nine meetings.

With two of the Management Committee residing outside the greater Wellington region, use was made of telephone conference facilities on several occasions.

Review of National Office

During the year Mr Robin Radford agreed to carry out a review of the functions and operation of the TTNZ National Office. The terms of reference were:

- 1 Identify what is being done in the National Office, both currently and at other times of the year, utilising Activity Reports prepared by staff members.
- 2 Identify what tasks could be done in other ways and/or by other people.
- 3 Document expectations of the National Office as submitted by the Management Committee, National Council, district associations, etc.
- 4 Determine how the function of the TTNZ National Office differs, if at all, from that of other national sports organisations.
- 5 Make appropriate recommendations for consideration by the Management Committee.

Copies of the report were circulated to associations.

NZ Lottery

The Lottery was again organised by Robert Gross to whom we extend our appreciation.

It was necessary to enter a joint arrangement with another sport to ensure potential ticket sales were sufficient to justify a car as the first prize. After extended negotiations the Lottery was conducted in association with the New Zealand Croquet Council.

Accounting has not been finalised but it is expected that the Players Travel Fund will benefit by more than \$9000.

Hutt Valley and Counties Manukau ordered the largest number of tickets: Hutt Valley disposed of tickets worth \$9,000; Counties Manukau in excess of \$5,500.

Australian Table Tennis Magazine

For the second year this magazine was made available to New Zealand subscribers at a discounted price. A TTNZ newsletter was enclosed with it.

As a result of an announced increase in price and falling local subscriptions, it is likely that TTNZ will not continue to mail the magazine direct to NZ subscribers. The magazine will still be available to individuals direct from Table Tennis Australia.

New Rating System

The ITTF "Epson" computerised ranking programme was utilised for the TTNZ Ratings in 1995 for the first time. A large amount of time was spent by Adrian Sutton in adapting the programme to our needs and advising the National Office on its use.

Rating lists were distributed on four occasions throughout the year, and associations were invited to comment on the new system. A number of modifications are being considered for 1996.

The top 20 rated players in each age-group are listed on page 29.

Publicity

Two events in 1995 received a very large amount of media publicity: the 43rd World Championships in Tianjin, China; and the New Zealand Championships in Whangarei.

World Championships: In preparing a media kit for this event (and the Commonwealth Championships which preceded it), we had free assistance from Olympic and Commonwealth Games media consultant Glenda Hughes. A package containing profiles, photographs, and statistical details of the event was sent to all major daily papers, with a promise of regular faxed results direct from the venue (via a specially set up ITTF media service). Added to this was a vast amount of coverage on Sky TV, much of it live.

New Zealand Championships: While the nationwide coverage of this event was a little slow in starting, the volume of material published in the local press was absolutely staggering. More than once reports on the championships totalled almost a full page, and the total coverage of the event was 1718 column/centimetres.

There was substantial coverage of the South Island championships in Timaru and a number of associations sent in cuttings of their own local publicity.

Travel Discount - Ansett New Zealand

The current travel discount with Ansett NZ has been renewed. The arrangement guarantees TTNZ a 30% discount off full economy airfares for domestic air travel within New Zealand. It is also available to affiliated members travelling to training camps and national type championships.

MEMBERSHIP

The following is a summary of the Membership Returns furnished by associations as at 31 August, 1995, compared with the previous three years. Four associations have not submitted their returns so the information supplied by them in 1994 has been used to give more credibility to the comparisons between the four years.

Playing numbers have shown a dramatic decrease and these are largely in the schools. The reason is not clear but it could be that there was less activity in the Kiwi Table Tennis area or the numbers had been omitted from the returns.

In June, 1994, the Sweeney survey of sporting participation, attendance, TV viewing and sponsorship awareness covering all sports indicated, overall, 18% of New Zealanders are interested in Table Tennis, 11% participate whilst 10% view the sport on TV.

From this survey two things are very apparent: interest and awareness are far greater than most people would realise, and there is a large market of prospective members. The challenge is how we can tap into this potential.

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR SPORT, FITNESS AND LEISURE

For our 1995 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$44,000. Details of the funding are included in the Treasurer's report and financial accounts.

Local Funding Scheme

It is pleasing to note that associations are applying for and receiving more funding through this scheme. Comparisons for the last three years are:

The funding is available to associations provided they apply according to the criteria laid down by their local District Council.

Planning

In the 1994 annual report it was recorded that the Hillary Commission was strongly encouraging us to hold a seminar to review the "big picture" of NZ table tennis and to consider our direction towards and beyond the year 2000.

With financial assistance from the Commission, workshops were held on 23 July and 5 November.

A detailed discussion document will be circulated to associations for consideration before the AGM.

At the first workshop the participants adopted the following vision statement:

"To provide an environment that promotes and supports active and lifelong participation in table tennis at all levels."

NZ WAY OLYMPIC SPORTS BRANDING



The New Zealand Way Brand is a long term and dynamic international campaign to develop a unique personality for New Zealand which will give New Zealand exports a premium position in the global marketplace.

The NZ Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association (NZOCGA) has entered into a joint venture branding campaign with The New Zealand Way Ltd by designing and promoting a complementary and vibrant joint brand called The New Zealand Way - Olympic Sport Brand ("The Brand")

The use of The Brand has been offered to all Olympic National Sports Federations and they each receive a fee based on their potential to promote The Brand. Bonus payments may be available to those National Federations which, in the opinion of the NZOCGA, exceed initial expectations in respect of promoting The Brand.

The initial period of the promotion is up to 31 December, 1996. Table Tennis received \$5000 for the year under review and will receive payments of \$2500 in December 1995 and December, 1996.

Our teams which competed in the Commonwealth and World Championships in Singapore and China had monograms on their tracksuits and playing shirts.

A banner was also displayed during the New Zealand Championships in Whangarei.

NEW ZEALAND SPORTS ASSEMBLY

The members of the NZ Sports Assembly includes 110 national sports organisations which represent 1.5 million sports members.

An important function of the Assembly is to make representations to and liaise with the Government and other organisations on matters which have or could have an impact on sport.

There seem to be more and more Acts which have the potential to affect sport. The Assembly has both a reactive and proactive role.

Our membership of the Assembly ensures that we are kept informed.

ASSOCIATION AWARDS

These awards were introduced by the National Council in 1993 to acknowledge associations for significant achievement. Two nominations were received in 1995 and it was decided that one of the nominees merited an award. Congratulations are extended to:

NORTHLAND TTA, for outstanding achievement in promotion and publicity relating to the 1995 New Zealand Championships.

COACHING

Training Camps

The following camps were conducted in 1995:

NATIONAL: Senior Camp held in Hamilton on 18-19 February

Senior Camp held in Wellington on 1-2 April

Emerging Players Camp held in Wanganui on 1-2 April Emerging Players Camp held in Hamilton on 13-14 May

AREA: Southern Area - 5 camps, 2 levels.

Central Area - 1 full camp, several regional camps (refer below).

Northern Area - 5 camps, 2 levels.

The total attendance at the above camps was just under 400 trainees.

Report From Coaching Director, Barry Butler

National Training Camps were well received by coaches and players, and each camp included an outside specialist in some aspect of the development of our sport.

A tight financial budget precluded much activity in the coach accreditation area and this needs to be addressed in 1996.

I look forward to 1996 and with the support of coaches and co-ordinators hope to increase the intensity in which coach accreditation is undertaken by associations.

Thanks to all those involved in the coaching programme and those who represented TTNZ at the various conferences.

Reports from Area Coaching Co-ordinators

The individual Area Co-ordinators included the following comments in their report to TTNZ:

SOUTHERN AREA (Co-ordinator: Keith Bradley)

- Nelson/Marlborough preferred to run their own programme, which was successful.
- The coaching programme in general needs to gain in importance in the minds of the players to be successful. Players should fight to be selected for camps, not have to be persuaded.

CENTRAL AREA (Co-ordinator: Kel Smith)

- The availability and desire of Wellington and Hutt Valley players to attend area camps was lacking on occasions.
- There are a number of promising juniors in Hutt Valley, Wellington and Wanganui showing up at national level with development continuing in Hawkes Bay, Hawera, Manawatu and Wairarapa.
- Goals for the future:
 - Introduce a structured two-tier area coaching system, and move its operation to the summer in two stages - culminating in a 5-7 day camp for elite area players in late January/early February.
 - Introduce competition play into area camps and award rating points.
 - Identify players with potential from age 12 upwards and arrange programmes to accommodate them.
 - Allocate the task of nominating players for National Camps to Area Coordinators.

NORTHERN AREA (Co-ordinator: Pat Low)

- Two key words throughout all training sessions were FOCUS and INTENSITY.
- Speed, strength and agility were the aims of all physical training sessions.
- The only problem 1995 was players not returning their invitations in time.
- It is planned in 1996 to hold sessions for older players below top level particularly veteran women

Thanks

The two-year term for all Area Co-ordinators and Coaches has now concluded and Table Tennis New Zealand thanks them for taking on the task. Many dedicated hours had to be worked while the new structure settled down and became established.

The Area Coaches were Martin Duffy (Southern), Barry Wynks (Central), and Richard Lee (Northern). Barry Butler was Southern Area Co-ordinator for the first year until the appointment of Keith Bradley.

The appointments for 1996 had not been finalised at the time of preparing this report.

Professional Coaches

Two Associations employed professional coaches in 1995. Nelson arranged for a former top Chinese player, Hu Binquan, to come to New Zealand and work throughout the season in their area; and Southland hired English coach Colin Wilson for six weeks in June/July. We commend the action of these two associations in taking this initiative.

RACKET SPORTS SCIENCE AND MEDICINE

During the year a group of people associated with the High Performance Programmes in Badminton, Squash, Tennis and Table Tennis have been meeting with Sports Scientists and medical personnel to investigate the possibility of integrating sport science and medical support programmes.

It is considered that, given the many similarities, benefits could be derived from the sharing of knowledge and expertise and access to knowledgeable medical personnel and sports scientists will enhance athlete performance and ensure better value for the high performance dollar.

Discussion is taking place to advance the proposal.

UMPIRING

For many years a Provincial Umpires qualification has been in operation.

It has been decided that a two-tier system be introduced to enable umpires to qualify at Regional and National levels. The completed test papers for both levels should be available in December.

DOMESTIC PROGRAMME

NATIONAL-TYPE CHAMPIONSHIPS

As a result of a remit at the 1994 AGM, a major change was implemented at three of our four regular national-type championships: the North Island, South Island, and New Zealand Championships. The change was the abolition of round-robin group play in singles events and the introduction of second and third division events for early round losers. Adjustments were implemented after the first two tournaments and the new system appeared to be thoroughly accepted when used at the NZ Championships.

Second and third division events were also played at the NZ Veterans Championships, but these were in addition to round-robin group matches.

A brief report on each event appears below, with full results listed in the Statistics section.

9th New Zealand Veterans Championships

Hosted by Canterbury, 14 - 17 April.

The TTNZ Liaison Officer, Ron Menchi, commented "...with only twelve tables and a large entry it was amazing that so few delays occured..." He congratulated the host association, and also commented on the closeness of the competition in the teams events.

The beginning of the event was marred somewhat by two disputes over the rules governing the make-up of composite teams, one of which resulted in the withdrawal of two players in protest. It was recommended that the conditions of play be re-worded to avoid any future misunderstanding.

The total entry in the tournament was 115, including 16 from Australia. The Tournament Manager was Trevor Flint.

Hollands Honey South Island Championships

Hosted by South Canterbury, 16 - 18 June.

TTNZ Liaison Officer, Ron Garrett, complimented the host association on the improvements they made to their stadium prior to the championships. His report also contained comment on the need for all players and spectators to know who is playing on a particular table and who is next on. Either a number of computer screens spread around the stadium, or one large display such as a semaphore board, would take care of this basic requirement. A number of other useful recommendations for the future were made, including dress codes, communication with players prior to the event, and advance notice to associations of seedings.

Play slipped behind schedule on several occasions, but the open finals were completed by 9.30 pm on Saturday, and play finished at 1 pm on Sunday.

Ron Garrett concluded his report with thanks to the management team for running the tournament in a relaxed, easy going manner - without any major problems.

Roger Bennett was the Tournament Manager, and there were 113 competitors.

North Island Championships

Hosted by Auckland, 7 - 9 July

Auckland's vast amount of experience in running national-type championships was evident in this tournament. Details such as a fully timetabled programme; a semaphore board specifying events and the status of matches (semi-finals, finals); and the individual barricading of four feature tables, all contributed to the professional "look" of the event.

Liaison Officer Merv Allardyce commented on the modifications made to the criteria for 2nd and 3rd division events after the experience gained at the South Island Championships. He also complimented the management and cafeteria teams for their tireless hours of hard work with very few breaks. He made reference to the fact that this year John Bower, who has managed many major events hosted by Auckland, worked very much in the background and the tournament was placed "in the very capable hands of Catarina Adam and Shona Cudby".

The referees considered the players' behaviour to be of a good standard.

Catarina Adam was the Tournament Manager. There were 185 entries.

Kensington Tavern - Lion Breweries New Zealand Championships

Hosted by Northland, 23 August - 2 September.

This was the first NZ Championships ever hosted by the Northland Association and they received much deserved plaudits for their efforts. Not only was the event a success by our normal standards - it was memorable in a variety of other ways and the TTNZ Liaison Officer (Merv Allardyce) listed eleven outstanding features. They included the large overseas entry (37 from Japan, Fiji and New Caledonia); a 124 page programme; daily presentations for "Player of the Day" and "Fair Play" awards; and generous sponsorship which resulted in a prize of a television set for the Men's and Women's singles winners; worthwhile cash prizes for the "Shootout", and prizes for all other events, including second and third division. Sponsors also provided a large number of tables which were donated to schools at the conclusion of the championships.

The huge amount of local press coverage generated by the event has already been referred to under "Publicity"

A large amount of guidance and advice was offered to the Northland Association by people outside the area experienced in running NZ Championships, and some also assisted at the control table. But inevitably, the bulk of the work was done by local officials over a considerable period of time.

The tournament was jointly managed by James Morris and Garry Frew. The total entry was 327.

Results of all team contests and individual events are listed from page 39.

Schools Teams Championships

The three schools teams championships were each held in three stages - association, regional and New Zealand finals.

Both the secondary schools finals were held just prior to the commencement of the NZ junior championships to save the costs of travel to another venue at a different time. We record our appreciation to the Northland TTA for hosting the event.

The primary/intermediate finals were kindly hosted by the Wellington Association for the second vear in succession.

Five regions were represented in the secondary open finals, three in the secondary girls and four in the primary/intermediate.

Summaries of the results are on pages 46 and 47.

We feel the potential of these championships is not being fully realised in some areas. The event is a chance to encourage <u>any</u> school with table tennis players to enter a team at association level. A modicum of success in an event such as this could be the start of a small club establishing itself around the school team.

Another problem which has to be addressed is the cost. Some regional winners are reluctant to participate in the New Zealand finals for this reason.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

PETER JACKSON (Auckland) has been named the 1995 Player of the Year. Peter's performance at the World Championships was his best ever. He reached the main draw of the Men's Singles and raised his world ranking from 171 to 119.

JUNIOR OF YEAR AWARD - H N BALLINGER CUP

The 1995 Junior of the Year and the winner of the H N Ballinger Cup was TRACEY PHILLIPS

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - RUSSELL DICKEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to that junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand table tennis taking into account performance, behaviour, neatness of presentation, co-operation and team spirit. The award can be won once only by any player.

The winner for 1995 was JAN NG (Auckland)

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Commonwealth Championships were held in Singapore, 21 - 28 April. The team, results, and other statistics are recorded later in the report, starting from page 48.

The team managers commented on the problems caused by lack of match play in the build-up to this event, always a factor in early season championships. Conditions of play were also difficult, with no air conditioning and temperatures as high as the early 30's. Nonetheless there were some good performances, especially from Peter Jackson and Sabine Koestel.

It was observed that an increasing number of expatriot Chinese are now representing a variety of Commonwealth counties.

The team commented favourably on the standard of accommodation at the Sea View Hotel.

43RD WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Held in Tianjin, China, on 1-14 May, this event was the obvious highlight of the international programme.

Those lucky enough to attend were awed by the venue, the opening and closing ceremonies, and the standard of play generally.

More than 100 countries competed and with the split of the former Soviet Union a number of new, and very strong, countries have made it more difficult for smaller countries to maintain their positions at world level.

Senior team manager Peter Hirst commented on the intensity of the event for the players: "A World Championships brings out the best and worst in people. Playing internationally one is exposed tactically, technically, physically and psychologically." He commended the teams performance, citing particularly good wins against Sri Lanka (women's team), and Bulgaria (men's team). He also said that Peter Jackson's performance was the best he'd ever seen from him. Jackson's world ranking improved from 171 to 119.

The team, results, and other statistics appear later in the report, commencing on page 51.

5TH INTERATIONAL TOURNAMENT OF NOUMEA

This tournament was held in Noumea, New Caledonia, from 12 to 15 July, and junior events were introduced for the first time. New Zealand selected one player in each of the four categories: Senior Men, Senior Women, Under 18 Boys, Under 18 Girls.

Peter Jackson and Debbie Garrett shared the Men's and Women's doubles titles respectively, both with Australian partners. Belinda Beazer proved superior to the New Caledonian opposition and won the Under 18 girls title.

The senior team finished second and the junior team third.

Full results and other details appear on pages 53-55.

NEW ZEALAND v FIJI

•

This series of friendly international contests, played from 22 to 29 July, came about as a result of Richard Lee taking up a coaching position with the Fiji Association for a three month period. Richard's task was to prepare the Fiji team for the South Pacific Games in Tahiti, and he requested that TTNZ arrange a visit by a party of New Zealanders as part of Fiji's build-up. With Richard co-ordinating arrangements from the Fiji end, the NZ selectors picked eight players and the series of matches proved a worth-while initiative.

We thank the players for availing themselves for this goodwill event. The teams and results are recorded on page 56.

1995 AUSTRALIAN UNDER 15 AND UNDER 17 CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Junior Championships were this year held at the Kilsyth International Table Tennis Stadium, Croydon, Victoria - from 8 to 14 July. The senior manager of the New Zealand team was Barry Butler, assisted by Murray Finch, Stacey Hooper and John Stapleton - the latter two travelling with junior teams for the first time.

Each of the team managers was allocated to a specific team, and this change from previous practice appeared to work well.

The New Zealand teams (one boys and one girls team in each age-group) did reasonably well and all finished in the top half of their competition. The Under 15 boys team finished 3rd. Barry Butler commented in his report on the unsatisfactory practice of not seeding New Zealand teams, which usually results in our teams meeting the strongest opposition in the early rounds. A promise was made by Australian officials to review this practice.

In the individual events, Stephen Hirst and Laura-Lee Smith won bronze medals in the Under 17 Mixed Doubles. A number of other NZ pairs reached the quarter finals in various doubles events.

Responsibility for assessing the players was assumed by Murray Finch, who furnished extremely detailed player reports covering a wide range of headings.

Full details of all the NZ players' results are listed later in the report, beginning on page 57.

1995 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

These championships were held in Melbourne from 14 to 21 October. The arrangements for the trip were co-ordinated by John Lelliott, whose report and results summary appear on page 62.

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT TOUR

A proposed tour of Queesland for emerging players was abandoned.

This tour was originally planned to take place immediately following the 1994 NZ Championships but because of travel difficulties it was deferred to June, 1995. The amended date did not suit enough of the players to justify the tour going ahead.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

- ** 1995 World Teams Cup: Held in Atlanta on 10-13 August. Australian teams, as winners of the last Oceania Championships, represented Oceania in both the men's and women's events.
- ** 1995 Men's World Cup: Although a qualifying tournament was scheduled to be held by Oceania, it was not held despite strong representations from New Zealand. OTTF decided that Paul Langley (Australia), as the current Oceania men's singles title-holder, would be the Oceania representative.
- 1995 Women's World Cup: This is a new event. As there was insufficient time to hold a qualifying tournament OTTF named Shirley Zhou (Australia), the current Oceania women's singles title-holder, as the Oceania representative.

Both World Singles Cups were held in France on 11-15 October.

- ** Oceania Championships: The next championships are scheduled for 1996. Guam was to have been the host country but did not confirm their option. The championships will now be held in New Zealand in May or June. The venue has not yet been finalised.
- ** Olympic Games: The next games will be held in Atlanta, USA, commencing on 20 July, 1996. An Oceania Qualifying tournament is scheduled to be played in Melbourne in April. The Oceania allocation is 2 male and 2 female singles players and 1 men's and 1 women's doubles pair.

The winning of a place does not automatically guarantee a place in the NZ Olympic team. Qualifiers are still subject to selection confirmation by the NZOCGA selection panel.

1996 NATIONAL TYPE CHAMPIONSHIPS

With the change to the four term school year, consideration was given to the timing of the various championships.

The Veterans championships will still be held at Easter. The North Island championships will move to Queen's Birthday weekend and the South Island to August. The Senior and Junior New Zealand championships will be run separately with the seniors in July and the juniors in September.

1996 OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS

These championships are held every two years. The 1996 event was scheduled to be hosted by Guam but as they did not confirm their option New Zealand was invited to take over as hosts. The invitation was accepted.

The championships are an important event for the member countries and their athletes. The winners qualify to represent Oceania at the Men's and Women's World Cup singles tournament, the World Teams Cup, and the Global Youth championships.

The New Zealand venue has not yet been finalised.

2000 WORLD VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The feasibility of hosting these championships is being explored. Documentation has been sent to several cities to identify whether a suitable venue is available (the required playing area alone is 5,000 sq m)

If a decision is made to proceed, a formal bid will be made to the World Veterans Organising Committee towards the end of April, 1996, with the result known about June, 1996. If the bid is successful it is proposed to hold the championships in early September, 2000, just prior to the Olympic Games in Sydney.

Whilst the task of organising such an event is quite "mind-boggling", it can be a focus for table tennis in New Zealand. An appreciation of the size of the tournament can be gained from the 1994 championships held in Melbourne which attracted over 1800 competitors.

Hosting the event will not only be a boost for table tennis but it will have a significant economic impact, especially for the host city.

OBITUARY

ICHIRO OGIMURA

(International Table Tennis Federation President, 1987 - 1994)

Ichiro Ogimura's death occured on 4.12.94, at the age of 62. He was a man who enjoyed a spectacular table tennis career - World Singles Champion in 1954 and 1956, later a renowned coach and finally ITTF President. He visited New Zealand twice: as a playing member of the Japanese team which toured this country extensively in 1957; and briefly in 1988 in his capacity as ITTF President - the only top ITTF official ever to visit New Zealand.

He will be remembered as an innovative man who worked hard to upgrade the image of table tennis.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Although the accounts which follow would suggest otherwise, the Association has completed the year in a sound financial position. The final deficit of \$10,764, against a budgetted deficit of \$9,040, is a satisfactory result given the number of training camps which were held with the major proportion of costs being a charge on reserve funds accumulated over recent years. Alternate funding sources will need to be identified if training camps are to be held during the next season.

Income received from association allocations, and from the Hillary Commission, was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including various tournaments, interest received, ball royalties, sponsorship and sales of stock items. Grants were also received from the New Zealand Sports Foundation towards the cost of travel by Peter Hirst to the World Championships, and as a contribution towards the costs of those players selected for the Olympic Qualifying tournament in Australia during 1996.

Costs to team members on overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) were offset by a contribution from funds received as part of the national lottery conducted during 1994. The value of the 'Players' Overseas Tour Fund' will be boosted with further funds due to be received as the 1995 lottery is processed.

National training camps were again subsidised; participants contributed a maximum of \$80 per camp; reduced from the \$100 charged during the previous year.

Grants totalling \$44,000 were received from the Hillary Commission in terms of the 1994 funding application including \$3000 for attendance at ITTF meetings by GP Rau. The level of funding was substantially lower than for the previous year and was as a consequence of the Commission's policy of limiting grants to no more than one third of the total income of any sports organisation.

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$76,914. Other revenue, excluding that in the form of grants, totalled \$9,503. Fees outstanding at the end of the financial year totalled \$20,116.

For 1995, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our total grant will be \$44,000; the same as for 1994. A condition of the funding is that the Association must give a clear undertaking to implement the plans developed by the recent planning workshops and in that respect the Management Committee will be giving priority to ensuring that current trends are reversed. With the exception of the funds payable to GP Rau, the balance of the grant will go towards meeting the administrative costs of the National Office.

1996 fee allocations to district associations are expected to be \$70,000; an increase of 1%.
