ADMINISTRATION

Restructure

The annual meeting held on 2 December 1995 was a memorable one and time will prove that it was a historic one. That was the meeting which gave the go-ahead for a restructure to have an appointed rather than an elected Board and that the role of that Board should be one of governance rather than management.

The task of overseeing the arrangements to bring the restructure to fruition was admirably handled by John Beatson.

We record our appreciation to the Board Appointments Committee of Trish McKelvey (Hillary Commission), Grahame Bilby (professional personnel consultant and well known sportsman), David Knowles (Hillary Commission manager for Regional Sports Trusts, previously manager of North Harbour Regional Sports Trust), Ron Menchi and Bob Inns (table tennis appointees.)

We are also very grateful to Robin Radford for his research on and drafting of the new constitution and to Kate Lane of Simpson Grierson for her professional input.

It is now history that the Special General Meeting held on 11 July 1996 approved the new constitution which included changing the name to Table Tennis New Zealand Inc.

<u>Management</u>

Between the last annual meeting and the special general meeting on 11 July 1996 which approved the new constitution, the Management Committee met on seven occasions. With two members residing outside the greater Wellington area, use was made of telephone conference facilities.

The only meeting of the National Council was held following the annual meeting.

NZ Lottery

We were unsuccessful in arranging a partner this year and the ticket orders received from the 11 interested associations were not sufficient for TTNZ to proceed with a NZ lottery with prizes befitting a national lottery.

Associations were referred to a professional lottery organiser and we are aware that some associations took advantage of that opportunity to raise funds.

2000 World Veterans Championships

The Olympic Games in Sydney in 2000 was the reason for the decision to make a formal bid to host these championships in September 2000. Four other countries submitted bids and Canada was the successful country. Had the championships been allocated to New Zealand they would have been held in Christchurch.

Although unsuccessful, a lot was learnt and the knowledge will be very useful for a future bid.

New Board

As can be appreciated it will take time for the new Board to settle in and to carry out a review of all aspects of the administration of table tennis in New Zealand. However, Chairman Alan Hounsell is not wasting time in ensuring that the function of the Board is one of governance, not management, and national issues are being addressed.

Delegates at the 1995 Annual General meeting agreed to the change of structure and this was formalised at the special general meeting held on 11 July 1996, with the adoption of a new constitution. Associations now need to have confidence that the Board will put in place structures for the progressive development and enhancement of table tennis.

Table Tennis Info Newsletter

One of the early decisions of the Board was to implement a regular newsletter to associations and clubs. The intention is that copies be made available to all affiliated members.

The first issue was published soon after the first meeting of the Board and the feedback has been very positive. The second issue was published after the next Board meeting in early November.

We record our appreciation to Robin Radford who prepared the submission upon which the Board made their decision. Robin has now accepted the role of compiler and editor. In the latter he is ably and enthusiastically assisted by Administration Officer, John Kilev.

Ratinas

The computerised rating system was extended to include Over 50, Under 21 and Under 17 age-groups, and to include every open tournament rather than two selected tournaments per region. There was also an adjustment made to the points weightings as they applied to age-group events and further minor adjustments may be needed in 1997.

Ten published lists were produced throughout the season, six circulated to all associations and four additional up-dated lists were displayed at major tournaments.

The final rating lists for 1996 are listed from page 26.

Publicity

All Associations were encouraged to appoint a specialist publicity officer. Fourteen Associations advised the name and contact details for their publicity officer and copies of all national press releases were sent to them. The officers were also encouraged to send copies of press articles that had been published to the national office. Nelson and South Canterbury are areas which are known to have had outstanding success with newspaper coverage of local activities, and a number of other associations have also enjoyed considerable success.

The playing numbers for 1994 and 1995 have been adjusted to take account of association returns which were received too late to be included in the reports for those years.

It is pleasing to record a change in the downward trend of recent years. There was a significant increase in the number of teams competing and a modest but encouraging increase in playing numbers.

Congratulations to those associations which generated more activity.

The trends in these figures are very important as they are noted by and taken into account by the Hillary Commission as a factor when they determine the level of funding made by them to Table Tennis New Zealand.

HILLARY COMMISSION FOR SPORT, FITNESS AND LEISURE

For our 1996 programme we received grant-aid funding from the Hillary Commission totalling \$44,000. Details of the funding are included in the Treasurer's report and financial accounts.

Local Funding Scheme

On the basis of \$1.35 per head of population, a total of \$4,938,575 was distributed by the Hillary Commission to 74 local authorities. A further \$2,979,983 was added to this figure as a result of loans revolving, funds carried forward from 1994/95 and some councils contributing their own funds so a total of \$7,918,558 was available for distribution. The total funds allocated by subsidy or loan were \$5,155,646.

Table Tennis associations and clubs were allocated \$27,383 (0.53% of the total allocation.) A comparison of the last four years is as follows:

Clearly, there is opportunity for more associations and clubs to apply for funding through this source. As there can be variations on the criteria from council to council it is important that the help of the council is sought.

NZ WAY OLYMPIC SPORTS BRANDING

The New Zealand Way Brand is a long term and dynamic international campaign to develop a unique personality for New Zealand which will give New Zealand exports a premium position in the global marketplace.

The NZ Olympic and Commonwealth Games Association (NZOCGA) has entered into a joint venture branding campaign with The New Zealand Way Ltd by designing and promoting a complementary and vibrant joint brand called The New Zealand Way - Olympic Sport Brand ("The Brand")

The use of The Brand has been offered to all Olympic National Sports Federations and they each receive a fee based on their potential to promote The Brand. Bonus payments may be available to those National Federations which, in the opinion of the NZOCGA, exceed initial expectations in respect of promoting The Brand.

Through the promotional activities of our teams which competed in the 1995 Commonwealth and World championships we received a bonus of \$500.

The initial period of the promotion is up to 31 December 1996 with annual grants of \$2,500.

NZ SPORTS ASSEMBLY

The membership of the Assembly included 110 national sports organisations which represent about 1.4 million sports members

Th Assembly has both a proactive and reactive role. It keeps abreast of legislation which could have an impact on sport, consults with the sports likely to be affected and makes submissions to the appropriate Select Committees. Examples are Sports Betting, Taxation, proposed Health and Physical Education Curriculum draft and Liquor Advertising.

Mary Stuart retired as Executive Director in 1996, having held the position for 13 years. Mary worked very hard on behalf of sport and it is appropriate that her work be acknowledged in this report.

UMPIRING

The Regional level umpiring examination was introduced and seven persons have completed the written examination. Five have also passed the practical assessment to qualify as Regional Umpires. The others are awaiting their practical assessment.

It is planned to have the National level qualification available in 1997.

COACHING

Activity in this area proceeded admirably in many districts and at area level, but was constrained somewhat at national level by limited funds.

The associations who are able to assign at least one person to the task of generating interest in schools, educating one or more teachers in the basics of coaching and following it up with regular coaching sessions at the school, are reaping considerable benefits. The ideal age at which to target children appears to be intermediate level, before they have made a firm decision over which sport to pursue seriously. Clubs and associations are then able to identify potential talent and invite area coaching co-ordinators to bring those players into our coaching system as early as possible.

Area coaching camps were well attended. Approximately 220 trainees in total attended 16 separate camps involving 24 coaches. In addition, specialists on fitness, physiology and nutrition were invited to lecture at northern area camps. Richard Lee's contribution to coaching in the northern area was immense and much appreciated by those with whom he worked. Although the central area did not have an appointed area coach, there was no shortage of high quality coaches to service the training camps in that area - some drawn from outside the area. Much of the southern area work was based around the newly set up Academy of Table Tennis in Nelson. (Refer below). Travel costs were inevitably a problem in the southern area and some trainees, if travelling by road, required two extra days off school or work.

Area coaching co-ordinators commented in their reports on the need for the scheduling of area and national coaching camps to be co-ordinated, finalised early, and not changed once finalised. They also urged that off-season periods should be utilised as much as possible.

The Coach Accreditation system is now in place and thirteen new coaches attained Level One as a result of a course conducted by Richard Lee in September.

At national level, two Under 20/Under 17 camps were held in January - one in Timaru and one in Hamilton. A further camp for the same age-groups was held in Hamilton at Easter, and an Under 14 camp was held in Wanganui later in April. Richard Lee, Murray Finch, Hu Binquan, Martin Duffy, Zhu Hui and Stacey Hooper led these national camps, with valuable support from the host associations.

Representations on the urgent need for a national coach in addition to a national director of coaching continued to be made this year and the issue will be given attention by the new Board.

Prominent coaches were encouraged by giving support to their participation in appropriate forums. Murray Finch and Richard Lee attended High Performance coaches seminars and Zhu Hui attended the 1996 Coaching New Zealand annual conference. In November, 1995 John Stapleton attended a Junior Sport Forum.

Table Tennis New Zealand sincerely thanks National Director of Coaching, Barry Butler, for admirably handling an immense work-load - made even more burdensome by a reduced budget. Thanks are also due to all who applied themselves diligently to the role of a coach or coaching administrator - whether at national level, area level, association level, club level, or in schools.

NELSON ACADEMY OF TABLE TENNIS

The status of table tennis in New Zealand was raised to a new level in 1996 by the opening of this country's first full-time table tennis academy in Nelson.

Established on the initiative of Bryan Keane, and set up following successful moves to have top Chinese coach Hu Binquan immigrate to New Zealand, the academy offers everything from short term camps and one-to-one coaching, to full-time study for up to three years which combines normal school work with a regular table tennis training programme. Considerable interest is being shown in what the academy offers by players from all over the country and overseas, notably Taiwan.

Table Tennis New Zealand congratulates Bryan Keane, Hu Binquan, the Nelson Association and all associated with this venture, and wishes it every success.

DOMESTIC PROGRAMME

NATIONAL TYPE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The advent of the four term school year forced a rethink for the dates of the various championships. The one which prompted the most discussion was the timing of the NZ Senior championships during the July school vacation. During a meeting of some of the top senior players at the championships there was a consensus that July was too early. Following the championships an invitation to associations to comment elicited only six responses.

A suggested programme for the 1997 championships has been circulated to associations for comment.

The new Board has affirmed the decision of the previous Management Committee that from 1998 the contribution of the national office in the processing of entries for national type championships be extended to a specialist team doing the timetabling and running the various championships. The aim is to keep improving the presentation of the championships through continuity of organisation and to provide opportunity for smaller associations with the facilities but not the personnel or expertise to host them. This will leave the host association free to concentrate on matters such as catering, publicity and sponsorship.

NEW ZEALAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

These were divided into separate senior, junior and veterans championships. All were hosted by the Auckland Association.

Veterans, 5 - 8 April

This event was being held for the tenth year and it was appropriate that it should be hosted by Auckland, who had hosted the inaugural NZ Veterans Championships in 1987.

Favourable comments were passed on Auckland Stadium's impressive new entrance, and the stadium fulfilled all the other requirements for the sport to be well presented - high quality lighting, tables and nets.

The entry totalled 124, a new record, and there was also a record number of players from Australia competing (24).

Seniors, 8 - 18 July

A total of eleven sponsors were acknowledged by the organisers of this event.

An otherwise high quality field was marred by the absence of Peter Jackson and Li Chunli, both of whom withdrew to concentrate on Chunli's Olympic Games build-up (Chunli as our sole playing representative, Peter as her Manager/Coach/Training Partner).

Overall the event received mixed reviews - some felt July was far too early, and the absence of junior players combined with the size of the Auckland Stadium gave the event a lacklustre atmosphere. However, timetabling was efficient and organisation was enthusiastic.

Juniors, 23 - 28 September

A more congenial atmosphere prevailed at this tournament than at the Senior Championships - contributed to largely by the greater number of supporters. The team finals in particular generated a lot of interest, in the lower grades as well as A Grade.

NORTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Hosted by the Wanganui Association from 1 - 3 June (Queen's Birthday weekend), this event was well supported and well run.

As always, accommodating the extensive programme in three days was difficult and delays were experienced at some stages. Despite this, and a relatively small team of table stewards and semaphore board operators, the tournament ended close to its scheduled finishing time.

Sixteen blue competition tables were available, with four practice tables in the Wanganui Association's own stadium adjoining the main competition venue.

SOUTH ISLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Hosted by the Otago Association from 9 - 10 August, this event was completed a day ahead of schedule due to extended hours on Saturday night and a drop in entry numbers from last year.

The liaison officer's report had positive comments concerning the players' behaviour and the quality of the lighting, but considered that the nets were below standard for a national event, and that the players' dress left a lot to be desired.

Tables were set out in three bays of three and one bay of five. Each table had its own umpire's stand.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

LI CHUNLI (North Harbour) was named the 1996 Player of the Year. Highlights of Chunli's table tennis year include:

- ** beating the current China open champion
- beating the world number three (Chen Jing)
- ** a clean sweep of titles at the Oceania Championships
- fifteen wins out of fifteen at the Oceania Olympic Qualifying Tournament
- ** selection for the Olympic Games in Atlanta at which she played above her seeding to finish second in her group
- ** raising her world ranking from 52 to 48.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR - RUSSELL DICKEY MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy is awarded to the junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand table tennis taking into account performance, behaviour, neatness of presentation, co-operation and team spirit. The award can be won once only by any player.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMME

OCEANIA OLYMPIC QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT (Melbourne: 12 - 15 April)

Six men and six women competed in this event (three from New Zealand and three from Australia). A high standard of table tennis was evident and, among the men especially, many long and close matches were fought. Thirteen matches went to five games.

Excellent performances from Peter Jackson and Li Chunli resulted in both completing the tournament without conceding a match.

The names of the selected players and singles results are listed from page 48.

While winners of this event are automatically nominated for selection by their respective countries, final selection is subject to approval by the national Olympic selectors. Chunli's selection was confirmed but Peter Jackson's was not. Despite strenuous representations to the national Olympic selection panel, Peter's omission was re-affirmed.

A report on the Olympic Games appears later.

OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS (Auckland: 17 - 22 June)

These biennial championships were last hosted by New Zealand in 1990 when the event was held in Palmerston North. This year Auckland Association was the host and the event was controlled by David Jackson and refereed by Ivan Houghton. Oceania President, New Zealander Geoff Rau, officially opened the championships.

Six countries competed. Team and individual events were conducted for open and under 20 agegroups, with individual events for under 17 players. The under 20 and under 17 matches were played according to the Global Youth championships format (games to 11, alternate serving).

New Zealanders Li Chunli and Peter Jackson dominated the championships - both unbeaten in teams events and winners of their respective open singles titles. Karen Li and Vicki Garrett also won titles.

There were major logistical details to be attended to and matters such as team transport, catering, umpires, and a social function were handled well by local personnel. Special thanks are owed to David Jackson, whose up-dated computer technology provided for smooth running of the event, accurate recording of results, and high quality presentation of information in the programme and results summary. Ivan Houghton set a high standard in performing his referee's duties.

A large contingent of New Zealanders participated. Their results are recorded from page 50.

AUSTRALIAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS (Sydney: 29 June - 6 July)

The competing age-groups at this event were Under 17 and Under 14 - a change from the previous age-groups of Under 17 and Under 15. The change meant that our top Under 15 players were denied the opportunity of travelling to the event. Several very young players were, instead, given an early taste of international play.

The four teams were supported in their matches by only three coaches due to the late withdrawal of a fourth. The three were required to spend long hours in the stadium and their efforts deserve commendation. A parent who travelled with the team gave valuable support.

The Under 17 girls team and the Under 14 boys team performed above expectations, finishing third and fourth in their respective ten-team competitions. Results in the individual events were not outstanding although quite a number of players reached the last sixteen in the singles and the last eight in the doubles.

Officials and parents expressed concern over the delay in the dissemination of key information relating to the travel and accommodation arrangements. The concern was legitimate and noted by TTNZ. Difficulties in finalising the itinerary arose from a three week delay in confirming that the coach who had withdrawn couldn't be replaced; and the late withdrawal of three players.

The cost to individual players of making this trip continues to raise concern, with sponsorship (either of individual players or groups, or of the whole event) appearing to be one of the few viable solutions.

A number of useful general recommendations were made by the team manager on behalf of the other officials and players.

OLYMPIC GAMES

Held in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, this four-yearly glamour event was attended by a team of just one player (Li Chunli), and a coach/team-leader (Peter Jackson)

Peter Jackson, who is also our top male player, was exceedingly unlucky not to attend the event as a player, given his performance at the Oceania Olympic Qualifying tournament (referred to earlier).

Due to a delay in naming the team manager/coach, there was less time for Chunii and Peter to form a working relationship than would have been desirable. However, Chunii was able to prepare well for the event by spending many hours on the table with her sister Karen and by travelling to the Japan open. Her form during the build-up was good and her confidence was high having beaten two of the best players in the world within a matter of weeks before the Olympics.

On the day, Chunli was eliminated by the eventual runner-up (Chen Jing of Taipei) but second place in her group ensured that she finished in the top half of the field (16th - 32nd in a field of 64).

1996 AUSTRALIAN OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS AND INTERSTATE TEAMS EVENT

Discussions between New Zealand and Australian officials at the Australian junior championships led to the participation in this event by New Zealand teams in Brisbane in August.

Initially we were to participate in the Open Championships only but negotiated to play in the interstate event as well to make a week-long trip.

Teams from Europe and Asia participated in the Australian open.

New Zealand players' results appear on page 63.

1996 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Held in early November, these championships were attended by thirteen New Zealanders. Val Beaver and Bob Lassen performed well in the teams events, winning 83% and 79% of their singles matches respectively. The Over 40 women's team finished third to qualify for bronze medals.

In the individual events, Val Beaver maintained her good form and won a bronze medal in the Over 40 women's singles, and a gold medal in the Over 40 mixed doubles with Paul Pinkewich. John Lelliott won a silver medal in the Over 60 men's doubles.

The trip to these championships was co-ordinated by John Lelliott. Results appear on page 64.

OCEANIA TABLE TENNIS FEDERATION

Thirteen countries are currently affiliated to the Oceania Federation.

The Biennial General Meeting was held in Auckland during the 8th Oceania championships. Geoff Rau did not seek re-election as President. Neil Harwood (Australia) was elected. At the same meeting David Jackson was elected to the Management Committee. Prior to this a New Zealander has occupied the position of either President or Executive Director so we have not sought a position on the Management Committee.

1996 Men's World Cup: This event was scheduled to be held in France in October. Oceania was represented by Peter Jackson.

1996 Women's World Cup: This singles event was held in Hong Kong at the end of September. Oceania was represented by Shirley Zhou (Australia.) Although Li Chunli is the Oceania titleholder and would normally have represented Oceania, the need for the nominee to be named at an earlier date than the Oceania championships and the fact that the 1995 event was cancelled at short notice prompted the ITTF to invite Shirley Zhou as the then current titleholder to compete.

INTERNATIONAL/OVERSEAS POSITIONS

Geoff Rau Is the current ITTF vice-president for Oceania but is not seeking re-election at

the BGM in May 1997.

Retired as the President of Oceania TTF at the meeting held in conjunction with

the Oceania championships.

David Jackson Is a full member of the ITTF Ranking Committee.

Was elected to the Oceania Management Committee at the meeting held in

conjunction with the Oceania championships.

Peter Jackson Is the Oceania representative on the ITTF Athletes Commission.

APPRECIATION - RON MENCHI

Ron Menchi did not seek a position on the new Board so when it took over Ron ended his direct contribution to the management of New Zealand table tennis which began in 1965 and which included a period as chairman of the Management Committee. He was interested in all aspects of table tennis at the national level and his contribution was recognised at the annual meeting held on 14 March 1992 when he was elected a Life Member of the Association. A trademark of his work was the conscientious manner in which he approached tasks and this was especially so in the areas of seedings and rankings. Fortunately, under the new structure there is going to be a greater need for persons outside the Board to contribute. If available, Ron Menchi's talents are still needed.

CONCLUSION

In last year's annual report we commented that 1995 could be seen as a turning point in the history of table tennis in New Zealand.

The planning workshops which were held during 1995 produced documentation to lay the foundations for table tennis to grow and move in new directions.

The administrative structure is almost in place and the new Board is tackling the challenges with enthusiasm.

The role of governance is a major change from how table tennis has been administered since its formation in 1934. The approach by the Board will be quite different from what we have been accustomed to and for many administrators it will mean moving out of their "comfort zone." This should not, however, be seen as threatening in any way; rather an opportunity to be part of a new ball game and the challenges which go with developing an established product in new and innovative ways.

This report finishes with a plea. Associations showed confidence by agreeing to the structural changes. Continue to show that confidence by giving the Board and its policies the opportunity to come to fruition. As already mentioned there will be changes to the way things have been done but let the "big picture" emerge and take shape before reacting.

Table Tennis is a great sport. It can have a great future. There will be plenty for those with some time and talents to be part of that great future at whatever level they choose to operate, whether it be at club, association or national. This is an open invitation to be part of the action. Will you join us?

TREASURER'S REPORT

This past year has been a 'holding' one as we have seen the transition to a new structure with a new Board of management. The final deficit of \$13,840, against a budgetted deficit of \$9,040, was a disappointing result with the cost of training camps and interational events being greater than envisaged. As was the case in 1994/95, the major proportion of those costs were a charge on reserve funds. Additional funding sources will need to be obtained in 1996/97.

Income received from association allocations, and from the Hillary Commission, was complemented by revenue from a number of sources including tournaments, interest received, sponsorship and sales of stock items. A sum of \$2,000 was received from the NZ Sports Foundation towards team costs in respect to the Olympic Qualifying tournament.

Costs to team members on overseas tours (funded largely by the players themselves) were offset by a contribution from funds received as part of the national lottery conducted during 1995. The value of the 'Players' Overseas Tour Fund' has diminished, however, due to it not being possible to organise a lottery during 1996. Available funds will be largely exhausted through grants to the players selected for the 1997 World Championships.

Grants totalling \$44,000 were received from the Hillary Commission in terms of the 1995 funding application including \$3000 for attendance at ITTF meetings by GP Rau, our ITTF official. The level of funding remained at the same level as in 1995.

Income from allocations to associations (determined by the then respective regions) and revenue from championships brought in \$77,566. Other revenue, excluding that in the form of grants, totalled \$8,924. Fees outstanding at the end of the financial year totalled \$15,664.

Costs incurred in respect to Council and Board meetings during the year have been expensed. 1996 fee allocations to district associations were increased to cover those costs from the previous year. Annual allocations will continue to provide for the costs of Board meetings to be recovered from that source.

For 1996/97, the Hillary Commission has confirmed that our total grant will be \$44,000; the same as for 1995/96. A condition of the funding is that the Association must give a clear undertaking to update and implement the strategic plan. In that respect the Board will be giving priority to ensuring that goals and objectives documented in the plan are achieved.

Along with most other national sports organisations, we are to be 'bulk funded' by the Hillary Commission. This means that we will receive funds to enable us to achieve agreed outcomes; failure to do will result in reduced funding in subsequent years.
