## INTRODUCTION

When I think of 2002, I think achievement, and none more so than the undoubted highlight of Li Chunli's Gold Medal in the Womens Singles at the Commonwealth Games in Manchester.

Li Chunli's gold medal showed all players that regardless of age, many hours of dedicated training will assist your goals to be met. To reach the highest levels in your chosen sport is not meant to be easy, self belief and hard work plays a major role in success.

Who would have imagined before the Games that a table tennis player would have been the sports person in the N Z team who won the most number of medals for an individual.

This was also a team success and the medals won were just reward for the many hours of practice and personal sacrifices made by the players and officials.

Let us not forget also, the NZ Under 17 Boys Team who beat Australia in the Teams event at the Oceania Champs in Fiji, thus earning the right to represent Oceania at the World Junior Championships at Chile in November 2003. This was an outstanding team effort.

Two of our players were also selected in an Oceania Team which competed at the inaugural World Cadet Challenge in Hungary. The incentives to display their skills on the world stage are in place for our young players.

Achievement was not just limited to the playing side, as we now have a new International Umpire in Bruce Penberthy, and Averil Roberts was given the honour of umpiring the Mixed Doubles Final at the Commonwealth Games.

Also in recognition of his skills, James Morris was appointed Coach of the Oceania Boys Team at the World Cadet Challenge.

Chunli's gold medal success and the ensuing publicity made the public more aware of table tennis, and resulted in many calls to the national office inquiring how to join a club. A significant number of calls were from ex players wanting to get back into the game.

One of the most important events for TTNZ will occur in September 2003 where we will host a leg of the ITTF World Junior Circuit. This has the potential to be the biggest international table tennis event seen in NZ.

The importance to table tennis in NZ is huge, as future tournament allocations to TTNZ will undoubtedly hinge on the overall management and success of the youth event as viewed by the ITTF.

What a challenge for Table Tennis Wellington and the many volunteers who will help to ensure this tournament is a resounding success on the world circuit.

Locally the coaching area has seen the appointments of Murray Finch as Junior Coach and Helen Codlin as Junior Assistant Coach with the emphasis on regional coaching. Their ability to identify and help develop young talent will be of immense value towards the further growth of table tennis in NZ and our focus on the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne.

The Umpires Committee are working hard to promote the importance of their specialist area and are keen to increase their membership.

The Publisher of the T T Info magazine Robin Radford has stepped down from this voluntary position.. I would personally like to thank Robin, as I know his contribution has been immense, involving many hours of work to produce a first class magazine

I also thank James Morris for his contribution to all areas of the Board and table tennis, as he stands down from the Board. James has always been a totally dedicated and a hardworking board member, and the void he leaves will be difficult to replace. Fortunately he will still be involved with table tennis outside the board.

I would like to thank my fellow board members for their work during the year, Kevin Thomas, our Administration Officer and his Assistant Averil Roberts, for their hard work during a difficult first year, and finally, I wish all involved with table tennis all the best for 2003.

Membership figures for the calendar year 2001 was slightly above that for the same period for 2000.

The figures as at 30 September 2002 regrettably do not reflect the true situation as one large association had not submitted any registrations as at this date. Indications are that if all registrations including a tidy up from some associations are received for the year by Dec 31<sup>st</sup> 2002, an increase will result, even though a small one.

## Awards

### Player of the Year

Li Chunli was named 2002 Player of the Year. This was in recognition of her magnificent performance at the Commonwealth Games in Manchester where she won the gold medal in the women's singles, silver in the womens doubles and womens teams, and bronze in the mixed doubles.

### Junior of the Year – H N Ballinger Cup

The criteria used in awarding this cup cover sportsmanship, potential, dress, personality, enthusiasm, interest in club and/or Association management and playing results.

The winner for 2002 was Blair Paterson (Manawatu)

### Junior Player of the Year – Russell Dickey Memorial Trophy

This trophy is awarded to the Junior player who has brought the most credit to New Zealand Table Tennis, taking into account performance, behaviour, neatness of presentation, co-operation and team spirit. The award can only be won once by any player.

The winner for 2002 was Jiani Hu (Nelson)

## Coaching / Coach Education Report

Highlights for the year

TTNZ resources were concentrated on the build up towards the Commonwealth Games. An increase in funding from the Academy of Sport and the NZOC was invaluable. The medal tally and Li Chunli winning gold in the women's singles rewarded this.

Commonwealth Games

- Table Tennis was included as a sport for the first time.
- Li Chunli won gold in the women's singles
- Li Chunli and Karen Li won silver in the women's doubles
- Li Chunli and Peter Jackson won bronze in the mixed doubles
- The women's team won bronze in the team's event.
- The men's team were 8<sup>th</sup> in the team's event.
- Video analysis programme was developed and Helen Codlin was appointed to this position which was funded through the PM coaching scholarship.

The build up and preparation for the Commonwealth Games included:

- Training camp in Whangarei for the CG squad where Jan Berner, international coach attended.
- Carded athlete status to CG squad – table tennis became a carded sport
- Women's team trained in China
- Fitness requirement for CG team implemented
- Oceania Championships preceded Manchester
- Commonwealth Games team trained at Northwich, England.
- High performance workshops were attended by elite coaches

Coach Education

- Kiwi sport accreditation of trainee teachers – AUT
- Level 2 solidarity funding was declined.
- Level 1 coaching courses continuing.

#### Other Significant Events included

- Appointment of NZ Junior Coach Murray Finch and Assistant Coach Helen Codlin.
- Oceania Championships in Fiji - juniors and seniors competed. Juniors and Murray Finch attended ITTF training camp organised by Glenn Tepper.
- ITTF world cadet championships held in Hungary for the first time.
- Jan Berner an international coach visited NZ and attended training camps throughout the country.
- Regional coaches in Otago, Hawkes Bay, and Northern Areas continuing. Training camps were held.
- Junior development camps in Nelson and North Harbour coordinated by Junior Development Officer Dave Cook.
- Trips by NZ coaches and players to the Commonwealth Games, Oceania Championships, ITTF World Cadet challenge.
- Elite players were awarded PM scholarships for tertiary study.

### Technical Committee Report

This year the committee had to deal with many things ranging from a disagreement at how a local Open Tournament was run right through to the full preparation work for the 2002 National's in Invercargill.

Our committee worked well but at times struggled to know just what we had to do in certain cases as a Job Description of any sort has never been forth-coming. In other words we were blind in some areas but worked through them until we finally saw the light, this caused a lot of time to be wasted and put us all under pressure to meet some deadlines.

David Jackson's depth of knowledge played against us all at the start but once a good rapport was established resulting in an excellent working relationship being formed, the National's went off without a hitch, showing how good teamwork results in an excellent Event being staged.

There were only a few transfers dealt with during the year and these were agreed to by all concerned so our job was made easy and there was no eligibility problems so the new set of rules seem to be widely approved of now. The main concern this year was that of "Direct Entry" to events at tournaments especially the South Islands but this was changed for the Nationals and the Tournament went off without problem. Direct entry will only be used in extreme cases where players are in a class of their own and it suits the draw.

The committee now has a clearer outline of what is involved and any of the four current members, Shona Cudby, Andrew Palmer, Ben Hurr or myself can be approached in person if anybody has anything that needs to be cleared up. We all are on this committee to help table tennis run to suit the players so feel free to directly approach us at any stage with comments or suggestions.

### Rankings

To qualify for a New Zealand ranking, players must have competed in a minimum of four rating events in any particular category, excluding B and C grades. Allowance is made for players who were unable to compete in rating tournaments due to overseas commitments.

The rankings are compiled by the Selectors. Results from Under 18, 17 and 16 events were considered as well as Under 19 for the Under 19 list; and results from Under 15 and all younger age-categories were considered for the Under 15 list. All other age-category results were considered for the Open lists.

There are some notable omissions from some lists caused by not enough performances in a particular category. We could only justify ranking 4 girls in the Under 19 age group which is a sad reflection on womens table tennis in New Zealand.

## **International Events**

### **International Programme, 2002**

New Zealand players participated in the Oceania Championships in Fiji, Commonwealth Games in Manchester and the World Cadet Challenge in Hungary. Players chosen trained extremely hard for these events. Manager of the Commonwealth Games team, Ron Garrett, along with the mens coach James Morris and the womens coach Simeon Cairns put in many hours of preparation work to ensure that things ran smoothly for the team.

A pre-event training camp was held in Whangarei prior to the Oceania Championships and Commonwealth Games.

The undoubted highlight of the Commonwealth Games for table tennis was a magnificent performance by Li Chunli in winning a Gold Medal in the Women's Singles

Details of teams and results for all international events follow this report.

### **Commonwealth Games, Manchester, 2002**

#### **The Beginning**

The inclusion of table tennis in the Commonwealth Games for the first time gave New Zealand the opportunity to take part. This was exciting for New Zealand table tennis.

The NZOC which organises the New Zealand Team to the Games invited table tennis to take part and set criteria for selection which mainly related to individual performances at world ranking events.

With teams events included this gave the opportunity for players who would not have reached the standard set to compete on an individual basis to take part.

TTNZ also set their own criteria.

#### **Management**

Team Manager Ron Garrett was appointed by NZOC in October 2001 and the coaches of the two teams were appointed soon after this. James Morris was appointed Head Coach and Simeon Cairns assistant coach. James was in charge of the men and Simeon the women.

#### **Selection**

The selectors picked the Games squad and the first training session was arranged for January 2002 in Whangarei. This session involved Swedish coach Jan Berner.

Players involved were Peter Jackson, Aaron Li, Shane Laugesen, Andrew Hubbard, Andy Huang, Adrian Soh, Karen Li, Tracey McLauchlan. Li Chunli was unavailable due to a contract in Japan and Sarah Finch was injured.

The team was selected in March with this being approved by NZOC before announcement.

This team also represented New Zealand at the Oceania Championships in Fiji.

#### **Pre Games Planning - training**

Arrangements were finalised to go direct from the Oceania Games to Manchester for training outside the Games venue for seven days before moving into the village a week before the Games begin.

#### **Uniform**

NZOC provided everything required except the playing uniform. TTNZ had to provide this.

NZOC provided all members of the team with tracksuit, shower proof jacket, polar fleece jacket, polar fleece vest, 3 black shirts, 3 grey shirts, singlet, long sleeve shirt, dress uniform including jacket, trousers or skirt, 2 shirts, umbrella, cap, gear bag.

Badger Solutions in Christchurch sponsored the playing shirt.

#### **Pre -Oceania Games**

NZOC agreed to a stopover in Fiji on the way to the Games at little or no cost extra to the Manchester flight. Chunli's professional contract in Japan excluded her from the Oceania Champs and considering the standard of play in Japan v one tough match in Fiji ( v Australia) her preparation for the Games and the chance of a medal was better by remaining in Japan. The down side was that she would miss out on representing Oceania in the Women's World Cup in 2003.

#### **Video Operator**

With the help of a grant through the Prime Ministers Coaching Development Scholarship the team were able to use Helen Codlin to video matches and using the coding analysis system via the Academy of Sport the results were of use to players and coaches. It was used mainly where we had medal winning chances to give an added boost to the player. Helen used this at the Oceania's and at the Games videoing our players and their future opposition also. The tapes of matches will be held for future reference and on loan to associations if required .

#### **England Pre-Games**

The team left Fiji at 10.25 pm on the 11th July and arrived in Manchester at 2.50pm on the 12th July after 21 hours flight time with short stops at LA and London.

Training was held in the Egerton Youth Centre, some 30 minutes drive from our hotel in Northwich. The facilities were good and the players responded well to the schedule set by James and Simeon to get them in top condition before moving into the village. This section of training was intensive and tested the physical abilities of the players.

### Entry to Games Village

We left our hotel in Northwich on 19th July for the Accreditation Centre in Manchester and were met by two members of the New Zealand Games headquarters staff who helped us through the process without any hitch, then on the bus to the Games Village where we were met by Dave Currie the NZ Chef de Mission.

In the evening we went to the Table Tennis Centre by bus for our first view of playing facilities. The Centre is normally used for tennis. It was arranged with two show courts with tiered seating all round, eight courts adjacent and eight practice courts at the rear. All courts were each surrounded by barriers, jade in colour, as were the tables. The floor was red rubber.

The main problem with the stadium was lack of ventilation.

The players practised that evening and every day until the competition began.

The Games ended with the Closing Ceremony starting at 9pm ( we had to leave the village at 6.30pm) and home around midnight. Biggest problem for the athletes was that it rained all the time. Manchester put on a great show- better seen on TV.

### Highlights

We went to the Games with expectations of 2 medals and a possible chance of others.

We came home with 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 2 Bronze medals. This result in the Games where table tennis was played for the first time was great for the sport in New Zealand.

### In Attendance

It was great to see important people in the sporting world in attendance, Dave Currie our Games Chef-de-Mission, Barry Maister and John Davies of NZOC, John Wells the Chairman of SPARC, Trevor Mallard, Minister for Sport. Plus players and officials from other sports, New Zealanders in Manchester and relations of some of the team members who gave their support.

### Thank You

The quest for medals began a long time ago, and I would like to record the amount of work put in by James Morris ( with great support from Christine), leading up to the camp in January, and right through to the GOLD MEDAL.

James was dedicated to the team performing well and put all his effort into bringing a good result, not without frustration at times. While it is difficult putting a cost on volunteers, if someone had to pay the bill for James's time and effort it would not be cheap but it would be value for money.

Simeon Cairns was equally dedicated to the quest for gold and used his qualifications to bring out the best in players .Simeon developed a good understanding with the womens team. Results speak for themselves.

I would like to thank James and Simeon for their support and the players for their efforts throughout the seven weeks leading up to and during the Games.

Goods and Services Tax: These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis and any tax due or owing at balance date is shown in the Statement of Financial Position. GST is accounted for on the payments basis.
