The Northland Association hosted the Oceania Championships in April this year and were lauded by the many nations that took part. Not only were the champs a success in the way they were run, there were also many great achievements by New Zealand players in the event. The highlight of this competition must have been the men's teams win over Australia. Thanks must be extended to the people responsible for making this event so successful and the players for making it so entertaining.

This year was also an Olympic year. Table Tennis New Zealand was incredibly proud to have two of our best representing the country in Athens. Well done Li Chunli and Karen Li. Table tennis players across the nation enjoyed watching you compete, live on the television, and you no doubt inspired a new generation of players to step up to the table.

Table Tennis is all about the players, so I would like to extend my congratulations to all players that have represented New Zealand this year, and to those players that have represented their Association at a national event.

The TTNZ strategy is starting to come together nicely as we search for an appropriate CEO to manage the sport. With a new website, integrated to the player management system we are endeavouring to use technology to improve the management of the sport. Phase two, the integration of a competition management system is being developed early next year, and this will eventually let any association easily manage an event using TTNZ software from any internet connection.

Finally, it is fitting that we recognise the individuals that are stepping down after years of commitment and service. In particular I would like to thank Alan Hounsell who, as a non table tennis person, has untiringly given the past seven years to the TTNZ board.

Alan Hounsell – Farewell to a great Chairman

After eight years on the Board with seven and a half at the helm, Alan decided to call it a day and will leave the Board at this AGM.

Alan came on to the Board in July 1996 with the restructure of Table Tennis New Zealand. This restructure saw governance of table tennis entrusted to a Board and management to the National Office. He came on to the Board as an independent member although he had played the game socially in his youth. A person with a sound business and sporting background, he was elected chairman at the Board's first meeting and remained chairman until April this year, when he resigned from that position.

Alan oversaw the appointment of our first Executive Director and ensured the role of the Board was governance and Executive Directors job to manage. Unfortunately funding was a problem and a few years later the Board was forced to dispense with the Executive Director position and employ an administration officer only. Its good to see moves are afoot to return to having an Executive Director.

With this change Alan also got involved more in the administration of the sport and was respected for his fairness, objectivity and dispute resolution skills. It would be fair to say Alan did not tolerate people who had their own agenda's and not the heart of the whole of New Zealand table tennis.

Alan was a strong Chairman, able to see the wider picture, he was truly independent. He had the interests of all table tennis players at heart, not just some groups. Having been on the Board throughout Alan's time at the helm I found him a pleasure to work with, a great chairman, adept at cutting the "crap" and with an interest in the sport.

He leaves, not to take it easy, for Alan and his wife Jill have taken on chief roles in another voluntary organisation.

If and when these are received the figures should exceed all previous calendar years. Other associations are on the ball with progressive and constant reporting throughout the year.

There has been a sizeable increase in school children registrations this year.

Registering before National championship entry has improved considerably but lack of reporting in good time by associations hinders this requirement.

Coaching / Coach Education Report

2004 has seen major championship participation for NZ players overseas. The thrust has been for developing players and the national junior coaches with the regional coaches have promoted the Junior Development Framework throughout the year with enthusiasm. The selectors have endorsed the vision of this framework with the selection of young developing players in teams to off shore events this year. Regional coaches are proactive in talent identifying players at association level which ultimately link with the national junior camps.

Coach Education

There have been no Level 1 or 2 workshops this year.

However liaison with the Auckland University and Germany for the training camp pre event saw preparation for this tour was well advanced. The German connection could be used again. This tour was regarded as low priority.

On going fitness testing of National junior and senior players – Dr Simeon Cairns BSC PHD.

The highlight for high performance for TTNZ was Li Chunli and Karen Li qualifying for the Olympic Games in Athens. Li Chunli made the last 16 in the singles and with Karen in the doubles made the last 16. This was a credible effort. Also the Commonwealth Table Tennis ranking of Peter Jackson at number 5.

It was unfortunate that the senior teams' overseas tours had no training camps preceding their departure. Previous organisation had seen training camps preceding overseas tours as non negotiable towards players and coaches preparation. Funding is the key requirement looking towards the Commonwealth Games in 2006. TTNZ needs to prioritise and identify someone to drive this funding / sponsorship need.

In April discussions with Pat Williams, sales director of John Vaughan & Co Ltd and referred him to the TTNZ Chairman Graeme Muller. Oceania Championships

The Oceania Championships were held in Whangarei and as Tournament Director, responsibility for coaching of the NZ teams was delegated to Simeon Cairns (senior assistant coach), and regional coaches to coordinate coaching. This commitment to the Oceanias as tournament director took much time and effort so I appreciated the involvement of the other coaches during the championships.

To have a pool of qualified coaches in the coaching structure is indeed a positive sign of growth. TTNZ needs to continue fostering qualified coaches to operate within the coaching framework. As all being volunteers, a large group is needed to share the commitment of coaching, national and international tours as well as training camps.

OTTF development officer Steve Dainton visited associations immediately following Oceania Championships in April / May. Due to a family bereavement he returned early to Australia. He is willing to return to work at national training camp level as well as in associations.

Technical Committee Report

2004 was again busy for our committee but with no real changes in this period. Our work was with the 5 major tournaments run by Associations for TTNZ. We used both David Jackson's and North Harbour's system to run various events with both systems having strong advantages but in the end we need a system owned by TTNZ that all Associations can use to make tournaments run more efficiently. The Nationals went extremely well on the Technical side with the programme running to time but the timetable set for some events was not satisfactory. TTNZ must spell out clearly what is expected by the host association so our committee can change any glaring error before the event begins. We saw a few transfers made during the year with all Associations concerned agreeing, so no work was needed except an official approval. We made minor alterations to the rules as set down at the last AGM. These were adopted during the year and put into the handbook, thanks to Bob Inns. Our committee is fielding fewer questions from Associations these days which shows that most of the answers to everyday type questions can be obtained from the "updated" handbook. This book has been a great revelation over recent years keeping everybody totally informed.

Thanks to the committee Andrew, Shona, Shane and Bob for yet another job well done.

Rankings

To qualify for a New Zealand ranking, players must have competed in a minimum of four rating events in any particular category, excluding B and C grades. Allowance is made for players who were unable to compete in rating tournaments due to overseas commitments.

The rankings are compiled by the Selectors. Results from Under 18, 17 and 16 events were considered as well as Under 19 for the Under 19 list; and results from Under 15 and all younger age-categories were considered for the Under 15 list. All other age-category results were considered for the Open lists.

International Events

World Junior Table Tennis Championships

(Held in Santiago, Chile, 14th – 21st of December 2003)

The Tournament

Over 140 competitors took part in the Championships, plus coaches and official. The host country, Chile, did a superb job in running the championships and apart from one or two minor organizational hiccups (eg. The non notification of some late changes to the draw), everything ran smoothly.

The host country provided transport, accommodation, food, translators as well as a local liaison person assigned to each team to help with transport arrangements etc. Additional facilities for players were provided, including massage rooms, computers with internet access, chat rooms, chill out rooms for relaxing, viewing boxes, players' boxes, information centres and video rooms. Although some countries considered the playing conditions in the practice areas to be not quite up to standard, the main playing arena was very impressive. On the whole, the championships were very professionally run with few problems encountered by players and officials. The standard of play at the championships was most impressive – the skills, talent and tactical ability shown by the players generally was outstanding, particularly given that these were junior championships. The atmosphere in the stadium was electric, with great support from the Chilean public, who were vocal in supporting their team as well as the event itself.

NZ team's performance

The New Zealand players, although outclassed in some of their matches, performed creditably and to the best of their ability. While not winning many games, the experience gained from playing top class players and participating in a world class event was invaluable. Our players were able to see the level of play required to be competitive internationally and rather than being daunted by it, they came away feeling inspired to pursue the challenge of improving their own game.

The lack of regular top quality match play was evident in our players' performance at the championships and clearly the lack of depth of players in New Zealand affects our players' ability to be truly competitive on the international scene. New Zealand's geographical isolation makes it hard for our players to get the level of top class competition with neighbouring countries which the Asian, European and South American players experience. It would appear as if many of the countries already have a more disciplined and concentrated training programme for their top players than we have and this may be something which New Zealand may wish to consider in its future strategic planning.

Requirements for the future

At the Jury meeting on the first day, officials at the championships expressed concern at the fact that the New Zealand team had no alternative playing strip. We were advised that if New Zealand is to compete in future tournaments of this caliber, then it must have two different coloured playing strips.

Conclusion

Despite the very tough opposition encountered by the New Zealand team, the experience of competing at this top level was a most worthwhile experience for all our players. The players enjoyed themselves and learned a lot from participating at this level and I would recommend that New Zealand continues to send a team to such events in the future. From a technical viewpoint, I believe the New Zealand players have the talent and ability to compete internationally, to learn from the experience of playing against world class players and to improve on any areas of weakness which may have been exposed at these championships (eg. explosive speed, anticipation and shot combinations). Mental toughness comes with experience and the more top level competition our players can get, the better. The team performed creditably and were good ambassadors for New Zealand.

Training Camp – Köping 4th – 17th February

After meeting in Sydney we finally arrived in Köping, a city in Sweden 2 hours west of the capital Stockholm. Walking in to the training centre for the first time on that same day our team was amazed at the number and the level of the players. For almost 2 weeks our players received training and coaching that was far superior to what they could ever find in Oceania. With Sören Ahlen, Sweden's National Women's coach, as the head coach and a support of other quality coaches our players learnt new training methods, were given knowledge to improve technique and came to understand the importance of Quality training, something Swedish table tennis is well renowned for. As far as our overall trip was concerned these two weeks were the most vital for us. Our players whom are geographically isolated from the parts of the world where top table tennis is played needed to see the top training methods in use by quality players and quality coaches.

World Junior Circuit Event and Safir International Event

On Paper there was no major results to talk about but in real terms the successes were many. Any major results in the competitions were not expected especially considering it was all but 2 players first time to see table tennis outside of their region. The important factor was the experience and the information that each player took from the event. It would be impossible for Oceania players to compete at a World level (a long term goal) without seeing or feeling what that level is, now for the first time they have felt and seen it. After the event it was obvious that there was a real determination, instead of being dejected the whole team was somewhat inspired – for the first time they knew what was needed to become an elite table tennis player and they now had a better understanding of how this could be possible to achieve. They were hungry to go home and do what was needed for better results. This was the real success.

What the players from the Squad do now that they have had this experience is very important. If they utilise their new tools and learn from their experience then there is still a chance for them to reach a high level in the future. They must now work hard, make their training good quality and make the most of their newfound knowledge. Then they have a chance at finding success at future South Pacific Games, Oceania Championships and also give them self a realistic chance at qualifying for the Olympic Games in 2008 – 2012.

However this is only a start of what are potentially greater things to come for table tennis in our region. If success is wanted it can not be the end, more experience is needed, more opportunities to compete and train in such places are needed and continued hard work within each players country is needed – with this there is a real chance success will come. Without further opportunities of this nature it will be extremely difficult.

The team continues on to Noumea for another leg of the ITTF World Junior Circuit in May. They will all also be participating in the Oceania Championships in Whangarei in April.

Finally the Oceania Table tennis Federation would like to thank – the Oceania National Olympic Committee, the ITTF and Butterfly for their generous contributions and helping to make this all possible.

Preparation

Difficulties arose to assemble the team for training because of funding. Individuals arranged their own training. Men: Aaron Li spent time in China, Andrew Hubbard was playing professionally in Paris, France and Peter Craven spent 2 weeks in France training with Andrew's club, on Andrew's invitation. Women: Karen Li trained in Auckland, Sophie Shu was involved in the Oceania training camp in Sweden, Hanna Squires, as the reserve was a late inclusion, on the withdrawal of Jacqui Wood.

Fitness

Overall fitness seemed adequate. There are a number of fitness components all of which are required for table tennis and include aerobic capacity, strength and speed (thus power), agility, flexibility, and anaerobic

endurance. One-selection criteria was that players passed a beep test. Men – level 12, Women – level 10. This criterion has been set since 2001 and is designed to show the extent of player's stamina for international competition. All players passed this test in NZ except Aaron who asked to complete this test in China. This was agreed, Zhu (past NZ national coach) would facilitate and send the documentation to TTNZ.

General Condition

Accommodation/Meals

The team stayed at the Ramada Hotel. The rooms were of a high standard, and there was a table tennis information desk in the lobby, which was helpful. Breakfast was provided at the hotel and lunch and dinner were provided at the stadium. All meals were good.

Transport

Travel to the stadium was on buses timetabled half hourly and took approximately 15 minutes.

Stadium

The Dohar Exhibition Centre was large, having 3 court areas. NZ teams played in court areas 2 and 3 and despite one day when the lights failed conditions were good. The practise hall, part of the main stadium was quite warm, and the tables were not all level.

The Draw

The men played in the 3rd division playing for placings 37 – 48th. Group H was drawn with countries Turkey, Switzerland, Bulgaria, Wales and Saudi Arabia, NZ finished 6th in this group. Chile was played in a crossover match for 46 or 47 place. The team won finishing 46th. 2001 saw the men's team finish 44th. (Please note England withdrew from division 2 moving everyone up one place.)

The women played in the 1st division playing for placing 13 – 24th. Group C was drawn with countries Czech Republic, USA, Belgium, Ukraine, and Thailand, NZ finished 6th in this group. Lithuanian was played in a crossover match for 23 – 24th place. The team lost finishing 24th.

World individual rankings were used to seed teams, and Li Chunli's ranking was used to position the women's team. Therefore the women's team played at a higher level than the teams ability.

Schedule

The men and women were scheduled at different times except one day so I was able to be with them. I feel the organisation was poor, when considering the financial costs for NZ to attend these championships. The men and women played one match each per day, with only one crossover match at the end of section play. These championships are about playing, as many matches as possible, for countries like NZ do not get these opportunities.

AGM

I attended part of the AGM with David Jackson as delegate, due to the commitment as coach as a game was scheduled. David will submit a report on the AGM.

In Summary

This world team event is the first time that the individuals and teams have been split. The schedules proved very light with the men and women only playing one match each per day and having one crossover at the end of section play. This placed a light demand on players. I believe this was poor organisation when considering the financial costs for countries like NZ to attend these championships. One match each over six days hardly justifies the inclusion of NZ's participation at this event. If this is the pattern of current World Team Championships I feel TTNZ need to reprioritise the international events that we attend to gain maximum value for the dollar and player exposure to international competition.

I thank all team members for their co-operation and to Averil in the office for her patience and work towards setting this up for a successful trip.

Training Camp

The tournament was an under 18 world junior circuit teams event followed by an individual competition. A training camp for competitors was held the 2 days prior the tournament beginning. The camp was taken by Glenn Tepper, Steve Dainton and Raoul Rainouard. I also helped with the Pacific Island players.

The training camp was worthwhile to allow players to acclimatise to the heat and conditions but also to practise with their eventual opposition. All players trained well and stepped up given the high standard of practice partners.

General comments

A member of the party's luggage was lost for 3 days by the airline. This re-emphasises the need for players to have as part of carry on luggage their bat but also a base playing strip and shoes.

Player morale was high and unlike Whangarei I was impressed with the support that all players gave each other.

Both Nathan and Bin Bin do not seem to have a structured approach to training when at home. The girls are somewhat better with Jenny coached by Aaron Li once or twice a week, likewise Sophie with Karen Li.

National and regional squad camps and other fixtures such as ITTF training camps give opportunity for coaching staff to review player progress, and suggest ways to improve strokes/tactics and give players a higher level of practice standard. Most improvement and development takes place in the day to day training that juniors do in their home associations. If not already in place I recommend that national and regional coaching staff set physical and on table training regimes for national squad players.

Financial

Money was an issue. New Caledonia was very expensive, especially for food. Some players were given insufficient cash by their parents and money cards/credit cards did not work as the "cirrus" facility is not available in French countries. This was also compounded by a long weekend public holiday when banks closed during the event.

Also over the period exchange rates were changing rapidly hence TTNZ deposits into my account to pay expenses over the week became very difficult to track conversions. This was eventually rectified by TTNZ transferring the cost electronically from NZ into the New Caledonian account.

Recommendations

- That national squad players be required to submit their training plans for review by national coaching staff and if appropriate the plans supervised by regional coaching staff. If the plans are not appropriate national/regional coaching staff prepare a more suitable plan. In my opinion this is essential given the investment TTNZ is putting into these players.
- As much as possible, TTNZ should settle expenses for overseas trips before teams leave the country.
- Calculate and ensure juniors have sufficient personal funds for trips

16th Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships
(Held in Malaysia, Kuala Lumpur, 21st – 27th of June 2004)

Preparation:

The selectors originally selected a three man team, with John Cordue a non-travelling reserve. A need was identified for doubles and that John Cordue was a developing player so he was included in the team. A women's team did not compete as the Li sisters were unavailable as they were preparing for the Olympics. All players were contacted on selection and sent fitness schedules and advice on table practise. There was no budget for a training camp before the event so players prepared individually. Peter Jackson was playing professional league in France.

Fitness

All players had satisfactory fitness standard before departure. On tour players were prepared and lack of fitness was not an issue.

General

Eighteen Commonwealth countries participated. Men's and women's team events, men's and women's singles, doubles and mixed doubles. This was played on a single knock out system. The teams were group play in a Round Robin League. The draws were made for individual events following team events. Peter Jackson and James Morris were present during the drawing. The tables were Joola (Blue) and the official ball was Butterfly 3 star white 40mm.

Accommodation – meals

All teams stayed at the Maluri Hotel which was 3 star. All meals were buffet, adequate and eaten at the hotel. The hotel was approximately a twenty minute walk from the stadium, which was ideal.

Transport

Buses ran to the stadium every 30 minutes. In peak time it took 30 minutes to the stadium and one could walk in 20 minutes.

Stadium

It was held in the Badminton Stadium. It held 8 courts and was air conditioned. The courts were not to ITTF standard in size, but did not pose any problems.

The Draw / Results

In the team events in the first stage, round robin, NZ men drew Australia, Sri Lanka and the Isle of Man, coming second to Australia. In the second stage of the teams round robin NZ drew Wales, India and Malaysia. NZ lost to Wales and India but beat Malaysia to then have the opportunity to play Scotland for 5th and 6th position, finishing in 6th place. This was a credible performance considering NZ finished ahead of teams such as Canada and Singapore, with a young developing team. (TTNZ has the official results book).

Individuals saw Peter Jackson in the main draw and John Cordue and Andy Huang qualified for the main draw. Peter Jackson went on to reach the quarter finals of the men's singles after beating Jason Sugrue (NIR) in the last sixteen, before losing to William Henzell of Australia.

Andy Huang, John Cordue and Simon Wallace all posted wins in the consolation singles with Andy Huang going on to the final and winning the silver medal.

AGM

Held Wednesday 23 June at the Maluri Hotel in KL. James Morris attended as delegate. The matters of interest to NZ that the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne were progressing. Commonwealth Games 2010 in New Delhi were confirmed Applications were sought for future Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships. James Morris sought a review of the present criteria for hosting a Commonwealth Table Tennis championship, as countries cannot fund such an event. The executive agreed to discuss this issue.

In Summary

This tour gave developing players the opportunity to gain valuable international experience, which I feel, was fulfilled. All members had wins and the chance to play stronger opposition. Selectors communicated to me that Peter Jackson's role was one of mentor and role model. He interacted with the young developing players well. On occasions Peter stood down in team events to give the younger players excellent opportunities to play quality opposition.

Team meetings were held when possible to keep communication open between the team and boundaries known to all. All team members completed player assessments of the tour and the benefits to them. These are enclosed.

I believe this commonwealth tournament is very important for NZ to attend, as we are competitive and capable of posting credible results. Peter Jackson's individual ranking is 5th and the team result 6th, indicates our

competitiveness for medals at the Commonwealth Games in 2006. As the world individual and team championships are now separated this commonwealth event should be of a higher priority for NZ players.

Posting credible results at the Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships gives TTNZ the opportunity to put a strong case to NZOC and SPARC for funding our high performance athletes.

Preparation

Following on from the good work done at the Manchester Commonwealth Games (2002), and assisted with grants from SPARC, several international events were attended in the build up to Athens (involving Chunli, Karen and myself as coach). This included the World Individual Championships 2003 (Paris), Japan Open Championships 2003, China Open Championships 2003, World Team Championships 2004 (Doha), Olympic Qualifying tournament 2004 (Melbourne), Oceania Championships 2004 (Whangarei) and training camps in China (Nanning). The training camp in Nanning, held over the weeks prior to Athens, was extremely useful not only because of the quality of the training partners but because of the time spent on doubles preparation and because the high temperatures allowed some acclimation to heat as required for Athens.

Chunli, as a full-time professional, was also involved in her regular competitions in Japan. Karen delayed her university studies for the year in order to prepare for Athens, and also was involved in extensive training and tournaments in New Zealand. Chunli, who was individually carded with the NZ Academy of Sport (NZAS), made use of medical and physiotherapy services when in NZ. More use could have been made of the sports science services especially sport vision and sport psychology however, this is removed from the traditional Chinese approach and only limited use was made of these services. Karen became carded after the Olympic Qualifying tournament and with some of her preparation time being in China she was only able to make little use of NZAS services.

The fitness levels of both Chunli and Karen were of the level necessary and expected for Olympic competition.

Selection

This was based on the International Table Tennis Federation's (ITTF) requirements from the Oceania regional qualifying tournament, followed with selection by the NZOC. Chunli was four places off qualifying directly based on her World ranking after the 2003 World Individual Championships (20 players get direct entry). It was unfortunate that Chunli did not play more international tournaments for ranking points due to her contractual obligations in Japan and to the costs involved. Chunli won the Olympic Qualifying tournament in singles winning all matches in round robin play. Karen finished second beating all the Australian girls but subsequently lost in both knockout tournaments to Jian Fang Lay and then Miao Miao (Australia). The Li sisters qualified for the Olympic doubles by comfortably beating the Campbell-Innes sisters. The top three NZ men were unavailable for the qualifying tournament as their world rankings were not in the top 130 in the world and hence could not meet NZOC selection requirements. Various Oceania officials expressed concern over this requirement due to the possibility that the ITTF may reduce the Oceania allocation of Olympic places.

Venue and organisation

The venue was Galatsi Olympic Stadium, which included a competition hall that contained 4 tables, and two practice halls that contained 16 tables. The main hall was air conditioned and provided excellent conditions. Transport to the stadium involved a 15-20 min bus trip from the Olympic village. Our girls practiced at sessions from Tues 10th Aug through the competition period. They were allocated two one-hour practice sessions in the competition hall and were happy with the conditions. The sessions requested for the practice hall were not all made available but tables were still found for practice. Results and information were readily available from the local helpers at the stadium and the Sports Information Centre in the Village. The food at the playing venue was inadequate and this had to be accounted for.

The seedings were available from Internet on the ITTF website but the final draw was not made until Thurs 12th Aug, i.e. just two days prior to competition starting. Nothing could be done to change this timing but it was extremely late compared with other sports and it did not help our players.

Women's Singles Results

There were 64 entries into the Women's singles. Chunli was seeded 27th.

Chunli reached the round of the last 32 players. She first disposed of the funny rubber player Bahn (seeded 48) with a solid display then faced World No 1 and eventual winner Zhang Yining (seeded 1). Chunli competed strongly, especially in the first two sets, hitting many aggressive winners with both forehand and backhand. In fact she held a game point in the second set. The complete absence of unforced errors by Zhang and strong service later in the match brought her victory. The draw was unfortunate (Chunli also drew the World No 1 and winner in Sydney) when considering that the player Chunli beat in the Manchester final reached the semifinals of this event.

Chunli and Karen reached the round of the last 16 teams. The first up victory over the Australians (seeded 23) included winning the first set after being down 5-0, and then tremendous attacking play to win the last three sets. An undoubted highlight was their upset victory over the German pairing (seeded 16) who had defeated our girls in the Sydney Olympics (Struse is a former European woman's singles champion). Both Chunli and Karen displayed tremendous forehand attacks, both close to and back from the table, to completely shut out their opponents. Unfortunately this match wasn't televised in NZ. Their next match was against the 8th seeded Nth Korean pair where our girls went down 4-2, with two closely won sets. This last 16 result is our best ever placement at an Olympics.

Throughout their competitions our girls had good visible and audible support from other NZ team members, NZOC members (Barry Maister, Eion Edger) and the Chef de Mission (Dave Currie), which encouraged them and helped raise their performance.

NZ TEAM ENVIRONMENT AND SUPPORT

The planning and support from the NZOC and SPARC is an important and integral part to allow our players perform the best they possibly can.

Conferences

Three conferences were held in the lead-up to Athens, which I attended. The first conference - held in April 2003 - mainly involved sport science to address expected environmental issues, and was of interest but I did not find of high value because of my background in exercise science. The two subsequent conferences involved building around a theme of one-team, one-spirit and were of considerable value to make links with the Athlete services team and Health team, and the other coaches for Athens (especially those involved with the smaller sports). Ongoing interaction with Don Tricker (coaching - NZAS) and Gary Hermansson (sport psychology) proved valuable.

High-performance seminar

Several high-performing Olympians described their experiences in a well organised, interesting and highly motivating presentation.

Communication

This was achieved through e-mails and the website - Zeus. The website was adequate but at times required considerable searching to find what was required. Our players found some aspects of the website confusing and some simplifying of the system would help. Some communication from ITTF to TTNZ (e.g. on drug testing issues) resulted in confusion when issues had already been dealt with earlier via NZOC communication.

Outfitting and playing gear

This involved sponsorship by Orca. The general NZ team gear was comfortable and appropriate (although some footwear problems occurred) and the playing gear - also supplied by Orca - was excellent with the girls being very happy with the comfort and look. Ross Gordon was helpful with sizing in Auckland and Athens. Orca was also obliging in supplying additional training gear appropriate for table tennis.

Athlete services team and health team

Full marks to both teams. We were met at Athens airport, eased through accreditation, and introduced to the Olympic Village. Karen had a table tennis package that did not arrive with our flight but that was recovered with assistance from our support team. Chunli had some muscle cramp early after arrival and received excellent assistance from the physiotherapists and dietician (Ien Hellemans), and had no subsequent problems. The relationship manager system and the small number of official meetings in Athens proved sufficient. The service from the front desk (in middle earth) led by Michelle was great.

Ceremonies

This included flag raising in the Village, the team photo and reception, Opening and Closing ceremonies. We all attended the first two, and I had driver support to attend a table tennis procedures meeting leaving directly from the reception. Karen attended the Opening ceremony given that she wasn't competing the following day. Karen and I attended the Closing ceremony.

Air transport

Good work from our Air NZ support staff of Rafael and Voula. Although some bookings disappeared from the Website no travel problems eventuated.

Village life

The accommodation was adequate and although the floors were noisy our players got sufficient sleep. The food available in the food hall was adequate. Security proved to be good without any major hassles. Washing clothes was something of a problem and was best done in our units.

Olympia visit

This was a pleasurable experience for both Karen and myself. Full marks to Charles Callis from NZOC as our guide.

Team environment

A very positive experience starting from being welcomed into the NZ base in the village with a haka. Other NZ teammates, NZOC members, Athlete services and Health team members encouraged and supported our girls. Similarly, we attended several events to support other NZ athletes. It would have been nice if even more tickets were available for other events as well. Celebrating with the medal winners made us all feel a real part of the One-team. Our girls appreciated support from the team mentor - Sir Murray Halberg. The farewell function was also fun and a great way to end this memorable occasion.

Finally, a special thanks to Dave Currie and his team for their insight and planning, to Averil for coordinating activities through TTNZ, and to James Morris (NZ Director of Coaching) for his ongoing support and discussions throughout the buildup to Athens.

Table Tennis Info magazine

This magazine was launched in 1996 and issue No 1 was published in October that year. Issues 23 and 24 were produced in the year ending 30.9.04 with all issues mailed directly to each of our registered members. Editor Robin Radford is responsible for the high standard of production and has built up a vast library of photographs, clip-art, and cartoons as well as a network of professional artists and support personnel. Obituaries

Keith Armstrong

Keith Armstrong, a high-profile Table Tennis Canterbury administrator and veteran player died on 25th of July 2004, aged 72.

Keith was a member of the team responsible for the Association's move from their former Selwyn Street premises to the sparkling new Blenheim Road Stadium. He was heavily involved in the process through all its stages: negotiating the business transactions, physically moving the equipment, decorating the new premises and obtaining the spectator seating. Keith would be the first to acknowledge that the project depended on major contributions from others, notably Eddie Moore (now of Wellington), but with Keith's passing the stadium will doubtless be seen by many as a monument to his memory.

As a player, Keith was a regular supporter of NZ Veteran and South Island Championships. He won several doubles titles at these events, again partnered by Eddie Moore.

Keith's all-round administrative skills will be greatly missed by Table Tennis Canterbury, and also by the Harewood Club, which he has led for many years and originally helped to set up.

John Bower

John Bower died on February 1st of a heart attack, aged 60.

During the late 80's and early 90's he was the Auckland association's chairman and put his many talents into making Auckland a strong association. Experienced in marketing and sales, he saw the need to raise the image of New Zealand Open Championships and the sport as a whole. He was tournament manager of the NZ Open in 1988, 1991 and 1993 when they were held in Auckland and did a lot to improve the presentation of the championships.

He was a National Councillor representing the northern region from 1987 to 1989, President of the New Zealand Association 1990-1991 and a Vice President 1992-1996.

Owen Cullington

Owen was active as a player and administrator for the Waitemata association.

The tall frame of Owen created an ease in reaching for the ball and although not figuring on the playing honours board at the Waitemata stadium.

Owen was a great influence in table tennis in west Auckland. He was made a life member because of his general work for the association and for his 10 successive years as secretary.

Merle Harding

New Zealand lost one of its most dedicated club players in early February when Merle Harding (Hutt Valley) passed away at age 89.

Better known nationally as the wife of former TTNZ chairman Alf Harding, Merle was highly esteemed locally for the sheer longevity of her playing career. She took up the game at the relatively advanced age of 47 and was still attending the Empire club on a weekly basis 39 years later.

A strong age-group player at national level, she won the NZ Over 55 women's singles in 1978. The Over 80 consolation women's singles title at the 1994 World Veterans Championships in Melbourne crowned her career.

Bill Hurrey

This year long-time table tennis identity Bill Hurrey died, aged 92.

Bill was NZTTA president in 1968-69, a position he had earned through his work for table tennis in New Zealand in general and in Northland in particular.

He was patron and life member of the Northland association he loved so much and for which he worked tirelessly to establish its sound foundation. He was regarded as the father of table tennis in the far north and help found the Northland association in 1948.

Former national champion and administrator, James Morris, of Whangarei, said: "Bill was noted as a strong administrator and it was his ability that set a structure in Northland which paved the way for many national champions. He will be sadly missed".

In 1979 the Bill Hurrey Cup was established in his honour, for the association whose players achieved the greatest success in the NZ junior championship finals.

Steve Gedye

Steve was born in Wanganui, the son of a keen player and administrator who was a founder of the old Castlecliff club.

Steve came to west Auckland about 20 years ago and later joined Waitemata, first as a social player, then as a capable competitive player. He took over the supervision of the social nights then joined the Waitemata executive a year ago.

Steve had a massive heart attack during the association's club night. He was 51.

Jim Steedman, QSM (for services to Table Tennis)

For several decades Jim Steedman was the face of Otago table tennis. First elected to the management committee in 1955, he served terms in every executive position and was heavily involved with the purchase, improvements and management of the Otago TT Stadium in Kaikorai Valley Road which was opened in 1965 and extended in 1975.

He paid for and donated all ten tables in the original stadium and a further four for the extension.

He managed countless tournaments for Otago, including the 1956 NZ Championships where he introduced a timetabling system later adopted by the NZ Association. Always aware of the needs of others, he purchased a van specifically to ferry players to and from tournaments, covering thousands of miles. Juniors especially never had to worry about getting to a Canterbury or South Island Championship, or even a Nationals. Jim would be going, and there was always room.

The highlight of Jim's playing career was the South Island veteran men's singles title in 1965.

He was honoured with Otago TTA Life Membership in 1971, and by the Queen in 1984 with a Queen's Service Medal for services to Table Tennis. Jim Steedman was aged 85 when he passed away last February.

Statement of Accounting Policies

For the year ending 30 September 2004

General Accounting Policies

The measurement basis adopted is that of the modified historical cost system. Accrual accounting is used to match revenue and expenses.

Particular Accounting Policies

Accounts Receivable and Sundry Debtors are recorded at net realisable value, after eliminating doubtful debts.

Stock on Hand: Stock for resale has been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Depreciation for the following asset classes is provided on a straight line basis at rates that will write off the cost of the assets over their estimated useful lives which are as follows:
