CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- All matches will be played under the Rules of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association.
- 2. Ball: The Villa xx Ball will be used for all matches.
- Dress: Players must wear Grey or Dark Clothing in all matches; tennis shoes must be worn. The Committee reserves the right to scratch any player who does not conform to this rule regarding dress.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to seed the draw.
- No player who has previously won a lower-grade title shall be eligible to enter in that grade.
- The referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law is final.
 The decision of the umpire on a point of fact is final.
- Competitors must report to official in charge on arrival each night.
- 8. Amount of back play is 10 feet 6 inches.
- 9. Matches commence at 7 p.m. each night. The Committee reserves the right to scratch any player who arrives late.
- Entries must reach the Hon. Secretary (C. Stanwell, 22 Awa Road, Miramar, E.4) by 5 p.m., WEDNESDAY, 7th AUGUST, 1940.
- Men's Open Singles and Men's Open Doubles events will be best of 5 advantage sets of 21 points up; all other events will be best of 3 advantage sets of 21 points up.
- The Tournament is under the control of the Tournament Manager, Mr. T. S. Williams.
- 13. Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match be concluded, provided that when necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the Umpire may suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play shall never be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his strength or his wind. The Umpire shall be the sole judge of intentional delay, and after giving due warning he may disqualify the offender.
