- 4. The committee reserves the right to seed the draw.
- The tournament referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law is final.The decision of the umpire on a point of fact is final.
- 6. Competitors must report to tournament manager on arrival.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to scratch any player who arrives late.
- 8. All senior events will be the best of five advantage games of 21 points up. All junior events will be the best of three advantage games of 21 points up. The committee reserves the right to amend this rule if entries and time make it necessary.
- 9. Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match be concluded, provided that, when necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the umpire may suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play shall never be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his strength or his wind. The umpire shall be the sole judge of intentional delay, and after giving due warning he may disqualify the offender.
