CONDITIONS OF PLAY:

- 1-All matches to be played under the Rules of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association (Inc.).
- 2-Ball: The Dunlop-Barna 3-Crown will be used for all matches.
- Dress: Players shall not wear light coloured clothing. Tennis shoes with white soles must be worn. The Tournament Manager reserves the right to scratch any player who does not conform to these requirements.
- 4-The New Zealand Executive Committee will seed the draw.
- 5-All Open Championship Events shall be the best of five advantage games of 21 points up; all Junior and other events shall be the best of three advantage games of 21 points up.
- 6-The "Pushing Play" expedite rule and the new regulations regarding bats will be enforced. A copy will be posted up in the Hall.
- 7—Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match be concluded provided that when necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the Umpire shall suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play shall not be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his or her strength or wind. The Umpire shall be the sole judge of intentional delay, and after giving a warning, he may disqualify the offender.
- 8-The Referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law shall be final. The decision of the Umpire on a point of fact shall be final.
- 9-The amount of back play will be not less than 14ft. and there will be 10ft. between tables.
- 10-Lighting as approved by the New Zealand Table Tennis Association will be used.
- 11-The number of tables available will be at least 10.
- 12-The Tournament is under the control of the Tournament Manager, Mr. L. Rolley. Deputy Manager, Mr. N. Ennis.
- 13-The Tournament Referee is Mr. J. L. Dunn. Deputy Referee, Mr. T. Rolley.
- -Matches will commence at the time scheduled above unless otherwise advised. The Tournament manager reserves the right to scratch any player who arrives late.
- 15—Competitors must report to the control table on arrival.
- 16—Entries received after the closing date (Wednesday, June 16, 1965) and entries not accompanied by the required fees will defintely not be accepted. (Exchange must be added to cheques.)
- 17-Juniors under 16 years of age will be permitted to play in both age groups as well as open events. Competitors are warned that in the event of any dispute regarding eligibility of competing in any event, verification of date of birth may be required.
- 18-Entrants in Junior events must have their age certificates properly attested by completion of the certificate at the foot of the Entry Form.
- 19-The Association reserves the right to televise any match.
