CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- All matches will be played under the Rules of the New Zealand Table Tennis Association (Inc.), and 12 tables will be available with 12ft. 6in. back play and 7ft. between tables.
- 2. Halex 3 Star Balls will be used for all matches.
- DRESS: Players must wear grey or dark clothing in all matches: tennis shoes must be worn. The Committee reserves the right to scratch any player who does not conform with these requirements.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to seed the draw.
- All Open Championship events shall be the best of five advantage games of 21 up. All Junior and other events shall be the best of three advantage games of 21 up.
- 6. Play shall be continuous from the first service until the match be concluded, provided that when necessitated by circumstances not within the control of the players, the Umpire may suspend play for such period as he may consider necessary. Play shall never be suspended for the purpose of allowing a player to recover his strength or his wind. The Umpire shall be the sole judge of intentional delay, and after giving a warning, he may disqualify the offender.
- 7. The "Expedite" rule will be enforced.
- The Referee's decision in any dispute on a point of law is final.
