James Morris

James has excelled in all aspects of table tennis.
He was New Zealand Champion and Player of the
Year in 1976 and 1981. In 1971 he was selected for the
World and Commonwealth Championships and for the
next 12 years represented NZ in numerous international
events. He beat a member of the touring Chinese
team in 1972.

In his home Association of Northland he has played, coached, fund-raised and trained teachers in the basics of table tennis coaching. As President of Northland he has been Tournament manager for highly successful New Zealand and Oceania Championships.

James was a TTNZ Board member from 1999 to 2004 and also served as TTNZ Director of Coaching and High Performance. He was inducted into the NZ Table Tennis Hall of Fame in 2005 and is a TTNZ Life Member. He is a member of the ITTF Junior Commission and President of the Oceania Federation.


In 2002 he coached the NZ team at the 2002 Commonwealth Games.


Ron Garrett

ITTF Veterans Committee for 3 years. He was NZ Table
Tennis Team Manager at the 2002 Commonwealth

for 18 months during a transitional period.
He is an International Umpire.

Since the early 1960s Ron has served as Southland Association President and Secretary; managed and coached Southland teams at NZ Championships and been a key figure when Southland hosted the NZ Championships, NZ Veterans Championships and South Island Championships. He has represented NZ in Veterans test matches and played over 300 matches for his Association. He continues to play and coach regularly.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ACCREDITATION PASS

The accreditation pass authorises access rights. Participants must carry it visibly, ideally on the lanyard provided, within the venue and while using official transportation. It must be presented when entering Trusts Arena, and for certain access around the venue, and must be shown when requested by event management or security personnel. Abuse of personal accreditation passes (giving it to a third party) will lead to confiscation, denying access to the venue. Replacement of a lost accreditation pass will be charged with a fee.

AIRPORT

Auckland International Airport is approximately 50 minutes (depending on traffic) away from Auckland's CBD and 30 minutes from Trusts Arena.

ARENA OPENING TIMES

The arena will be open 1 hour prior to the scheduled beginning of the first session. Access is only possible through the main entrance at Trusts Arena.

CONDITIONS OF ARENA ENTRY

Patrons may bring small amounts of food and beverages (must be plastic bottles) intended for personal consumption, but nothing that is available for sale at the venue. It is at the discretion of the Event Organiser, to undertake bag checks upon entry.

CATERING

There will be a wide range of food options for participants and spectators to choose from at the venue, throughout the Championship. The main dining hall will be the Genesis Room, on level 1, which allows participants and spectators to enjoy a seated meal, or a takeaway option, that can be taken into the spectator stands.

There is also a café located in the foyer, offering payment by cash or eftpos. Additional food and beverage options will be available at the grandstand, situated 100 metres to the right of the main entrance to Trusts Arena.

CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH PLAY EQUIPMENT

The 17th World Veteran Table Tennis Championship will use Stag Americas tables and Stag Peter Karlsson Premium White Balls throughout the Championship.

CHANGING FACILITIES

Changing rooms for players are located on the Trusts Arena ground floor. We suggest all participants get changed into their playing outfits before coming to the venue, as the number of changing rooms available is limited. Please do not leave any valuables in the changing rooms.

DOUBLES EVENT

The draw for doubles will be made Monday 12th May, 2014 after 12 noon. The pairings will be published on Arena bulletin boards and on the event Website WVC2014.com as soon as possible after the draw is made.

FIRST AID/MEDICAL DUTY

First Aid staff will be at the venue, and can be located in the First Aid room throughout the Championship. Should you be on medication, or have a medical condition which may be aggravated during the event, please complete a medical information form, available at accreditation desk or information desk, so that it is immediately available to medical staff in the event of emergency. The remaining tables in use for the competition are "Stag Americas". This model is approved by ITTF and is suitable for tournament play, featuring 25mm top and a roust undercarriage with 125 mm wheels. The snap-on nets are easily maintained to ITTF specifications.

The tournament will be played on stag flooring, specially laid for the event. It is 4.5mm thick and is three layered construction with top layer 100% vinyl and bottom layer of closed cell structure with a reinforced centre layer for dimensional stability. Its'main qualities include shock absorption, anti skid, tear resistance, abrasion resistance and ease of maintenance. The flooring is available for sale after the event and enquiries regarding purchase should be addressed to Table Tennis New Zealand.

Peter Karlsson Premium 3-star balls will be used throughout the tournament. These balls are produced in China and are the result of stringent quality control for a consistent bounce in all conditions.

Over 600 arena surrounds will be deployed to stop balls travelling too far. They are both lightweight and sturdy, making them easy to put up and down.

The umpire tables, scoreboards and towel stands complete the Stag presence on the playing floor, and meet the needs of officials, players and spectators in stylish manner.

You may notice a Stag robot machine being used for demonstrations. These are available for purchase from Table Tennis New Zealand and are particularly useful in developing strokes and hand-eye co-ordination for both novice players and disabled players. The accompanying nets and collection bucket, combined with controls that allow desired variations of spin, direction and pace, make it possible for an individual to have an intensely beneficial work-out with minimal downtime.

Many of the items supplied for the world veteran championships will be used afterwards to support the introduction of table tennis into AIMS Games, a huge event for middle schools throughout New Zealand and overseas. Stag International is the AIMS Games code sponsor for table tennis, and the tournament floor at QEYC, tauranga will utilise the same equipment used at trusts arena. A lot of other WVC2014 stag equipment will be supplied into schools planning entry into AIMS table tennis, as part of the event legacy.

Stag is also supplying a wide range of apparel and merchandise for WVC2014. Some of this will be supplied to registrants in Stag bags at accreditation. These items and others are available for purchase at the Stag shop and displays in both the entrance foyer and the upstairs Genesis room. How did it all start?

In 1980, some local clubs in Gothenburg, Sweden discussed the idea of inviting senior table tennis players to an international tournament.

ITTF was contacted and asked for permission to name the event "World Veterans Championships" but with very little hope of getting a positive response.

The Secretary General at that time, Tony Brooks however gave a green light but the events had to be announced as "unofficial".

In order to find out how senior table tennis were organised in different parts of the world, Hans Westling went to Novi Sad to present the idea for representatives from various countries at the 1981 World Championships.

The reactions were most positive and a decision was made to invite the first World Veterans Championships (WVC) to be staged in May 1982 in Gothenburg.


Regulations (age categories, playing system etc) were put together based upon the experience from domestic events but also input received in Novi Sad.

The organisers presumed that a majority of the guests looked at the event much as a holiday combined with table tennis and that a guarantee of a certain number of matches was needed to attract players of various quality.


The concept decided (a pleasant time of the year, a large number of matches for all participants, time for social activities etc) was most appreciated and has since in principle been kept the same.

A lot of time was spent promoting the championships and much effort was made to identify and attract contact persons in different countries. 21 countries were represented by 451 participants and these figures were far higher than the organisers had expected.


Among participants of various playing strength were many ex-champions including three former World Champions: Kazuko Ito from Japan, Ferenc Sido from Hungary and Laszlo Bellak from USA, but representing Hungary during his career.











The event became a great success with its friendly atmosphere and the organisers were approached by a large number of participants with requests for future championships.

Contacts were made with Swaythling Club International (SCI), an organisation of former international players and coaches.

SCI president at that time Joe Veselsky was more than happy to accept SCI to become the responsible organisation for WVC.

A WVC committee was formed with responsibility to identify future organisers, assist them in preparation for the event and to give full support during the championships.

The second WVC took place in Helsinki, Finland. ITTF president Roy Evans was present and announced in his opening speech the championships as "official".

WVC has through the years become more and more popular and a record high participation figure of 3.650 was reached 2006 in Bremen, Germany.

This meant that about 14.000 matches were played on 156 courts during four playing days, indeed remarkable figures.








PARKING PLAN






