JAPAN versus SOUTHLAND INVITATION TEAM

The Japanese have long been top-class exponents of table tennis. They have set a high standard, and become the first nation to exploit the advantages of the sponge rubber bat.

This year, in Europe, Japanese players won six of the seven world titles, and all five English championships.

K. MATSUZAKI, is the reigning world singles champion, and in her appearances to date in New Zealand she has left no doubt of her ability.

K. YAMAIZUMI, was co-holder of the world doubles title in 1958 and is at present ranked third in Japan as a singles player.

J. WILLIAMSON, of Christchurch, is a former N.Z. champion and has gained considerable experience in Europe.

J. MAGORIAN, of Dunedin, won the N.Z. singles title in 1955 and has been runner-up on numerous occasions.

JOHN CATTO & RAY MERCER, of Southland are present South Island doubles title-holders. Catto is the Southland Champion and former N.Z. Junior champion. Mercer is a Southland and South Island representative, and holds a New Zealand ranking.

MR. H. SHIMIZU, manager of the Japanese girls is the same popular manager who accompanied the men's champions, T. Tanaka and I. Ogimura when they toured New Zealand in 1957.

This contest tonight could almost be classed as an unofficial test match, as both Miss Williamson and Mrs. Magorian have been selected to represent New Zealand this season.
