SWEDEN

HANS ALSER

Alser is the current European Champion and has won this title seven times since 1960. He has been a member of Sweden's team for 12 years and would rank as one of the most complete players in Europe. Alser possesses a fine defence and an attack from each wing and some of his counter hitting from well back from the table is tremendous.

Alser will probably retire after the 1971 world championships in Tokyo and take up a coaching appointment in Germany for a two-year period initially.

Besides his European titles Alser has won many Swedish and other titles throughout his career . . . far too numerous to mention here.

KJELL JOHANSSON

Johansson won the European crown at only 17, and has been a member of the Swedish team since 1964. An attacking specialist, his forehand hitting ranks amongst the world's best. It took a long time for top world players to cope with his lightning counter hitting. Not a defensive player at all, simply because he can't chop, but his counter hitting from 15 feet behind the table is, like Alser's, tremendous.

Johansson also has won titles at European and Swedish tournaments too numerous to mention.

Alser and Johansson are the current world doubles champions having won the title at the last two championships.

WANGANUI

GERRY SANDERSON -

Present residential titleholder and a member of the Wanganui team since 1965. One of the steadiest players in this area and quite capable of beating any other player in the district. Gerry also won the North Taranaki title and repped for them before moving to Wanganui.

LEE MUMMERY

The most improved local player last year when he first played for Wanganui. Lee is a tremendous fighter and will keep trying all the way. This has enabled him to win many matches against his opponents. Has also played cricket for Wanganui and Central Districts.

NELSON TIZARD

Probably Wanganui's most consistent player in recent years; although a residential finalist in nine of his last II attempts has won only two. An attacking player who likes to get on with the game, Nelson has just completed his 100th successive win in the inter-club competitions.

MURRAY BORLASE

Appearing by invitation with the Wanganui team, Murray will need no introduction to followers of table tennis. Murray, who plays in Hutt Valley, first hit the top in 1967 with his win in the North Island championships and was later that year selected to play for N.Z. against the English players, Neale and Gibbs, and then in 1968 represented N.Z. at the SEAPATT tourney in Melbourne.
