Ma Lung Sang, 19 years old, is a graduate in an English High School. He is the most promising young Table Tennis player in Hong Kong. He holds the pen-holder grip and is a fast attacking player. He was runner-up of the Hong Kong Open Singles Championships in 1969 and 1970 and is now in the last 8 of the current singles championships. He is one of the 3 players in the Dron Eagle Team which has won the Hong Kong Open "A" teams events for the last three years. He has represented Hong Kong in the last Asian Championships 1970, 1st Commonwealth Championships in Singapore and the 31st World Championships in Japan in April, 1971. He was one of the players of the Hong Kong team which won a Silver Medal in the teams event in the 1st Commonwealth Championships in Singapore last April. He also won a Silver Medal in the men's doubles in the same championships. In the current World Championships in last April he only 1-3 to Chuang Tse Tung, three times world champion in the singles event.

Tang Hung Bor is a native Chinese, 5ft llins. in height and 136 pounds in weight. He is a graduate in High School with a good command in both English and Chinese. He works as a clerk in an accountant's firm in Hong Kong. Tang, former champion in singles, doubles and teams event in Hong Kong, is a pen-holder Chinese style attacking player. He is an experienced and crafty player representing Hong Kong many times in international championships including the Asian Championships, Asian Games and the recent 1st Commonwealth Championships. He was one of the players of the Hong Kong team which won the Silver Medal in the teams event in the 1st Commonwealth Championships in Singapore in April this year.

FRANKLIN - THE CHAMPAGNE ASSOCIATION!

INTERNATIONAL CONTESTS:

The programme shall consist of four singles and one doubles. The players selected for the singles will each play two singles followed by the doubles and then the final two singles. In accordance with international procedure the draw shall be made prior to the commencement of the contest. The order of play shall be where the two singles players on one side are lettered "A" and "B" and the two singles players on the other side are lettered "X" and "Y" - 1st match "A" v "X", 2nd "B" v "Y", 3rd the doubles match, 4th "A" v "Y" and 5th "B" v "X". Before the commencement of the contest the right for the singles players to be "A" and "B" or "X" and "Y" shall be decided by the two captains by lot, and this decided, each captain shall name his two singles players to the contest manager, allotting a letter to each of his singles players. The order of play thus determined may only be altered by mutual agreement between the captains and with the consent of the contest manager, always provided that, if the selection and lot oblige any player to play two or more matches in succession his captain may allow for that player, not more than ten minutes rest between such matches.

Each match shall be the best of five games and the Dunlop Super 3-crown table tennis ball will be used.

An exhibition match by the visitors at the conclusion of the test is only to be arranged if agreed to by the Manager of the Touring Team. Spectators will be advised during the evening whether or not this exhibition match will take place.

y B. Murphy (Auckland) won the Zealand singles title in 1970, red Australia with the N.Z.Univeries team in 1970 and won the N.Z. s under 16 Singles title in 1964 the N.Z. Boys under 18 title in 6. He has represented Hutt Valley, go and Auckland.

Alan R. Tomlinson (Auckland) played for N.Z. in 1961 World Championships in Peking and in 1967 World Championships in Stockholm, Sweden. He played for N.Z. against Japan in 1957, against Australia (1960,62,66 & 69) represented N.Z.in the Seapalt Tournament in Melbourne, Australia in 1968, and played for N.Z. against Sweden in 1970. Has captained New Zealand several times and was Captain of the Mens Team at this year's World Championships Tomlinson's best wins include 2 over England international, Dennis Neale. Tomlinson was N.Z. Champion in 1959, 64, and 69. He has won the N.Z. Mens Doubles title 9 times and the N.Z. Mixed Doubles once. In all he has won 13 N.Z. titles.

Richard E. Lee (Hamilton) The youngest male player ever selected to represent New Zealand. He played against Sweden in 1970 when 15. A left-hander Lee won the N.Z. under 16 and under 18 years titles in 1968 and in 1969. He won the 1970 North Island Mens Open Singles and was Runner-up in the 1970 South Island Mens Singles. Lee won 32 titles in New Zealand in 1970.

James R. Morris (Northland) won the N.Z. Boys under 16 singles title in 1968 and was runner up to Richard Lee in the N.Z. under 18 singles in 1970. A Northland representative since 1968.

(James is the present holder of the Franklin Open Championships Mens Singles Title).

** FACTS ON FRANKLIN **

Where is the Franklin Table Tennis Association?

Its Northern Boundary is the Tamaki River between Otahuhu and Papatoetoe, and it stretches to Rangiriri in the South, while running coast to coast from East to West - an area in excess of 1,200 square miles.

Who belongs to the Franklin Association?

In 1971, there are 27 Clubs affiliated with Franklin. These are:-

How many members are there?

The membership in 1970 was 750 and Franklin was the fourth largest Association in New Zealand. In 1971 the membership has risen to over 1100 putting Franklin amongst the largest Associations in N.Z., with no Sub-Associations; and run by one central executive committee comprising 20 members representing 10 clubs. How many Teams in Inter-Club Competition?

There are 69 teams in the Franklin Interclub Competition in 1971 - teams are of 4 players. There are 6 teams in the A Grade, 8 teams in the A Reserve, 8 in the B Grade, 8 in the B. Reserve, 8 in the C Grade, 8 in the C Reserve, 8 in the D Grade 8 in the E Grade, and 6 in the E Reserve, and matches are played on a 2 round home-and-away basis.

How long has the Franklin Table Tennis Assn.been in existence?

Franklin was formed in 1938 with Pukekohe as its headquarters and until 1953 was a sub Association of Auckland. Then Franklin gained full Association status and since then has gone from strength to strength, with the administration centre shifting from Pukekohe to Manurewa as the Northern area became more developed.
