CZECHOSLOVAKIA TEAM

Milan Orlowski

He began playing table-tennis at the age of eight. His first coach was his father Mercel Orlowski, a former table-tennis and soccer player. When Milan was ten, his father brought him to the a.c. Sparta Club. In 1969 he was sent for the first time to the world championships to gather experience in the men's singles. Three more times he was then member of the victorious Czechoslovak Juniors Team at European Championships. For the second time he represented the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic at the World Championship at Nagoya, Japan in 1971, where in the singles he reached the last eight and he repeated this at the World Championship at Saraiyeva in 1973, where he was stopped only by the World Champion His En-ting.

In. Jaroslav KUNZ

Ing. Jaroslav Kunz is one of the exceptions among Czechoslovak and European players. His basic stroke is back-hand and his back-hand blocking is very effective with most players whose basic stroke is topspin. He began to play table-tennis for boys of the Stadion Zizkov Praha Club and soon he worked his way up into Czechoslovakia's representation. Already in 1964, as an eighteen year old, he was a member of the Czechoslovak team at the European Championship at Malmo.

Josef Dvoracek

Josef Dvoracek was a member of the excellent junior team of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic (Orlowski, Turai, Dvoracek) which was twice the undisputed winner of the European Championships in 1968 and 1969. In 1969 at Obertraun it was Dvoracek who secured the first place for Czechoslovakia by beating, in the decisive match, the Swede Stellan Bengtsson, the later World Champion.

Alice Grovofa

Grofova began to play table-tennis at the age of 10 soon belonged to the best juniors in the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic. In 1967 and in 1968 she was member of the Czechoslovak team which reached the European Junior Women's Champions title. In her play she relies on a smashing finishing forehand drive and a fast dangerous backhand. The first time she cam to the fore in the singles was in 1971 when at the World Championship at Nagoya she fought her way among the last eight players. But her greatest successes came in 1973 when she put the so-called anti-spin cover on the backhand side of her racket.



RICHARD LEE

Richard Lee aged 19 who is the present National Champion, plays an aggressive game with a typical "lifty" forehand. He has improved steadily since he was a junior and with more International experience will improve further. His first International tour was in 1971 when he played in the first Commonwealth championship held in Singapore and world championship at Nagova, Japan.



JAMES MORRIS

James Morris is a young dedicated player who has worked very hard at his game and on the China tour had some very good wins. He stands very close to the table and likes to counter attack, he has improved his service greatly and has a strong forehand follow-up.

He played in matches against the last two teams which toured this country - China and Japan - and was the only male N.Z. player to record wins against these teams. Aged 22 he also went to the World Championships in 1971 as a team mate of Richard Lee; this enabled him to obtain great experience.

ANN STONESTREET

Ann Stonestreet aged 20 is the current New Zealand Champion, a right handed agressive player of great promise, she was also in the team which toured the East recently. One of the few New Zealand women players who loop-drives. Ann has won the National title three years in a row. Prior to the Easten tour she had played with success in England beating several of the ranked players in that country. Most are aware that the English standard is high, therefore this is no A Stonestreet mean effort. Since her return she has devoted her full time to playing table tennis and is determined to raise her standard.
